

Clay Tucker is Appointed as Boise County Commissioner

BOISE COUNTY – On June 21st, Governor Brad Little announced his appointment of Commissioner Elect Clay Tucker as Boise County Commissioner for District 2.

Tucker was the elected Republican nominee for the Boise County Commissioner District 2 seat and was scheduled to take office in January 2023. However, due to the premature resignation of District 2 Commissioner Robert "Ted" Holmes, Governor Little has appointed Tucker to assume the full duties for a Boise County Commissioner starting on July 1, 2022. He will be sworn in at their next regularly scheduled meeting on July 5th.

Vacancies in the boards of county commissioners are filled through an appointment by the Governor of Idaho, which is addressed in State Idaho Code 59-906A. The Boise County Republican Central Committee submitted the names of three candidates to Governor Little for consideration.

Commissioner Elect Tucker responded for comment: "First off, I would like to thank Governor Little for appointing me to the Board of County Commissioners. I will be sworn in and begin my term on July 5th. I would also like to thank the residents of Boise County for all your support and I look forward to working with and representing all of you."

City Council Meeting in Idaho City

IDAHO CITY -- The regular City Council meeting was held on Wednesday June 22, 2022. Those attending were Mayor Ken Everhart, David Martin, Ashley M. Elliott, and Mari Adams. Absent was Tom Secor. After the Pledge of Allegiance, the council approved of the minutes from June 8, 2022, and approved Mayor Everhart to pay the bills from June 9, 2022 through June 22, 2022 in the amount of \$38,138.09.

They began by discussing a checklist for the 4th of July which was submitted by the Idaho City Fire Protection District and included the 4th of July Parade and fireworks.

The event list begins at 9:30 with the parade in the high school parking lot, and goes until midnight when the fireworks are cleaned up on the football field. The city council approved the event checklist.

There was not a report from the Engineer of Mountain Waterworks regarding "water rights" update. The council expects to hear something at the next meeting in July.

Under New Business, the council discussed the unclean conditions regarding the Ray Robison Community Hall. When an individual rented the hall for a graduation party, it had not been cleaned properly and the family had to spend hours cleaning it before

they could hold their activity. Mayor Ken Everhart and the councilmembers agreed that a refund of half the payment should be given back to to the family in the amount of \$83.48. Mayor Ken Everhart suggested that the cleaning deposit should be raised to alleviate this problem in the future. "This same situation has happened within 2 months; we have a \$50.00 cleaning fee in place, but to some people \$50.00 is not important and they just go. My recommendation to this, is to raise the cleaning fee to at least \$150.00 to make it worth their while to actually clean the place, and if they don't, then that covers the cost of us coming in and have to clean the building." After consulting City Attorney, Joan Callahan the City Council clarified that this was increasing a fee, not raising the price or profit for the city. Councilman David Martin made a motion to increase the cleaning fee, Councilmember Mari Adams seconded the motion, and it carried. It will now cost \$150.00 for the cleaning fee, for anyone who rents the Community Hall.

Dana Zoch from the Theater and Publications/Audio Video production at the Idaho City Middle and High School made a presentation to sponsor Historic Ghost Tours at the Pioneer Cemetery in October 2022. The City Council woould need a checklist submitted as an action item, before this could be reviewed.

There were no ordinances or p.m.

resolutions to discuss.

Employee Updates, Mayor Everhart reported that Tami Claus has been patching Main Street, has the Rodeo ground ready and will start watering the dusty roads as needed.

City Clerk Nancy Ptak reported that the budget is still being adjusted and worked on by herself and the Councilmembers.

Under Water and Sewer updates, the City Clerk, reported that the City Police will be serving delinquent sewer accounts.

Citizen comments, Doug Pottinger, inquired about his parking lot. He was informed that Tami Claus and Chief of Police Mark Otter will help to keep people off the parking lot when they are working on it.

Meting adjourned at 7:02 p.m.



BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Transcribed by Eileen Capson

The Boise County Commissioners' meeting was cancelled on Tuesday, June 21st, due to no quorum. Commissioners Holmes and Stirm were not present and/or could not be reached.

June 23, 2022 - Special Meeting

Present: Commissioner Steven Twilegar and Ryan Stirm (via phone call)

Chairman Twilegar brought the meeting to order, "this special meeting – we didn't have a quorum last time, so there's certain things that we have to do."

AGREEMENTS AND GRANTS: Chairman Twilegar said the first thing they would talk about was the T-Mobile agreement. Sheriff Scott Turner said the agreement is so they could get the government pricing, which he's already reviewed and approved. "We're going to switch from Verizon to T-Mobile. The reason for that is that the hotspots for the computers in the patrol cars, using the hotspots on our phones is not working. We put hotspot devices in the trucks." Sheriff Turner added, "We met with T-Mobile, they offer all the same government services that Verizon does, government wise with tower priority and everything else, at an extremely reduced rate."

