BOISE COUNTY -- On 9-16-19, the Boise County Sheriff's Office served search warrants in the Clear Creek area of Boise County. A marijuana grow was located and the plants were seized. One male subject was arrested for felony controlled substance manufacturing. The investigation is ongoing.

Editor's note: Gerald Uehlin was arraigned in court on Tuesday, September 17. He was charged with one count of Drug Trafficking in Marijuana, in possession of 25 to 50 plants, which Uehlin said was personal use. Magistrate Judge Roger Cockerille released Uehlin from jail and set a court date for September 30th, at 11am.


