JUSTICE FOR MICAH OF HORSESHOE BEND

Two years ago, on March 15, 2020, the small town of Horseshoe Bend was rocked by a tragedy. Eleven-year-old Horseshoe Bend Elementary School student Micah Pecyna was murdered by a stranger who shot up the home Micah shared with his family. After following the family home from a neighboring market, 46-year-old Benjamin Poirier knocked on the family's door and when Micah's mother, Jolie French Pecyna, opened it, he told her, "It's the end of the world."

After closing the door and calling 911, Pecyna told the 911 dispatcher that the stranger was still knocking. Then the knocking stopped and the gunfire began.

Armed with an AK-47 and a handgun, Poirier opened fire on the home. In the end, Micah was shot five times. His mother and stepfather escaped Poirier's bullets, but not the effects of the aftermath.

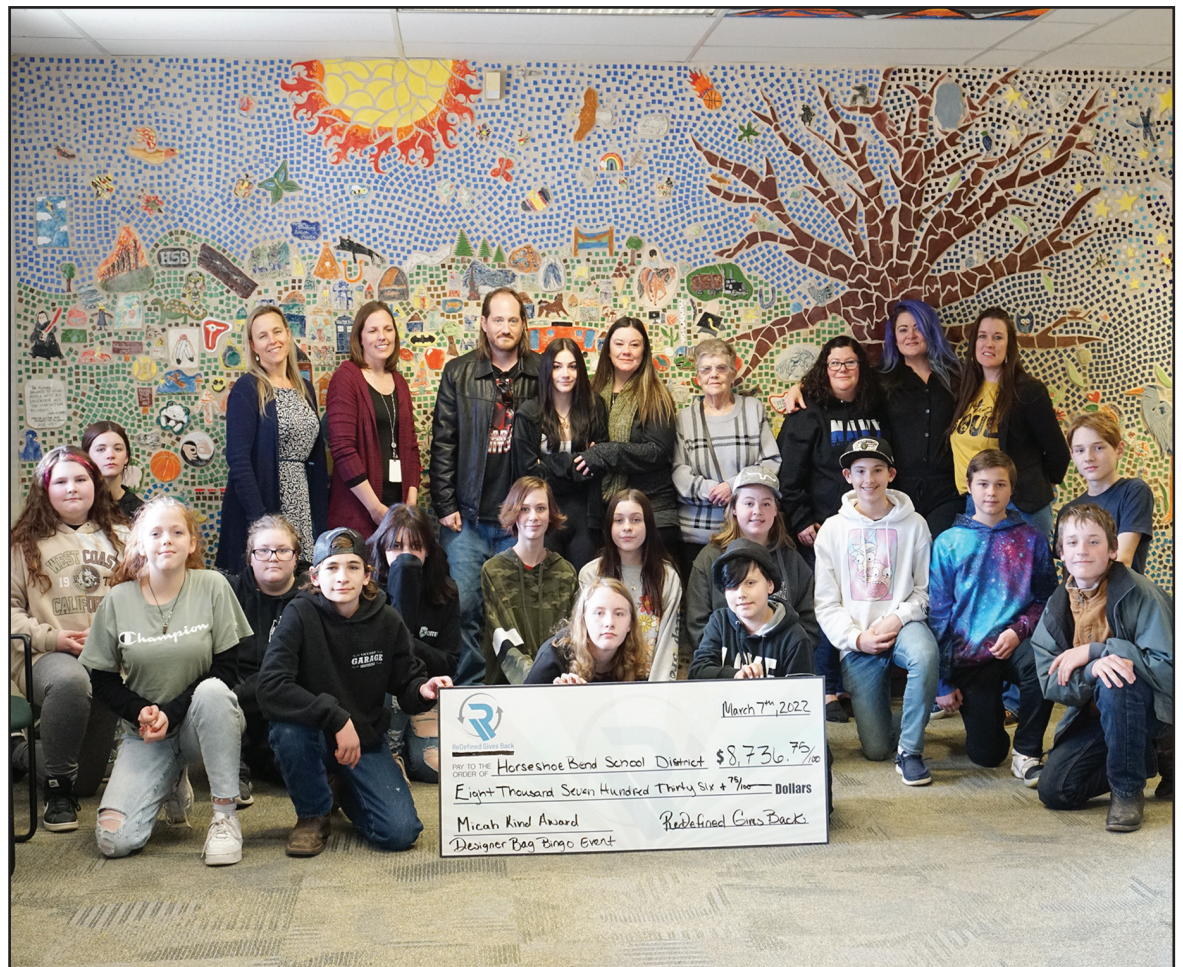
Poirier was arrested by the Boise County Sheriff's Department and has been incarcerated throughout his trial. Sentencing was handed down by Judge Samuel Hoagland on Friday, March 18. The sentence was consistent with what the prosecution had requested, life in prison without the possibility of parole. As part of a plea deal, Poirier accepted that to escape

the death penalty, he will not be allowed to appeal Judge Hoagland's sentence.

