CELL TOWER IN ROBIE CREEK DEBATE

Planning & Zoning Appeal of a Robie Creek Cell Tower Approval

March 3, 2022

Present: Commissioners Steve Twilegar, Ryan Stirm, and Robert "Ted" Holmes. There were approximately sixty constituents in attendance on Thursday morning.

Commissioner Stirm called the meeting to order and all stood for the Pledge of Allegiance. He then motioned to do a realignment of the Board of County Commissioners and nominated Commissioner Twilegar as the chairperson. Commissioner Holmes seconded, and Twilegar abstained.

Chairman Twilegar adjourned that special meeting and readjoined for the public hearing of the Robie Creek cell tower appeal.

Commissioner Twilegar started by saying, "This room will be treated much like a courtroom for these proceedings in order to protect the due process rights of all parties. Everyone will have an opportunity to speak, but only when testifying." He added that federal law prevented the board from considering any health effects from radio waves, so they were unable to allow discussion on that topic.

Planning and Zoning Administrator Alex Gross recapped that his office met with Horizon Tower, LLC in July of 2021 regarding a cell phone tower at Robie Creek Fire Station #2. The company applied for a conditional use permit for a 15-story high cell tower.

Property owners were represented by one lawyer, and another was present through a zoom conference to stress the issue of property values and the neglect of proper evidence for a conditional use permit.

Josh Leonard for Horizon Tower had Steve Kennedy, a radio frequency engineer, speak regarding the need of the tower's location. He recapped that it was a 150-foot tower, which would provide coverage to Highway 21 and around the community of Robie Creek. "This is a license protected site," Kennedy said. "So, the FCC (Federal Communications Commission) regulates any transmitters that have a license that they must provide coverage for this license within a certain period of time," or they forfeit those licenses at a large expense. He explained that they have to cover the populations to protect the license, and "there is a significant gap in service." He said that license that they're trying to protect is at eight years and will expire at ten years. "Carriers typically don't like to let their license go because of the amount of money they've spent." He said in the latest auction that occurred over a year ago, "all of the carriers spent over \$84 billion dollars to acquire those licenses from the FCC via auction. That's a lot of money. I don't think they are going to want to give that up." There were a couple of alternative sites considered, but Leonard from Horizon Tower said that the location at

the fire station was the only viable site, "This is it!" He said in reviewing comments made by landowners, "A lot of people said they came here to get away from the city - a lot of them. What they don't realize is that as more people move into a neighborhood and create a population center, they bring the city with them and cell towers are part of that bringing the city with them." He pointed out that Boise County did not have a comprehensive system of multiple zones, but rather a single zoning district "in which almost every use requires a conditional use permit." However, he recognized regulations placed by the federal government for construction during the mating or nesting times of the Bald Eagle. Leonard clarified that they had a two-year window to have the tower built and up-and-running to maintain their license.

The Board heard ample testimony from surrounding property owners with concerns

ranging from substantial property value decreases, lack of notification, the location, and private property rights. There was also discussion regarding Bald Eagles nesting in the area, generator use, aesthetic views, and another constituent questioned whether the nonprofit Robie Creek Volunteer Fire Department even had the authority to enter into the contract with Horizon Tower, LLC.

The public hearing, which began at 9:30 am, concluded

after 3:00 pm. The board closed public testimony and Commissioner Twilegar explained, "I'm not ready to make a decision," stating there was too much information to digest and he would like to review the record. The commissioners will meet again on Tuesday, March 15th, for their regular Board of Boise County Commissioners meeting and will have made a decision regarding this proposed conditional use permit.

