POWER SHUTOFFS?



Idaho Power crews are working throughout the county to tie in an old line from Horseshoe Bend, bringing it through Garden Valley, up Alder Creek to Placerville, and to Idaho City. This will provide another route for power, should one line go down, and result in fewer power outages. The foreman said that the work is not expected to be finished until late October.

BOISE COUNTY -- *What are these rumors of a power shutoff?* Paris G. Dickerson, of Idaho Power's Economic and Community Development, explained that a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) is "when a company like Idaho Power proactively turns off power to a certain area where wildfire risk is high due to extreme weather conditions. There are no outages planned

at this time." "A PSPS outage is an effort to protect our customers, communities, employees, and equipment from wildfire. A PSPS is a last resort to prevent wildfires in extreme weather conditions—especially high winds and dry vegetation. From trimming trees to wrapping poles in fire-resistant mesh to maintaining and inspecting our equipment, wildfire mitigation

is part of year-round, everyday operations at Idaho Power. You can find additional information, including the PSPS zones in Boise County, by visiting www.idahopower.com/pssp. Also, we highly recommend that our customers review ways to prepare for wildfire season (tips on that same website) and update their contact information so we can reach them in case of outages."

GARDEN VALLEY -- In the summer of 2022, many libraries across the country will celebrate oceans and rivers in their summer reading programs. The slogan "Oceans of Possibilities" was chosen by library professionals to help inspire children of all ages to discover there are oceans of possibilities in their life.

The Garden Valley District Library participating in this Summer Reading Program. The library is hosting a lot of Summer Reading activities. So far, kids (and adults) have been making faux stained glass, yarn turtles, sock octopuses, a stick together poster, and coffee filter sun catchers. Saturday, July 23 the Forest Service brought a visit to the library with their watershed trailer.

Hannah R. Adams, Hydrologic Technician at the Forest Service, drove from Emmett to Garden Valley with their watershed trailer. The trailer was filled with special sand and kids could build mountains and meadows, beaver dams, etc. Whole stories were built in this trailer. Water was then put in and rivers and oceans became visible. Hannah Adams is a great storyteller and shared with a lot of humor interesting facts about watersheds: how water moves across the landscape, how floods affect streams and/or human habitat, and what happens when there are rocks, trees in the way of the water.

Sarah Jorgenson, Fire Prevention Technician at the Forest Service, is the person who brought this program to the library. She initiated a couple of dates at the library where the Forest Service will educate people about some important issues. On Friday, July 29, there will be a river safety class for kids (and adults) at the library, between 11 am and 1 pm. The grand finale will be Saturday, August 13, between 11 am and 1 pm when Smokey the Bear will celebrate his birthday with a big party at the Garden Valley District Library!

July 19, 2022

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Clay Tucker, and Ryan Stirm (via phone)

Pledge of Allegiance

CONSTITUENT INPUT: Betty Jean Mollenkopf spoke about a meeting of Republican delegates (*see letter to the editor on page 8*).

Debra Jackson spoke about reducing "crossover voting." She said, "the way that they're going to do it now is they're going to look at the last 25 months, you can't cross over. So, what that does is it protects our Primary, because that's when the Republicans want to nominate *their delegates* to go to the General [Election], and we don't want a watered down individual selected for us. I think it's going to be fabulous!"

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from Tuesday, July 12th. The motion carried.

HIGHWAY 17: Prosecutor Adam Strong spoke about the improvements needed for the state of Idaho to take over each of the three sections of Highway 17. "From our perspective, we have completed all the work required in section one." Prosecutor Strong continued, "The problem from my view is – the contract was not well thought out before it was signed." He said there were no details or dates listed. He recommended that the board talk with someone from ITD who has the authority to make some decisions and redo that contract.

CUMO MINE: There is no

further information.

CERTIFICATE OF RESIDENCY: Through a motion, an individual was approved a certificate of residency.

LICENSE RENEWAL: Commissioner Tucker motioned to approve the license application from the Gold Mine. The motioned carried with an aye from Commissioner Stirm. Commissioner Twilegar abstained.

Commissioner Tucker also motioned for a brewery catering permit and Stirm second. Twilegar abstained from the vote and the motion passed.

ASSESSOR: Chris Juszcak spoke of corrected notices from last year that have populated over to 2022. As the Boise County Board of Equalization, Commissioner Twilegar read a list of parcel numbers, new total assessed value, and new taxable value.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session to discuss pending litigation and risk management. [Time 9:30am to 9:52am] Coming back into session, Chairman Twilegar said that no action was required.

IMPACT FEES ASSESSMENTS: An individual presenting spoke about the growth of Idaho counties and the costs accrued by fire and EMS. She went through a slide presentation, and addressed operating expenses and capital improvements.

Representatives from the Garden Valley Fire were present and expressed concern for the growth. Colton McCarthy, Wilderness Ranch Fire Chief, had some concerns about the

initial costs. There was also a representative from Horseshoe Bend Fire.

COUNTYWIDE AMBULANCE SERVICE: Commissioner Twilegar opened the conversation with the different fire departments regarding their thought on a countywide ambulance service. "The benefit, as I see it, is instead of just having volunteers, you are going to have people who are paid and are *obligated* to be there, as opposed to just volunteers. *Not just volunteers*, we'll always have volunteers – Thank God!"

