Groundbreaking for Micron's Vast Expansion



Idaho Governor Brad Little thanked the employees of Micron and all involved, "This is a logical step, for a great, great company." He added, "We want to keep Idaho as a great place to innovate, but we also have to keep Idaho a great place to live so we can contin-

ue to retain, to grow, and to attract the talent we need for this great company. We want Idaho to continue to thrive. This is going to be great for Micron, it's going to be great for Boise, it's going to be great for Idaho, and most importantly, it's going to be great for America."



Sanjay Mehrotra, President and CEO of Micron took the podium and said, "It really gives me goosebumps when we think about how this place will and I know you are excited as well... Over the coming years,

the desert around us will be completely transformed with our \$15 million dollar investment. The largest private investment ever made in Idaho. be transformed in just the next And this will bring manufacfew years. We are super excited turing back to here in Boise, and will ultimately create 17,000 new jobs in Idaho, in-

cluding 2,000 direct jobs right here in Boise."

Mehrotra continued, "Today, we are proud to make this \$15 billion dollar investment commitment in this new facility to meet the world's future demand for memory. And this transformation from desert to a leading edge memory fab is only possible because of the bipartisan coalition that came together in Washington, DC, with leadership with the Biden administration to pass the CHIPS and Science legislation."

Micron will play a role in meeting the 2030 demand in the memory market, "The revenue is expected to double to more than \$300 billion dollars by the end of this decade."

"This new fab will be a tremendous addition to Micron's global headquarters. The Boise campus is home to our industry leading R&D [research and development], innovation, and it's a center of excellence. It is in fact the only leading edge technology center here in the United States."

The company plans to start construction "promptly," with targeted construction in 2025.

Mehrotra added, "And to say that it's going to be big is a bit of an understatement. By the end of this decade, this clean room will be 600,000 square feet, and I'll give you a comparison. If you're a football fan like me, you would really appreciate that means it will be the size of ten football fields. This will be the largest single clean room ever built in the United States."

He also said the company is concerned about the environment, water treatment, and

"plans to make a one hundred percent renewable electricity supply, as operations grow here." They also plan to invest in the community through the Micron Foundation, and have given over \$100 million dollars in the past twenty years to nonprofits. "Our commitment to invest in the Idaho community, with an emphasis on STEM education in all K through 12, and higher education systems. It also means a focus on reaching under-represented and rural student populations. We want to inspire young minds to build the STEM skills they need to succeed in our technologybased world today."

He concluded, "Together, I really believe that we can realize Micron's vision of transforming how the world uses information to enrich life for all."

BOISE COUNTY -- Our Deputies were busy this Labor Day weekend! With the hot weather, recreationists came up sooner and stayed longer.

From 08/31/2022 to 09/06/2022, Boise County Dispatch generated 252 calls for service (this does not include just general phone calls fielded).

We did not have a single automobile-only accident from Friday to Monday. Though we did have three separate UTV-related accidents resulting in at least four airmeds to transport victims.





As of publication, the Ross Fork Fire had grown to 37,612 acres and had only been 19% contained, even with the rains on Tuesday, September 13th. The fire was started by lightning on August 12th and is near Smiley Creek and Alturas Lake, effecting Blaine and Custer County. There are intermittent Highway 75 road closures, air tankers, fire engines, and several evacuations due to fire danger.



Volleyball: The Horseshoe Bend Mustangs traveled to Meridian on Tuesday, September 6, to play the 2A Western Idaho Conference Cole Valley Christian Chargers (2-4 overall). The Mustangs won all three set matches 25-12, 26-24, and 25-15.

Statistical standouts were senior Annelie Wilson with 22 kills (an attack on the ball which is not returnable by the opposing team), 3 aces (a serve which is unable to be played or returned by the opposing team), 1 block (blocking the ball into the opponent's court leading to a point or side out), and 11 digs (passing a spiked or hard hit ball). Junior Torey Tschida contributed 13 kills and 1 assist, junior Olivia Bauer had 10 kills, 1 ace, 1 block, and 4 digs while sophomore Aliyah Meyer had 2 kills, 3 aces, 6 digs, and 36 assists (pass, set or dig ball to another player who gets the kill).

The varsity team made the drive up north to Orofino on Saturday, September 10, for a one-day tournament. The team came out on top against the 1A White Pin Conference Troy Trojans 25-21, 25-16, and 25-23. STAT leaders were Wilson with 19 kills, 2 aces, 1 block and 3 assists, Meyer with 3 kills, 1 ace, 1 block, 14 digs, and 31 assists, sophomore Ashlyn Wolsleben with 1 kill, 5 aces, 1 block and 9 digs, and Tschida with 19 digs.

The team finished strong, besting tournament hosts, the 2A Central Idaho Conference Orofino Maniacs, 25-17, 25-16, 25-23. Game standouts were Wilson with 14 kills, 8 aces, 1 block, 15 digs and 3 assists. Junior Abby Howerton had 9 kills, 2 aces and 8 digs, and Meyer came up with 5 kills, 14 digs, and 30 assists.

The Mustangs are currently 2-0 in Long Pin Conference play and 9-1 overall. The team is in Garden Valley against the Wolverines on Monday, September 12, and will host the 1A Long Pin Meadows Valley Mountaineers Junior Var-

sity team at home on Wednesday, September 14. The Varsity team travels to Meridian for the Idaho Classic Tournament at Mountain View High School on September 16-17, and both teams are at home against fellow Long Pin conference team, the Tri-Valley Titans (5-0 overall) on Tuesday, September 20. JV starts at 6:00 followed by varsity at 7:15.

