Horseshoe Bend is One Step Closer To Veteran's Memorial Park

HORSESHOE BEND --

The Horseshoe Bend City Council held a special meeting on Wednesday, May 4, at 7:00 p.m. After the Pledge of Allegiance and the unanimous approval of the night's agenda, the meeting began with the one item listed: continued deliberation for approval of the rezoning of city property located at 382 Highway 55 (action item).

City attorney Tony Pantera attended via Zoom (along with three additional viewers) and councilmember Curtis Corvinius was absent. Eleven community members made up the audience, along with two Boise County Sheriff deputies.

Pantera had previously sent the council packets containing pertinent information regard-

ing the rezoning of the property from R1 to public use. Mayor Pat Goff asked the council to review the information. Councilmember Patti Burgess asked for a clarification of what the change to public use would entail. Pantera responded that the change would allow for a public building or other public use, such as a park. He further explained that maintenance and existing ordinances would govern the property, such as those that currently apply to the city's park located next to city hall. Goff called for further discussion, and when no one on the council came forward, he asked that a motion be presented.

Councilmember Stephen Chartier made the motion to rezone the property to public use and councilmember Martye

Poll Watchers/Challengers and Absentee Signature Verification

BOISE COUNTY -- After reading a "Letter to Boise County Voters" in the May 4th edition of the *Idaho World*, authored by a candidate on the May 17th Republican Primary ballot, I am compelled to provide the residents of Boise County with accurate election information.

Boise County, and the Secretary of State's Office, follow the election laws of the State of Idaho. The laws as they currently exist, not what people might want to see changed in law. With regards to Challengers and Watchers, Idaho Code 34-304 is the governing law on this topic, combined with Secretary Denney's Directive 2022-03, dated April 27, 2022, which provides detailed guidance in applying I.C. 34-304 (and incorporates 34-431 and 34-1009 as well).

A challenger is someone that has been designated by a political party, via written request submitted by the chairman and secretary of the party, to the county clerk, no later than 12

days before the election. If this process is completed, a representative of the party is allowed to challenge voters as to their qualifications. There are no authorized challengers under I.C. 34-304 for this year's Primary Election.

A watcher may be authorized by a candidate, several candidates, or a political party, and may be present at the polls to watch every step of the voting process. However, there are some caveats to this. A watcher may not be positioned in such a way that private, personally identifiable information would be viewable or in a way that would violate ballot secrecy. A watcher cannot challenge a voter or a returned absentee ballot. Watchers are not allowed to handle any voted ballots or interfere with the election process. A watcher is not allowed to take photos or videos while in a polling location, early voting location, or location where absentee ballots are being processed or counted. A candidate may not serve as a watcher. Watchers are there to observe the election process and are not

to interfere with the process.

There is a team of watchers, designated by a State Office candidate, for the in person, absentee, and election day polling locations for the Boise County Primary. I worked with this candidate's designated representative to ensure that both Boise County and the candidate were in compliance with the existing pertinent law, and policies established by the Idaho Secretary of State.

Other items of note -- the 2020 Primary Election was a 100% absentee ballot election, as determined by the Governor and Secretary of State, during the pandemic. The voter signature on the backside, outer envelope, of returned absentee ballots is verified against the signature on the voter's registration card.

White seconded it. The motion passed unanimously without additional discussion.

Present: Commissioners Steve Twilegar, Ted Holmes, and Ryan Stirm (via phone)

GRANTS: Nancy discussed several different options for upcoming grants.

PLANNING & ZONING: Alex Gross said they have updated the website and posted in the *Idaho World* that the office will now be closed on Fridays. They will not be taking phone calls. This time will be used to catch up with the backlog of permits and other business. Gross said so far there hadn't been any backlash.

SHERIFF: "We've been extremely busy," Sheriff Scott Turner said. "We have a lot of major things happening and going on."

They are also short a vehicle and the car dealer cannot provide a manufacturing date. There is concern over an increase in cost. Sheriff Turner said that they are five weeks out to get car parts.

Clerk Mary Prisco spoke about the state contract and good pricing. Chairman Twilegar suggested buying a truck off the lot while they still could.

Commissioner Holmes asked, "What companies are not supplying law enforcement vehicles anymore?"

Sheriff Turner replied, "Chevy and Dodge, they shut

down. They will not take any order or any government catered pricing for the whole year of 2022." Chevy may take orders in the spring of 2023, "but that's not 100%." The sheriff said that when they ordered with Ford, they were told they were 18 weeks out, and they ordered them in October. "And now, they still can't produce a manufacture date for them." He said the government rate is about \$34,000, compared to a difference of \$47,000 to \$50,000.

