# HORSESHOE BEND SWEEPS VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONSHIP AGAIN!

**HORSESHOE BEND** -- It was deja vu for the Horseshoe Bend Varsity Volleyball team on Saturday, October 27 as the team won the Idaho 1A State Championship (Division I last year, Division II this year after the school left the 1A Western Conference for the 1A Long Pin Conference) for the second year in a row. The 1A state tournament began on Friday at Borah High School in Boise. Their first game had them facing the Carey Panthers, defeating them 3-0 (25-19, 25-17, 25-12). Stat leader were Syringa Riley, senior, with 37 assists (pass, set or dig ball to another player who gets the kill), and 5 digs (passing a spiked or hard hit ball), Jade Warren, senior, with 19 kills (an attack on

the ball which is not returnable by the opposing team), 14 digs, and 3 blocks (blocking the ball back into the opponent's court), Madison Chesnut, senior, with 11 digs, 10 kills, and 3 aces (a serve which is unable to be played or returned by opposing team), Lana Larson, junior, with 8 digs and 4 aces, Brooke Lane, junior, with 4 kills, 4 digs, and 2 aces, team libero, Brittani Cooper, senior, with 9 digs, and Julia Black, senior, with 4 kills, 1 dig, and 1 block. Advancing to the next round the Mustangs went up against their Long Pin Division rivals, the Salmon River Savages. The Savages came to play but Horseshoe Bend took the match 3-0 (25-22, 25-



## What Will Happen to the Electronic Sign?

**IDAHO CITY** -- The Idaho City Marquee, which resides on the right of highway 21 outside of the Idaho City limits, has stopped working. One side of the panel died and so it was shut off. The High School requested a bid to repair the sign, and found that it would cost \$835.00 to repair one of the panels, but it might need both panels replaced, and it might be cheaper to use LED lights, instead of the incandescent lights.

Superintendent Brian Hunicke said that the sign was made with incandescent lights, which take up a considerable amount of electricity. Each month the school pays \$40.00 a month for electricity and another \$39.00 to Century Link for the line to connect to the marquee. Hunicke said: "that is \$80.00 a month just to run the sign, and since we have had it we looked back at records and learned that we have spent \$15,000 just to keep it running. Those are taxpayer's dollars which we could use for educational needs." He also added that most of the advertising on

the marquee is for community events, not school events.

On October 24, in the regular Idaho City Council meeting, the broken marquee was discussed. Idaho City council members stated that the sign is not in Idaho City limits, and therefore not their responsibility. The Chamber of Commerce was present in the meeting, and Michelle Audette said that they have grants for "signage and publicity." She said that they would research what they could do, but would make no promises that they would take over the responsibility of the marquee.

### Training for Robie & Clear Creek Fire Departments

**EAST BOISE COUNTY** -- Members of Robie Creek and Clear Creek Fire attended training in Boise at Orchard Combat Training Center [OCTC] Fire Department. The firefighters from various volunteer agencies trained alongside the OCTC career guys, preparing for chimney fire season in the mountains. Members went over basic structure side-up, radio communication, search and rescue, and confined space training.

Starting out in "rooms" made from chairs and tables, firefighters wore masks over their eyes to simulate the darkened environment, found in homes, full of smoke. They crawled through these makeshift homes looking for people to rescue, as well as finding their way to the fire. Once they mastered, this they practiced the same drills blindfolded, wearing packs, and breathing air from their Self-contained breathing apparatus [SCBA].

Later in the afternoon, the firefighters entered a OCTC connex trainer. A two-story maze built to test the mental and physical constraints found in homes that have collapsed, or are badly burnt. This maze has four levels that twist, turn, have rotating walls, plastic tubes to crawl through, and even some spaces so tight it requires the firefighters to remove their packs and helmet to squeeze through. All of this is done in complete darkness. Each firefighter completed this maze to finish the days' training. Thanks to OCTC Fire, we now have several members of our volunteer community trained better and ready to respond in a moments notice, to help their neighbors.

Members that attended the training were Neal Lince, Cole Reeder, Brian Doran, Eric Geibel, and Jacob Pecorito. OCTC trainers were James Moore, Kory Simmons, and Noah Copen.



**IDAHO CITY** -- The Idaho City Volunteer Fire Department has recently acquired a "Res-Q-Jack Aluminum X Deluxe 4-Point Kit" of vehicle stabilization struts for use in accident stabilization and rescue. The kit includes four 10,000 pound rated struts and two 6,000 pound rated jacks to use with the struts. The kit also includes several different accessories including ratchet straps, chains and other items to safely stabilize a wrecked vehicle while getting the occupants out. They also have a TNT battery operated cutter to be delivered very shortly for use in extrication of vehicle occupants trapped in a crashed vehicle. All this and other pre-owned equipment for rescue is

in service for use as necessary, and training was held on October 27th to get the crews up-to-date on the new equipment.

sin" They were then asked to explain the picture. This rapidly changed their mind and they stated that Moose had been reintroduced to the area 10 years before but were poached. Boise Basin Boosters then launched a Moose awareness campaign with the help of Idaho Fish and Game.

