





Monte See Memorial Heifer Legacy Project Continues

BOISE COUNTY -- Monte See (1940-2019) lived in Gem County and was an avid supporter of local youth and the cattle industry. He was a hardworking and creative man, often giving selflessly to support others and causes that were important to him.

In 2020, a committee formed to honor Monte See's passion for youth and cattle and created the Monte See Memorial Heifer Legacy Project. The goals of the project are to inspire future cattle producers and create mentoring relationships between current industry professionals and the next generation. Youth are asked to select a heifer calf and provide care for her as she grows to breeding stage and through having her first calf (a two-year commitment). The youth are also asked to show her as a heifer (year 1) and as a cow-calf pair (year 2) exhibit at the Gem-Boise County Fair. Youth can be either a 4-H or FFA member to participate in the project.

For the 2021–2022 project year, youth were asked to write an essay and participate in an interview for the opportunity to receive a scholarship of up to \$1000 toward the purchase of a heifer calf. Funds for the scholarship were provided by Erin See Bolen (Monte See's daughter), Cowboys Chophouse, and Dan Hinman. The buckle was provided by Karol Burlile and a variety of show and feeding supplies were provided by BAG Farms (Beth and Grant





15-Year High for Traffic Fatalities in Idaho



ISP joins a statewide effort to increase DUI Patrols as traffic deaths on Idaho roadways are at a 15-year high

BOISE COUNTY -- Troopers with the Idaho State Police are joining law enforcement agencies throughout the state this holiday with increased patrols to remove DUI drivers from Idaho roadways. The effort comes at a time when many celebrations often include alcohol, and traffic fatalities across Idaho are at a 15-year high according to the Idaho Transportation Department Office of Highway Safety.

"Putting others at risk with dangerous driving behavior is simply not acceptable. ISP Troopers join our partner agencies and our communities in having zero tolerance for impaired driving," said Sgt. Justin Scotch of the Idaho State Police District 1 DUI Team based in Coeur d'Alene.

"When holiday celebrations include alcohol, we need folks to think and plan ahead for a safe, sober ride home. A trip with a rideshare, taxi, or designated driver is a lot better than a trip to jail." Said Sgt. Scotch.

Idaho State Police DUI efforts will increase statewide beginning Friday, December 17, and through New Year's Eve weekend.

DUI education and enforcement is intended to keep families safe and sound every day, including through this holiday season.

- Traffic fatalities in Idaho are at a 15-year high. So far this year, ITD OHS reports at least 254 people have been killed in traffic crashes. That compares to 195 traffic fatalities through this date last year, and the most fatalities in a single year since 2006.
- Between 2016 and 2020, 36% of all fatal crashes in Idaho were related to impaired driving, according to the ITD OHS.
- Between January 1, and December 15, 2021, Troopers with the Idaho State Police have located and charged 1,453 drivers with impaired driving-related criminal offenses.

ISP Troopers appreciate the support of partner agencies and are exceptionally grateful for community support, including volunteers from Mothers Against Drunk Driving.

"We are aware that behind every fatal crash is a family who will forever feel broken by the loss of a loved one. As crash investigators, we talk with those families and many volunteers with MADD are families who continue to feel those losses," said Sgt. Curt Sproat of the Idaho State Police District 3 DUI Team based in Meridian.

"Together as a community, we need to make safe, sober driving the standard in this great state."

about the importance of driving sober and, as a passenger, never get into a vehicle with a driver who may be under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

- Plan your safe ride home before alcohol clouds your judg-
- Choose a non-drinking friend as a designated driver;
- Arrange for a ride share service or taxi.
- If you're hosting a party where alcohol will be served, also include non-alcoholic beverage options.
- If someone you know is about to drink and drive, take the keys away and help with arrangements to get them a safe ride.
- Always wear your seat belt - it's your best defense against impaired drivers.
 - If you see what could be an

impaired driver on the road, call *477(*ISP) or call 911. Your actions could save a life.

ITD Reminds Motorists of Snow Plow Safety

ITD issues reminder on plow safety following six incidents in two weeks

BOISE—With snow in the forecast for several regions in the state, the Idaho Transportation Department would like to remind drivers how to travel with plows on the road.

In just the last two weeks, there have been four incidents of drivers striking plows and two incidents of drivers forcing them off the road. This compares to eight plow strikes recorded last year. Most of the collisions have occurred after other drivers tried passing plows on the right.

Drivers should be aware that most ITD trucks have two plows: one on the front, and one that extends from the right side known as a wing plow. Lights alert drivers to the presence of wing plows, but during storms those lights and the

wing plows can be obscured by plumes of snow.

So far this winter, plows have been struck in nearly every region of the state:

On Dec. 9, a plow was hit on Interstate 90 near the Rose Lake exit when a driver tried to pass on the right.

On Dec. 14, a plow on U.S. Highway 95 near Moscow was forced off the road to avoid hitting a vehicle that had lost control and was in the opposing lane.

On Dec. 16, a plow was hit on U.S. Highway 20 near Ashton and on Interstate 84 near Twin Falls. Both incidents involved drivers trying to pass on the right. That same night, a plow on US-95 near Winchester was forced off the road to avoid hitting a vehicle that had lost control and was in the opposing lane.

The latest plow strike occurred this morning on I-90

near Osburn. Another vehicle attempted to pass the plow on the right, collided with the wing, and forced the plow off the road. The driver then fled the scene. The Idaho State Po-

To date no one has been injured. However, plows must be checked for any damage before being put back into service, which stretches resources thin with a direct impact to driving conditions.

"This time of year drivers need to take their time and never pass a plow on the right," said Jerry Wilson, the operations engineer for North Idaho. "Let's all get home safely."