PROSECUTOR: Adam Strong said they are busy. They also have to share a District Judge with Ada County, "and we were supposed to have a trial last, but at last minute they canceled it because they couldn't find a judge." Strong said, "It's kind of annoying, because you spend three days getting ready for a three-day jury trial and the last minute they kind of pull the rug out from under you." They have done a few trials this year, but the prosecutor's office is still backlogged with trials. He said law enforcement was busy and doing their job, so they are also busy on the criminal side. The office is also working on civil cases and contracts.

CLERK: Mary Prisco said they were "quite busy, especially with the elections." She spoke about the banners and political signs that were tak-

en out of the ground and laid down along the Highway 21 corridor. Signs were also removed from private property and she said one of her signs was missing. "It's really, really upsetting. I think we all agree on that." [An article about this event was published in last week's newspaper.]

In person, absentee voting started on May 2nd and goes through May 13th.

The absentee voting ballots must be sealed and received at the Clerk's office by 8pm on May 17th. Clerk Prisco said, "I always like to warn people, that means we have to have them here. If you're sending them through the postal service, it often takes five days for mail within county." She reminded them that all of our mail is processed down in Boise and then comes back up to Boise County.

Her office is also preparing for the 2021 audit. Prisco said, "There's a lot of work that we do in my office, beforehand, to upload documents to them."

COUNTYWIDE AMBULANCE: Chairman Twilegar said they had invited someone that had not come to the meeting. Commissioner Holmes spoke regarding Gem County and how they conduct business and emergency services.

Prosecutor Strong said that if the commissioners would like to put something to a vote,

it would need to be in this November's election. There is a petition that would need to be done with at least fifty members of those that live in the boundaries of the proposed district. Their needs to be a public hearing. The cities would also have their own public hearings. He advised that each step would take several weeks, "but all those steps would need to be done by about the first week of September."

CONSTITUENT INPUT: Rick Aspril of Garden Valley said, "Residents and people I've talk to of Garden Valley have the questions that they gave to me, asking, would you ask the commission why this and why that? And I said, yep, I'd be more than happy to. I did and nothing was really mentioned in the minutes." Aspril said he looked at Robert's Rules of Order, and would like to get what he said in a prior meeting into the record. "The necessary employees are leaving the county. I've talked to a number of department heads, and it's only for one reason. You can't find a more beautiful place, but you have to afford to live in it. And I think this latest increase in inflation has driven the questions even stronger and harder and that is - right now being the lowest... pushing forward, some of that [budget] could go toward employees." He also spoke regarding health insurance.

Aspril also asked about training for road department employees.

There was discussion about hiring more people and losing experienced employees. Basic housing was also a topic of discussion.

Aspril then asked regarding the money being pushed forward from budget year to budget year, "What surplus do we have?" Aspril followed by asking what was required of the county with this surplus to carry as a minimum. Prosecutor Strong replied, "There is a mandatory contingency amount that we have to have in the budget." Clerk Prisco provided some numbers for the General Fund and Justice Fund. She then spoke about "auditing standards" and "the county's financial policy." Prisco added, "We have historically budgeted, appropriated, the five percent." She said, "They are specifically set up,

and intended for, for unanticipated expenditures."

She said "surplus is not a word that we use," but the county website does have the audited financials and appropriated budget.

Clerk Prisco went through the process of how official meeting minutes are drafted, reviewed, and forwarded onto the Board of County Commissioners for approval. They are also uploaded to the website. Condensed minutes are legally required to be published in the newspaper of record, the *Idaho World*. "What we absolutely have to get in there are action items of the board."

Aspril asked about transparency and adding a link to listen to the audio from the commissioners' meetings. Chairman Twilegar said they're working on it, but their new tech person has been "slammed" with a lot of new equipment.

SPECIAL MEETING**April 26 at 3pm**

PAYROLL REQUEST: Planning and Zoning presented, for approval, an individual's name to fill the position of building inspector/ code enforcer officer. Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the individual for this position. All were in agreement.

Commissioner Emergency Meeting, May 2nd, 2022.

Present - Chairman Twilegar, Via Teleconference - Commissioner Stirm and IT Director McCracken.

Chairman Twilegar brought the meeting to order and a discussion ensued concerning the items needed to repair the county server. An amount of \$1,350 was spent on parts and shipping. A discussion of best and worst case scenarios ensued and what steps would be taken with either one. Chairman Twilegar and Prosecutor Strong agreed that monies should be freed up for the worst case scenario.

Chairman Twilegar MOTIONED to approve the use of up to \$25,000 to Robert McCracken's discretion to fix the problem. Commissioner Stirm SECONDED; All Ayes.