Football: The Horseshoe Bend Varsity Mustangs were under the lights in Wilder on Friday, September 9, to play the 1A Wildcats. While poor air quality canceled many of the games in the Treasure Valley (All 5A and 4A Southern Idaho Conference games in Idaho were rescheduled), the Mustangs and the Wildcats battled it out under a smoke-filled sky. Senior Blayne Meyer was good for 209 running yards with 4 touchdowns (one off a returned punt), 28 receiving yards plus one touchdown off a pass from junior quarterback Carson Drake to help the Mustangs win 53-8. Junior Kaelun Jones had 154 rushing yards with 2 touchdowns. Senior Jedi Graham had 23 rushing yards and 93 receiving yards, Drake had 5, 129 passing yards with 2 touchdowns, junior Mason Beliveau had 2 rushing and 2 receiving yards, and junior Gavin Tomlinson had 6 receiving yards. Defensively, Meyer had 10 tackles and 1 quarterback sack, Jones had 8 tackles and 1 interception, Graham had 5 tackles and 1 interception, senior Cash Smith had 5 tackles and 1 quarterback sack, junior Nic Cooper had 5 tackles, Tomlinson had 5 tackles, senior Seth Rubal had 5 tackles, Beliveau had 5 tackles with a quarterback sack, senior Joseph Wellan had 3 tackles and 1 quarterback sack, while junior Jared Wolsleben had a quarterback

The team originally had a bye on Friday, September 16, but an invite from the Camas 1A Division II Mushers (2-0 overall) will have the Mustangs traveling to Fairfield for a 3:30 p.m. kick-off.





and Science Act would also serve rural populations, those under-represented, and assist with veterans' transition programs. "Micron's leadership will help push open the door to our nation's future. A future where science and technology includes and benefits everyone in America. We can do this!"



Jennifer Granholm, United States Secretary of Energy for the Biden administration, said "This will really help America to get ahead of where the global economy is going." With the CHIPS and Science Act, "We are investing \$52 billion dollars to boost the domestic chip manufacturing and facilities like this one with the Inflation Reduction Act. We are putting over \$300 billion dollars into clean energy manufacturing." She added with emphasis, "And America is back at manufacturing."



Dr. Alondra Nelson, Director of the Office of Science and Technology Policy, recognized, "This is a momentous day for the Micron team, for the Boise community, for the state of Idaho, and for our nation." She described how the technology infrastructure, and these semiconductors, would make so much more possible. Dr. Nelson said, "They will ensure the future health, economy, and the national security of our nation. And it will foster innovation that will drive the next generation of scientific breakthroughs. In things like clean energy generation, disease detection and treatment, and bio technology and bio manufacturing, which there is a big announcement about today in Boston." She said the CHIPS



Senator Jim Risch said he sits in on National Security briefings, "with our eighteen National Intelligence Agencies. We talk about the various problems that we have, challenges that we have, and the dangers that we face." He recalled, in 2020, "One of the things that came to light at that time was the fact that the semiconductors supply chain is in great jeopardy because of the way that it is developed. Look, it was born here, it was America's baby, but we all know that over the years, chased the siren call of lower wages to Asia. A lot of us believe, and certainly the National Security Agencies believe, that there are incredible vulnerabilities to us right now." He said semiconductors were needed "in the defense industry and every other indus-

In the spring of 2020, he and several bipartisan senators introduced the CHIPS Act. However, these bills are not easy to passed. He said that it was vetoed by President Trump, but they were able to override the veto "and CHIPS was born." He said it took some time to get a "stand-alone bill, because the bill was so good, they wanted to hang it on stuff that would move it along... First string they tried to hang it on was Build Back Better; we all knew where that was going and it went there, and of course it didn't go anywhere."

They tried to pass it again, it failed, and then tried another time. Senator Risch explained, "But my spending friends couldn't resist the last moment to hang another \$200 billion dollars on the bill. So, \$52 billion is a lot of money, \$252

billion is a whole lot more money." He said the Idaho delegation voted no, but did get the stand-alone bill passed. He explained that it is a jobs and economic bill, "but that's not what this is all about! What we're trying to do is – We want to bring back the semiconductor industry to America. It was born here, we deserve to have it, and this is a step in that direction to bring this industry back. And Micron Technology is going to play a major role in that. Sanjay, Micron Technology, America needs you! America has stepped up, we've put up the \$52 billion dollars that's going to get this started, and now, what we need to do is roll up our sleeves and get to work on it. So, let's do that! Micron, God speed to you as you move forward. Thank you, and God Bless America!"



Boise Mayor Lauren McLean thanked all for their partnership and for making, "the right choice in choosing to stay home and to build for the first time in twenty years a fab facility on American soil, right here in Boise." The mayor shared that she had been to the Idaho National Laboratory recently and had seen the innovation that occurs there, "As we talked about ways that our city can partner with them, when it comes to a transition to clean electricity and innovation."

Mayor McLean concluded, "Our city's committed, as is the state, to partner with Micron as we continue to foster innovation, to grow our economy, to protect our clean water -Iam so excited about partnering with you- and innovating around clean water and open space.