On October 20th 2018 a large Bull Moose and two cows were spotted in down town Centerville next to the train station. We were not able to obtain good photos of them. On October 18th, 2018, four were seen visiting Placerville and a good photo was obtained. We have received reports that the population has grown from 1 on 2005 to 8+ in 2018.

It will be fun to see how this population grows.

Outstanding play came from Riley with 40 assists, 7 digs, 3 kills, 1 block, & 1 ace, Warren with 23 kills, 10 digs, and 4 blocks, Chesnut with 22

digs, 10 kills, 2 aces, and 2 assists, Larson with 16 digs, 2 assists, and 1 ace, Lane with 6 kills, 3 digs, and 1 ace, Cooper with 8 digs, and 1 assist, and Black with 4 kills. The win set Horseshoe Bend up to play for the state championship against fellow Long Pin opponents, Salmon River. The Mustangs victory was 3-0 (25-22, 25-12, 25-12) When the final figures came in Riley was on top with 36 assists, 18 digs, 1 kill, and 1 ace. Warren had 21 kills, 16 digs, 6 blocks, 1 assist, and 1 ace. Other big contributors included Chesnut with 18 digs, 8 kills, 1 ace, and 1 assist, Cooper with 17 digs, Larson with 14 digs and 2 assists, lane with 8 digs and 4 kills, Black with 6

kills, 2 digs, and 2 blocks, and Vanessa Jimenez, senior, with 1 block.

The team returned, trophy in hand, to the school on Sunday morning to be greeted by family, friends, and community well-wishers.

knew it did not hit the ground first."


Emergency responders from the Garden Valley Fire District came on the scene and stayed for at least four hours making sure no fires were started or that anyone was trapped under the debris. Fire Chief Jon Delvalle came in with the fire truck tanker and rescue responders. Boise County Deputies were also on the scene.

On the day after the accident, one neighbor was picking up the pieces of what she could get out of her home, thankful that she could retrieve a few items. A local construction company was on site to begin much of the work ahead. The tree was cut up and removed from one

house. The other home still has the tree laying through it.

One item that brings sadness to one of the homeowners is that the tree destroyed an 1870's piano that belonged in her family. Pictures and household items can be replaced, but the piano was a cherished item. The families will spend the next few days literally "picking up the pieces" and figuring out the next steps to remodel or maybe even tear down the home and start over.

Neighbors have come to help box up items. Another neighbor who uses their house only during the summer offered their place as a temporary home for the winter. The comment that stood out is, "There are so many good people in Garden Valley".



## Fun Family Outdoor Ideas...

### Walk right in the woods, fawn spots

We've been doing it our whole life, but I'll wager you don't give much thought to walking in the woods. A few simple changes might add miles to your day. After a marathon weekend following my dog, these ideas came back to me ... a little late, but better than never!

U.S. Army research proves a shorter stride minimizes injury to hips and pelvis bones. Ask a physicist why, but I've found it also helps you stay on top of some types of crusty snow, rather than "postholing." A slower-than-urban pace allows for more regular, rhythmic, evenly-spaced strides; ultimately you cover more ground.

Avoid stepping on the tops

of boulders, logs or similar obstacles – step over instead. Thigh muscles aren't taxed as much, because they don't have to lift your body as high. Placing your foot on the ground rather than the tops of slippery or imbalanced rocks means you can't slip off and turn an ankle.

Off-trail, follow as straight a line as possible through brush. The fewer twists and turns, the less energy expended, and stress on hip, knee and ankle joints is minimized. Follow the critters: most deer trails traverse slopes in a gentle incline for good reason.

Be sure to drink plenty of fluids. Muscle cramps are often a consequence of dehydration.

### Bits & pieces

- Dandelion, the green thumb's nemesis, is savored by goldfinches and pine sis-

kins. Incentive enough?

- Make your walking staff long enough. One as tall as you is about right. You get better support holding the "neck" instead of the very end, of a good staff.

- The common merganser goes by a variety of nicknames. Hunters and biologists also know the large duck as the sawbill, fish duck, goosander, and American merganser.

- If you see high-flying birds eating airborne insects, the good weather should hold for at least a day.

- The horns of mountain goats are efficient daggers – sharp and smooth – but most importantly, short and curved. Their size and shape allow an aggressor to quickly withdraw its horns from – yuk – its opponent's body.

- How many spots does a deer fawn have? Between 272 and 342, according to

those who had the patience to count.

### Another waterborne menace

Didymo isn't just a funny name. It's a freshwater algae that is causing problems in some streams and rivers in the United States.

Although native in some northern regions, in more southern areas it's forming extensive mats, smothering streambeds and affect-

ing fish, invertebrates, and plants as it overruns habitat. It spreads by attaching to recreation equipment: boat hulls, props, and trailers, even an angler's waders, so clean up your act before you leave the lake. While not considered a human health threat, scientists have yet to find a way to eliminate didymo once it infests a river or stream. And unlike its name, THAT's not funny.




