Horseshoe Bend Councilman and Former Fire Chief Due in Court on Grand Theft

HORSESHOE BEND -- Curtis Corvinus had an amended complaint filed against him alleging he took \$3,668.53 from the Horseshoe Bend Fire Department's Burn Out Fund during his tenure as the fire chief. This felony grand theft case will be held before Boise County District Court on Friday, October 14th, at 10:00am for an entry of plea.

Corvinus stepped down as chief in March of 2022, but retains his seat on the city council. If convicted of a felony, he will no longer be able to serve on the council. The Constitution of the State of Idaho states, "No person is permitted to vote, serve as a juror, or hold any civil office who has, at any place, been convicted of a felony, and who has not been restored to the rights of citizenship, or who, at the time of such election, is confined

in prison on conviction of a criminal offense."

Corvinus also has a misdemeanor reckless driving charge from March 30, 2022. He had set a jury trial in Magistrate Court in September, but that was vacated and a pre-trial conference for that case is now set for November 28, 2022 at 2:00pm.

Idaho Power's New Line



BOISE COUNTY -- Idaho Power is working on a new power line. This picture was taken between Garden Valley and Placerville. On their website, Idaho Power explains the value of this new power line; "Rising energy demand has strained existing power lines and other equipment in the Horseshoe Bend and Garden Valley areas. To continue our tradition of reliable, affordable service, Idaho Power plans to build a new 34.5-kilovolt (kV) distribution line north of Horseshoe Bend to Garden Valley.

The new line will connect to an existing 34.5-kV line about four miles north and one mile east of the Horseshoe Bend Substation near Highway 55 on the north side of Horseshoe Bend. It will follow Porter Creek east to Placerville and then turn north along Alder Creek to Garden Valley."

September 26, 2022

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar and Clay Tucker. Commissioner Ryan Stirm joined via phone later.

Pledge of Allegiance

LEVY CERTIFICATION: Clerk Mary Prisco explained, "The calculated proposed levy rate for the 2022 tax year for each and every single taxing district, including the county." She said this levy rate was "the culmination of what the taxing districts sent to us in terms of their budget dollars and what they are asking to be levied for property tax. The county clerk's responsibility is to review that, to make sure that they're within their statutory units of what they're asking for and similar items."

There were no further comments. Chairman Twilegar motioned to accept the certificate of county levies for Boise County. Commissioner Tucker seconded and the motion passed.

RESOLUTION: Chairman Twilegar said the resolution was to increase the Boise County Road and Bridge Fund. Clerk Prisco said this was for fiscal year 2022, to amend two accounts for the Road and Bridge Fund for fuel costs and parts/repair. "They are significantly over budget," Clerk Prisco said and added, "I made a similar budget amendment to the Sheriff's." Commissioner Twilegar said, "Well, there's not much we can do about that."

Prisco said they did receive "unscheduled monies in July and August," which were not included in the budget. (At this point, Commissioner Stirm joined the meeting via phone.) Commissioner Twilegar recapped for Stirm that they were going to motion up the resolution to receive money from the state.

Chairman Twilegar motioned to adopt Resolution 2022-39 to increase the Boise County Road and Bridge Fund. Commissioner Stirm seconded and the motion passed.

RESOLUTION: The second resolution was to transfer funds from the Solid Waste Fund to the County Road and Bridge Fund. Paul Rekow with Solid Waste said that the funds for paving were in this account and it was cheaper to go this route. Commissioner Twilegar motioned to transfer the funds from Solid Waste to Road and Bridge Fund, Resolution 2022-40. All were in favor and

the motion carried.

MINUTES: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from September 20th, and the motion passed.

ROAD & BRIDGE DEPT: There was discussion regarding comp time. Commissioner Twilegar motioned to pay down the comp time for four individuals in the Road and Bridge Department to a balance of 40 hours of comp time. All were in favor and the motion carried.