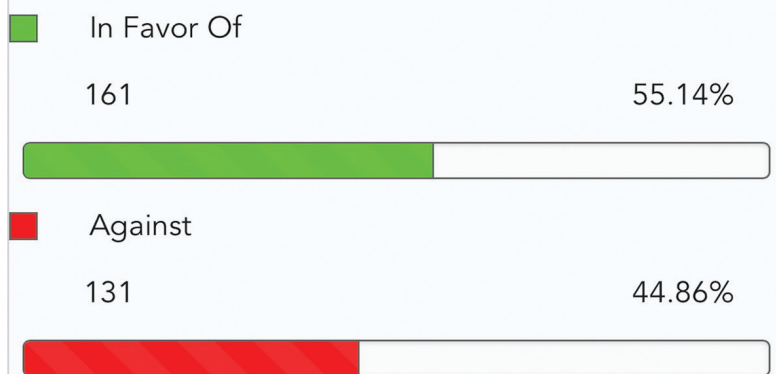

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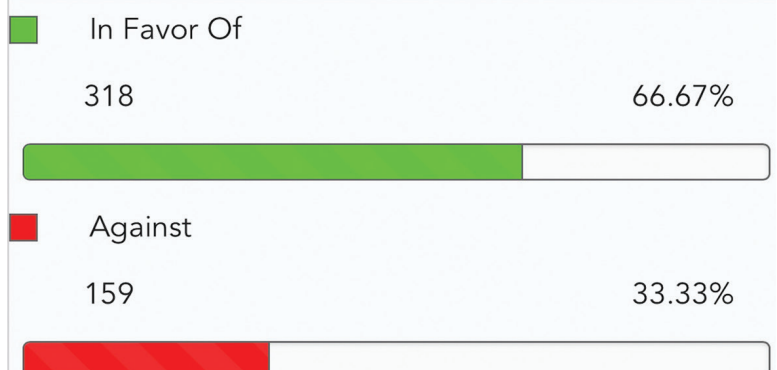

March 1, 2022**Present:** Commissioners Ryan Stirm, Steven Twilegar, and Robert Holmes**Pledge of Allegiance****EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Closed session for hiring an employee. [Time 9:03 am to 9:30 am] Coming back into session, Commissioner Stirm said there was no action required.**CONSTITUENT INPUT:**

Bruce Baumhoff, of Centerville, spoke to the commissioners about the declining condition of the roads and, "It's come to my attention that only state certified products [road mix] can go onto the county roads. Are you guys aware of that?" Commissioner Holmes said he was not. Baumhoff continued, "I keep questioning why they keep hauling gravel, dirt from Boise. I mean, they're hauling gravel from Boise to a half mile from my pit and they don't buy gravel, there's always an excuse, but it's cheaper." He spoke about lodging a complaint if there is other gravel that doesn't meet state specks and having it removed. Holmes said he would be talking with the head of the road department that day.

Another constituent, Rick Barber of Placerville, said Alder Creek was like a sheet of ice. He discussed maintaining Arrowrock Road. Chairman Stirm stated, "We're just considering all options."

MINUTES: Commissioner Stirm motioned to accept the official meeting minutes from February 22, 2022.**ROAD DEPARTMENT:** Commissioner Stirm asked about the ice on Alder Creek. Curtis Dill spoke about heavy road equipment and said, "We're getting it all worked out."**DEMAND WARRANTS:** Chairman Stirm motioned to pay YMC inc. for a furnace repair at the prosecutor's office in the amount of \$1865. Prosecutor Strong commented that it was an unusual repair, but it stemmed from the contract lease that they signed 20 years ago. He also said that the contract would be expiring in two months and are trying to "clean up" that contract.

Stirm motioned to pay CenturyLink on behalf of the Sheriff's office in the amount of \$1,355 for repair and labor.

He then motioned to pay the National Association of Counties dues in the amount of \$450,

from 1/1/22 to 12/31/2022.

Stirm motioned to pay Air St. Luke's in the amount of \$180 for their 2022 memberships for four individuals, new employees.

COMMISSIONER HOLMES DISCUSSION: Commissioner Holmes explained that he had "a personal issue" and explained that his wife had "a life-altering illness." He then said, "There's been a few times when I've not been on my game, or things are going on that are personal." For that reason, he has decided not to run for commissioner again. Holmes said he has taken his oaths over the years very seriously, and expects the next incoming commissioner candidates should as well and assume accountability.

He then addressed another concern, "There's drugs, there's drugs everywhere. We've got drugs in Idaho City. I know people that did them. I'm a D.A. - a drug recognition expert. I can walk out and see who's high and tell them what they're on. My issue with drugs is, if they're illegal and you're an elected official, you don't use them. I'm not going to put any names out today, but I will in the future if it continues." He plans on working with the other two commissioners to "put it into law for this county" so that elected officials test. "So that our constituents know that we are not above the law." Holmes also mentioned the repercussions for testing positive for illicit drugs, "that we will be thrown out of office." He added, "As a leading county for the State of Idaho, that our elected officials are not better than the citizens that put them in. Because, we are held to a higher standard."

Commissioner Holmes then motioned to remove Commissioner Stirm as chairman, because he had been in that position for more than a year "and put Commissioner Twilegar in it." He explained that he had previously talked with Twilegar and that he would accept the position should Holmes make the motion. He then said Stirm had done a good job.

He then added that if employees drive a county car, they should be subject to random drug testing.

Commissioner Holmes said he plans on finishing his term, about another ten months, and plans to stay involved. He said that there were three people

he was aware of running for commissioner in his district: George Simpson, Marla Lawson, and Brent Adamson.

Commissioner Stirm asked whether the county was legally allowed to make an ordinance that requires that elected officials drug test. Holmes said, "They do it in other states and other places, and in some cities. But we don't do it in Idaho, but I think it needs to be done." He pointed out that someone with a felony could not hold office.

