RESTRICTION ORDER

BOISE COUNTY -- The Central District Health Board was told by the Mayor of Boise and the Chief of Police to stop their meeting within the first 15 minutes on December 8th, due to an abundance of protesters outside the CDH building and at the homes of at least three board members. One Ada County Commissioner excused herself and said there were protesters banging at her door with her young son at home alone. She called the police and left the meeting holding back fearful tears and in a panic. The officiator thanked everyone and asked that they stay safe. The meeting abruptly adjourned due to the uncertainty of the large-scale protest and safety concerns.

There have been over 3,000 written comments received by CDH over the past several days, December 4th through December 7th.

Russ Duke, District Director for Central District Health

stated: "We appreciate the public's interest and investment in this process, but the safety of CDH staff, our Board members, and our law enforcement partners is of the utmost importance. Our community is being severely impacted by this virus and our team members and board are working tirelessly to protect our community's health. We simply ask that those who may disagree with these difficult discussion points and decisions do so in a way that is respectful and does not endanger our staff, board of health members, and our law enforcement, all who are critical in this response."

Boise County Commissioner Ryan Stirm sits on this Board of Central District Health as a representative of the county. Due to the increased rise of COVID-19 cases, more stringent restrictions are being considered for Ada, Boise, Elmore, and Valley Counties. A revised Restriction Order

was to be implemented on December 8th and voted on by the Board due to the "immediate danger to public health, safety and welfare of the people." The detailed 5-page order included items like prohibiting gatherings of 10 or more people in both private and public places, excluding school settings. It also detailed that every person would be required to wear a face covering that completely covers the person's nose and mouth when social distancing cannot be maintained. "All employers shall ensure that employees work from home whenever possible."

There was no mention of fines or imprisonment in the order presented. *The Idaho World* reached out to Boise County Sheriff Scott Turner and he had no comment at this time.

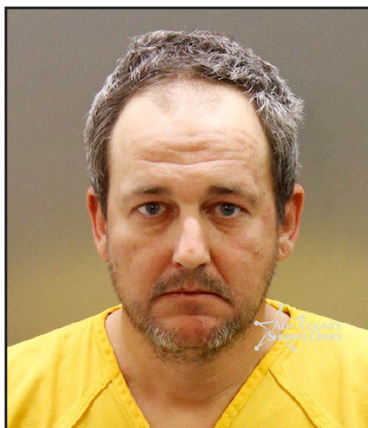

Seeking the Death Penalty

BOISE COUNTY -- A preliminary hearing was held on October 28th to determine if Benjamin Poirier, 45, could stand trial in the charge of Murder in the 1st Degree, to shooting of an 11-year-old child in Horseshoe Bend on March 15, 2020.

On November 24th, although two psychologists had a difference of opinion, the court, through state statute, determined him capable to stand trial. The case has since moved on to be heard in District Court. Poirier, previously from Florida, will appear before Judge Hoagland on February 19th at 10 am. Poirier has waived his right to a speedy trial and it is expected that this could stretch out into 2022. Evidence has been purposefully suppressed by the judge, in order to try this case in Boise County, in an attempt to not taint the jury pool.

Grant Money for Boise County

Idaho Community Foundation grants more than \$315,000 to southwest Idaho community organizations

The Idaho Community Foundation's Southwest Regional Council has awarded more than \$315,000 in grants to 71 community organizations from its Forever Idaho Southwest Fund.

Grantees are from, or have projects in, Ada, Adams, Boise, Canyon, Gem, Owyhee, Payette, Valley, and Washington counties.

In Boise County: Boise Basin Senior Citizens Inc. received \$3,000 to purchase new cookware, knives, and kitchen tools.

Garden Valley District Library received \$4,971 to establish an ongoing laser cutter program for a public maker-space.

Horseshoe Bend Community Pantry received \$4,532 to replace the entry stairs and purchase a commercial refrigerator.

There have been some changes to the Forever Idaho grant program this year.

The first is that grantees can use their funding for any charitable purpose, a type of grant-making known as community-driven philanthropy.

The second is that the regional council, which reviews grant applications and recommends which organizations should receive grants, is focusing grantmaking in ICF's Areas of Impact – family homelessness, mental and physical health, educational opportunities, and access to services. Grants in other areas will be considered.

Third, the regional council is trying to fully fund grant applications. Of the 71 grantees in this cycle, 65 received full funding. The regional council

is comprised of local volunteers who live in the counties receiving funding.

"We want our grantees to be successful and we know that fully funding grant requests and providing them the flexibility to use the grant for their greatest needs are two great ways to ensure that success," said Cara Nielsen, ICF's Vice President of Philanthropy and Impact.

Commissioner Responds to Possible New Mandates Proposed by Central District Health

BOISE COUNTY -- *The Idaho World* reached out to Commissioner Ryan Stirm for comment, but he did not respond prior to publication. On social media, however, he defended his position taken with Central District Health of possible new mandates, due to a rise in COVID-19 cases, stating: "Actually, I do not take the decision lightly, I only wish more people understood the consequences of making a no decision regarding this mandate. I feel I am upholding my end of the bargain by protecting EVERYONE'S life, liberty, and freedom, not just the life, liberty, and freedom of one specific group of people. It is more important to me that everyone has a fair chance at surviving this ordeal than just making a decision that lets a few people

be happy with their own ideas. Also, a lot of the thought processes are fear mongering. No one is taking anyone's rights away, the right to free speech, the right to assemble, and all of the other rights are still intact. You can still group up on social media and other media platforms, based off this very post you have the right to comment about whatever you want in any manner you want without fear of retaliation or other 'legal' issues, and none of the other inalienable rights granted to the American people by the Constitution are being infringed upon. The mask mandate only makes these things slightly more inconvenient. Also, I would love for any group of people to get together and come up with a better solution to the current problem

that makes everyone happy and keeps everyone safe. Sadly, you will not be able to because there is no such solution regardless of how you feel about it. I do not believe the answer to this pandemic is to simply sit back and see how it plays out. That is a reckless way of thinking and will only do more harm than good."

"Also, no one is being forced to close. I do not know where people are getting that information from; no business will be required to close its doors, only modify the way they do business, which based on what I have seen will not take much effort and in some cases has already been done, so it would be nice if people would stop spreading a rumor that businesses will be forced to close because that is simply not true."



Ryan Stirm was recommended by the BCRCC to the Governor for appointment as Commissioner in 2019 to finish Laura Baker's 4-year term, which will run through 2022. A recall is being discussed among the members of the Republican Central Committee.