TRANSFERING LAND TO THE IDAHO CITY HISTORICAL FOUNDATION: Prosecutor Adam Strong said that the proposed land transfer was placed as a legal notice in the local newspaper, the *Idaho World*. He said that the statute for surplus property allows the county to donate it to other government entities and included a historical society. Commissioner Twilegar recapped that it's a very small piece of property, "that you could really not do much with. You really couldn't do anything with it. It's already a veteran's memorial." They have leased it to the historical foundation for the past 25 years and there is concern for liability.

Chairman Twilegar made a motion to accept Resolution 2022-31 to transfer land from Boise County to the Idaho City Historical Foundation.

COMMUNICATION: The topics discussed included mountain top repeaters and significant issues with radios. The batteries will sometimes not work and there have been problems with communications. Sheriff Scott Turner said this affects the Road Department, law enforcement, and four or five fire departments. He said the repeaters were so old that a company that came up to look at them couldn't even tell when they were made and they were not serviceable. Sheriff Turner said, "The wiring up there is all messed up, the power supply is bad -- they put a spare one up there that they had to get us by." He said that the biggest issue is the solar, which is not generating enough power to accommodate what's there. There was concern to get the work done before the snow comes and makes the area inaccessible.

There are also plans for the U.S. Forest Service to remove all their radio equipment off and out of the historical lookouts and then build new

towers. The sheriff said that, in that case, Boise County "would have to pay to move our equipment onto that tower and into that building to get it off the lookout." He said this would be for Hawley Mountain and Thorn Creek. Commissioner Twilegar thanked the sheriff for being proactive about this situation.

Commissioner Twilegar recognized, "this is super important, we've got to do this." He then made a motion to buy new equipment in the amount of \$3,904 for the Hawley Mountain power system, and \$75 for shipping. All were in favor and the motion passed.

SCHOOL COUNSELING CONTRACT: Juvenile Justice's Amanda Leader spoke of funding for a school counselor. Twilegar motioned to accept the contract with the independent contractor, a school psychologist. All were in favor and the motion carried.

CROWFOOT RANGE: Commissioner Twilegar said there was a change to the stipulation to limit the size, specifically of center-fire rifles, to .375 inches caliber, "which doesn't include any other kind of weapon -- pistols, handguns, and so forth." Twilegar motioned to approve the amendments to the caliber. The motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING: Clerk Prisco said the hearing was to incorporate all of the previously approved fiscal year 2022 budget amendments. Commissioner Twilegar motioned to adopt Resolution 2022-41, an amendment to the FY2022 budget for paying the current expenses for Boise County, beginning October 1, 2021 and ending September 30, 2022. Commissioner Tucker second and all were in favor, motion passed. The public hearing was closed.

CLAIMS: Commissioner Twilegar asked the sheriff about the new county fuel tanks. Sheriff Turner said, "They were supposed to pour the concrete last week," but the company is expected to pour it soon.

Twilegar motioned to pay the claims in the amount of \$122,685. The motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to go into this closed session [from 10:08am to 10:31]. Coming back into session, there was no action required. The meeting was adjourned until October 4th.

October 4, 2022

Pledge of Allegiance

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from September 26, 2022. The motion carried.

CONSTITUENT INPUT: Debra Jackson gave an update and said that the Boise Republican Party was at a booth during Idaho City Days. "We've registered five people," and another two took cards to register to vote. She said the Democrats also had a booth and they registered a few Republicans for Boise County. She added, "So, overall, I think that was a pretty good turnout."

POLLING PLACES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to accept the designated polling locations: Garden Valley, Horseshoe Bend, Idaho City, Lowman, Placerville, Mores Creek, and the Records' Office. All were in favor and the motion carried.

SNOWGROOMER: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to amend the snowmobile pay raises, as advised by the clerk.

PLANNING AND ZONING: Administrator Alex Gross addressed a training his office attended, and future trainings with associated costs. He said there are concerns to be aware of, regarding planning and zoning regulations within the flood plain. Commissioner Tucker interjected, "Everybody wants to be on the river." Gross agreed.

