Crouch Looking at Ways to Greate Revenue as a Resort Town

CROUCH -- The sign coming into Crouch reads that Crouch was established in 1951. Initially, the founders wanted a place to sell alcohol and gamble. This was only allowed if an incorporated city was formed. Back in the day it was just a simple village. Today it is suffering growing pains with no additional revenues to improve aesthetics and create a safe and appealing environment.

Thought was given to finding ways to draw up some additional local revenues, so a committee was formed with some members of city council local residents and businessmen in Crouch to address how that can help the city with growth issues, and abundance of tourism. The Idaho Tax Commission has allowed for small tourist towns to create a local tax. This is referred to as a Local Option Tax,

designed to capture mainly tourist money. It will be decided by the community if this is a viable and purposeful way to achieve additional revenues.

Crouch is considering a few options to help defray the impact of tourist demands on the city and seek ways to make the area safer and do some beautification as well. The city would like to join 15 other Idaho resort towns that have opted for a "tourist tax." Resort towns can use this local tax to include sales tax to lodging, alcohol by the drink, and restaurant food or anything subject to a city sales tax.

Taxation is always a sore subject, but this type of local tax certainly targets the tourist dollars. Tourists can provide a boost to the economy but have a huge impact on infrastructure and the general wear and tear of the community. Crouch has never asked property owners

to pay extra taxes to the city for these things. However, that means that Crouch does not have enough revenues to do the "extras" people like and expect in the town they love. The Local Option Tax could give some relief because dollars accrued could go to improvements such as road maintenance, and services such as water and sewer, as well as safety and beautification

Owners of the Garden Valley Market say this: "The Garden Valley economy is growing from both local growth and an increase in visitor traffic. While the majority of the visitor traffic is positive and helping to grow our economy and provide more opportunities for local residents, there is also a strain put upon the infrastructure in Crouch. Basic concerns such as safety, road surfaces, litter, and good signage are difficult to address due to lack of

funding. The business owners, for years, have pitched in to help when and where they can but a funding option to have visitors help with the process is a positive idea that the Market supports. Creating a partnership between the businesses, local residents, and visitors with a very low-cost funding option is a good solution for a long-standing problem."


Steve and Teresa Fitz, Crouch Mercantile Owners, want a robust and thriving community, saying, "We believe the City of Crouch needs funding to provide not only essential services such as increased city water infrastructure, road maintenance, and safe pedestrian foot traffic areas, but also to provide for beautification of the town center. We support the tax options proposed as the best solution to incorporate a sharing of expenses for those that visit and spend time in Crouch."

The city council is proposing the following Local Option Tax rates: Lodging Tax of 3% would include hotels/motels, rooms in homes or home rental, VRBO, AirBnB, RV Pads, and camp sites. For a \$50/night

room this would add a \$1.50 tax charge. Alcoholic Drinks and Meals Tax of 2%: this would be on individual drinks sold at bars and restaurants. For a \$5.00 drink this would add \$0.10 and for a \$12.00 meal this would add \$0.24.

The Local Option Tax funds would be used for improvements such as road paving and expansion, parking, bike/walking paths and city building improvements; snow removal, public safety and sanitation, city water system completion, expansion, and maintenance. There is a need to support the arts and cultural activities and facilities, land acquisition for additional city parks and recreation in partnership with the Parks & Recreation District.

The community will be given the opportunity to have a voice, ask questions, and see what a Local Option Tax can do for the area. First, there will be a Public Meeting on June 22 at 6:00pm in the Crouch Community Hall. This is the time to be informed and weigh in on the proposal. Then it will come to a vote by the City of Crouch residents in November.
















COUNTY COMMIS

Commissioner **Present:** Ryan Stirm, Steve Twilegar, and Ted Holmes

Pledge of Allegiance

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session per pending litigation and risk management. [Time 9:01 am to 9:21 am] No

action required. **EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Per personnel issue(s). [Time 9:22 am to 9:37 am] No action required.

CONSTITUENT INPUT: None

MINUTES: The official meeting minutes were motioned and approved.

