### BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS Transcribed by Eileen Capson

#### November 16, 2021

**Present:** Commissioners Steve Twilegar and Robert "Ted" Holmes

Absent: Commissioner Ryan Stirm

Pledge of Allegiance EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for pending liti-

gation. [Time 9:07 am to 9:33 am] No action required. MINUTES: A motion was

made by acting Chairman Twilegar to approve the minutes from November 9<sup>th</sup>.

**S N O W M O B I L E GROOMER OPERATOR:** Twilegar motioned to approve a payroll addition for a groomer operator.

**PLANNING AND ZON-ING:** Administrator Alex Gross said he's been working with Avimor and a gentleman that bought property from them at the top of the hill by Highway 55. The survey is getting done and he is applying for a road name; MAGA Ranch Road. There will be not be a need for a public hearing.

**POLAR BEAR CHAL-LENGE:** An annual mass gathering to benefit ALS [Lou Gehrig's disease] was approved through a motion.

**PROSECUTOR ISSUES:** The commissioners had a document that was provided by the prosecutor to cover long-term concerns, including: Bogus Basin taxing status and emergency services, a county-wide Ambulance District, trying to get Highway 17 to the state, evaluating salaries – a step and grade system, grant issues for rural counties, ongoing software updates and computer associates. Fixing the Boise Street Bridge was taken off of the list because Twilegar said that nobody wanted it.

Administrator Gross men-

tioned updates to the comprehensive plan, Unified Land Ordinance, and fee schedule.

Work on the Gardena Bridge is a long-term goal too.

Fuel tanks for county vehicles were discussed, along with a use card system.

Road Supervisor Curtis Dill would like to revisit Arrowrock Road and visit with the Atlanta Highway, because he has concerns that they are losing a lot of road. It's washing out with erosion and needs a lot of work. Dill said, "I graded up to the thirteen a week and a half ago and you couldn't even tell after these last rains."

Clerk Mary Prisco spoke regarding the Boise County policies, "I'm planning on taking out all of the history that's under the Boise County policies and adding a procurement or purchasing policy, and then the personnel policy *which is ex-* *tremely outdated* at this point." She also addressed Computer Arts and had done some research on an alternative company. There are currently a lot of issues with software and customer support with Computer Arts.

**BILLS:** Acting Chairman Twilegar motioned to pay "Payee #9" in the amount of \$4,247 for confidential legal services. He then motioned to pay "Payee #3" in the amount of \$2,362 and "Payee #1" in the amount of \$4,775 for confidential legal services. Prosecutor Adam Strong confirmed that these were all for a murder case.

**EXECUTIVE** SESSION: Closed session for a personnel issue. No action was required.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Closed session for exempt records. Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve an emerging case.

EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE: Commissioner Twilegar made a motion to approve six new tires for Ambulance Unit 15 for the amount of \$2,850.92. EBCAD Director Melissa Potts discussed options for a new ambulance with the board.

They are looking at doing another EMT class in March and will advertise it. Twilegar said he had a lot of response from it and, "People are asking me *constantly* about it."

REDISTRICTING THE **COUNTY:** Prosecutor Strong suggested that to better distribute the number of people for a district, Duquette Pines may go to the Garden Valley District/ Lowman District. "I don't know how the population is going to work out," Strong said. "But it's either going to be Wilderness, Robie, or Clear Creek, or some combination of those three adding up and going to Horseshoe Bend District." He suggested going through all the data. Moving Wilderness Ranch to Horseshoe Bend would add close to 600 votes.

Prosecutor Strong says he hopes to have the final rezoning of the districts approved by mid-December.

**NO COMMISSIONERS MEETING:** There will be no commissioners' meeting for the week of Thanksgiving. They will meet again on November 30, 2021.

# Horseshoe Bend's City Council Meeting

#### **By Tracy Koslosky** HORSESHOE BEND --

The following is a synopsis of the Horseshoe Bend City Council meeting on November 17, 2021. In council chambers that were standing room only, including a Boise County Sheriff's Deputy to help maintain some semblance of decorum, Mayor Pat Goff made the call to order at 7:00 p.m., led the Pledge of Allegiance, and after unanimous approval of the agenda, minutes from the previous meeting, and the authorization to pay the city's bills, Goff opened the dais for public comments.

Horseshoe Bend resident Kelly Jakovac took the podium and requested that future minutes of meetings accurately depict meetings. She also expressed her displeasure that the council seemingly ignored a woman at the previous meeting and asked that Zoom meetings be held. Jakovac also mentioned meeting violations with regards to executive sessions.

A woman came up to speak to the council about city codes regarding recreational vehicles parked on private property and wanted to know why a city council member was signing violations. She said she didn't have a clear understanding of the rules and was looking for clarifications. Goff replied, "Okay."

