BOISE COUNTY -- Clay Tucker was sworn into office on July 5th to serve as interim Boise County Commissioner for District 2, appointed by Governor Brad Little. He will serve out the term of Robert Holmes, at which time he will assume his elected term of four years, starting in January of 2023. Commissioner Tucker, a lifetime resident of Boise County, raised in Garden Valley, received just over 40% of all the votes for county commissioner between five candidates. He's dedicated to a "common sense approach for preserving our values and way of life." He has a background in logging, construction, and geotechnical drilling.

Illegally Parked Cars will be Towed from Robie Creek

BOISE COUNTY -- There has been a longtime problem with visitors to Robie Creek Park illegally parking along the roadway and impeding traffic. Boise County Sheriff Scott Turner says the department does not have enough deputies to sit all weekend to ticket illegally parked vehicles and ask them to move. He says they have been parking right in the middle of Robie Creek Road.

Over the past several years, there has been a sharp increase in the number of recreationalists who use Robie Creek Park, where access to the Lucky Peak Reservoir water is free.

According to the Sheriff's Office, the Army Corps of Engineers has refused to put in any oversight, management, or institute fees to access the park as they have done at other locations along the reservoir. There has also been expressed concerns from the Robie Creek Volunteer Fire Department; should the roadway be blocked and emergency vehicles not permitted to respond and precious time is lost, there could be a tragic situation for Boise County residents.

Sheriff Turner asked that this be put in the Corps of Engineers' press release: "Any vehicle in contact with the roadway pavement may be removed. Deputies can order a tow on-the-spot and are not required to attempt to seek out or warn the registered owner. The Boise County Sheriff's Office can be reached at (208) 392-4411 to learn where the vehicle was removed to. The park is in an area without cellular communication. Free for public use, an emergency phone is provided at the entrance of Robie Creek Park which makes 911 calls in addition to free local calls."

Sheriff's Corner SCAM Alert!!

BOISE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE -- Scammers are calling Boise County residents, falsely representing themselves as a deputy, and advising residents they have an outstanding arrest warrant. The scammers are then asking the resident to pay a balance so that a sheriff's deputy doesn't show up to their door to arrest them. These particular scammers are using an application that makes it look like a Boise County sheriff phone number is calling. The scammers are instructing the residents to buy gift cards to pay off the balance or they will be arrested today.

1) The Sheriff's office is never going to ask you to pay us money. Any citations or court fees will be paid to the court. You can pay the court with cash, check, or credit card.

2) Scammers ask you to pay them with western union, green dot cards, iTunes cards, or something other than check, cash, or credit card.

3) If you do have a warrant, deputies will show up to your door to let you know in person that you have a warrant for your arrest.

Other scams that are popular in this area that ask you to pay using gift cards or money transfer:

Idaho Power Scam - Idaho Power will turn off your power in the next hour unless you pay them the balance using gift cards.

Rental Scam - On new rental, the scammer will ask you to pay first and last months rent on an apartment/house that isn't theirs to rent.

Craigslist Scam - Scammer offers to pay you more than your asking price if you will send them the overage via Western Union money transfer.

BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

June 28, 2022

Pledge of Allegiance

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Robert "Ted" Holmes, and Ryan Stirm (via phone)

CONSTITUENT INPUT:

A constituent talked about posting on social media about "the zoo" at Robie Creek Park and said she had spoken with the Sheriff. "People are complaining that it's a safety hazard, in trying to get in and out... people blowing up rafts and paddleboards moving throughout the street, parking in front of the mailboxes, etc." There was concern from the Robie Creek Volunteer Fire Department that their response time could be impacted.

Chairman Twilegar stated: "For the record, this is nothing new." He said there was talk of closing Robie Creek and no help has come from the federal government (owners of the park). "We have a couple plans; we've got to do something." He discussed "substantial increases in fines," towing, and maybe even barriers.

MINUTES: The minutes from June 14th were motioned and approved.

