Horseshoe Bend Christmas Festival

HORSESHOE BEND -- The Horseshoe Bend Tour of Trees and Christmas Festival was a record-breaking success. The festival took in approximately \$2,300, which will be donated to the Horseshoe Bend Food Pantry.

Horseshoe Hardware, Locking Horns Riverside Restaurant, Lust For Rust, Mustang Towing, The Parts Store, Ray's Corner Market, The She Shoppe, the U.S. Post Office-Horseshoe Bend, White Horse Grocery & Mercantile, Valley View Chevron, and Ziggy's all displayed Christmas trees at their place of business that they decorated to be auctioned off for the event. The Parts Store was the high bid winner, taking in \$150 from Marty Broom. Several trees were on display at the Horseshoe Bend Senior Center. Among the display were entries from the Horseshoe Bend Food

Pantry, Horseshoe Nursery, Barreto Manufacturing, Valley Christian Center, Kathy Broom, and Amy Heffner. The Food Pantry, Barreto Manufacturing, and Valley Christian Center each received high bids of \$250 for their trees.

Community members gathered at the Horseshoe Bend Senior Center/Valley Christian Center on Saturday, December 4 from 2pm to 4pm to partake in chili dogs, hot cocoa, and cookies.

A silent auction with donations from the community as well as local businesses Sonora Mexican Restaurant, Ziggy's, and the Long Branch Saloon was also held.

Santa flew in from the North Pole to visit with the children and hand out gift cards and candy canes. The Horseshoe Bend Christmas Festival was sponsored by Idaho Power and Valley Christian Center.

November 30, 2021 - continued

Present: Commissioners Ryan Stirm, Steve Twilegar (left at some point) and Ted Holmes

EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE: A discussion regarding the new ambulance, grant, and solid numbers will be brought to the Board next week.

COMMISSIONER REDISTRICTING: Prosecutor Adam Strong said, "The end result, essentially the changes are that Wilderness Ranch goes to District 3 [Horseshoe Bend district] and Duquette Pines goes to District 2 [Garden Valley/ Lowman district]." Assessor Chris Juszczak brought out maps and spoke regarding the number of individuals according to census records. Strong continued, "This was the easiest way to get the numbers within the range they needed to be. District 1 is still the biggest district, even with all of these subtractions from it. "Horseshoe Bend is the smallest with 2,490. Then 2,523 for District 2," Strong said before Commissioner Holmes interrupted with a question regarding when they could approve this redistricting. Prosecutor Strong said they could approve the redistricting in January.

Special Meeting**

Present: Commissioner Steve Twilegar and Ryan Stirm on the phone

COMPUTER EQUIPMENT: Commissioner Twilegar asked if this was a "do or die kind of thing." The I.T. person, Robert, said that if the commissioners do not get the equipment now, they could be waiting for a long while. A motion was made for twenty laptops at \$235 a piece for a total of \$4700. Barcode readers, printers, and a bunch of accessories were also approved through a motion in the amount of \$22,034.60. A motion was said to purchase twenty antenna and routers at the total of \$7,882.28. From Dell Technologies, "a pile of computers and everything in between," Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve a total of \$42,000.

Regular Meeting of the Boise County Commissioners**

Present: Commissioners Ryan Stirm, Steve Twilegar and Robert "Ted" Holmes

Pledge of Allegiance
EXECUTIVE SESSION: None

CONSTITUENT INPUT: None

MINUTES: Chairman Stirm motioned to approve the November 30th Boise County Commissioners' meeting minutes as written. He then motioned to approve the December 1st meeting minutes as written. The motions carried.

IDAHO CITY SNOW GROOMERS: There were three new part-time as needed payroll additions for the Idaho City Snow Groomers.

PLANNING & ZONING: A subdivision plat approval and signature was needed. Commissioner Stirm motioned to sign the minor subdivision plat for the Hess subdivision.

TAX CANCELATIONS: Chairman Stirm motioned to approve the three tax cancellations in the amounts of \$109.29, \$53.20, and \$264.

ROAD DEPARTMENT: Mr. Curtis Dill requested to purchase two trucks from the Bureau of Land Management. Chairman Stirm motioned to approve the quote for the 2012 Dodge Ram 2500 for \$18,500 and the 2015 Dodge Ram 2500 for \$25,500.

OPIOID SETTLEMENT DISCUSSION: Prosecutor Adam Strong said this has been going on for a long time. It's a class action lawsuit settlement of those claims against manufacturers and distributors, "with Johnson & Johnson as

the primary manufacturer and with a bunch of distributors." Prosecutor Strong explained, "the more counties that sign on, the more money they're willing to put in the pot." There is an 18-year payment schedule and Boise County would likely receive about \$108,000. The money can only be used for certain things, "which is primarily treating opioid addiction." Or it could be given to Central District Health. The Board has until January 2nd to decide, but Strong would like to encourage the commissioners to decide sooner rather than later. "It probably makes sense for Boise County to sign off on this," the prosecutor said.

