HORSESHOE BEND -- The Horseshoe Bend Varsity Volleyball team took the 1A DII Long Pin Conference Championship and heads to Rexburg on Thursday, October 27 to defend their 2021 State Championship. The team achieved the district's top spot by defeating Garden Valley 25-19, 25-12, and 25-12 in the first round of district play in New Meadows on Wednesday, October 19. The Mustangs finished the regular season 16-1 overall, 8-0 in conference play. Statistical standouts were junior Annelie Wilson with 15 kills (an attack on the ball which is not returnable by the opposing team), 4 aces (a serve which is unable to be played or returned by the opposing team), 1 block (blocking the ball into the opponent's court leading to a point or side out), 2 digs (passing a spiked or hard hit ball), and 3 assists (pass, set or dig ball to another player who gets the kill). Junior Abby Howerton had 5 kills, 10 aces, 9 digs and 1 assist, while sophomore Aliyah Meyer had 5 kills, 1 ace, 2 digs and 25 assists.

The win set the Mustangs up to compete for the championship against the Council Lumberjacks who finished their regular season 11-2 overall, 6-2 in conference play. The match took place on Friday, October 21 in New Meadows where Horseshoe Bend beat Council 25-17, 20-25, 25-11, and 25-17. Stat leaders were Wilson with 24 kills, 3 aces, 1 block , 17 digs and 4 assists. Howerton came out with 8 kills, 5 aces, 13 digs and 2 assists and Meyer contributed 8 kills, 2 aces, and 10 digs with 37 assists.

The team will head to Rexburg on Thursday, October 27 after a school assembly which will be immediately followed by a community send-off at 9:30 a.m. On Friday, October 28 the Mustangs meet the number 8 seeded Clark Fork Wampus Cats who finished 11-4 overall, 5-1 in 1A Northstar Conference play.

Flying Over Boise County in a Small Plane

BOISE COUNTY -- John Robison, Public Lands Director of the Idaho Conservation League, served as the guide for the Ecoflight flyover of Boise County. Ecoflight is a nonprofit and their mission is, "to educate and advocate for the protection of the remaining wildlands and wildlife habitat using small aircraft." Idaho World Photographer Linda Ruppel commented that it was not only informative, but a lot of fun, and the pilot provided a very smooth flight in the small Cessna 210 aircraft that departed from the Boise airport. Their course took them over Boise, towards Avimor, north over Highway 55, to Sage Hen Reservoir, and around Lake Cascade to observe the Four Corners Fire damage. Looping back, the plane overlooked Crouch, Garden Valley, Grimes Pass, CuMo Mine area, and over Idaho City. Throughout the flight, Robison discussed the good that had been done

for the land and posed some needed improvements to help mitigate the fire damage.

"Recently approved federal funding for forest and watershed restoration is bringing millions of dollars to Idaho, and some of these funds could be utilized in the Boise National Forest," said John Robison with ICL. "This is a great chance for the public to get involved with forest restoration projects, which could include watershed restoration opportunities and expanded recreation opportunities. If done correctly, this next set of projects could serve as a model for the next generation of forest and watershed restoration projects in Idaho and beyond."

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Clay Tucker, and Ryan Stirm (via phone).

Pledge of Allegiance CONSTITUENT INPUT: None

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to accept the minutes from October 11, 2022.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE: Sheriff Turner said they were down two dispatchers again and they keep losing them due to low pay. "It's a part of living in a rural county, folks," Commissioner Twilegar stated. "We don't have a lot of money." This will be addressed next week.

Sheriff Turner then discussed ordering three radios for the three patrol vehicles. He said the last radios ordered took a year to be shipped. Chairman Twilegar motioned to purchase the radios in the amount of \$5,862.

TREE TRIMMING: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the bid for \$725 to trim the trees in front of the Planning & Zoning building and the apple tree by the courthouse.

PLANNING & ZONING:

A final draft was presented for approval. Commissioner Twilegar motioned to adopt the findings of fact and conclusions of law for a partial plat amendment that was discussed in the previous meeting in Duquette Pines subdivision. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Twilegar then motioned to adopt the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and conditions of approval for Old Mill Acres. The motion carried.

TIRES: The solid waste department submitted an invoice for the Horseshoe Bend transport station for "tire/ trailer support." Commissioner Twilegar recognized, "Man, that's a lot of money." Prosecutor Adam Strong clarified that it was the price for all the old tires that had been transported to Oregon for disposal. Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the invoice in the amount of \$23,603 for tire disposal. There were all ayes, and the motion passed.

GARDEN VALLEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT IMPACT FEES DISCUS-SION: Alex Gross said it sounded like the rest of the fire departments were not that interested, but Garden Valley was considering resuming the use of impact fees. Gross said they were going to need a consultant to move forward on this. Commissioner Tucker said he did not like how restricted the money was, "it was so limited on how you're allowed to spend it." Commissioner Twilegar would like to hear more from the Garden Valley Fire District.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for pending litigation. [Time 9:35 am to 10:00 am] There was no action required when coming back into session.