COMPUTER ARTS CONTRACT: "My position on this is pretty clear. They've refused to help us, but we're paying them," Chairman Twilegar said. He talked about getting rid of the contract and billing them for the office support hours.

Prosecutor Adam Strong spoke about the one-sided contract, "they have waved all liabilities." He recounted that the licensing was about \$52,000 a year, software between \$10,000 and \$11,000 a year, including other fees adds up to about \$70,000 a year that the county pays Computer Arts. Strong said office support was \$10,000 a year. "They kind of know that they are the only game in town, and so they can write these contracts the way they want to write them."

Computer Arts is customized for government in Idaho, so most Idaho counties use them.

The committee will meet on July 12th to discuss other options, during the commissioners' meeting.

ABANDON OLD HIGHWAY 55: Prosecutor Strong advised that there would need to be a public hearing. The commissioners would first need to make a resolution next week.

SOLID WASTE: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve

the application for a collection and transportation license. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Another employee was coming on, which had retired from the Garden Valley School District. To comply with PERCI benefits, commissioners terminated and rehired the employee through two motions.

COMMUNITY JUSTICE: Amanda Leader discussed 10-year-old surge protectors and the difficulty in replacing their batteries because there are so many different models. The purpose is to keep the computers up-and-running.

AGREEMENTS: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the memorandum of understanding between Idaho Department of Lands and Boise County to receive money in the amount of \$240,000 for fire mitigation. "We like that federal money," Twilegar said.

BILLS: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the claims in the amount of \$116,991.78. The motion carried.

SOIL CONSERVATION: An agreement was motioned and approved between Squaw Creek Soil Conservation and Boise County for a "donation agreement" of \$2750.

BILLS: Two AED defibrillator units were purchased, without tax because the county is tax exempt, at the amount of \$3,215.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for indigent issues. [Time 9:43am to 10:25am]

ASSESSOR: Chris Juszczak said the hearing dates are posted online at the boisecounty.us website. Clerk Mary Prisco added that the hearing dates would also appear on the assessment notices.

GRANTS: Some possible grants were reviewed with the grant writer, including discussion on the transportation plan. The grant writer suggested having discussions with "stake holders" and business owners in the region of the county that the work has been proposed for the grant. Chairman Twilegar suggested they coordinate with the chambers of commerce throughout the county.

TREASURER: Gina Turner said they have April and May's 2021 reentered for tax payments. They are working on June, "which is huge," and will probably take a couple of weeks. [The county server had lost all the information when it was corrupted.] "We're slowly making progress," said Turner.

IT: The computer person with

the county said he is working on a plan for backups on computers, and another server.

WASTE: There were sixteen loads of garbage out of Horseshoe Bend this month, even before the final week of June. They are expecting to hit a record.

WEED SPRAYING: Paul Rekow said they have been spraying county roads, had been working on Highway 17, and had most of the roads done in Horseshoe Bend.

PROSECUTOR: There has been an increase in court cases and new cases, but they're getting through those. There are more cases, "where people can't get along with their neighbors," and those take a lot of time. Prosecutor Strong said they have been getting more and more of those.

CLERK: Mary Prisco said that her office is still recovering from the server crash. They are very delayed in getting information to the state of Idaho. That has put the county off the timeline for the annual budget, because they don't know what the property tax revenue will be. Clerk Prisco said, "I feel like we're in a holding pattern with this." She has some concern about this because they need to send that information out to all the taxing districts in the county, so that they in turn can use that in their estimated property tax revenue.

PUBLIC HEARING ON TITLE COMPANY FEES FOR REMOTE ACCESS TO DATABASE: Chairman Twilegar said, for the record, "The reason we're doing this is because some of this equipment is specifically for a title company. So, there's no reason taxpayers should pay that. So, we're going to make people who are making money off of it, pay for it."

There were no public comments.

Prosecutor Strong advised the board regarding the cost.

Chairman Twilegar made a motion to approve this new fee for title companies, \$50 for one user, \$100 for five users per a month in Boise County, effective October 1, 2022. The motion carried.

