





Avoid Possible Chimney Fires for 2020

It's that time of year again to crank up the wood stove or fireplace and warm our homes and hearts. Unfortunately, it's also that time of year when folks experience chimney fires. Let's review the causes of chimney fires. When you have a fire in your fireplace or stove, unburned fuel, in the form of creosote, condenses on the chimney wall as it goes up the chimney. When a flame, spark, or hot ember reaches the deposits, it ignites, resulting in a chimney fire. The more efficiently your fire burns, like a gas insert or well-functioning pellet stove, the more of the fuel burns, so fewer deposits form in your chimney. Specific conditions that encourage build-up include: restricting the air supply, using unseasoned wood, and cooler than normal chimney temperatures.

• Restricting the air supply can do two things to encourage creosote build-up. First, the restricted air supply can cause less efficient burning of the wood, creating more smoke/ unburned fuel. Second, the restriction can slow the smoke in going up the chimney. The longer the smoke is in the chimney, the more deposit it can leave. One additional way to restrict air supply can be overloading the firebox with wood to get a longer burn. Many people fill the firebox and "stoke down" the fire to keep it burning all night. This creates inefficiency in burning the fuel, and thus more smoke.

Unseasoned wood holds a lot more water than seasoned wood. This water requires energy to evaporate before the fuel burns. This means less efficiency in burning the wood, more unburned fuel going up the chimney, and the evaporating water actually cools the smoke, thus encouraging depositing.
Cooler than normal chimney temperatures can be caused by nature, a cold snap, and by burning your fire at lower temperatures.

peratures by using unseasoned wood and/or restricting the air supply. Cooler smoke means a cooler chimney and the opportunity for more deposits.

Chimney fires can burn explosively, which is when the symptoms of a chimney fire become apparent, signalled flame or dense smoke shooting from the top of your chimney, and the infamous low rumbling sound like a freight train or low flying plane. A chimney fire can also burn slowly and not produce noticeable symptoms, so the fires can go unnoticed but still can reach very high temperatures that cause damage to the chimney and combustible materials in your home, even to the point of igniting your home's structure.

What should I do if I notice a chimney fire? The first and most important thing to do is call 911! We are served by volunteer firefighters. It takes a while for them to drive to the fire station and get rolling in a fire truck to your residence. We are all familiar with winter road conditions, so this may take quite some time for the firefighters to get to your home. The sooner you get them rolling, the better for you.

This year I am happy to report there are several fire suppressant products that are available to purchase. While I am not endorsing any product, I found all of these on-line. Orion Safety Products' Chimfex is a fire suppressant that you ignite like a flare and put in your stove orfire place. Meeco's Red Devil Fire Ex chimney fire suppressant and Kidde's FireEx are pouches of fire suppressant and Kidde's Auto Fire Off (AFO) is a fire extinguisher ball. With these three products there is no pre-ignition, you simply throw the package into the fire, which then ignites and suppresses the fire. The good thing about all of these products is that they suppress chimney fires from the ground, there is no climbing ladders or working on steep, snow-covered, icy roofs.

There also some products on the market that are designed to reduce creosote build-up during the winter as we use our stoves or fireplaces. All of these products are also available online. The Creosote Sweeping Log for Fireplaces, when used according to the manufacturer's instructions, reduces the weight, thickness, and flammability of creosote. Pine Mountain's First Alert Creosote Buster Chimney Cleaning Safety Fire Log contains a specially formulated powder that when heated converts to a super penetrating gas to attack and break down creosote compounds in your chimney to remove dangerous creosote. Meeco's Red Devil Creosote Destroyer also controls creosote buildup in fireplaces and wood-burning appliances. With regular use according to the manufacturer's recommendations, it acts as a catalyst and destroys the binder that holds the creosote particles together.

Other steps you can take to help prevent chimney fires include:

• Most importantly, clean and inspect your chimney at least once a year. Removing the deposited creosote reduces the fuel for a chimney fire. Inspecting the chimney for damage like cracks, holes, and sections that have come apart will help prevent fire spreading out of your chimney and into the structure of your home.

• Use the correct wood, one that burns hot and doesn't have a lot of water in the wood, seasoned vs. unseasoned.

• Do not over-restrict the air supply by dampening down the fire.

• Do not overload your fire box with fuel.

• Remove ash from your fireplace or stove on a regular basis.

• Be sure your fireplace or stove and chimney were installed correctly. Sometimes owners see instillation as a DYI project. When buying a home, always have the fireplace or stove installation inspected by a pro.

• The regular use of chemicals to break-down creosote that builds up in your chimney. These can come in the form of a "log" or loose material that you spread on your fire's embers.

Finally, one last suggestion. If you have a fireplace or wood stove, you should have a smoke detector <u>and</u> carbon monoxide detector. They are relatively inexpensive and they can save your life. Look for detectors with 10-year batteries so you don't have to worry about changing the batteries every time you go from daylight savings to standard time.

I have been wavering about responding to Melissa Potts' article in the October 14th edition of Idaho World. I wavered because, as a firefighter from Placerville, I work with Melissa and her staff regularly and I feel she is doing a very good job considering the massive problems she faces.

EBCAD reports to the Boise County Commissioners who are ultimately responsible for the way EBCAD is run. I feel that Melissa could receive a lot more support from the Commissioners than she is getting. As a case in point, Melissa stated in her article that "There are currently ambulances staged in Lowman, Idaho City, Placerville, and the Mores Creek area." That statement is misleading at best.

The ambulance in Placerville (Unit 13) has not been operational for at least five years to the best of my knowledge. I filed a Freedom of Information request last year and confirmed that, for the prior three years, the ambulance had not been staffed except for possibly one or two shifts.

Placerville Fire responds to most medical calls in our area. We provide first aid, assistance in transporting the patient, setting up a landing zone, or all three. Recently, I know of six people who have self-transported themselves to the hospital and didn't call 911. They didn't call 911 because they felt they couldn't wait the 30 minute to over an hour delay in getting an ambulance to our area. The closest ambulance is in Idaho City if it is in service. If not, the ambulance has to come from Mores Creek. The two ambulances rotate when they are in service but, usually, only one is in service at a time. Occasionally neither is in service and that leaves the Lowman ambulance which, like Unit 13 here in Placerville, has not been in service for months.

I don't blame Melissa for this situation. I blame the Commissioners. Melissa is trying to get additional staffing but she is not getting the support from the Commissioners that she needs. The Commissioners have been saying that they are trying to resolve the situation, but if what you are trying doesn't work, you might want to try something else.

Thanks for your efforts, Melissa. We will continue to support you as best we can.


Placerville