Mary Grover approached the council and told them that the councilmembers were very difficult to hear during meetings.

She requested that they get microphones and an audio system to eliminate the problem. She asked that the accommodations be made immediately. Goff replied, "Thank you."

Public Hearing: CBF Enterprises was on the agenda for a variance application but the applicant was not in attendance. The matter was continued to a future date.

New Business: Resident Vickie Andra came to the council with a fair housing request. Andra asked for reasonable accommodations to maintain her emotional support horse on her property. She told the council she was on .423 acres of land, just shy of the required .50 acres to board a horse. Andra told the council that a previous citation regarding the horse had been dismissed in court. She claims to have put in the request for reasonable accommodations 69 days prior, but had not received any notice from the city.

City attorney Tony Pantera reviewed the application and told the council that it was unique and recommended approval since Andra's property is very close to .50 acres.

Councilmember Martye White asked if there was any paperwork that substantiated that the property was in fact .423 acres in size. Pantera responded, "We have Ms. Andra's representation." White asked, "Has anyone talked to the adjacent land owners?" Andra told the council she had

turned in that information to the city.

City Grant writer Cheryl Pleak spoke from the audience, saying that she had heard a neighbor asked for the horse to be removed, to which Andra responded, "You're not in this discussion as far as I'm concerned."

Councilmember Curtis Corvinus made a motion to approve the reasonable accommodation regarding the horse pending a plat map verification of the property's size and a petition from surrounding property owners. He also added that the property must be maintained for cleanliness. Councilmembers Ben Riley, Stephen Chartier, and Corivinus voted for the motion, councilmember White voted nay.

Resident Dave Jakovac approached the council with an 

appeal form he created. He wanted the council to adopt the form for use by citizens to appeal decisions by the council. Goff told him, "Thank you."

Old Business: Goff asked the council to consider moving their meetings to the second Wednesday of the month so as not to conflict with Horseshoe Bend School District Board meetings. White was concerned about the date change affecting the city's bill paying. He wants to wait on deciding the matter until after the new change in meeting days. Corvinus said he was flexible either way. Chartier indicated he was okay with the change as well. Pantera said the date adjustment would require a new city ordinance which he would prepare for approval at the next meeting.

Department **Updates:** EMS- Goff reported that ten people were currently training with a company in Eagle and that they will test in January.

currently a tremendous need within the city for affordable housing, as 43% of the residents in Horseshoe Bend live beneath the federal poverty level. She spoke about developing a community land trust. According to Wikipedia, "A community land trust is a nonprofit corporation that holds land on behalf of a place-based community, while serving as the long-term steward for affordable housing, community gardens, civic buildings, commercial spaces, and other community assets on behalf of a community."

She then began speaking about the proposed veteran's memorial park but Goff interrupted her, telling her that the park needed to be put on hold until a community meeting was held.

Pleak told the council about a grant that may be available for the purchase of lights for the new bridge. The grant would not be funded until June.

She suggested that she wanted to start a community newsletter that she would produce monthly. The council didn't respond.

City Engineer: Working to

In the meantime, the city will have a paramedic from the company to service Horseshoe Bend calls.

Public Works- The department is working on cleaning up leaves. Public bathrooms in the park are closed for the winter. A mid-December delivery date is expected for the ozone generator.

Grants- Pleak asked for four minutes to speak, to which Goff responded, "Alright." Pleak passed out the city's comprehensive plan to the council along with the capital improvement plan. She requested that they read pages two and three of the comp plan to better understand what it allows. She told the council that there was

support the public works department and working on updates in the water and sewer plants.

City Attorney: Pantera said he will work on an ordinance to change the city council meeting date and ordinances to annex and rezone the proposed Deer Valley subdivision and have all three ready for city council review at next month's meeting. Goff adjourned the meeting at 7:40 p.m. telling those in attendance, "We have a lot of great people, a lot of great families in the community." Before closing he added, "Have a blessed, blessed, Thanksgiving." The council will meet next on Wednesday, December 15th at 7:00 p.m.

A logging operation is taking place along Granite Creek Road from Placerville, and will continue on through Alder Creek Road in the coming weeks. The purpose of this operation is to clear trees hindering the future path for Idaho Power to run another line to improve reliability to Placerville, Idaho City, and other areas throughout east Boise County. This new line would create power redundancy. The logging operation will likely continue through the middle of December 2021.

Boise County's Road Superintendent Curtis Dill said that motorists should expect long delays, lasting up to one hour, to allow trees to be taken down and cleared from the roadway. Flaggers will be controlling traffic and operations will take place from Monday through Friday. Signage will be placed in strategic areas and motorists are advised to consider alternate routes of travel during this time.

In addition, motorists should expect to see increased logging traffic along Harris Creek Road. Renfro Logging in Horseshoe Bend anticipates that there will be four to five truck loads a day.
