


PAYETTE FORWARD WILL CLOSE ON THE FOLLOWING DAYS

BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Transcribed by Eileen Capson

November 18, 2021 Special Meeting

Present: Commissioner Steve Twilegar and Commissioner Ryan Stirm via phone.

GRANT: Commissioner Twilegar conducted the meeting and said there was a grant for "e-ticketing" which is a computer system for the Sheriff's office. This allows them to scan driver's licenses and it automatically populates, making everything quicker. E-ticketing will be installed in all the patrol cars. Sheriff Scott Turner said there was a 25% match, but that could be in mileage and/ or deputy hours for traffic enforcement. "That wouldn't be too hard to pull off then." Commissioner Stirm said via phone conference. Twilegar made a motion to accept this Highway Safety E-ticket grant for the vear 2022 and up to the amount of \$92,000 with the match of 25%.

HEATER: Commissioner Twilegar made a motion to remove and replace a heater in the amount of \$3,189.

SNOW GROOMER: Twilegar motioned to reimburse an individual for purchase of groomer tools in the amount of \$50.55.

INTERNET: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to pay a company for the internet service in Horseshoe Bend in the amount of \$184.89.

PROSECUTOR'S OF-FICE: Twilegar motioned to pay \$550 for December 2021 for the lease of the prosecutor's

building.

late electronically filing our employer federal taxes." Commissioner Twilegar said in disbelief, "You're kiddin'!" The payroll clerk contacted the IRS and they directed her to write a letter, which they did and both signed it. It was to ask forgiveness for the \$561 penalty. She said they denied that request. "So we are left with no other option than to pay this," Clerk Prisco stated. It is due by December 5th and they would like to get it paid soon before they add more penalties. Commissioner Twilegar made a motion "with prejudice to pay the Internal Revenue Service of the United States of America to pay this \$561.71 late fee for 44 seconds." Clerk Prisco responded, "Thank you, with prejudice."

Adjourned until November 30^{th} .

CONSTITUENT INPUT: None

MINUTES: Chairman Stirm motioned to approve the Boise County Board of Commissioners' meeting minutes for November 16, 2021. He then motioned to approve the official special meeting minutes from November 18, 2021.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE K-9 RETIREMENT: The official retirement of Emery will be spent living with her handler, Deputy Wes Crawford. Commissioner Stirm said, "He's going to take Emery so that she can live the rest of her life with her brother." There are two other dogs in the home. Stirm made a motion to approve a resolution declaring a retirement of police K-9 Emery and "offing the donation of Police K-9 Emery to her handler, Boise County Sheriff's Office Deputy Wes Crawford." The effective date is December 31, 2021

SNOWGROOMER: An individual spoke concerning parking lot clearing, a piece of equipment, and funding. They are hoping to clear the parking lots better through the grooming program. Chairman Stirm would like to see what a rental agreement would look like for the equipment to furth discuss this topic.

TAX CANCELATIONS: Commissioner Stirm motioned to accept two tax cancelations for Boise County.

COMMUNITY JUSTICE: Ms. Leader presented an annual financial report for Community Justice. Chairman Stirm motioned to accept the report and it was signed.

BILLS: Chairman Stirm motioned to pay the claims report in the amount of \$157,814. Commissioner Holmes seconded the motion.

GEM PLAN BOARD OF TRUSTEES NOMINEE: The nominee was said to be an active member and a longtime member who is running unopposed. Commissioner Stirm motioned to approve their nomination for District Three Gem Plan.

C A T A S T R O P H I C HEALTH CARE COVER-AGE: Commissioner Stirm explained that they do all of their indigent funding. Commissioner Stirm motioned to vote for a Gem County Commissioner to be a catastrophic health care board member for District Three.

BROADBAND GRANT: Commissioner Holmes said they have until December 31st to finish hooking up residents in the Lowman area. Chairman Stirm would like to postpone this until they can confirm that it's operational.

PLANNING & ZONING: Commissioner Stirm motioned to pay an individual a refund of their building permit.

JUVENILE JUSTICE: Ms. Amanda Leader said that their case load is getting larger because the cases from the summer are now getting resolved.

ROAD DEPT: Mr. Curtis Dill said they had their first snowfall, so that was good training for the new guys. "All trucks are up and going right now," Dill said. The new graders are expected to be in sometime in January. The department is working to get more road material back on the dirt roads. They did some work on Robie Creek.

PLANNING & ZONING: Mr. Alex Gross said they have Avimor next Tuesday, a preliminary plat for their first phase for approval. He said they received two separate appeals, which was approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission, for the cell tower for the Robie Creek area. This will come before the Board of County Commissioners. Gross said they were pretty much caught up on building permits.

COUNTY ASSESSOR: "I thought this year was bad," Assessor Chris Juszczak said. "If you look at sales around the whole county," and he agreed with Commissioner Stirm that

it was not isolated. "You know taxpayers complain about their tax bills, make sure to reminded them, if you took the federal bailout money last year, which there is no federal money this year."

SHERIFF: Sheriff Scott Turner said they're busy as usual. They are still having a difficult time hiring dispatchers. "Just chugging away, trying to keep up. It hasn't slowed down at all for some time," Sheriff Turner said.

SOLID WASTE: Mr. Paul Rekow said they are also busy and it hasn't slowed down. "We're still doing close to a 100 tons a week right now." Commissioner Stirm said he expects that the solid waste department was going to stay busy.

TREASURER: Ms. Gina Turner said, "People are a little upset that the tax bills went up and none of them remember the discount that they got last year." There was also a lot of return mail where people didn't send in a change of address.

PROSECUTOR: Mr. Adam Strong said they were busy as well with all the criminal and civil cases. They are still trying to hire a deputy prosecutor, but haven't had any applicants.

CLERK: Ms. Mary Prisco said that this time of year they have a lot of annual reports to do for the state. "We're still not closed. We have not financially closed fiscal year 2021. We are struggling with that, in part because of Computer Arts [the county's software company]."

She said Nov. 29th was the last day for the recall petition for the Basin School District Trustee Zone 3 effort and they received nothing.







Accident Near Lowman

BOISE COUNTY -- A search warrant to review the phone records of Michael Lopez, 71, who had gone missing out of Missoula, Montana was used to identify his last known location. His phone pinged off of the AT&T tower in Lowman between 9 pm and 2 am on November 10th. Sheriff Scott Turner said that it was like finding a needle in a haystack, but he and other deputies scoured the area, looking for any signs of a vehicle having gone over and physically looked over all the embankments.

That five hour window of time was an indicator to Sheriff Turner that the man must have had an accident in this general vicinity.

Great Basin Imagery came up to get a visual with the use of a drone on Thanksgiving day, but was unable to locate the vehicle. The following day, a private helicopter offered to help search the newly laden seven inches of snow to find anything that might resemble a green Dodge Ram truck. The pilot indicated an area where the truck may have been sight-

ed and with the help of Search and Rescue, they were able to positively identify the truck with its sole occupant. Unfortunately, the man was not wearing a seatbelt and was ejected, found deceased at the scene on Friday, November 26th. The vehicle had fallen down the embankment, which was approximately 400 feet from Highway 21, and was located about four miles south of Lowman.

Next of kin has been notified and the incident remains under the investigation of the Idaho State Police.