IDAHO POWER: A representative said there were wildfire impacts, specifically in California, on overhead powerlines. He said, "That's kind of what's led us here. Utilities across the nation, particularly in the western nation, are really starting to take a more proactive approach around what's

called WP, or wildfire management... The goal of Idaho Power's wildfire management plan is that we - our electrical source - is not a source of ignition of a wildfire." He emphasized to the public, because of recent damaging social media posts, "I just want to say that there is not an imminent public safety power shutoff happening." He said this was rather just looking to protect their system and planning. "We're not here today to announce a power safety shutoff, at all!"

The representative said they have contractors staged to probe the Robie Creek, Wilderness Ranch, and Clear Creek area. He said they are doing substantial work to "harden those feeders" - upgrading some of the poles, crossarms, and wire. Those folks will like-

ly be working on this project all summer. This will assist with power reliability and wildfire mitigation.

He said two big obstacles were trees and osprey. Idaho Power hired contractors to trim trees in 2021 and do vegetation controls every year. They organized a safety patrol from Boise searching for problems that occurred over the winter.

He outlined Boise County and "red zones" where topography and certain weather conditions would be of concern. This included Crouch, Garden Valley, and Idaho City as wildfire risk management areas. "If we were to do a public safety shutoff, and I'll talk about why in a second about that, those are the areas - you've got the Wilderness Ranch area, you've

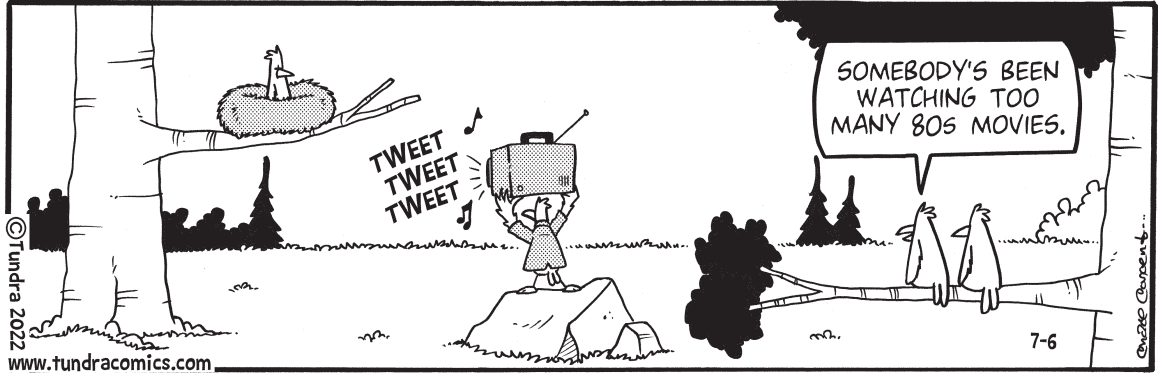

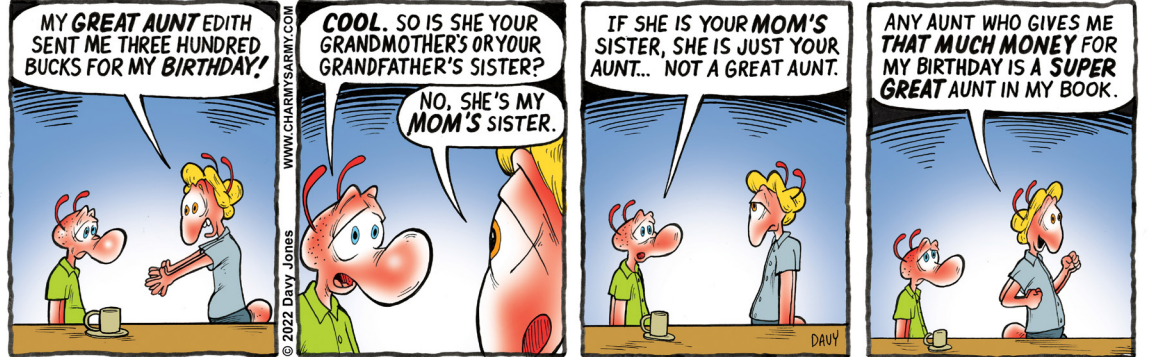

City Council Meeting in Idaho City

IDAHO CITY -- There was a special Idaho City Council Meeting on June 29, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall.