Commissioner Twilegar made a motion to approve a road name change [from Harold Drive] to Yonder Way. This was seconded and approved.

TREE TRIMMING: Amanda Leader spoke to several tree trimming outfits and received quotes. There are several trees of concern that may conflict with the powerlines. Commissioner Tucker advised working with a company that contracts with Idaho Power, and if they view it as a problem, they may cut the tree for free. Commissioner Twilegar agreed with Commissioner Tucker.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER: Sheriff Scott Turner explained that employment of a resource officer is via a yearly contract with Horseshoe Bend that goes through their school board. Commissioner Twilegar motioned to adopt an agreement

to provide school resource officer services to the Horseshoe Bend School District. All were in favor and the motion carried.

POLLING LOCATIONS: There were five locations and several of them require a fee, but the others are free. Chairman Twilegar motioned separately to adopt the use of a polling place at Centerville Fire Station, Lowman Emergency Station, Wilderness Ranch Fire Station, the Ladies Auxiliary Building in Horseshoe Bend, and the Garden Valley School. The motions were seconded and approved.

4-H: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to adopt the cooperative agreement between the University of Idaho Extension Program and Boise County. Commissioner Tucker seconded and all were in favor.

CONFLICT ATTORNEY: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the contract with the conflict attorney. This was seconded and the motion carried.

BOISE NATIONAL FOREST YOUTH CONSERVATION CORPS: A letter of support was requested from the Forest Service to have a Youth Conservation Corps in Idaho City. Prosecutor Strong said it was just a letter, the county did not have to do anything or pay anything.

Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve this letter of support for the 2023 Boise National Forest YCC to the Southwestern RAC (for grant funding).

AGRICULTURAL REFUND: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to refund \$257 for agricultural exemption building permits. All were in favor and the motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for pending litigation. [Time 9:40am to 9:52am] Coming out of executive session, there was no action required.

ELECTIONS: The Board will meet later in the week of November 8th, due to the election.

City Council Meeting in Idaho City

IDAHO CITY -- The City of Idaho City met at their regular City Council meeting last Wednesday, September 28, 2022. There was a full Council with Councilmembers Ryan Heffington, Ashley M. Elliott, Mari Adams, Tom Secor Jr. and Mayor Ken Everhart present.

The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance, the approval of minutes from the September 14th meeting, and a motion to approve the bills payable from September 15, 2022 through September 28, 2022 in the amount of \$25,475.25.

Under the Idaho City events checklist, the Pioneer Cemetery Historical Ghost Tour was presented by Basin PTA and Dana Zoch, ICHS Theater director. Chief Otter had previously discussed the event with Officer Gomez and agreed to work during the event. They will need to obtain a vendor's permit and proof of insurance, since the PTA will have concessions on Friday, October 28th and 29th. This item passed with four ayes and the motion carried.

The Engineers' report was given by Ed Stowe with Mountain Water Works. He updated the council on the "Sand separator task order 294-07". A motion was passed with 4 ayes.

There was no old business. Under new business, Clerk Ptak provided the council with new information she gathered from a Clerk's Conference. Employee records were brought to her attention, in regard to the details for how long they should be stored, how

they should be filed, and what the city should keep or purge.

The City of Idaho City has been non-compliant for decades and has a chance of being audited by Homeland Security and the city needs to be aware of this. Ptak let it be known on record, with open transparency, that she will be going through employee records, refiling, reorganizing, and purging. There will be a records destruction list. She bought a new five-drawer locked filing cabinet for employee records, specifically to remain compliant. From the time it takes to purge and refile employee records according to Federal, State, and local laws, moving forward Idaho City should be compliant. Mayor Everhart and the councilmembers are all in understanding of this restructure.

Resolution 2022-08, authorizing the disposition of surplus personal property to the Basin School District #72 was passed with no discussion, all ayes, motion carried. Regarding employee updates, Public Works director Tami Claus reported that on 100 Hill Road, the sewer project is almost finished.

