BOISE COUNTY -- County rivals, the Idaho City Wildcats, took on the Horseshoe Bend Mustangs at home on Tuesday night. The Wildcats led most of the game with the Mustangs close behind. The teams were tied up at the end of the fourth quarter, sending the game into overtime. The Mustangs were first to score, but the Wildcats followed with two consecutive free throw shots, bringing the score to an even 38 to 38. The Mustangs capitalized on one more free throw shot.

Trailing by just one point, with two seconds remaining in overtime, the Wildcats shot a free throw, after being fouled. The crowd hushed as the ball circled the rim and nearly went in the basket. However, it didn't fall in the hoop and the Horseshoe Bend Mustangs took the win with a score of 40 to 39 in Idaho City.





Boise County Commissioners' Meeting Transcribed by Eileen Capson

11-24-2020

Present: Commissioners Alan Ward and Ryan Stirm (Chairman)


MINUTES: None

CLERK ELECTIONS GRANT/ SPENDING/ ETC: Clerk Mary Prisco presented Excel sheets and stated there were dollars for COVID-19 grant reimbursement from the Secretary of State's office in the amount of \$28,520. She then said the total from the Secretary of State's office was \$21,329 and the county match was \$2,600, for a total of almost \$24,000. The ability to receive reimbursement dollars from the state is almost \$50,000. "Our piece [county's portion] would be the total of about \$6,500. So, *it's a good deal*," said Clerk Prisco. Commissioner Ward agreed.

She continued: "With the General Election behind us, I feel *strongly* with the turnout that we had and the number of registered voters we now have, we're at a tipping point. We've always done paper ballots, paper count, but when your numbers start getting up there, you can no longer do it in an expedited way to count these

ballots. My goal is to work the county towards a more auditing way of doing things." Chairman Stirm asked, "With Express Votes?" She said that was part of it. Clerk Prisco reviewed some different types of expenditures, like tabulators. She would like to get a total of five more Express Voting machines with grant money, and a trailer to carry all the elections equipment. They will need an additional scanner, and secure boxes, so there is no theft.

TREASURER: There was a discussion regarding a parcel that belonged to the "United States of America." Commissioner Ward asked why the federal government wanted private land, 68 acres. Assessor Chris Juszczak spoke saying that it was adjacent to federal ground, Forest Service



made a motion to approve the tax cancelation for this parcel in the amount of \$520. Commissioner Ward stated in discussion: "I just don't approve of the federal government buying property. It's off the tax rolls forever; I don't know what they could possibly need it for. The county, to my knowledge, the commissioners weren't made aware of it." There are no structures, it's steep in timber, and at the end of a road. Clerk Prisco asked if this was where Alamar had planned to go in and the Assessor said it was really close. Commissioner Ward asked if the sale was already agreed to, and Treasurer Gina Turner said "yes." He said that it was a tough one, but agreed to the tax cancelation.

EMERGENCY MAN-**AGER:** Bob Showalter stated that he now has in his office a count of 6,000 masks. He said some of the schools may be in need of disposable masks, so this will be brought up in next week's commissioners' meeting, to help supplement their supply. Showalter said he was surprised by the number of masks the schools had and thought they would have had more. Commissioner Ward stated: "I think it's more important that if there was a mask epidemic, sudden expansion, that they would know where they could get some." Emergency Manager Showalter said no one was ready for the pandemic, and he suggested the county have several thousand masks in reserve. Clerk Mary Prisco said what they need is to order more face shields. Showalter said he did have some and to let him know the number they want. Prosecutor Adam Strong added, "The county was allocated, I believe it's \$193,000 of CARES funds that have to be used for care related expenditures. December 11th is our last day." Clerk Prisco said the county has spent about \$80,000. Assessor Juszczak spoke concerning the recycled air in his office building and air quality. Chairman Stirm asked the emergency manager to get some numbers together for the next meeting, so that they could get an order together.

BILLS: Commissioner Ward motioned to pay the claims report dated 11/19/20 in the amount of \$84,848, which passed.

DEMAND WARRANTS: Public defense, payee #4, in the amount of \$7,537.50 for comprehensive legal services.

EMERGENCY MANAG-ER: Showalter said that he is still working on the Emergency Operations Plan, "which *is huge.*" He's trying to work with all of the mayors of each of the cities.

SHERIFF: Scott Turner reported that nothing is slowing down.

PROSECUTOR: Adam Strong reported that they tried 1,200 cases last year and were going to more than double that - 2,500 by the end of the year.



Known to Garden Valley charity workers as "Brian-will do-it," it may be surprising to some that he had previously led a much different life. Before coming to Garden Valley, he obtained two degrees from the University of California, San Francisco, and went to work for a competitive company as a financial consultant.

However, as the stress began to mount and wear on him, he began drinking alcohol excessively. Brian didn't like the person he was becoming, and one day, he had an epiphany. He suddenly knew what he wanted; a totally different life. He wanted a life that was almost the exact opposite of the one he had worked for so many years to obtain. He no longer wanted to live an intellectual or materialist-based life. He wanted a life that was closer to nature, closer to God, and to work with his hands and body instead of solely with his intellect, focusing only on monetary rewards.

Having little idea of what he wanted to do, he somehow knew he wanted to live in Garden Valley, as soon as he saw it. He knew he wanted to serve others, and he bought a house with a wood-working shop already in place. Brian had never studied wood-working, but he soon proved himself to be a

craftsman. At one of his volunteer gigs, he built a fabulous check-out station and a log bench that is now the showpiece of the store where he works.

He said he wouldn't be where he is in his craft if it weren't for several mentors. "Without them, I would have taken much longer to learn. My life has meaning and purpose now. I want to serve God."

Brian reflected, "I think the majority of people do believe in some sort of higher power, who cares about mankind and who is pleased when He sees us doing good. I want to be one of those that please Him." He added, "When I wake up in the morning and I look in the mirror now, I see someone who works hard to help people and to do my work to the height of my ability. I help a lot of people, now, and I think it is pleasing to God."

Brian Tudes' new business, Garden Valley Rustics, is built on solid craftsmanship, with a traditional, classic feel. He

uses a lot of reclaimed wood, because he loves being able to give it another chance, just as Garden Valley has given him a second chance to define who he is.

A few of his pieces are on display at a local thrift store and at Melodee Low's gift shop across the street. Brian Hude works mostly by contract. If you have a design, or even an idea, it may be possible that Brian could build it for you.