Commissioner Twilegar agreed and said they should keep the money local, like for EMT training or other training. Commissioner Stirm agreed and made a motion to sign on with the Idaho Opioid Settlement for local governments. He added that the money would stay here in Boise County, "so we can use it for our services and our citizens."

Chairman Stirm motioned to approve Resolution 2022-04.

ROAD & BRIDGE AGREEMENT: A lease for 125 Mill Road in Horseshoe Bend was said to be where the county stores their road chips. Mr. Dill said the chips would be utilized next year on the Banks Lowman Road. Commissioner Stirm motioned to approve the ground lease agreement for the storage of chip sealing materials. The motion carried.

IDAHO CITY SNOWGROOMER EQUIPMENT AGREEMENT: A partnership was discussed briefly and will be discussed further next week.

DEMAND WARRANTS:

Chairman Stirm motioned to pay the postage reserve account in the amount of \$1500 for additional postage for the auditor's postal account. He then motioned to pay Air St. Luke's in the amount of \$3555 for the annual 2022 membership. Stirm motioned to pay "Payee #3" [from a death penalty case] in the amount of \$457.50 for confidential legal services. He motioned to pay the reserve account of the Planning and Zoning department for postage in the amount of \$1000. He then motioned to pay the State of Idaho Federal Surplus Property in the amount of \$18,500 for the 2012 Dodge Ram truck, and \$25,500 for the 2015 Dodge Ram truck.

INDIGENT EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for

exempt records. [Time 9:56 am to 10:26 am] Chairman Stirm motioned to approve the non-medial indigent case and the motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for risk management and personnel. [Time 10:27 am to 10:41 am] Stirm said there was no action required.

EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE: Ms. Melissa Potts had an updated quote for the ambulance, which includes a powerlift. It takes 210 days to deliver this ambulance. She said it could take up to a year and a half. Chairman Stirm motioned to approve the quote for a 2023 4x4 diesel ambulance in the amount of \$223,978. Commissioner Twilegar seconded the motion and there were all

eyes.

Potts added, "Winter's here. If anyone knows of any ambulance driver who does well driving in snow, send them my way."

LOWMAN BROADBAND UPDATE AND CERTIFICATION: Mr. Westcott presented to the commissioners some information about what was required to receive funding. He said the project has been completed and it meets the original design. They installed the infrastructure and broadband is operational. There is an invoice for the board of commissioners for the grant funds. He provided a map detailing where the fiber is laid and distributed to all the homes and businesses indicated in the Lowman area. Westcott said the total project actually cost \$1.175 million. There was a new radio dish installed at Jackson Peak.

Commissioner Twilegar noted for the record, "If you could find more grant money to light up the rest of the county, we'd be happy to talk about it." Chairman Stirm agreed, "Yes, absolutely." Westcott said, "It is possible, depending on the amount of bandwidth that they have available."

Chairman Stirm motioned to sign that the project meets the original design, has been completed, meets requirements, is operational, and ready for use.

AVIMOR PRELIMINARY PLAT APPLICATION: Commissioner Stirm opened the public meeting and had Planning and Zoning go first and provide some background. Alex Gross said the planned community for Avimor has been approved and the ordinance has been signed. They submitted the preliminary plat to the office. Gross explained that the Avimor development is located in an area right off of Highway 55, right across the Ada County line into Boise County. He said there are likely to be some changes from now until they have the final plat. The legal notice of this hearing was posted in the *Idaho World*. He said that Avimor believes that they have enough water rights to provide water to the subdivision. Mr. Gross provided seven conditions for approval, which included following all federal and county laws and regulations. They do have an agreement with Ada County for EMS Services. Avimor is working with the Idaho Transportation Department re-

garding an underpass, which ITD plans to re-pave from the golf course to Horseshoe Bend on Highway 55 in 2023.

For public comments, an individual from Eagle spoke regarding the project and opposed the annexation of Avimor by Eagle. She asked that the commissioners continue to watch all the roadway conditions and others. Twilegar asked why she was opposed and she answered that it would likely cost Eagle residents more than it should.

Another woman from Eagle spoke, opposed to the annexation. She said studies showed, "economically, it's a bad long-term investment for the city of Eagle." She was also concerned with the water issues long-term and fire issues.

A representative of Avimor said there were multiple studies done for water and they have a water permit. They have "an adequate amount of water" with one well and an additional well being drilled. He added that there were water conservation techniques incorporated into Avimor's plan.

Chairman Stirm motioned to approve the Avimor - Boise County preliminary plat full subdivision with the conditions of approval. All were in favor.