Mayor Ken Everhart called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Councilmembers David Martin, Ashley M. Elliott, Mari Adams, and Tom Secor were present.

Idaho Code 74-204 (4) An agenda may be amended after the start of a meeting upon a motion that states the reason for the amendment and states the good faith reason the agenda item was not included in the original agenda posting.

Final action may not be taken on an agenda item added after the start of a meeting unless an emergency is declared necessitating action at that meeting.

The declaration and justification shall be reflected in the minutes.

The agenda needs to be amended for the following reason: Idaho City's water source Elk Creek is in imminent danger of being shut off because we have a priority date of 1945 and Elk Creek is also serving entities with a 1940 priority date. According to a letter from the District 63 Watermaster, in order to keep the water running we need to rent water from the rental pool.

We are currently using roughly 20 acre-feet a month and are out of priority. In order

to keep the water running, the city will need to rent 80 acre-feet of water from the rental pool. The Watermaster has water set aside for Idaho City. A rental agreement needs to be filled out and sent to the Watermaster. It will cost the City a total of \$1600.00 for the remainder of the water season. This information was sent to Mayor Everhart on June 28, 2022.

3. RESOLUTION NO. 2022-04 WATER BANK LEASE ACTION ITEM

Mike Meyers, Watermaster from Water District 63 explained that the City of Idaho City's priority date for water rights is 1945 and right now they are serving entities with a 1940 date, so the city cannot obtain water rights from the Elk Creek source right now. We can lease water from another source at Lucky Peak

storage on a rental basis that would cost \$1600.00 for the remainder of the water season, ending in October 31, 2022.

Meyers believes that a more permanent water rights source was located on the Mores Creek drainage with an 1863 priority date and would like to contact the City Water Rights Attorney and City Water Engineer to negotiate the details.

Councilmember Tom Secor made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2022-04 Water Bank Lease to lease temporary water from the water pool in the sum of \$1600.00 for the term ending October 31, 2022, Councilmember David Martin seconded. Secor-Aye, Adams-Aye, Elliott-Aye, Martin-Aye. Motion carries.

Adjournment was 6:45 p.m.

got the Placerville/ Star Ranch area, and you've got the above the Crouch area. Those are the areas that that if we were ever to have extreme weather conditions, particularly wind, along with heat, humidity, low humidity, dry fuels, things like that. But specifically, wind events. High, kind of abnormal wind events, those are the areas that we would look at for potential public safety power shutoffs."

"I'm very proud to say that, you know that we've built a new line out of Horseshoe Bend. You're familiar with

that? This last January, we had a heck of a snow event, we were having a lot of tree issues. I'm happy to say that the new line to Placerville is also connected to Idaho City. We have back-fed Idaho City twice since last fall with that new line out of Horseshoe Bend."

The representative said they watch weather patterns and can give a 72-hour notice that there is a concern and potential for a planned outage as a public safety precaution. Idaho Power may call with recorded messages warning customers of the potential outage.

Kirk Bradford Starry
1957 - 2022

Kirk Bradford Starry, 65, passed away at his home on June 29, 2022. He was born on March 14, 1957 in Burley, Idaho. He moved around a lot during his childhood, but ended up back in Idaho and graduated from Twin Falls High School in 1975, where he met the love of his life and future wife, Pam. They married on June 10, 1978 and, in doing so, set in motion a 44-year-long romance. Things weren't always easy, and he never figured out where the laundry hamper was, but he built his family a beautiful home and it was filled with love and laughter.

