Boise County Fire Season Begins and Fire Resources Respond

BOISE COUNTY -- There were three new fires this week in Boise County, and an aggressive fourth fire was reported in the Thompson Creek Drainage near Centerville AS The Idaho World went to print Tuesday night. A fire in Wilderness Ranch was still under investigation by the Idaho Department of Lands. The fire started on Saturday, burning up a sidehill from Rush Creek Road. No structures were damaged, thanks to neighbors and the Wilderness Ranch Volunteer Fire District banding together to extinguish the flames. There is currently a burn ban in effect in Boise County.

The U.S. Forest Service gave an update on Tuesday, July 28th, detailing that the Warm Fire was 25 acres in size, located about three miles south of Bull Trout Lake in the Lowman Ranger District, and was started on July 27th by lightning. There were no immediate threats to structures. There is concern for gusty winds and possible thunderstorms within the coming week. As of Tuesday, there were 67 firefighters on this fire.

An additional update was given on the Golden Fire, located three miles southwest of Coulter Summit in the Idaho City Ranger District. It also started on July 27th, but is currently under investigation. It is burning in dead and fallen timber, in a steep draw, which is challenging for firefighting. It has spread to about 30 acres.

Chief Colton McCarthy of the Wilderness Ranch Fire Protection District said, "The fire started Saturday evening on Rush Creek Road between Wilderness Way and Meadow Lane. Wilderness Ranch Fire resources responded and with the help of people from the community were able to catch it pretty small. Unfortunately, in the middle of the night, there was a breakout toward the bottom of the fire. A breakout is where a pocket of heat smolders through a section of line that may not have been down to bare mineral soil, or where an ember rolls out from the black side to the green side of the line. It is uncertain what caused it, but it allowed the fire to double in size. Wilderness Ranch Fire was toned out again at 2:30 AM Sunday morning for this breakout and we were able to catch it at .3 acres. Later Sunday morning, Wilderness Ranch Fire transferred command to resources from Idaho Department of Lands so we could get our folks home to sleep and, in

some cases, back to work after a short nap." He added, "I would like to thank all of our firefighters and members of the community that helped stop this fire from spreading. You were all a tremendous help, both on and off the fire-line. It was great to see how well the firefighters and community members worked together on this incident. It pleases me to call you all my neighbors." The cause of this fire is currently unknown and is under investigation by the IDL.

BOISE -- Fire broke out on July 25th in Ada County, 7 miles from Arrowrock Dam. Helicopters were used to make bucket water drops and retardant planes blanketed the brush and grassy hillsides.

There were 110 personnel on the fire, along with two helicopters, seven fire engines, two dozers, two water tenders, and three hand crews.

The fire was creeping by the end of the day and full containment and the extinguishing of the hot spots along the perimeter would by monitored over the next two days.

The cause is under investigation, and is estimated to have burned 150 acres.

Coed Softball Finale with Bragging Rights

The teams came to win and played under a brutally hot July sun. The first game of the tournament pitted the number two seeded Idaho Pest Control team against the number three seed Fair N Square Construction. The Idaho Pest Control team took the win 24-10 in a shortened mercy rule game that ended after the top of the fifth inning. Game number two featured the number one seeded Ochoco West against the number four seed Mel's Muds. Mel's Mud took the early lead and kept it until Ochoco West rallied in the fourth inning, bringing in 7 runs to take a 10-5 lead. Ochoco West went on to win the game 13-9 which set up a final tournament game showdown between the two teams from Horseshoe Bend. The final game of the tournament (and season) was an exciting contest between teams made up of friends and families from the Horseshoe Bend community. The first inning ended with a tied score of 3-3 before Idaho Pest Control turned it up in the second inning batting the lineup and bringing in 9 runs, which had them starting the third inning with a 12-5 advantage. Ochoco West was in with 3 runs in the third, including home runs from 2017 Horseshoe Bend High School graduate Colter Elliot and 2020 Horseshoe Bend High School graduate Calvin Drake (with an RBI) ending the inning 13-8 in Idaho Pest Control's favor. In the fourth inning, Ochoco West started getting serious and drove in 10 runs, holding Idaho Pest Control to just 4 runs and taking the lead for the first time with the score of 18-17. The fifth inning opened with Idaho Pest Control up to bat, scoring 3 runs with a home run and an RBI courtesy of the team's captain, 2014 Horseshoe Bend High School graduate Kenny Beckman. The team went on to hold Ochoco West scoreless before going into the sixth inning, having taken back the lead with a two point lead, 20-18. With two outs, a solo home run with by 2019 Horseshoe Bend High School graduate Angelo Koslosky gave Idaho Pest Control a 21-18 advantage as Ochoco West came and took their turn at bat in the bottom of the sixth.

Idaho Pest Control opened the seventh strong, with 5 runs for a two point lead before a double play ended their rally in the middle of the seventh inning. Ochoco West opened with a line drive out to third base before scoring two runs and tying up the game 26-26. With 2 outs, Drake returned to the plate and drove in the winning run for Ochoco West, winning the game 27-26. The two teams congratulated each other and posed for pictures at the conclusion of the tournament. Most met for a float down the Payette River, capping off another summer softball season.

