Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Ryan Stirm, and Robert "Ted" Holmes

Pledge of Allegiance CONSTITUENT INPUT: A resident of Idaho City would like to get a land survey recorded and brought up issues with delays. Assessor Chris Juszczak helped to explain the process.

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from March 15th and special meeting minutes from March 15th. The motion carried.

PROMOTION: Road and Bridge would like to promote a lead man in Garden Valley, and has been doing the job. Chairman Twilegar motioned to promote the lead man. All were in favor.

MASS GATHERING: An application for the Idaho City Enduro 100 was approved through a motion.

BOGUS BASIN: Chairman Twilegar asked to talk about Bogus Basin's tax exempt status. The prosecutor said he was ready for the initial discussion. Prosecutor Adam Strong said they have had the tax exemption for decades. He said they are a non-profit organization, "but that's not sufficient in the statute." He read over eight factors that the county would need to do an analysis on to determine Bogus Basin's tax exempt status. Prosecutor Strong said, "In 2019, they had a total revenue of just over \$16 million and total expenses of around \$12.7 million, so they had net revenue in 2019 of \$3.5 million total profit."

Prosecutor Strong presented a slideshow of Bogus Basin, explaining the district they are located in, the levy rates, and the ballpark amount they would pay to those individual taxing districts. It would total just over \$200,000 annual. He said, "This would not be additional revenue. This would go into the budgets and would essentially -- in theory, lower everybody else's property taxes." He said there were a few things he would like to discuss in an executive session. He added that Bogus Basin does not own most of the ground, that it's federal land, so they wouldn't be able to tax the land. The board would like to pursue further analysis.

information and prices for laptops for the board. They gave permission to proceed with the purchase.

Robert then spoke about county computer vulnerabilities, and stated that he gets a spam call nearly every day between 6am or 7am in the morning. Commissioner Twilegar asked if it was the Russians and Robert replied, "It's usually Ukraine, actually. All the cryptics [encryptic callers] have always come from the Ukraine." He said that's what the county's insurance company had told him and that they're always trying to get money. "So far, we're holding strong." Commissioner Twilegar replied, "Good!"

SHERIFF: Sheriff Turner proposed to send out a bid the cost of a card reader system and fuel tanks, for both the Idaho City and Gardena road shop.

Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the request for bids for fuel storage and distribution located at two separate locations.

TIRE DISPOSAL: There was discussion of costs, and only one contractor or they could take the tires to Oregon again. Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the agreement with Castle Tire and Boise County Solid Waste. All were in favor.

RESOLUTION: Chairman Twilegar motioned to increase the general fund for the Emergency Manager Department 2022 budget. The amount of the grant is \$4,551. This was approved.

BILLS: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the claims approval report at the amount of \$215,144. The motion was approved unanimously. MONEY WIRE TRANS-FER: Treasurer Gina Turner said earlier in the meeting it was odd to wire money for the payment of the road graders. The prosecutor was going to look this over. After looking it over, Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the wire verification transfers for the three road graders for the Road and Bridge Department, in the amounts of \$373,000, the second one for \$326,000, and the third for \$319,000. **EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Closed session for exempt records. [Time 10:06 am to 10:12 am] Coming back into session, per non-medical assistance, Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve this assistance to pay a gentleman's rent in the amount of \$400.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for hiring an employee. [Time 10:14 am to 10:25 am] Coming back into session, Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the position of Boise County Grant Writer for 20 hours a week. All were in favor and the motion passed.

EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT: Mass gatherings were discussed. Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the agreement to provide ambulance services with the EBCAD and the Idaho City 100 Enduro for June 4th and 5th, 2022. He then made a motion to approve the agreement between EBCAD to provide ambulance services for the Race to Robie Creek on April 16, 2022. These were approved.

AVIMOR ROADS: A representative from Avimor development spoke regarding the underpass and plans for ITD [Idaho Transportation Department]. He said it will be part of the "big package" next year when they pave Highway 55, from State Street in Eagle to Horseshoe Bend's Second Street. "That will take place the end of July, starting 1st of August, 2023." He added that the underpass would be completed by that time. There are portions of the work that the development will be doing, such as the widenings and on/ off ramps. It has not yet gone to bid.