ROAD NAME CHANGE **REQUESTS:** There were two that the planning and zoning administrator presented. The name "Horseshoe Heaven Way" will be approved contingent on the Idaho Transportation Department report. On the second application, all of the landowners consented to the name change, so no public hearing was needed. "Patriot Point" was requested and approved by motion of the commissioners.

REPAIRS TO COUNTY **BUILDINGS:** Commissioner Stirm said he had talked with one of the contractors and the bid had gone up 30%, in the past 30 days, due to the rising cost of building supplies. Stirm suggested they hold off on doing any repairs or maintenance, unless they are absolutely needed. "Unless it's going to

be detrimental to your operations, we're just going to hold off on anything that has to do with material. It's just ridiculous."

ASSESSOR: Assessor Chris Juszczak spoke regarding the "Board of Equalization," which the Boise County Commissioners act as to determine if the property in question was unfairly taxed. He suggested having three similar surrounding properties to compare with, when individuals petition to have their property tax reevaluated. Those petitions can come into the assessor's office anytime before June 28th at 5pm. Hearings will take place after July 6th. Chairman Stirm made a motion to approve the Board of Equalization notice.

LITTERING: Prosecutor Adam Strong informed the commissioners that there was a littering state statute, which they could use. He said it was punishable by a \$150 fine. Commissioner Twilegar quickly said, "That's not going to work." There was talk regarding a county statute or ordinance. He continued, "I'm going to say it again, \$150 dollars is not even close. Double that is not close. How do we get around this? I want to see a fine. I want people to suffer. If you're going to throw your crap out the window, or leave your diapers around, you're going to pay for it." Someone who was in the room said she had picked up litter and beer bottles

along Robie Creek for four hours, filling four large trash bags. Fifteen hours of community service for a misdemeanor charge was discussed. Prosecutor Strong also suggested that they could offer residents an incentive of \$50 for turning in those that litter, with the prosecution of the misdemeanor. Commissioner Twilegar would like to send a message and to post signs that say they could be prosecuted up to a \$1,000 fine. The solid waste ordinance will be reviewed by the prosecutor.

ROBIE CREEK PAVING **PROJECT:** The project was discussed briefly, and the prosecutor said it was a standard agreement. Commissioner Stirm motioned to approve the agreement between Knife River and Boise County Road & Bridge for the paving of Robie Creek Road in the amount of \$172,000.

WEED **DEPARTMENT:** Commissioner Stirm made a motion to approve the modification of grant for an agreement between Boise County Noxious Weed and the U.S. Forest Service in the amount of \$10,534.74.

A big ad in the Idaho World was discussed for all the open positions in county government

RESOLUTION **FOR** ROAD AND BRIDGE: There was an additional match for the Banks Lowman Road, and the budget was increased for Boise County Road and Bridge through a resolution to cover the cost increase.

CLAIMS APPROVAL RE-PORT: The claims approval report was motioned for approval, dated June 3rd, in the amount of \$129,382. Commissioner Holmes had some questions regarding some of the line items in red. Clerk Mary Prisco explained that some of those costs would be covered by Avimor housing development for all their legal fees. The motion passed unanimously.

DEMAND WARRANT: Per the capital crimes case, "Payee #1" in the amount of \$2,868.75, for confidential legal services.

FUTURE AGENDA: Clerk Prisco warned that July was going to be a busy month for the Board. The Board of Equalization will be held July 6th through 9th. She proposed a

special meeting on July 12th, "Where all the departments are here, at the same time, to talk about the budgets." She will have prepared a draft balanced budget. Prisco would like to continue budget discussions the afternoon of July 13th.

EBCAD: The Jack Pine Rodeo agreement will have two ambulances in Idaho City, to be held later in the summer.

An ATV event was occurring last weekend, and called East Boise County Ambulance Director Melissa Potts, but there was no time to bring it before the board to approve the contract. They hired a private ambulance company to cover the event in Idaho City.

Adjourned at 11:54 pm.