GEM PLAN FOR THE COUNTY: The representative from Gem Plan said, "2020 and 2019, phenomenal! A round of applause for sure. 2021, you went from 107% loss ratio though September of this year, you're at 120% loss ratio. So, what helped cause the loss last year was a COVID bounce, that's what I think their industry is calling it and is what it was for sure. So, for a year and a half, two years, everybody's locked up, you can't go get any procedures done. As soon as the door cracked, the floodgates opened and it hit us all. About two thirds of member counties were in the red. And so, that resulted in the 9.5 percent rate increase." He said the previous year there had been no rate increase. "This was a real rough cycle, for a lot of folks."

MEETING WITH THE USDA: Tobin Dickson from the USDA, Area Director for Rural Development, shared what the USDA offers, including three programs for housing, community, and business. They have loan programs for low income individuals. There

is a grant and loan program for home repair (for 62 years of age and older) for very low income people. Dickson said, "That's an under-utilized program and it's a shame that it's under-utilized." There are also loans for businesses in rural areas with better rates. They have grants and low guarantee programs for energy efficiency improvements. The USDA also have programs for water and waste water.





Idaho City Historical Foundation's Ribbon Tree Time Log Dedication



Toting a cherry picking ladder, ready to tie a bow around the girth of an enormous pine tree, well into her early 80's, Manetta was always ready, always smiling, and usually had a dog in the car. "It was just a magical time, as all of you who knew her," explained Mary Ellen Mc-

Murtrie (below). She explained that s o m e the lumber fromthe ribbon tree has been milled n used for local projects.



There was a long list of people to thank that helped in this venture to place a section of the historic ribbon tree in Smoke Jumper's Park of Idaho City. Beth Wilson, President of the Idaho City Historical Foundation, explained that this was done, "So that everyone could remember that once the tree was along Highway 21 and once there was a Mannetta Schrite. Two very unique parts of our community that we don't want anyone to forget about."



IDAHO CITY -- An interpretive sign tells the story of Manetta's unique appreciation for the Ribbon Tree, standing at 167 feet tall, 14.5 feet at the base, and with 311 tree rings. It had been slated to be cut for being too close to the road, but Manetta obtained signatures and presented them to Idaho Governor Cecil Andrus, in order to preserve this solitary giant tree. The tree was given historic significance status by Boise County in its comprehensive plan.

It is joined in the park by another bottom cut tree that perished in the Pioneer Fire in 2016. It was the largest fir tree in the Boise National Forest, at 314 rings of life. It was said to have had good water in a draw, and is quite a bit larger than the Ribbon Tree.

IDAHO CITY -- This is a synopsis of the Idaho City Council meeting, held on October 12, 2022. The meeting started promptly at 6:00 p.m. when Mayor Ken Everhart called the meeting to order. All council members were present: Tom Secor Jr., Ashley M. Elliott, Ryan Heffington, and Mari Adams, who attended via Zoom.

The regular business of minutes and paying bills was conducted. The bills from September 29, 2022 through October 12 came to \$17,308.32 and both items were approved.

Hank Elliott was appointed to the Parks and Recreation Commission.

Under new business, Trudy Jackson contacted the Mayor and he voiced her concerns about the fragile state of headstones, property, and trails in respect to the increased exposure of the Cemetery, especially if an event is sponsored over Halloween. She wanted to make sure that there would be no incidents, or vandalism in the Pioneer Cemetery.

The council members decided to join the Idaho City Historic Foundation with "gold brick" membership of \$250.00 which would come from the Mayor's fund.

Public Works director Tami Claus gave a report on all the labor to replace water pipes and road improvements that have taken place to prepare for the coming winter.

The law enforcement report was given by Clerk Ptak, who said they are working on

grants, installing solar-powered lights to improve hidden areas of town, and wireless camera lights for the RV dump which has been vandalized.

Clerk Ptak said the annual audit for the City would be done in January 2023.

The meeting adjourned at 6:48 p.m.





Another failure of the schools is their failure to hire staff to teach the students. If you do get your child to school, they may or may not have a teacher.

These are not money issues. These are management issues.



Fire spread quickly throughout the dry grass in the Horseshoe Bend area, along Brownlee Road above Gardena, on Thursday, October 20th, just before 2pm. According to local homeowners, the Horseshoe Bend Volunteer Fire Department was quickly on the scene. The fire appears to have been started by an individual attempting to burn brush around his home, which grew into a range fire. Edith Williams watched from her home, the black smoke and flames billowing, then noticed the winds shifting, and said, "Had the fire been allowed to make a run for it, it could have been disastrous."

Horseshoe Bend Fire was solely able to impede the fire from spreading, even without the help of air support drops or other larger fire agencies.

The local fire department later confirmed that the homeowner was cited for burning during the burn ban. The state of Idaho has a burn ban from May 10th through October 20th, and any burning, excluding campfires, is required to have a burn permit from the Idaho Department of Lands.

Williams said, "We got lucky. A big shout out to Horseshoe Bend Fire for their fast response time and expertise in putting this out and preventing a range fire."