Meanwhile, life has continued in Horseshoe Bend, but Micah's memory will forever be remembered through the "Micah Kind Award" that was established in his honor. Micah was known as a kind, caring soul and was a well-loved student on campus. His kindness, forgiveness, and desire to make the world a better place were instrumental in developing the Micah Kind Award. The award is presented to a student who exemplifies similar characteristics to Micah, most notably, displaying kindness to others. Each year the recipient's name will be engraved on the Micah Kind Award plaque on display at the school. The recipient will also receive \$200 to be donated to a cause of their choice in Micah's memory.

The first recipient of the award was KayLee Bowery. Currently a 7th grader at Horseshoe Bend Middle School, KayLee was a 5th grade classmate of Micah. Bowery donated the \$200 award to the Horseshoe Bend Food Pantry.

The Micah Kind Award received a big boost on March 7. The ReDefined Outreach committee presented the school with a check for \$8,736.75 to be used to further Micah's legacy. ReDefine Outreach's mission statement: "Our mission is to connect and strengthen our

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Ryan Stirm, and

Pledge of Allegiance

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from March 10th, 2022. All were in favor.

CONSTITUENT INPUT:

A constituent asked regarding the cell tower and a lawyer from Boise County stated that no further testimony could be taken. However, the constituent had submitted a letter, which Commissioner Twilegar confirmed that he had read.

ELECTION: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the election canvas for the Basin School Levy and Garden Valley School Levy.

ISSUE TRACKING:

Chairman Twilegar would like to put the Boise Street Bridge back on for discussion, because an individual obtained some grant money.

Commissioner Stirm asked if they were in a "holding pattern" with giving Highway 17 back to the Idaho Transportation Department. Commissioner Holmes said he had a talk with them last week about a "swap" in responsibilities between Highway 21 and Highway 17. He then said he'd talk to them again. The board discussed all the rock sliding down right now. Prosecutor Adam Strong suggested approaching them after the legislative session.

CuMo Mine was discussed and said they had not gone bankrupt, but had not filed some paperwork in time, which stopped them for a year. Twilegar said, "They have not disappeared." Curtis Dill, Boise County Road Department, said they wanted to redo the road agreement for Grimes Pass Road. Dill is working with the prosecutor on this.

Chairman Twilegar said that Midas Gold was up in Boise County last summer doing some surveys.

Commissioner Holmes asked Dill about the road mix the county was buying down in Boise and the haul time. Holmes said he wants to look out for the taxpayer's money and would like to talk, "offline" regarding how many loads, how much was spent, and hours of work. "I want to use our local pits and keep the money local as much as possible, unless you've got some valid reason we can't." Dill ex-

plained that as soon as it dries out enough to get the trucks over that way, "we haul from him. It's just right now, with as soupy as the roads are, I don't need to be putting 60,000 lbs. trucks on..."

Commissioner Stirm ask regarding SRS and PILT funds for the roads. Clerk Mary Prisco said they never know how much they will receive, but SRS normally comes the end of April and PILT in June.

MOTION: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve a bid to repair a 1999 Super Duty Ford truck in the amount of \$1,655 for the solid waste department.

BIDS: Twilegar said there were three bids for the roads and the county's engineer suggested they the board accept the Sunroc bid. He motioned to accept the bid from the Sunroc Corporation in the amount of \$683,337.50. All were in favor and the motion passed.

GRANT WRITER: Chairman Twilegar presented a document to hire a grant writer. In regards to grants, "I have people sending me stuff almost daily now." He motioned to approve the position summary, for a potentially new Boise County grant writer position. All were in favor.

Chairman Twilegar added, "I want to get this done, so we don't miss a pile of money like we did last year."

NEW LAPTOPS: Commissioner Stirm would like to look at getting new laptops and mentioned that the 2016 models were having issues.

RACE TO ROBIE CREEK: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the contract with the Race to Robie Creek in Boise County with East Boise County Ambulance. All were in favor.

LAW ENFORCEMENT AGREEMENT: A motion was said to approve the yearly agreement for Boise County law enforcement to provide services for the U.S. Forest Service and Boise National Forest. The motion carried. Another motion was made to approve the agreement to provide law enforcement services and traffic control for the Boise Ridge Riders event. The motion carried.