Chairman Twilegar also stated on record that due to there being no way to record the commissioners' meeting that was scheduled for May 3rd, 2022, it will be canceled.

Meeting Adjourned until May 10th, 2022 at 9:00am.

Exception: Fuelwood sales in the Visitor Center not available until end of June.

Boise, Idaho, May 10, 2022 -- Personal use fuelwood permits for the Boise National Forest will be available for sale beginning May 15, through Nov. 30, 2022. The Boise National Forest is offering multiple choices to purchase personal fuelwood permits. For information about fuelwood cutting on surrounding National Forests, please contact them

directly.

The Mountain Home Ranger District office is open now and the Idaho City, Emmett, Lowman, and Cascade Ranger District offices will be reopening May 16. The Visitor Center in Boise, Idaho, will not be selling fuelwood permits until the end of June.

Fuelwood permit prices remain at \$6.25 per cord with a 4-cord minimum, and a 10-cord maximum per household. **Please note**, we cannot sell permits for only 2 cords. If you want all 10 cords, permits purchased will need to be 5 cords and 5 cords, or 4 cords and 6 cords, or all 10 cords at once. Pick up your 2022 fuelwood brochure with tags when you purchase the fuelwood permit.

Permit holders are encouraged to cut fuelwood early in the year because fire restrictions may impact the cutting season later in the summer. Early season fuelwood cutters are asked to use caution to avoid wet muddy roads where travel may cause resource damage. Fuelwood cutting is not allowed within riparian areas (adjacent to creeks and rivers).

There is no cutting of Larch (Tamarack) after Nov. 1. Larch lose their needles every fall and appear to be dead, resulting in too many live trees being accidentally cut. This new regulation is to prevent the cutting of live Larch trees after they have lost their needles in the fall.





The Wonders of Idaho City Schools

Student Collaboration Miss Porter's Middle School Creative Writing Class

IDAHO CITY -- Our school is wonderful. We have great sports teams, physical education, extra-curriculars, programs for struggling families and students, and plenty of financial (and physical) freedom for lunch. We have come together to write about these marvelous features in our school.

We think our school has wonderful programs and helpful resources for struggling students, whether that be academically, or financially. Students who are failing their classes have opportunities to get their grades up and students who struggle in some subjects do as well. But not only students with bad grades, but students who don't have access to food, hygiene products, clothing, and other things. This school cares deeply about the well-being of the people in the community.

For example, Math Lab and Study Hall are both classes provided for students who need extra help in certain subjects. We also have an after-school homework club, where students can do their homework, catch up on missing assignments, and do projects or classwork that is due. These are very helpful to students who may be failing their classes and just need a little assistance. The teachers in these classes are also very helpful, as they walk students through each problem, help them get caught up in their classes, see things from a different perspective than their normal teacher, and help them fully understand what they are learning. Sometimes students just need more than one point of view, and a little more help individually.

After school homework club is also helpful because for struggling students it is easier to focus with fewer distractions and less happening around them. Sometimes students just need a little peace to focus, and it is easier to do in a classroom environment. The teachers help each student become

successful and bring up grades in classes that they may be failing.

Another program to help students academically is summer school. At summer school, it is kind of like a normal day at school, but you can read, do fun projects, and it isn't as scrupulous. We also have credit recovery programs, like one after school, and one during summer school. In credit recovery, students can work through units to get the required credits to graduate. So if students transferred schools and need credits to graduate, or students didn't earn enough credits, they can do credit recovery.

On the other hand, there are programs for financially struggling students and their families. There is the food pantry, the community wellness center, and free lunches. The food pantry is open to students who don't have enough money to purchase food, as well as free lunches. COVID-19 has resulted in many unemployed people and many families in the school community have been affected by that, so the food pantry provides food for students who need food, and having free lunches helps students who don't have food at home or lunch money. The food pantry will be able to stay, but free lunch won't because that is federally funded.

The community wellness center is also kind of like the food pantry. It has clothes, school supplies, hygiene products, and shoes for students who can't afford them. In the winter it is useful for winter boots, jackets, gloves, and hats. This is useful in meeting the basic needs of students to prepare them for class. The school is very helpful for students' families who don't have much money for clothing, food, hygiene products, and school supplies.

Another amazing feature at our school is the freedom we have during our lunch hour. The lunch hour is just about as long as all of our other periods and students don't have to stay in one spot. They can eat in the gym, the caf-

eteria, outside on the playground, and 9th-12th graders can even leave the campus for the period if they want to.

Like said before, school lunches are free for everyone because the government pays for the food. It hasn't always been this way and it won't stay like this. Once the government stops paying for our food, the school will need money to pay for the food they give out. The automatic solution is to make the families pay for lunches for their kids. Families will be required to pay for school lunches again and they might not be able to. That is why our school lunch program needs funding for kids that would be hungry otherwise.