Commissioner Tucker was concerned about providing the same level of service to everyone in the county, if it were a countywide taxing district. "To me it seems impossible. Way too much money."

Commissioner Twilegar agreed, "I just don't think we're going to have enough people. We're still going to be scraping by, because we don't want to tax the hell out of people."

PUBLIC HEARING: A subdivision within a subdivision was discussed, along with water supply. The planning and zoning department recommended that the board approve the preliminary plat plan that was originally for an assisted living facility, but is now going to be developed for homes. They plan on moving the assisted living facility closer to the highway.

There were no comments from the public.

Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the Avimor preliminary plat. All ayes and the motion passed.

The preliminary plat for Avimor Phase Two of 395 acres with 283 proposed "units" and a common area. There would be access from Highway 55. There are some commercial businesses that are being considered, including a vet clinic.

There was no public present.

Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the Avimor Two preliminary plat including the findings of fact and conditions of approval from Boise County's Planning and Zoning. Commissioner Tucker second and there were all ayes, the motion carried.

Highway 21 Accident

BOISE COUNTY -- Idaho State Police is investigating a vehicle collision that occurred at 4:11 P.M., on Friday, July 22nd, 2022 on SH21 at milepost 14, in Ada County.

A 68-year-old male from Boise was driving southbound on SH21 in a Chrysler Town & Country, where he drove off the road and the vehicle rolled. Passengers in the ve-

hicle were also a 39-year-old male from Boise, a 71-year-old female from Boise and two juveniles. Everyone was wearing their seatbelts and the juveniles were in their car seats. All occupants were transported to the hospital by ground ambulance.

This incident remains under investigation by the Idaho State Police.

Boise County Drowning

BOISE COUNTY -- A drowning occurred at Spring Shores on Sunday, July 24, when a paddleboarder fell off his board and tried unsuccessfully to get back on, close to the pier. Witnesses dived in and pulled the man out and began CPR. Ada County para-

medics responded, continued CPR, but were unable to revive the victim.

Boise County's Chief Deputy Coroner Mike Johnson said it was ruled an accidental drowning. Merrill Davis, 49, of Boise was not wearing a lifejacket.

Elmore & Boise County Sheriff

ELMORE COUNTY SHERIFF -- NEWS RELEASE

On July 21, 2022, at approximately 1:50 p.m., Elmore County Dispatch received a report of a possible deceased individual that was located in the Wilderness Recreation Area at the northern part of Elmore County. Boise County Sheriff's Office was first advised by the reporting party, who had ridden out north towards Boise County to advise emergency services. Information that Elmore County dispatch received was that the two males were riding on mules in the Wilderness Area approximately ½ mile from the Elmore County and Boise County line. Boise

County was told that the victim was thrown from the mule and had sustained a possible head injury. Lifesaving methods were performed by the friend with no avail. In this situation utilizing air assistance was the most feasible resource due to the remoteness and deadfall from trees on the trail. The distance was approximately 9.5 miles from the Queens River trail head to where the victim was located making a foot recovery extremely difficult.

With the help of the Boise County Sheriff's Office, Boise County Search and Rescue as well as Elmore County Sheriff's Office Deputies and the Elmore County Coroner they were able to utilize a privately owned Helicopter company

that aided help in getting the victim safely off of the mountain and released to the Elmore County Coroners custody. The victim is only going to be identified as an 82-year-old male, his identity is not being released at this time until next of kin can be notified.

This is an ongoing investigation.

No further information will be released.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Boise County's Sheriff Scott Turner agreed that it was a "challenging recovery" and would not have been possible without the collaboration with Boise County Search and Rescue and Elmore County.

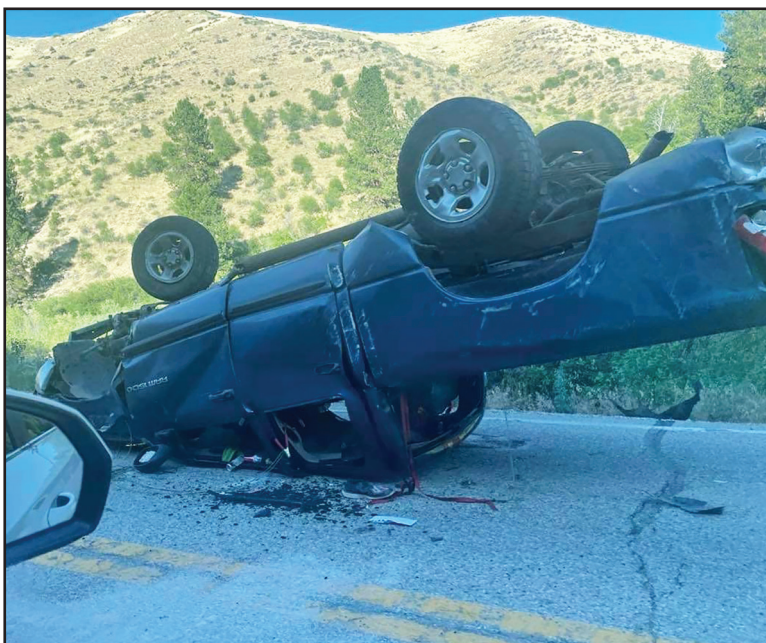
Accident on Highway 21




