BANKS - HWY 55 INTERSECTION MEETING

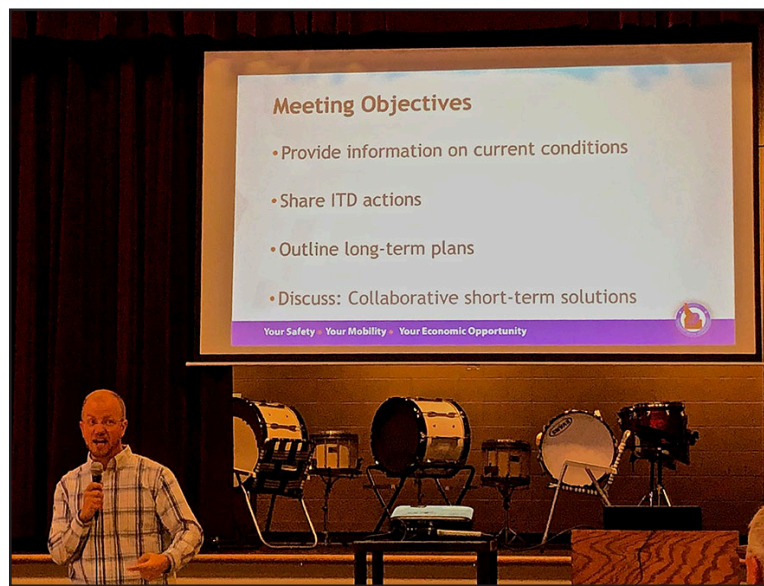

WEST BOISE COUNTY --

The intersection at Highway 55 and the Banks Lowman Road has been a hot topic for many local residents. A meeting was held at the Garden Valley High School on Friday, September 27th, for the Idaho Transportation Department [ITD] to address these concerns with the public. Through the department, they made a rough cost analysis, factored in safety, and measured the volume of traffic, but say there

are further challenges with funding. Although there was a fatality within the last year, they say the intersection becomes a problem primarily on Sunday afternoons during the summer months, from 11am to 5pm. ITD has reported an increase of 2,000 motor vehicles per day, traveling up through the rural mountain road network. Jake Melder, a spokesman for ITD, recognized the significant growth factor across the state of Idaho. The budget the department has to

work with is \$406 million, but it is spent rather quickly on expansion projects throughout the state. Each project is ranked, but this project did not rank as high as others.

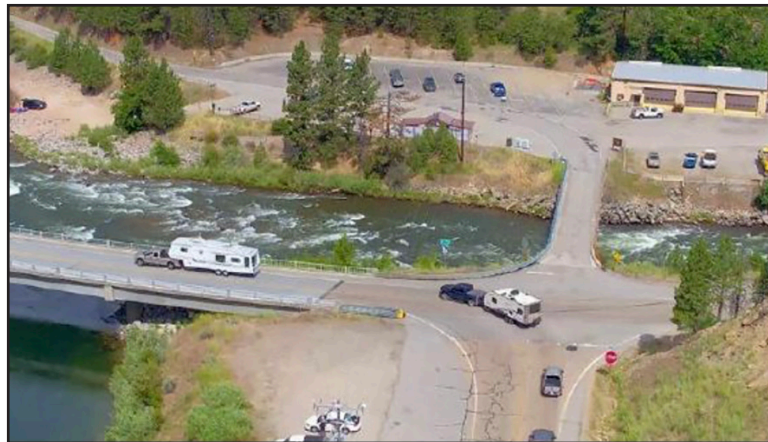
At the meeting on Friday, a big note pad was displayed to take input from community members, from which ITD will review the pros and cons of each suggestion. Melder reiterated: “We heard some great ideas.”