MOTION: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the payment of an invoice for a 2022 Caterpillar grader in the amount of \$39,661. He made another motion to ap-

prove a second invoice for an all-wheel drive Caterpillar grader 2022 in the amount of \$37,565. Twilegar then motioned to pay the invoice for a third Caterpillar 2022 all-wheel drive road grader in the amount of \$38,657.

BOISE COUNTY SNOWMOBILE TRAILS/ SNOWGROOMER:

Prosecutor Strong discussed misdemeanor crimes versus an infraction with fines for littering. Sheriff Turner stated that the way the ordinance is written now, it's really hard to write a citation. Prosecutor Strong will review the ordinance and get back to the board.

TECHNICAL: Commissioner Stirm asked to get a quote for laptops.

DEMAND WARRANTS: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the payment of the lease for the graders in the amount of \$37,565, \$39,661, and \$38,657.

AVIMOR: Commissioner Twilegar opened the public hearing. Alex Gross with Boise County Planning and Zoning said this was to vacate a portion of the Avimor planned community. The State of Idaho will be making a land trade. Commissioner Twilegar made a motion to approve and all were in favor.

IDAHO CITY RANGER DISTRICT: Acting District Ranger John Riling said he's

been here for about fourteen years, lives down in Boise, and monitors restoration work after logging. Riling stated that since the 2016 Pioneer Fire, they have been actively planting in that area and have worked on restoration work with salvage logging.

He spoke regarding a closing of snowmobile routes and will plow, to start planting to help with the success of the trees. The official closure should be posted on the Forest Service's website with a map. They plan on planting an area about 3,100 acres and over half a million seedlings. Riling said, "It's the largest planting effort in the intermountain region by far, and probably the largest sustainably planned reforestation program in the country. So, it's a big deal nationally." He continued, "With the infrastructure bill, and the emphasis on the replant act, and all the money that's coming down from that, the Boise [area] and all the work that we've been doing in Boise County, we've situated ourselves in good position to compete really well for those funds and to keep up those restoration efforts."

He then addressed burning over 1,000 acres with prescribed burns, but that depends on weather conditions. They would like to do the Buckskin area.

Riling discussed the live fire

on federal and private land that will involve all the ten rural fire departments in Boise County on May 14th. They are working on getting all the agreements in place to help showcase for future funding.

He spoke of reducing wild-fire risks and the money they're receiving, "This is a game changer for the Forest Service, but I also think this will also help us achieve our larger objectives." He added, "Right now, we're in the process of *hugely* ramping up in terms of workforce hiring. For the Idaho City Ranger District, we're trying to double our workforce, just about." He said they may need to address the housing issue with the counties. "This area is one of the high priorities for the country."

Boise County Forester Trinia Richardson spoke regarding funding for our county due to high fire risk on properties. She will present more information and a PowerPoint at some later date.

CELL TOWER APPROVAL: (This was recorded and published in last week's newspaper, pg 1.) The board of

Sentencing in the Murder Case of HSB Boy

BOISE COUNTY -- The Honorable Judge Samuel Hoagland commenced sentencing in the case of Benjamin Poirier, charged with first degree murder of an eleven-year-old, Micah Lee Pecyna. The defendant was present in court on March 18, 2022. The State of Idaho and Boise County had filed a death penalty notice in this case on May 20, 2020. After lengthy proceedings, ultimately, the defendant has entered a guilty plea to the first degree murder charge. This plea bargain agreement, "whereby the state agreed to withdraw the death penalty. The state would recommend a fixed-life sentence of imprisonment."

Judge Hoagland recapped the events of March 15th, 2020 in Horseshoe Bend: "When the defendant drove from his home in Emmett, Idaho to Horseshoe Bend, saw Micah and his family in Horseshoe Bend, followed them to their home, knocked on the door with his AK-47 type rifle in his hand. Made the comments to step-father Wes, slammed the door and directed his wife, Micah's

mother, to call the police. Mr. Poirier stepped back, waited some time and then shot forty rounds out of that AK-47 into the trailer house, and seven more rounds out of a 45 mm pistol into the trailer house. Ultimately, hitting Micah five times, including a fatal shot to the head. He subsequently got into his vehicle, and drove his car into the propane tanks of the unit. Trying to explode those. He was arrested almost immediately by the police that had then arrived, taken to the Ada County Jail." Judge Hoagland continued, "The defendant entered his guilty plea on October 15, 2021. Thereafter, the court ordered a presentence investigation report, together with various evaluations." Evaluations were done on social history, substance abuse, and a mental health assessment. There were past jail reports and quite a few victim impact statements from family members.

The judge then asked if there were any errors or corrections in regards to the presentence investigation written report.