Kirk had many professions over his career, from building contractor to hotel engineer, but it was not until he decided to give teaching a shot that he found his true calling. Kirk began his teaching career at Me-

ridian Academy, teaching at-risk youth in a non-traditional setting. He truly loved helping students with difficulties that would often be ignored in a traditional school setting. Having summers off with his wife led to travel adventures around the United States, seeing Civil War battlefields and National Parks. It was while he was teaching at Meridian Academy that he was first diagnosed with a rare cancer, mantle cell lymphoma. The prognosis was not good, but Kirk came from a long line of tough bastards and fought back. He won his cancer battle, had both of his knees replaced, and went with Pam to hike the Camino de Santiago, a 500-mile pilgrimage through Spain where they met people from all over the world on what he described fondly as "the world's longest pub crawl."

After years of teaching in a larger school district, Kirk ended up back in his own "neck of the woods" at Idaho City High School teaching history and government and economics to the children of his community, many of them his lifelong friends' children and grandchildren. He loved teaching in a small town and attending the many athletic events. He retired at the end of 2021 with hopes to continue traveling the world. Unfortunately, his cancer returned.

Kirk was a man of many hobbies and projects and pastimes, from collecting comic books to beekeeping to rebuilding classic cars. He was never able to sit still and was always thinking about the next project. He was full of random stories and "useless" knowledge that raised eyebrows. When smartphones came into the mix, his children began to fact check him, convinced he was making something up. Twenty-five percent of the time he was. (You know it's true, Dad!) His lectures at the backyard firepit on life and wine and the history of Western Civilization will be

dearly missed.

He is preceded in death by his father John Starry and his mother Amy Thiebert, his sister-in-law Kristin, and his best friends Leonard Roeber and George Warenko. He is survived by his wife, Pam; his daughter Melissa (Shawn) and son Colin (Kelly); his brothers Ace (Susan), Stuart (Shannon), Carl (Steffani) and his newly found sister, Kathy (Peter); his grandchildren Cooper and Cameron; his sister-in-law Shelly; his brothers-in-law Craig (Sheila) and Michael; his nieces and nephews Cori, Lyndsi, Chadwick, Ariel,

Chase, Natalie, Ryanne, and Jack; his numerous cousins; and many friends he considered family.

He was the best husband, dad, brother, papa, friend, teacher, amateur Jeopardy! player, brew master, vintner, beekeeper, devil's advocate, and comic-book-enthusiast that anyone could ask for. He helped everyone he could. He gave freely. He loved large. DEQ Awards Terrace Lakes with Funds to Study Drinking Water

DEQ awards nearly \$83,000 to three drinking water and wastewater systems across Idaho

BOISE COUNTY — The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) today announced the award of \$82,467 to three drinking water and wastewater systems to help the facilities evaluate system deficiencies and determine necessary upgrades.

The systems include Country Haven Utilities Association Inc., **Terrace Lakes Water Company**, and the city of Juliaetta. These planning grants are funded from the \$2 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds that Governor Little directed to DEQ on August 6, 2021.

“Families, farmers, ranchers, and all Idaho residents rely on clean, efficient water and wastewater systems,” Idaho Governor Brad Little said. “These systems are not only a crucial part of our way of life but our economy as well. Funding for these projects from my Leading Idaho plan aims to ensure that Idaho residents – especially those in our rural communities – can depend on our water and wastewater infrastructure for generations to come.”

Terrace Lakes Water Company – Terrace Lakes Water Company in Boise County was awarded \$30,000 to prepare a drinking water planning study to evaluate the current drinking water system and identify needed improvements. The total eligible project cost is \$60,000, and the remaining \$30,000 will be funded by Terrace Lakes Water Company.

Background

DEQ’s Planning Grant Program provides assistance to eligible wastewater and drinking water systems. These grants are used to develop engineering reports identifying the most cost-effective, environmentally sound method of upgrading a system to achieve and maintain compliance with state and federal standards. Grants cover up to 50% of eligible planning costs, with the remaining cost is the grant recipient’s responsibility.