The Federal Access Lands Program Helps Fund Road Projects in Boise County

BOISE COUNTY -- I have often heard conflicting stories about road repair and snow removal in the Garden Valley and Lowman area. To clear up misconceptions, I recently spoke with the Federal Highways Administration and the Idaho Department of Transportation. Here is what I found out.

Lowman Banks Road (Highway 17)

I recently wrote on the repaving of portions of Route 17 also known as the Banks/ Lowman road. The Banks Lowman Road connects the towns of Banks and Lowman through Garden Valley in Boise County. The paving occurred between mile post 29 and 34, leading into the town of Lowman. The paving process began in June 2020 and was finished the first week of July. The contractor who completed the work (CB Construction) explained that the repaying was part of an agreement between Federal Highways and Boise County. He also explained that, currently, Federal Highways is responsible for maintenance of the road. Federal Highways have been contracting Boise County for snow removal in the winter; however when all of the Boise County criteria, such as this repaying, is completed, responsibility for maintenance will be handed over to Boise County. This information is not entirely correct. First, I spoke with Doug Hecox who is in public affairs with the Federal Highways Administration. He

explained the paving is a part of a federal program referred to as FLAP. FLAP stands for Federal Lands Access Program. This program is to help rural areas that lead to federal lands, in this case the Boise National Forest. The FLAP program helps rural communities to maintain roads that are often traveled by people that are not a part of that community's tax base. This program helps pay for that extra wear and tear on the roads. The paving of the Lowman Banks road was funded through this program. The Federal Highway Administration was responsible for the repair, but ultimately Boise County has always had jurisdiction over the road (and will continue to do so). Boise County has always, and will continue, to snow plow this road as well.

Another FLAP funded project is the intersection of Highway 55 and the Banks Lowman Road. Highway 55 is a state road, not county. It runs from Marsing to New Meadows (Idaho), connecting with US-95 at both ends. In Boise County, this highway runs through Horseshoe Bend and intersects the Lowman Banks Road in Banks as the highway (55) meanders north towards Cascade.

Jake Medler, a Public Information Officer from the Idaho Transportation Department explained that ITD received \$750K in Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP) funding to conduct environmental clearance and achieve 30% design (concept design) for the intersection of ID-55 and the Banks Lowman Road. When that work is complete, ITD intends to compete for additional federal funding, likely from FLAP, to construct whatever improvement the study recommends. The environmental or concept design work has not yet been completed, therefore the ITD cannot say what that improvement will be yet.

Highway 21 (The Ponderosa Pine Scenic Byway)

This route is a state highway that runs from Boise to Stanley. Most of this highway is in Boise County, running through Idaho City and Lowman to the northern border of Stanley.

Since this is a state highway, snow plowing is the responsibility of the IDT. That includes snow removal between Idaho City and Stanley. The ITD also has an interagency agreement with Idaho State Parks and Recreation to remove snow at the park-and-ski pullouts along that section.

The Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP) website states that it "was established to improve transportation facilities that provide access to, are adjacent to, or are located within federal lands. The program supplements state and local resources for public roads, transit systems, and other transportation facilities, with an emphasis on high-use recreation sites and economic generators." The FLAP program has indeed helped improve access for Boise County with more projects

in the works!

Boise County, the Idaho Transportation Department and the Federal Highways Administration have all been hard at work ensuring that Boise County residents and forest visitors alike can travel safety within and through our beautiful county.

80+ Year-Old Dies with COVID-19



First Boise County resident dies from COVID-19

BOISE COUNTY – This week, Central District Health (CDH) has confirmed the death of a Boise County resident who passed away from COVID-19-related illness. The resident was a man in his 80s and is the first confirmed death of a Boise County resident related to the novel coronavirus. At the time of this release [Tuesday, July 28th], 32 cases have been identified in Boise County residents.

"We express our deepest sympathies to those impacted by the recent COVID-19 related death in Boise County. As we see more people in rural areas of our health district affected by COVID-19, it serves as a good reminder that wearing face coverings out in public and keeping ourselves physically distanced are the greatest tools we have to help protect our fellow Idahoans at this time. Anyone visiting our remote counties, for any reason, needs to follow this guidance to help protect people living in

those areas where access to immediate healthcare is limited," said Russ Duke, District Director for Central District Health.

CDH recommends that everyone:

• Follow statewide orders and any local orders in place

• Practice social distancing: avoid crowds, maintain at least 6 feet from others

• Wear face coverings in public environments, especially in places where it's hard to maintain at least 6 feet of distance between yourself and another person

• Stay home if you are sick, even if symptoms are mild

· Limit your trips in public; limit unnecessary travel

• Wash your hands frequently and disinfect high-touch surfaces

Create a plan for how to safely care for a household member if they become ill