The City's backhoe needs transmission work, the part that needs work is still under warranty.

Construction will begin on the water main line in Mores Creek Subdivision. The Idaho Digline has been notified, and Clerk Ptak will notify the public with dates on the website for the work, and Public Works Director Claus will deliver notice to the affected homeowners of the dig and the water shut off. At least four services will be di-

rectly affected but more could possibly be without water for a short period of time as public works buries the lines deeper to prevent freezing during the winter months.

The sewer samples have been pulled and submitted.

A discussion over Cowboy Campground was held between Mike Woodworth of Mountain Waterworks and director Clause. Woodworth called and spoke with Director Clause, informing her that he would be no longer working with Sabrina on this project. Cowboy Campground will need to get engineering plans of their own submitted to Idaho City, get State inspections for water and sewer, and be tested for 191, so the city's sewer system will remain safe from outside hazards, such as chemicals. Cowboy Campground will need to comply and resolve these issues or desist in the ongoing work.

Law enforcement updates were presented by Chief Otter. He is pleased with his employees, and said, "everything is going fantastic!" Traffic stops and citations are staying up, everything else is slowing down. Bids are in for signs, computers, and ticket writers. Councilmember Secor asked if they had some cameras that the city could put up to help in prosecution of those who are abusing our RV water and sewer dump station, as a misdemeanor. Secor said, "I would love to reopen." The city will be pursuing options.

Clerk Ptak updated the council on the budget. September is nearly closed and opening the

next fiscal year is in progress. Once September is closed, Ptak will be able to provide a budget update for the fiscal year end. Regarding water and sewer updates, the billing adjustments are done or in progress for many accounts. Clerk Ptak has requested that a councilmember come in to look over

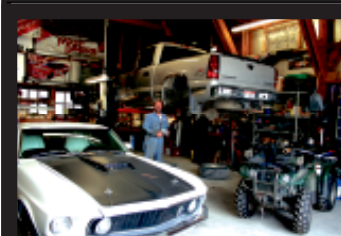
adjustments and put down a signature of approval. Elliott offered to come in Wednesday, October 5th to sign and approve with Clerk Ptak.

Clerk Ptak introduced new Office Clerk Emily Sinclair.

Meeting adjourned at 7:00 p.m.

