However, I do find my place to be in the chutes, as much as I do love sunset rides and running flags, I'd rather tie myself to an untamed animal in hope of getting a buckle. City Council Meeting in Idaho City

IDAHO CITY -- The regular meeting of the City of Idaho City Council was held on Wednesday June 8, 2022. Mayor Everhart called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Councilmembers David Martin, Mari Adams, and Tom Secor were present. Councilmember Ashley Elliott was absent. After the pledge, the minutes were approved and the bills payable from May 26, through June 8, 2022 were paid in the amount of \$19,356.59.

The meeting went to New Business with a request from Susan Kelly, who lives on

Hill Road, to move her property out of the Historic District designation. Rhonda Jameson, Idaho City Historic Commission Chair indicated that Kelly would need to have building plans approved by Planning and Zoning, and then submit a "Certificate of Appropriateness," and once that is approved the property would be eligible for removal from the Historic District. At that point, the request to be removed from the Historic District can be presented to City Council for final approval. City Attorney Callahan will work with City Clerk Ptak to hold joint meetings between the approval committees.

There were no ordinances and solutions, and the meeting went into updates from Public Works.

Director Tami Claus of Public Works reported that the fixing of potholes on Main Street was nearly completed. Mayor Everhart will contact Curtis Dill from the county to finalize Boise County's plan for repairing Montgomery Street.

Councilmember Martin inquired about vandalism at the skate park as well as the cleaning of the bathrooms at the skate park. Public Works Di-

rector Claus and Mayor Everhart will discuss this with the custodial staff.

The bathrooms at the Visitor's Center are locked at night to curtail vandalism. This is the only option available currently.

Councilmember Tom Secor thanked Public Works Director Claus for her help connecting water and sewer to the tiny homes property on Hwy. 21.

Councilmember Mari Adams stated that there is an urgent need for volunteer ambulance drivers.

Councilmember David Martin stated that he has family complications back East and will be leaving on August 1, 2022.

Updates from Mayor Ken Everhart involved the Ray Robison Community Hall. He indicated that there have been at least two instances recently that the Community Hall has been rented and the hall was not cleaned prior to their event. The quality of cleaning by the custodial staff needs to be addressed. It was discussed there might be a need for a part time cleaning person dedicated to cleaning the Community Hall after rentals conclude.

It was discussed that the \$50.00 refundable cleaning

deposit should be increased to 150.00 - 200.00 to help ensure that those renting the Community Hall leave it in a clean state.

Mayor Everhart made a recommendation to refund at least 50% of the rental fees to the two families that rented the hall last weekend and needed to spend multiple hours to clean the facility prior to their event. Council will decide at the next council meeting.

He continued, "the power bill for the Community Hall is \$2,946.41 and the revenue for renting the Community Hall last year was \$2,977.42. The rental fees for the Community Hall are not enough to pay for the overall operations of the building. Mayor Everhart would like City Council to consider increasing the rental fees to cover the yearly maintenance and operations of the building. Any fees that are raised more than 5% will require a public hearing. Any change in fees will be set by a resolution. Additional revenue and expense data will be presented at the next City Council meeting to discuss an appropriate fee to make the Community Hall self-sustaining.

Meeting was adjourned at 6:50 p.m.

BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS Transcribed by Eileen Capson

June 14, 2022

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Robert "Ted" Holmes, and Ryan Stirm (via phone)

Pledge of Allegiance CONSTITUENT INPUT: An individual who has owned property in Garden Valley for 41 years spoke about a property with a new airfield in 2021, located on the south side of the South Fork of the Payette River. He said there was no conditional use permit for this land use and that the Planning and Zoning office seemed to think it was an existing landing strip. He quoted Boise County code and the process for conditional use (CUP) permits.

Planning and Zoning Administrator Alex Gross said, "I have former county commissioners telling me that aircraft have been landing there for a long time. I don't have any proof either way. I don't have any proof right now to take any action. And if I did, *I would do so*."