ITD does pay for flaggers through an independent contractor to come out on three heavily travelled holiday weekends a year, during the summer months, to help direct traffic. The cost for each Sunday event is \$3,500, which includes paying the flaggers, their supervisor, and four ITD employees to assist with timing and limiting the delay with traffic backing up. This also covers the cost of breaking down the equipment. The current solution is what ITD

says they will continue for holiday weekends, which will justify the volume and can be safely done.

The suggestion of a stoplight was turned down, due to safety reasons. Melder said that motorists tend to speed on Hwy. 55 and could come flying around a blind corner, see brake lights, neces-

sitating a quick and unexpected stop. He added that the department is looking for alternatives and excited to move forward; however, funding is challenging. ITD hopes to pursue a grant for Federal Land Access, which would pay for an engineering analysis of the area and further address the congestion.

Congratulation to the Idaho City Volunteer Fire District. They were recently awarded a grant for a new fully tactical tender, which will carry 3,000 gallons of water to protect structures and fight wildland fires. The grant was finalized on Tuesday, October 1st, in the amount of \$295,000.

Special thanks to David Haney, grant writer, for the district. He has also helped in writing for grants benefiting the Clear Creek and Thorn Creek Volunteer Fire Departments.

Idaho City Fire Chief Terry Teeter said this addition will make four tactical tenders for the east side of Boise County; including the fire departments for Wilderness Ranch, Thorn Creek, and Clear Creek.

From 11am - 1pm and 2pm - 5pm, the Basin Innovation Station will be open with a variety of STEM activities, including virtual reality, a huge LEGO wall, circuit activities, engineering challenges, and rock painting. New Trespassing Laws in Effect in Idaho

BOISE COUNTY -- As of July 1, 2019, there were new trespassing laws, HB 658/Senate Bill 658 and Senate Bill 1313, that went into effect in Idaho on July 1st, 2019.

What is trespassing?

Trespass is defined as "the act of entering another person's property without the permission of the owner or legal authority."

What is Different Now?

In Idaho, and other western states, big investors such as the billionaire Wilkes brothers have been buying up private land in huge quantities, has fu-

eling alarm among Idahoans.

What if they're blocking roads that belong to the public?

The U.S. Forest Service has determined that at least one road has been closed illegally: Road 374, (Boise Ridge Road). Their investigation concluded that this road was built with public money by the Civilian Conservation Core. Public money has also been used sporadically to maintain its trails. Other possibly illegally closed roads are being investigated.

What's New in the Bills?

Landowners are no longer required to post land, except at

the corners or other natural barriers. If a property is fenced, cultivated or reasonably associated with a residence or place of business, the bill expects a reasonable person would know that it is private property. The same holds true for unfenced or undeveloped land that has no trespassing signs or bright orange paint at specific locations.

Idaho trespass laws are written in three different sections of code: civil, criminal, and Fish and Game. There were objections from the Idaho Sheriffs' and Prosecuting Attorneys' associations.

What can we do legally if the owners forbid recreationists and others to use their land?

Nothing, if the ownership, easements and legal title are satisfied. They have the right to control who enters their property.

"We want to be good neighbors," Justin Wilks said. "I know some people think we haven't been, just because we haven't let them freely roam across our property as they saw fit. But I'll also offer: Do you want me camping in your front yard?"