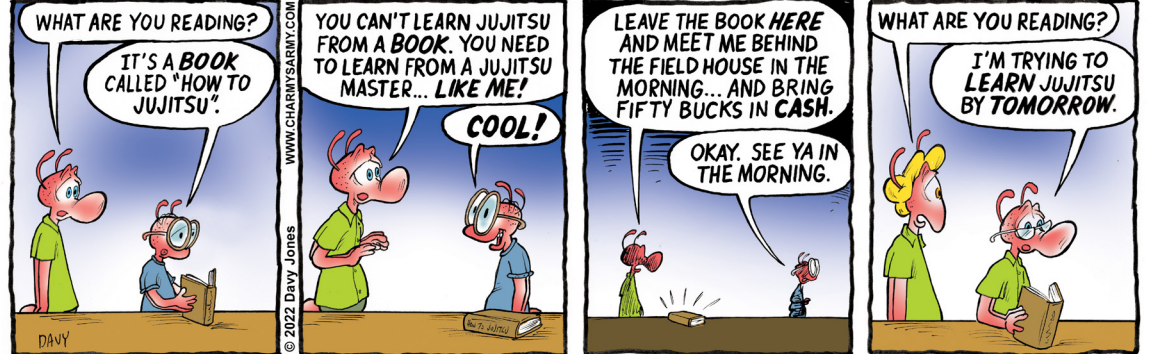

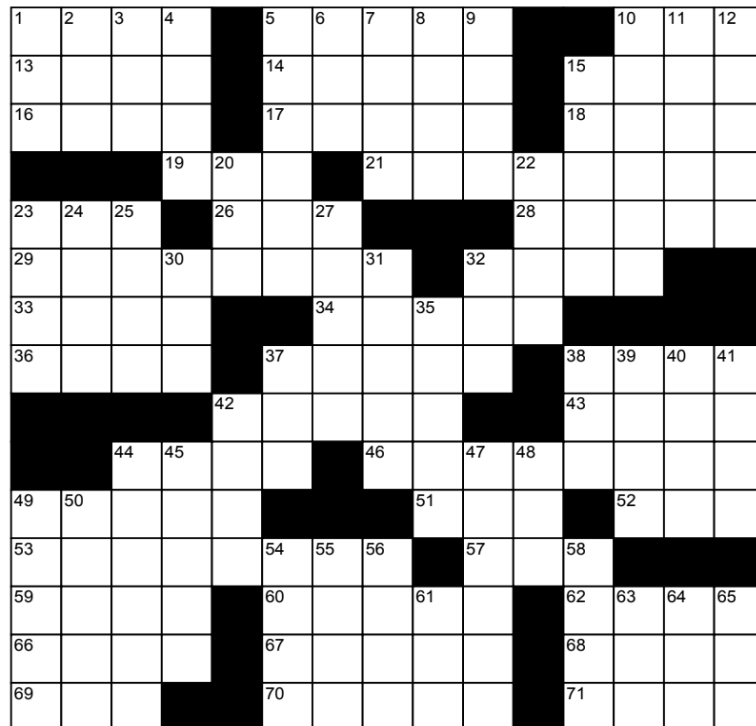

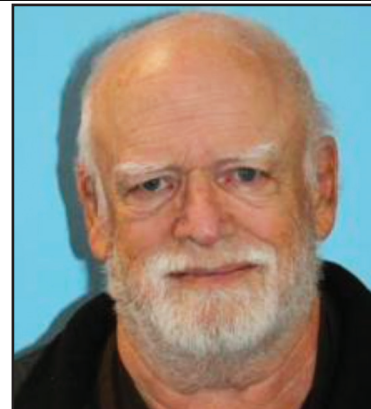
at home), watch the Glowforce Demo, and get a goodie bag. The Halloween Drive Boo is on Saturday October 29 from 6 - 8 pm.