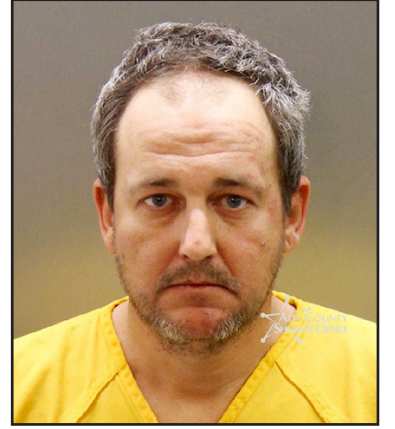
Mr. Poirier's attorney Elisa Massoth pointed out some changes she wanted, "Beginning with page one of the presentence investigation, the second paragraph, the middle of the paragraph, the sentence begins with: The defendant saw them, chose them as his targets. We request a correction that he did not ever see Micah. And that he did not choose -- the word choose is disputed because, based on the other police reports and the information in the social history, Mr. Poirier was having a psychotic episode and the radio, um well, he was hearing voices. He was getting messages from the radio and not making his own choices."

Another point the defense attorney made was that the defense team actually went to Florida to meet with an individual close to the defendant, who was quoted saying Mr. Poirier "was living a very unhealthy lifestyle."

Massoth added, "Because Idaho doesn't have an insanity defense, he feels caught in a situation where from what was actually going on, on March

15, 2020 -- Idaho doesn't see it as a defense." However, when tested on the day of his arrest, he did test positive for marijuana.

The judge asked Jolie Pecyna, Micah's mother, to take the stand to deliver her victim impact statement. In the midst of tears and tissues, she said, "It's hard to put into words what I feel, and what I've lost. Micah was a beautiful child. He loved being alive. He loved his friends, he loved his family. He was kind and he had so many dreams. Every day is another day that I don't get to see my son accomplish those dreams. Every day is a reminder of what happened that night... and every day I live with flashbacks of what happened to my son. And watching him *die* in front of me and I will live with that *for the rest of my life* -- for no reason." She added, "I'm still in contact with my son's friends, who were all struggling and suffering with the loss of their friend. And it is heartbreaking to me because I can't fix it for them." Micah's mother choked back sobs, "I

want my son to be remembered for the beautiful human that he was and the amazing things he would have done in this life, had he been given the chance."

Judge Hoagland said in conclusion, "I believe it's necessary to accomplish the objective to protect society. I have no assurance and no one else can assure me that Mr. Poirier wouldn't continue to be a danger to society. That I also think that the circumstances and gravity of the crime require a fixed life term in this case. Therefore, that is the judgment."

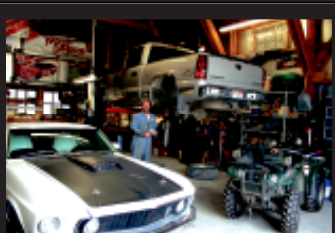

Sophomore Nevaeh Church was good for one run off a hit by pitch before leaving the game with an ankle contusion. Church was replaced in left field by sophomore Jullian Wellan who had 1 RBI with 2 walks. Freshman right fielder Cara Gorski walked twice with

Seedlings Available for Landowners

BOISE COUNTY — Landowners who need trees and shrubs to create wind-breaks, improve wildlife habitat, and enhance forests on their property are encouraged to come to the Boise National Forest Lucky Peak Nursery's annual surplus seedling sale.

The surplus seedling sale will begin Saturday, April 2, from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Seedlings will not be available on Sunday. The seedling sale will continue through the end of April, Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., as supplies last. The price is \$30.00 for 50 seedlings.

The minimum quantity that can be purchased is 50 seedlings of each species.

Each customer will be able to purchase a maximum of 500 seedlings. First come, first served, no presales.

All sales Saturday, April 2, will be drive up. CASH or CHECK only.

This year's available species are Douglas fir, Engelmann spruce, Ponderosa pine, Antelope bitterbrush, and Wyoming big sagebrush. Seedlings will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Sagebrush is highly desirable for improving big game habitat in the foothills. In forested areas, Ponderosa pine is typically found on drier sites.

The seedlings are best suited for landowners with property in rural areas. They are not intended for

homeowners in urban areas to plant in their backyards. Landowners who purchase the one-year-old trees can expect the majority of them to grow and thrive if planted correctly. Written planting instructions and technical assistance will be available.

Each year, the Lucky Peak Nursery produces over three million one and two-year old trees and shrubs. These seedlings are used for public land reforestation activities in the intermountain west disturbed by wildfire, timber sales, or other events. When the nursery has produced more seedlings than its customers need, that surplus becomes available to rural landowners for conservation plantings.