Commissioner Holmes relayed that he had talked to the Idaho State Aeronautics Division, "And they said, look, we have planes that land backfield, as long as it's not federal forestry and it's private property, we can do nothing about it." The constituent acknowledged that as a pilot himself, this was not an FAA (Federal Aviation Administration) issue, "this is a Boise County land use issue." Holmes interrupted, "It's a private property issue."

Another neighbor in Garden Valley said that to his recollection there had never been an airstrip there. Holmes asked if planes had been seen landing there. The neighbor, also a pilot, recalled that there was one time a plane ran out of fuel and landed there.

The neighbor was also concerned about "Deadwood Dam," the efficiency rating, and his concern for the dam failure. He said that could cause an enormous amount of water to move through Garden Valley and Horseshoe Bend. He asked if there was any plan with the emergency management. Sheriff Scott Turner said there is an emergency operations plan for Deadwood Dam, should there be a dam failure.

Another constituent from Centerville commented about a personal hardship, threats, and presented a paper to the commissioners for the record.

Commissioner Holmes readdressed the first constituent regarding the airstrip in Garden Valley. He suggested that if a meeting were held by Planning and Zoning, that the landowner be included in that process. Holmes said, "And you know how I feel about private property - Don't tell me what I can and can't do with my property... Like I said, the feds and the state level, they could care less." The individual countered, "If you don't like the planning and zoning ordinance, which clearly outlines the process, then we need to abolish the county planning and zoning ordinance." Commissioner Holmes replied, "Yes, sir, and we could probably do that as county commissioners, could change that ordinance."

Commissioner Twilegar

moved the conversation on and thanked everyone for their time.

[June 20, 2022: P&Z Administrator Alex Gross said that the P&Z Commission met last Thursday, but there was no discussion of this airfield on the agenda. "Currently, there is no plan or application to discuss this at the commission."]

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from June 22nd. The motion carried. (Commissioner Holmes apologized for a Superman theme song ringtone.) Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from June 7th. This was also approved.

ROAD DEPARTMENT: Clerk Mary Prisco said, "The county attempted, they went through the process to officially abandon that old Highway 55, but for some reason, and I do not know why - this was back in 2003, '04, or the early two thousands - they actually had all the paperwork done up, but then we didn't finalize it."

Curtis Dill with the county road department said, "We maintain the upper section and we maintain the lower section," but there is a section that is not maintainable. He said the ground is unstable. The county has always treated it as "abandoned." Dill said, "everybody's buying property along there without knowing, and then they get there and see that [signs saying that the road is not maintained]. There's just no way that we can keep up with that section."

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for a personnel issue and indigent. Chairman Twilegar discussed hiring a contractor to assist and put back the data for the county when the server went down. [Much of the meeting was inaudible with feedback echo, the audio randomly skipping chunks of the recording, unable to play portions, and stopping intermittently.]

COMPUTER ARTS: Commissioner Twilegar would like to put on the agenda time for their "team to get rid of those guys." Assessor Chris Juszczak said it was like the computer software company was holding them "hostage." Twilegar would like to do some preliminary brainstorming.

Adjourned at 12.08 pm.

draft wastewater reuse permit for Avimor Water Reclamation Company

BOISE COUNTY – The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) seeks comment on a draft wastewater reuse permit for Avimor Water Reclamation Company.

The facility owns and operates a private municipal wastewater treatment plant and municipal Class B recycled water reuse facilities in the Avimor Planned Community, approximately ten miles north of the city of Eagle, Idaho. In 2020, the facility reused approximately 23.6 million gallons of recycled water on approximately 22 acres of landscaped

DEQ seeks comment on common areas interspersed within the community, along with rapid infiltration basins during the winter non-growing season.

> The draft permit would continue the limits and monitoring established during permit M-211-03. It would also increase the allowable hydraulic loading rate to the rapid infiltration basins, which would allow the facility to operate at the basins' original design capacity as opposed to the reduced capacity required by previous permits as a safety factor for a new treatment system.

> The draft permit also establishes monitoring requirements, limits on nutrient and hydraulic loading, and conditions established by DEQ to protect public health and the environment. As part of the

permitting process, the facility was required to show that its operation would not cause public health or environmental concerns.