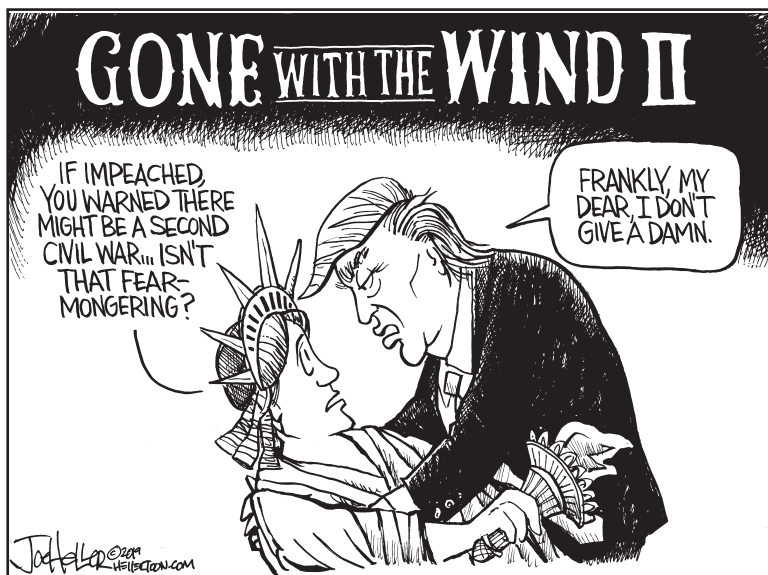
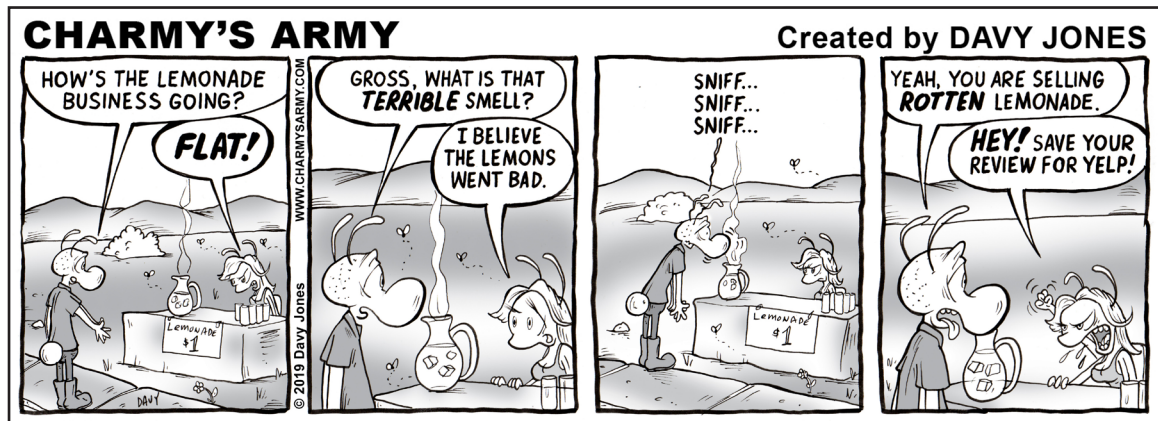
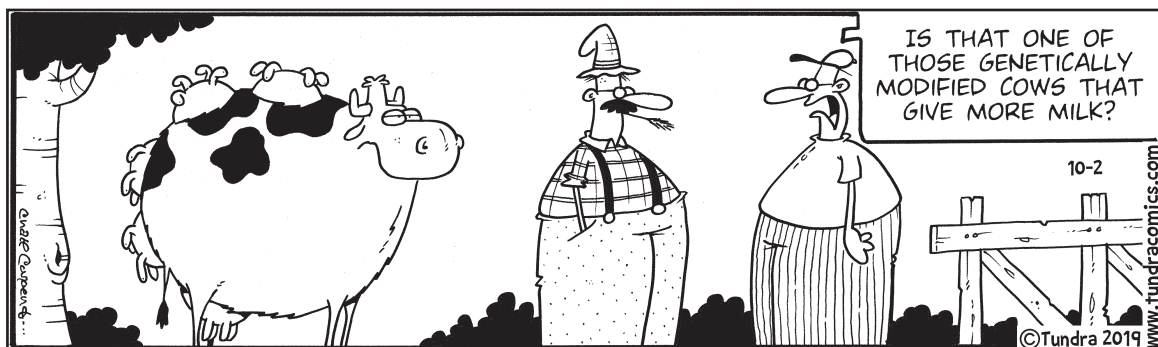

PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT TO PROPOSE OR PROMULGATE NEW OR CHANGED AGENCY RULES

The following agencies of the state of Idaho have published the complete text and all related, pertinent information concerning their intent to change or make the following rules in the latest publication of the state Administrative Bulletin.