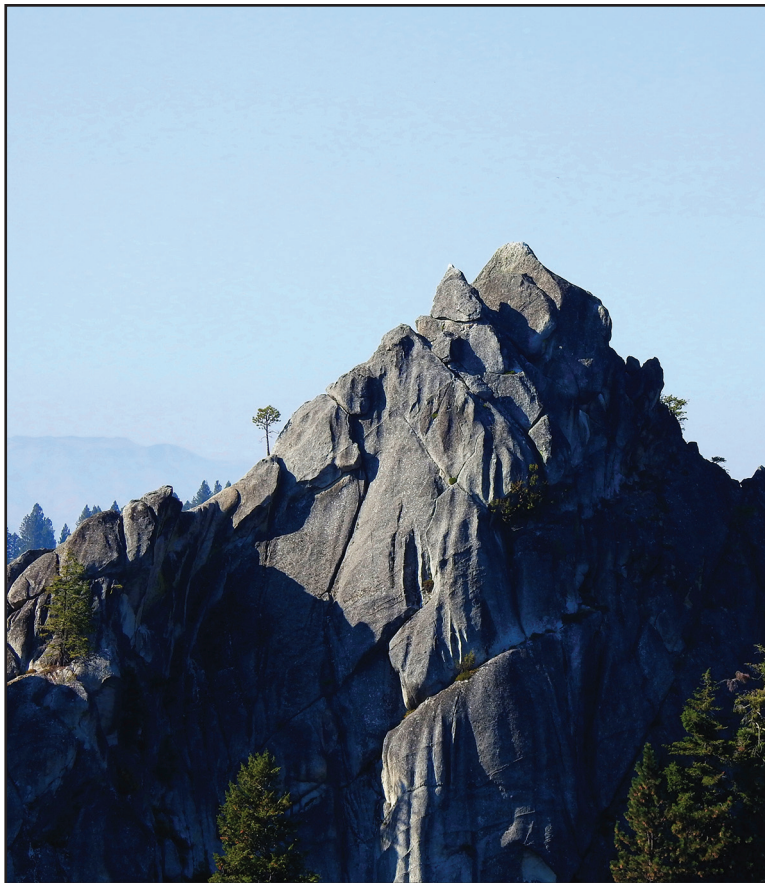

FIRE AT COULTER SUMMIT

BOISE COUNTY -- Several new fires were discovered on the evening of Wednesday, October 5, near Coulter Summit. Boise County Sheriff Scott Turner confirmed that these were human caused. The U.S. Forest Service resources, in conjunction with the Centerville Volunteer Fire Department, responded to the four new incidents. Resources in the Idaho City Ranger District included engines, crews, helicopters, and a fixed wing aircraft.

The fires were fully contained and/or out on October 9th. Mapping shows the total size of all the fires collectively equated to 7.1 acres. The burned area is on both sides of NFS trail 690 and forest users are urged to exercise extreme caution if in the area. No clo-

sures are in effect, but forest users should continue to look for fire traffic on NFS road 380 from the junction of NFS road 382 to Coulter Summit. If possible, avoid the NFS trails 163 and 690 to maintain public and firefighter safety and allow firefighters space to move between incidents.

The fires are still under investigation.

DEQ announces drinking water and wastewater funding opportunities for fiscal year 2024

BOISE COUNTY — The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) is announcing fiscal year 2024 grant and loan funding opportunities for Idaho's drinking water and wastewater systems.

Funding will be used to assist eligible public drinking water systems and wastewater systems with facility planning projects and help entities build or repair existing public drinking water systems and wastewater treatment facilities.

Eligible applicants include governmental entities and nonprofit corporations that have authority to collect, treat, or dispose of sewage or industrial wastewater as well as community water systems and nonprofit noncommunity water systems.

Funding Availability

DEQ has several funding opportunities available.

State Revolving Fund (SRF) Loans

State Revolving Fund (SRF) loans provide low-interest funding for up to 100% of design and construction costs for drinking water and wastewater facilities. SRF loans also offer below-market interest rates with average rates under 2%.

Planning Grants

Planning grants are available to help systems cover the cost of preparing facility planning documents or fund environmental reviews. These grants cover 50% of eligible costs.

Application Process and Deadline

The letter of interest process includes two phases. Applicants are first required to submit a letter of interest—also known as an LOI—detailing their need for funding. A separate LOI is available for each funding opportunity.

LOI forms are available on DEQ's Grants and Loans page. Completed LOIs are due by January 13, 2023, at 5 pm MST. Submit applications electronically to grants.loans@deq.idaho.gov.

DEQ will then evaluate, rate, and rank responses for inclusion on the annual priority list. LOI forms that receive the highest ratings will then be invited to submit a grant or loan application.

