Dedicated Site for Veterans' Memorial and Wall of Heroes

Stormy weather couldn't stop the Horseshoe Bend Veterans Memorial dedication ceremony on May 30, 2022. Memorial Day dawned wet and rainy, but miraculously, Mother Nature halted the deluge and the dedication at the proposed Wood's Memorial Park was a huge success!

estimated crowd of around four hundred individuals braved the weather to honor our country's fallen heroes and take part in the dedication ceremony of the future site of the Horseshoe Bend Veterans Memorial and Wall of Heroes. There were members of the Veterans and Patriots Association, Combat Vets, Horseshoe Bend firefighters, Horseshoe Bend Swift Water Rescue team, Horseshoe Bend EMTs, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Boise and Ada County Sheriff Departments, and veterans from all over the Treasure Valley and the community of Horseshoe Bend.

The project has been a labor of love between the Horseshoe Bend Valley Chamber of Commerce and the surrounding community for almost two years.

The 25th Army Band played for the assembled crowd and after an opening prayer by Horseshoe Bend Valley Christian Pastor Marty Broom, the Young Marines Honor Guard raised the flag with assistance from the Veterans and Patriots Association and Combat Vets.

Unfortunately, the weather grounded the 190th Air Force Fighter Squadron, so the much anticipated flyover was put on hold. Dave Nudo sang the National Anthem before Colonel Tom Shuler, Idaho Air National Guard, took the stage and recounted his experiences with call signs and the meanings behind them.

Celebrating Veterans on Memorial Day

blustery day greeted a crowd of about a hundred people who gathered to remember their loved ones who served in the United States Armed Forces. There were fifty-four new bricks dedicated at the Garden Valley Veterans Memorial Wall.

Hosting the ceremony was Charles Snurkowski and Cathy Garner. The audience joined in saying the Pledge of Allegiance, then a beautiful rendition of the Star Spangled Banner was performed by Miss Kendall Williamson.

Pastor Brian Smith of the Crouch Community Church gave the invocation, remembering fallen friends and family and praying for better health for those who could not attend the ceremony on Monday.

Snurkowski gave a brief history of Memorial Day, formerly known as Dedication Day, and Lois Davis told the story

of the inspiration of the Memorial Wall, which led to a total of three hundred and six bricks placed so far on the wall.

Gold Star families were recognized and the fifty-four new bricks were acknowledged with present family members telling their stories.

Cathy Garner read part of the poem, "We Remember" in which she added some appropriate verses (the author of the poem is unknown) as the crowd joined in the chorus, "We Remember."

Superintendent and veteran Randy Thompson had a family emergency in Georgia and could not play Taps in person, so Kea Loveland provided the sound system to play Taps, followed by a minute of silence and reflection.

Taps is normally played at 3PM, but on this day there was an exception. The flag was raised back up to full staff at 3PM, as decreed.