Commissioner Twilegar made a motion to approve the T-Mobile agreement, it was seconded by Commissioner

Stirm, and passed.

RESOLUTION-18: Clerk Mary Prisco asked that the board approve this bill for Sunroc for road paving. She said it would amend the budget for the Road and Bridge Fund. She said it was for their paving projects "for the \$150,000 additional, or amendment, to Old Emmett Road." She said the budget needed to be adjusted to "bring it up to where it needs to be" from the original bid work. Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve Boise County Resolution-18, as explained by the clerk, which was seconded and passed.

RESOLUTION-19: Clerk Prisco explained that the next resolution was to amend the IT budget, which includes the computers and the monitors from Dell. She said there was a budget amendment for FY2021 for this purchase, "but then, of course, we didn't see new computers for almost a year. So, this is basically a repeat of the budget amendment that we did last year. Just for the record, we're using funds that we received under the CARES Act allocation that were received fiscal year 2021."

Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve Resolution 2022-19 for the IT department, for computers and monitors from Dell, "partially funded by the CARES Act." Commissioner Stirm seconded and the motion passed.

COMPUTER ARTS: Assessor Chris Juszczak asked for employee additional hours

to be approved and said that Computer Arts has been working with them. Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve an additional up to ten hours for both the Treasurer and Assessor's departments to hire a consultant, "because Computer Arts won't." All were in favor.

DEMAND WARRANTS: Clerk Prisco said it was a "lesser amount" than what the budget amendment was for Dell computers, because there is additional equipment that has been ordered but has not been received yet. Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the invoice in the amount of \$63,765 for what the county has received thus far. The motion passed.

The second demand warrant was described as a partial payment for a station for county vehicles to fuel up. Sheriff Turner said, "It's 75%, they've got everything ordered in." Most of the parts are in already, with the exception of the tanks. The sheriff added that, "The road department had the pad prepped, their concrete guy and the electrician are going to work with Curtis [Dill – Boise County Road Department]. It sounds like they're going to pour concrete pretty soon."

Chairman Twilegar made a motion to pay a portion of what the county owes them for their new fuel tank systems in the amount of \$107, 545. Commissioner Stirm seconded and the motion carried.

Adjourned until June 28, 2022.






If participation is high, the program may continue for subsequent years, if funding is available.


be there and the Army Honor Guard team will perform a short ceremony for this Vietnam War veteran. Please come





First Annual National Wildland Firefighter Day is Announced



BOISE COUNTY - Wildland firefighting is difficult, physically arduous work, often largely undertaken out of the public eye. Every year, thousands of federal, state, local, Tribal, military and contract firefighters, and support personnel respond to wildland fires across the U.S. As a result of climate change and other factors, these wildfires are increasingly larger and more complex, placing additional demands on a dedicated workforce.

In honor of our nation's wildland firefighters who answer the call throughout the year, the National Interagency Fire Center's Fire Management Board is proud to proclaim July 2, "National Wildland Firefighter Day." The board represents the national fire programs for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Bureau of Land Management, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, National Park Service and USDA Forest Service, along with partners including the National Association of State Foresters, U.S. Fire Administration, the National Weather Service, and the Department of Defense. The July 2 date will hereafter be designated each year to honor the important work of wildland firefighters.

"Today we pause to recognize our dedicated wildland firefighters before they head out once again to fight larger and more intense wildfires across the West," said Jerry Perez, Forest Service Director of Fire and Aviation Management. "These dedicated men and women are working to protect communities, private property, and public lands in increasingly challenging conditions, and we are grateful for their work."

"National Wildland Firefighter Day" will occur annually during the previously established, "Wildland Firefighter Week of Remembrance," (June 30-July 6), during which wildland firefighters review the lessons of previous fatality fires and incorporate those safety principles into firefighting today. "National Wildland Firefighter Day" is the first designation of a day specifically for wildland firefighters.

"While we support and appreciate wildland fire personnel today and every day, National Wildland Firefighter Day is designed to recognize the hard work and devotion of all wildland firefighters and support personnel who are the backbone of the wildland fire community," said Grant Beebe, Bureau of Land Management As-

sistant Director, Fire and Aviation Management.

On average, wildland firefighters respond to nearly 63,000 wildland fires every year across the U.S. Factors such as drought and wildfires in the wildland-urban interface have led to increasingly complex and challenging fire activity that starts earlier in the year and lasts later into the fall. Despite these conditions, wildland firefighters have remained dedicated and resilient – every year, they save lives, property, communities, infrastructure, and precious natural and cultural resources.

"Firefighters are integral to state operations, including those we rely on to help us from our federal and local interagency partners, private fire service and Tribal nations," said George Geissler, Washington State Forester. "We could not do this alone."

National Wildland Firefighter Day will offer an opportunity to reflect on those who have been lost during wildland firefighting while recognizing the on-going work of all federal, state, local, Tribal, military and contract wildland firefighters and support personnel.