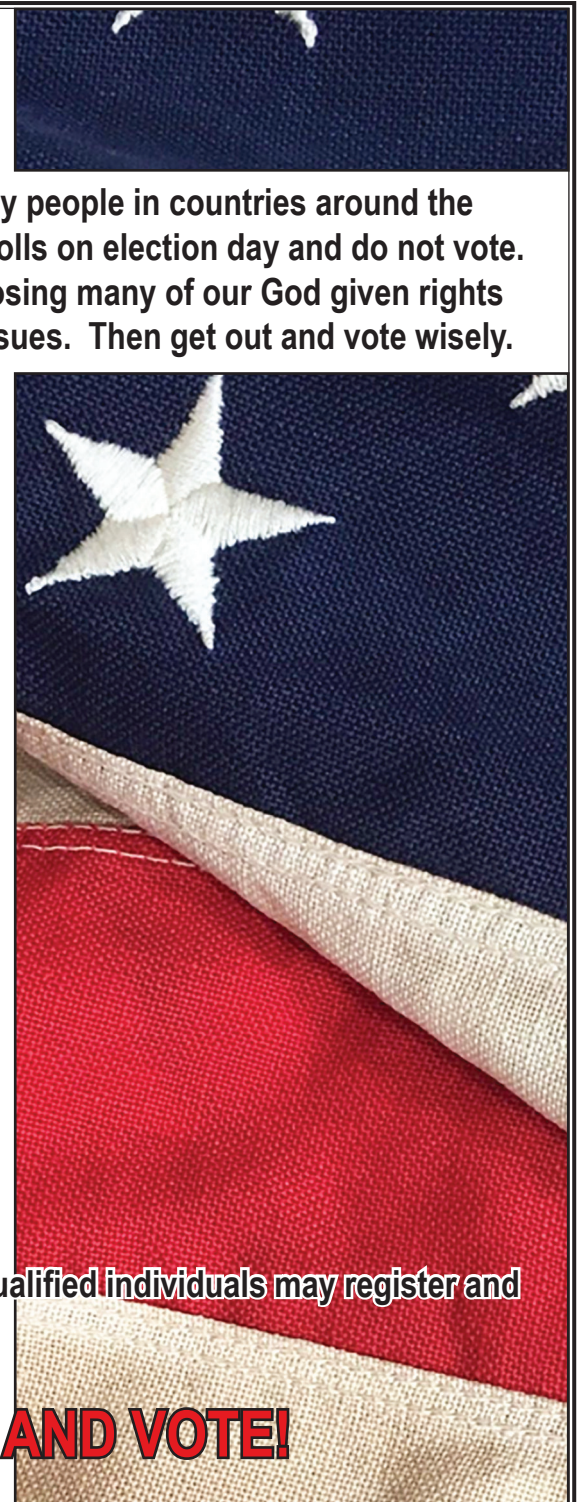

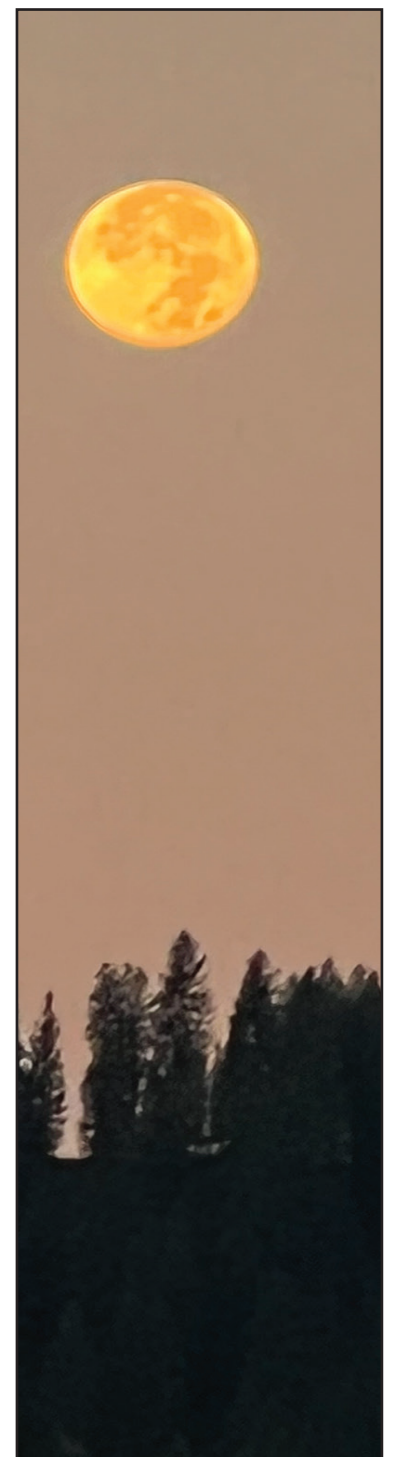