The proposed rule public hearing request deadline is October 16, 2019, unless otherwise posted.

The proposed rule written comment submission deadline is October 23, 2019, unless otherwise posted.

(Temp & Prop) indicates the rulemaking is both Temporary and Proposed.

(*PH) indicates that a public hearing has been scheduled.

IDAPA 07 – DIVISION OF BUILDING SAFETY
PO Box 83720, Meridian, ID 83642

07-0301-1901, Rules of of Building Safety. Incorporates by reference the 2018 editions of the International Building Code, International Residential Code, International Existing Building Code, and the International Energy Conservation Code.

07-0801-1901, Idaho Minimum Standards and Practices for Logging. Allows ISP and ITD to enforce these rules on public highways; updates rule by eliminating outdated terminology, equipment and practices requirements and adding updated work-related safety procedures and safety equipment requirements.

IDAPA 08 – IDAHO STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION
PO Box 83720, Boise, ID 83720-0037

08-0113-1901, Rules Governing the Opportunity Program. (Temp & Prop) Amends student eligibility and application requirements to allow up to 20% of the scholarship awards to be used for individuals who have 24 or more postsecondary credits; defines "adult learner" and "graduation plan." (eff. 8/29/19)T

08-0201-1902, Rules Governing Administration. Removes language identifying the grade range performance metrics to conform to statute; removes obsolete provisions.

08.02.02 - Rules Governing Uniformity.

08-0202-1901, Per statute details the critical components required in any suicide awareness and prevention training offered to public school personnel.

08-0202-1903, Removes outdated terminology and duplicative definitions to terminology found in statute.

08.02.03 - Rules Governing Thoroughness

08-0203-1901, Incorporates by reference the career technical education program content standards.

08-0203-1902, Per statutory

requirement adds chronic absenteeism to the state longitudinal data system.

08-0204-1901, Rules Governing Public Charter Schools. Adds language to the charter renewal and performance certificate review process to clarify what happens when an authorizing chartering entity chooses not to review their performance certificate and takes no action to renew or nonrenew a charter.

12-0110-1901, Rules Pursuant to the Idaho Residential Mortgage Practices Act. Updates references to federal law and regulations applicable to the business of mortgage origination and eliminates duplicative rules relative to disclosure requirements.

16-0201-1901, Rules of the Idaho Time Sensitive Emergency System Council. Incorporates by reference the 2020-1 edition of the "Time Sensitive Emergency Standards Manual."

16-0202-1901, Rules of the Idaho Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Physician Commission. Incorporates by reference the 2020-1 edition of the "Idaho Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Physician Commission Standards Manual."

16-0214-1901, Rules Governing Construction and Operation of Public Swimming Pools in Idaho. Increases public swimming pool permit fees to offset cost to the Public Health Districts that run the inspection programs.

16-0301-1901, Eligibility for Health Care Assistance for

Families and Children. (Temp & Prop) Provides Medicaid inpatient care services to inmates of a public institution; establishes rules for the adult population that may receive Medicaid for people 19 - 64 years of age and includes the pregnancy Medicaid program. (eff. 1/1/20)T

***16-0310-1704, Medicaid Enhanced Plan Benefits.** (*PH) Revises the reimbursement rate setting methodology for Developmental Disability Agencies (serving adults and children); Residential Habilitation Agencies; Supported Employment Agencies; and Targeted Service Coordinators.

***16-0318-1901, Medicaid Cost-Sharing.** (*PH) Aligns the Personal Needs Allowance (PNA) for all HCBS participants regardless of marital status; clarifies that Native Americans and Medicaid Workers with Disabilities are exempt from this share of cost requirement.

16-0504-1901, Rules of the Idaho Council on Domestic Violence and Victim Assistance Grant Funding. Removes obsolete language and updates language to reflect current best practices.