He also addressed the water system, "We've purchased the twenty-inch pipe that's eight and a half miles." He said it's expected to arrive in May. He expects the system to be up, with the tank in place, and booster stations sometime in August or September.

Chairman Twilegar asked that the representative say for the record what the public could expect. The representative said, "There are two entrances into Avimor. There's the south entrance, which we call Avimor Drive. That is three to five years out, to relocate Highway 55 up the slope." He continued, "All of that work will take place outside of the roadway, and once it is complete and ready to turn on, that's when traffic will be swapped over to the new highway." He then spoke of the underpass, "to where you don't have people crossing the highway and potentially getting hit. It will all be, just right-ins, right-outs, with ramps and lanes." He said they want to get this complete by August 2023 for when the paving comes through.

He said Avimor Drive is

three to five years out, but the stoplight will go away, and it's about a \$25 to \$30 million dollar project. The highway will completely move up on the slope by the powerlines, west. Avimor is funding these projects.

Homes on the Boise County side are expected to take off, "By fall of 2023, we should have about one hundred and fifty homes constructed." He said the average house price now is about \$850,000. "Our highest, just this last week was \$1.4 million. It was a 2,400 square foot house, two car garage." Commissioner Twilegar asked if we were going to have some of those million dollar homes in our county, and the representative answered, "Yes, yes." He expects in phase two, they will be building better homes than what they are currently building, about one hundred and fifty of them with a view of the Owyhee Mountain Range.







George W. Dovel, 91, beloved husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and great-greatgrandfather passed away at the VA Hospital in Portland, Oregon on March 15, 2022.

Mr. Dovel was born May 23, 1930, in Harrisonburg, Virginia to Robert and Alice Dovel. He was orphaned and grew up as a child of the Great Depression but had wonderful times in the outdoors, including fishing trips to the countryside in his uncle's horse-drawn buckboard wagon.

While finishing high school, George received his pilot's license. After graduation he went to work for National Airlines. He married Amy Dovel (Violet) in 1950. He served in the Army, first as an aviation mechanic, then as a cargo and

medevac pilot in Korea and was promoted to warrant officer. George and Amy had the first of nine sons in 1953 at the U.S. Army Hospital in Fort Benning, GA. George and Amy divorced after 38 years. George and Patti Newell (Hubbard) later married and had a wonderful life together in Horseshoe Bend that included many hunting and fishing trips. George served as a father figure to Patti's three children.

After George's service in the Army, he moved his growing family to Idaho where they purchased Strawberry Glen Airport in Garden City and a backcountry property in central Idaho. He was an accomplished backcountry pilot, and flew as a government contractor, a backcountry hunting guide, conducting airshows, and volunteer search and rescue. He retired from flying and bought a property in Banks, Idaho where he and his family raised livestock, and later, a second property in Horseshoe Bend where he had a farm and cattle ranch.

George was a fierce advocate for the conservation of wildlife, hunting and fishing opportunities, and the 2nd amendment. During the 1970s he published a wildlife magazine, The Outdoorsman. After retirement, he published a newsletter under the same name. He served as an advocate and expert witness on wildlife issues before the Idaho State legislature and the area representative for the NRA.

George is survived by seven of his nine sons, Bill, Mike, George, Jim, Dan, Joe, and Matt, and a large number of grandchildren, great-grandchil-

dren, and great-greatgrandchildren. He was preceded in death by two of his sons, Bob and John, his first wife Amy, and his second wife Patti.

A graveside service will be held at 2:00 pm on Saturday, April 2, 2022, at the Pioneer Cemetery in Horseshoe Bend with a reception at the senior center in Horseshoe Bend immediately after.

The family extends warmest thanks for the outpouring of wishes and numerous caretakers at the Boise and Portland VA hospitals.