Extracurricular activities such as tutoring, homework club, and credit recovery can help students who are struggling with their grades and need help to get caught up with school. But all of our extracurricular activities are beneficial, being that they help with students' health or they help students' imagination and vocabulary skills. Extracurricular activities such as music and theater allow students to grow their minds and imagination. And sports such as football, volleyball, basketball, softball, baseball, and track all help students' health. This is why funding for sports is much appreciated to keep kids active and healthy.

Supplies for school include binders, paper, highlighter, markers, sticky notes, pens, pencils, colored pencils, notebook, etc. Teachers are buying half of the supplies for their students for class projects that require things such as Poster Board, glue, tape, and paper. Not including the stuff they have to buy as normal necessities for themselves such as dry erase markers, staples, stapler, tissues, hand sanitizer, cleaning wipes, planners, etc. teachers spend a lot of money, even hundreds of dollars on school supplies for projects, normal classroom supplies, and things for the classrooms, but they can't always spend that much money on supplies.

Throughout the year at our school, we have varieties of sports such as volleyball, cross county, football, basketball, softball, baseball, plus track, and field. Even though some of our students do not play sports or can't keep their grades up to partake, there are still great opportunities for exercise in our physical education classes.

Some things you will learn in P.E are: how to play volleyball, how to dribble, and mostly how to have fun while exercising. When you get into high school there are chances to take a weight lifting class as well.

Sports are open to 6th through 12th grade. Our middle school teams are 6th through 8th and our high school teams are 9th through 12th. In middle school, there is usually an A and B team, while in high school there is a junior varsity team and varsity team. Every-

one is given equal opportunities to play. Sports are a great activity provided for students to exercise, have fun and make sure to keep their grades up.

Our school offers these opportunities to students because kids need to stay active while having fun. Each kid should have at least 30 minutes of exercise. Without school support, some students would struggle to stay active and healthy. To sum it up, staying active and healthy is very important for our well-being, and in Idaho City, there are plenty of opportunities for students to have fun while also getting exercise.

As you can see, we have a glorious school with a lot of amazing features. The staff works hard for the students to have a great learning experience, and many students appreciate that.





Boise County had a judgment against it for violating the Federal Fair Housing Act in December 2010. The reason for the violation was the denial of the Alamar Ranch Development which was denied by the County Commissioners. The judgement against Boise County was \$5.4 million.

Mary took office in January of 2011.

The County filed a Petition for Bankruptcy in March 2011, seven weeks into her first term as Boise County Clerk. Just imagine the amount of administrative work that came from that violation.

The matter was heard in the Federal Bankruptcy Court in June 2011. Mary testified, along with others, in a three day hearing. In September 2011, the Federal Judge decided that Boise County was not bankrupt and ordered the County to use any and all operating funds, to pay the \$5.4 million. The County entered into a Warrants Payable agreement for debt payment at a high rate of interest, as there was no other lawful way at that time, to pay the debt.

In the 2012 legislative session, the elected officials of Boise County testified multiple times before the legislators, asking them to create a law which would allow Boise County to enter into a bond issuance for debt service. The legislators did so but with the caveat that Boise County hold an election so that our voters could essentially approve the law that was created. It passed. Boise County made the last payment in September of 2019.

I do not believe this would have happened if Mary Prisco had not been our County Clerk.





Unapproved Airfield in Garden Valley?

Last fall, after observing low flying aircraft over the South Fork of the Payette River in the vicinity of the old Black Bear Subdivision (on the south side of the river across from Gallagher Creek). I drove east from Garden Valley to see if aircraft were landing in the former subdivision. I was surprised to discover a new aircraft hangar, an airplane, and an airfield where previously there were only fenced horse pastures.

Because Boise County planning and zoning ordinances require a conditional use permit before a

new airfield is built in the county, I called the Planning and Zoning Office to find out when a permit was issued for the project. I was told initially that a permit is not required to improve an existing airfield. When I explained that there was never an airfield on the property during the 41 years I have lived near the new airstrip, I was told that someone from the office would provide me with the information I requested. On the 17th of February this year, I received a voicemail from the Planning and Zoning office telling me that someone would call me in a few days. I never received that

response.

After about a month, I called the District 2 commissioner with my request for information on whether a permit was approved for the airfield. He promised that he would get an answer for me within two days. Although I have since made at least four attempts to reach him, he has not responded. Early in April, I again called the Planning and Zoning Office, and was promised that someone would provide the information to me, again, within two days. As of May 9, I am still waiting for that response.