16-0612-1901, Rules Governing the Idaho Child Care Program (ICCP). Removes obsolete language and updates rules to align to federal regulations regarding health and safety training for providers.

18-0408-1901, Individual Disability and Group Supplemental Disability Insurance Minimum Standards Rule. Provides standards for various individual disability and group supplemental disability policies; clarifies pre-existing condition language; removes medical expense coverage types; clarifies which standards apply to which type of coverage.

18-0416-1901, Rules Governing Short-Term Health Insurance Coverage. New chapter implements HB 275 regarding short-term, limited-duration insurance by defining requirements for enhanced short-term plans and nonrenewable short-term coverage, including minimum standards for benefits, rating rules, enrollment, renewability and required disclosure provisions.

18-0606-1901, Rules for the Surplus Line Regulation. Provides updated procedures for the placement of surplus lines insurance in Idaho.

"Killer Intersection," money, and the Horseshoe Bend School:

Dorothy Moon, our State House Representative, instigated a valuable meeting with 60-80 citizens and the Idaho Transportation Department (ITD) last Friday on the "Killer Intersection" at Idaho Route 55 and Banks-Lowman (B-L) Road. The upshot was that the ITD recognizes that the intersection is very dangerous on many Friday to Sunday night periods. Five accidents and one death over recent history prove that. The downer was that ITD has a limited budget to address the issue and cannot afford the \$750,000 that would be required to install a stoplight and make road alterations to solve the problem with today's technology. For the short term, flaggers will cost \$3,500 per day to manage the intersection on the days of highest danger and that comes to around \$120,000 per year. The issue is money, of course.

So let's get the money from those that cause the problem, the thousands of folks driving up and back to the North every weekend on route 55 dragging their toys. Let's feed them on the way back on Sunday night so that they don't have to make dinner when they get home. In recent history, my Boise County JC/RC non-profit proposed to support the Horseshoe Bend School by feeding those same folks but the proposal was rejected by the Superintendent due to pressure from a local restaurant that they would lose business even though all the restaurants were guaranteed no loss. Let's use the same plan to feed the returning travelers right at the 55/B-L intersection either in a drive-through in the Banks Cafe parking area or even in the county yard where many use the bathroom anyway. Flaggers will be necessary. The forecast in that plan would have provided the HSB School with up to \$500,000 a year income. Since the

school won't allow the plan to utilize their cafeteria and parking area, we will have to make do with the area at the intersection. We'll have to use paid people instead of the school sports teams as volunteers, so the profit will not be as large as the school plan, but will be plenty to solve the intersection problem.

Response to fundraising proposal at Horseshoe Bend School:

I am perplexed at Mr. John Cottingham's thinly-veiled attack on me and our school for simply declining to participate in his fundraising idea. Approximately a year and a

half ago, Mr. Cottingham approached us with a fundraising proposal that involved selling food to weekend travelers on Highway 55. He called it the "I'm a Bender" plan (the plan included selling "I'm a Bender" merchandise as part of the projected revenue). His plan would have local restaurants give the school prepared food from their restaurants at cost, and the school would then sell that food to travelers and keep the profit.

After some deliberation, we concluded that Mr. Cottingham was, 1) overly-optimistic about the number of travelers who would stop at our school for a meal, rather than just hustling on to their Treasure Valley homes on a Sunday afternoon/evening, 2) underestimating the number of volunteers needed every weekend for a project of this scope, 3) overestimating the buy-in from local restaurants to provide us with their food for our profit (we did hear concern from lo-

cal business owners after Mr. Cottingham sent out a letter to businesses describing his plan). Additionally, we felt it exposed the school to an unacceptable level of potential liability (we are a school, not a drive-thru restaurant). For these reasons, we declined to participate.

While we don't appreciate the attack, we bear no ill will toward Mr. Cottingham or his plan, and we hope he is able to find a group willing to work with him, and that our doubts about the viability of the project are proven to be unfounded.