Prosecutor Strong answered a question about who tests individuals. The county contracts with an agency that chooses random employees to test. Commissioner Holmes said, "I want a list and I want to see who popped, if anybody, in the last 14 months. Period." He added, "I want names." He recognized that the Sheriff's office and Road Department, for CDLs, test frequently.

Commissioner Holmes again stated his motion to "switch" making Steve Twilegar the chairman for the Board of Commissioners. Ryan Stirm seconded the motion after Twilegar asked him if he wanted to. Stirm said, "That would be all in favor." However, Twilegar said he would abstain from voting. Stirm discussed having Twilegar chair the next meeting.

ATLANTA HIGHWAY DISTRICT/ MIDDLE FORK ROAD AGREEMENT: Commissioner Stirm recapped that Boise County is responsible for a portion of Arrowrock Road, from Highway 21 to Atlanta. It spans 28.93 miles. The Atlanta Highway District is responsible for the remainder up into Atlanta. The contract is due to be renewed and the finances discussed. He added that they would be sticking with this contract and changing the dates, or coming up with something else.

Mr. Dill said that the highway district contracts with them in the spring to do a grading to about mile marker 16, which includes ditch cleaning. Then in the fall, they do a full grading from the county line to the pavement. This includes snow removal during the winter, based on snow amounts in Twin Springs. Commissioner Stirm asked if there had been a review, if we were spending more than we were receiving.

John Howard, a Commissioner from the Atlanta Highway District and resident of Atlanta, said they definitely want to continue the arrangement. He would like to pool resources, and wouldn't mind if the county sent more money their way. Howard explained that the board was all new people, and suggested lever-

aging Forest Service and State to address this road. "This road is getting used by people who aren't paying taxes in our district." Twilegar and Stirm agreed that was almost exclusively by those people. He recommended speaking to representatives in the legislature to pull some funding out of Fish and Game, or ATV registration, "Our road is being used as a trail."

Mr. Dill said that they are losing material from the road and it is not safe, "When I'm running grader, I'm tire to the hillside, tire to the edge." Commissioner Stirm will reach out to Congressman Fulcher's office and have Twilegar reach out to Rep. Dorothy Moon.

The agreement is for every two years. Dill said two years ago they went in with rollers and they were \$11,000 over with the haul cost and materials.

Stirm asked Strong to update the dates on the contract and the Board will look at the contract again next week.

LAND USE EXECUTIVE SESSION: Chairman Stirm motioned to go into a closed session regarding land use in Boise County. [Time 1:17 pm to 2:29 pm] Coming back into session, Stirm said there was no action required.

Adjourned at 2:29 pm.

Garden Valley's Supplemental Levy

Garden Valley School Board to Consider Supplemental Levy to Cover Deficit

Voters went to the Polls on Tuesday, March 8th, and voted in favor of the 2-year levy.

GARDEN VALLEY -- The Garden Valley School Board held two informational meetings this past week about the proposed tax levy. These meetings, held in Garden Valley and Lowman, were intended to discuss with the public what the levy entails and why they feel it is needed. Superintendent Randy Thompson led the discussion with the help of school personnel Morris Morgan, Stephanie Corn, Lydia Callaway, and Mellissa Smith.

A supplemental levy is a tax for homeowners that makes up the difference between state allocated funds and the required expenditures to meet the budget for school operations and maintenance. Mr. Thompson explained that the supplemental tax levy is not a new tax (a supplemental levy tax has been in place since 2009). State law requires that supplemental lev-

ies be voted on every two years. This supplemental levy will cost an average of \$17 per year more than the previous two years, due to inflation. Mr. Thompson stated, "We really do try and be fiscal with taxpayers' money. We are taxpayers." The school would prefer not to have to ask the community to help fund the school, but the state only gives the schools so much.

According to the nonprofit Idaho-based BLUUM organization, 60% of funding for schools comes from the state, 28% local, and 12% federal. In fact, at \$7,833 spent by the state per-student, Idaho has the lowest estimated per-pupil spending of all 50 states and the District of Columbia in 2020-21, which has been the case since at least 2018. The number is up \$128 per student from 2019-20, but still well below the national average of \$14,243 per student. Part of this state money is from the state's lottery. The state also received federal COVID-19 relief money for schools. However, all of these monies have specific stipulations. The state requires the school to spend \$110,458 for the mainte-

nance and improvement of student occupied facilities, but only gives the school \$20,795 from the lottery. Federal COVID-19 money helped to purchase many of the items the children needed such as chromebooks, jetpacks for student connectivity at home, interior and exterior cameras, and ½ day salary for a school nurse. However, COVID-19 funds are not permitted to be used for normal maintenance, operations at the school, or budgeted items. The school district must petition the state for these funds and requested money must contain specific criteria. Additionally, the state only allocates for 65% of the transportation costs. The school is entirely responsible for athletics, extracurricular activities (such as drama club) and associated travel fees, as well as full time employees' insurance.

In previous years, the supplemental levy funds have been used for teacher and nurse salaries and the student Resource Officer. Superintendent Thompson hopes the school was able to get the word out to the taxpayers on the need and importance of this levy.

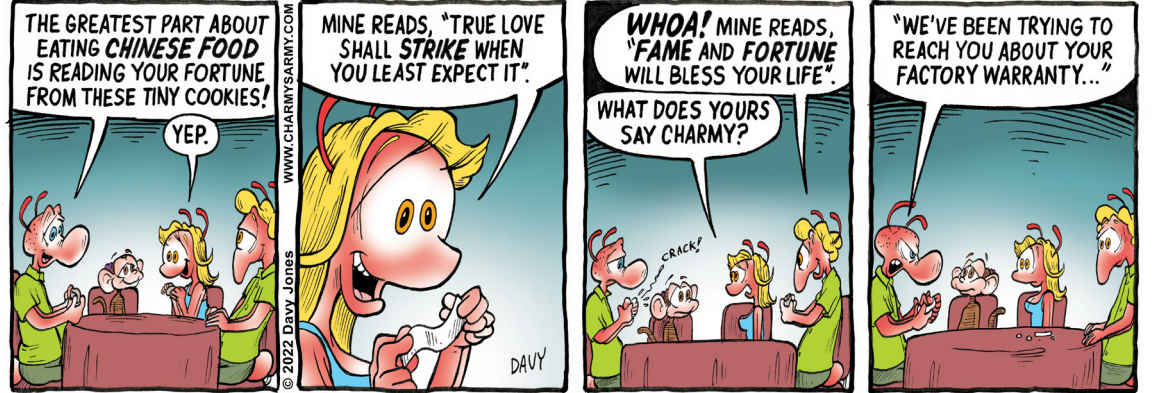

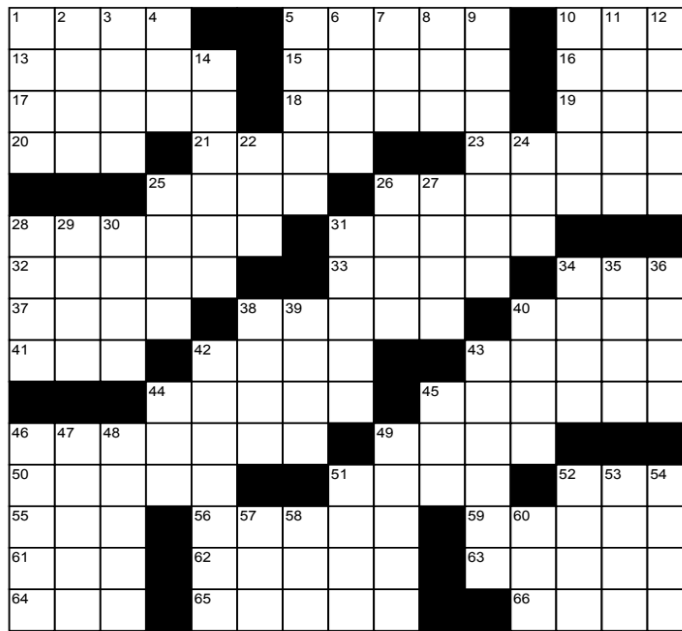

Fire Department Offers Lifesaving Training

IDAHO CITY -- The Idaho City Fire Protection District (ICFPD) Firefighters were recently re-certified in American Heart Association (AHA) Basic Life Support (BLS) and First Aid (FA). The AHA certification covers Adult/Child/Infant CPR and AED as well as Basic FA skills. This refresher course will help ensure that lifesaving techniques are performed properly and quickly on the scene of an accident or incident. This provides critical time for ambulance personnel and Life Flight Paramedics to arrive.

Practicing the best CPR techniques as a team also increases a patient's chance of survival and decreases their recovery time. Idaho City Firefighters who participated in this training will be certified for two years. This qualifies them to be

able to work with other Emergency Medical Service [EMS] personnel and to provide the best care for the community.

ICFPD has obtained training grants over the last few years to purchase the equipment and supplies required to offer this training in our community, and have personnel on staff as an AHA Certified Instructor.

ICFPD has considered offering Community AHA Heartsaver CPR/AED/FA courses at the Idaho City firehouse, all we would ask is that an individual pay for the AHA paperwork to get the full two year certification, with a small fee for consumable supplies. If you are interested, please contact a local Idaho City firefighter.

All are also welcome to come down to the firehouse for the monthly department meeting. The meetings are held the 2nd Thursday of every

month at 7:00 p.m. The Saturday trainings are also held that same week. If there is enough interest within the community

to put on classes, we will start scheduling AHA Heartsaver courses. Also keep in mind, the Fire Department has open

positions available, if you are interested in learning a variety of skills and in making a difference in your community.
