

HSB Volleyball Wins State Back-to-Back

HORSESHOE BEND --The Horseshoe Bend Lady Mustang Varsity Volleyball team took home the 1A DII State Championship trophy after defeating every opposing team in Rexburg on October 28 and 29.

First up on Friday, 10/28 the Mustangs defeated the Clark Fork Wampus Cats 25-12, 25-9, 25-19, setting Horseshoe Bend up to play the Mackay Miners at 4:00 p.m. The girls took the win in three games, 25-12, 25-9, 25-11. On Saturday, the Mustangs defeated the Rockland Bulldogs 25-21, 25-11, 25-17 and then had to wait for the outcome of a match between fellow Long Pin Conference rivals the Council Lumberjacks and the Rockland Bulldogs. Rockland took the win against Council, setting themselves up to play the 2021 Horseshoe Bend Mustang State Champions.

Horseshoe Bend defeated Rockland to take back-to-back 1A DII State Championships! Horseshoe Bend also received the Sportsmanship Award. Junior Annelie Wilson was named the 1A DII Player of the Year. Junior Abby Howerton and sophomore Aliyah Meyer were both named 1A DII First Team players. Junior Torey Tschida was named to the Second Team and junior Oliva Bauer was given an Honorable Mention.

Prescribed Fires in Boise County


BOISE COUNTY — The U.S. Forest Service has begun burning piles of vegetation debris throughout the Boise National Forest. This is an effort to reduce hazardous fuels that are generated by logging, thinning operations, and administrative site clearing. These piles will generate smoke from around the Bogus Basin ski resort, Lowman, south of High

Valley and north of Crouch, Idaho. For updates please visit the Forest's Facebook page at: https://www.facebook.com/ BoiseNationalForest. Prescribed burns may affect travel and access routes. There will be notices posted, and the Forest Service asks that, with the decreased visibility, motorists drive slowly and remain aware that firefighters and equipment are in the area and on the road-ways.

BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS Transcribed by Eileen Capson

October 25, 2022

Present: Commissioners Ryan Stirm (Acting Chairman) and Clay Tucker

Absent: Commissioner Steven Twilegar

Pledge of Allegiance CONSTITUENT INPUT: None

MINUTES: Commissioner Stirm motioned to approve the official meeting minutes from October 18, 2022. Commissioner Tucker seconded and the motion passed.

PAYROLL CHANGES WITH SOLID WASTE: Commissioner Stirm motioned to approve the payroll changes per the department head's request.

APPROVAL: **CLAIMS** Clerk Mary Prisco explained, "We're still in the period where we cannot separate the 2023 budget from the 2022 budget." There were two claims approval reports. [Revisited later in the meeting] Commissioner Stirm motioned to approve the claims approval report for FY2022 in the amount of \$46,083. Tucker seconded and the motion passed. Stirm then motioned to approve the claims approval report for FY2023 in the amount of \$84,119. The motion carried.

DEMAND WARRANTS: Commissioner Stirm motioned to pay "H&H Treatment Program" for the Clerk's office in the amount of \$1,710 for "client treatment assessment." All were in favor and the motion passed. Commissioner Stirm clarified, "Just so everybody knows, that's a psychological treatment." It was stated by others in the room that the treatment was for a defendant in the court.

Commissioner Stirm motioned to approve an auto glass business \$950 from an accident. Clerk Prisco recapped that the windshield was damaged while an elected official was attending a conference up north, "and unfortunately, that vehicle is new enough that it has the cameras built into the windshield, so that's why it's so expensive." Stirm motioned to approve the expenditure for the windshield replacement deductible. The motion carried.

Stirm then motioned to pay \$394.14 for petroleum products, items for the Idaho City snow groomer, diesel, and oil.

EXEMPT RECORDS: Closed session for exempt records and pending litigation. [Time 9:14 am to 9:20 am] Coming back into session, Stirm said, "There's no action required."

JUVENILE JUSTICE:

Amanda Leader said they have had an increase of people on electronic monitoring. Commissioner Stirm asked if the bats on the building had flown away, since it was cold. Leader said she wasn't excited to find that the reason they were having problems with their heating and cooling was that the unit was covered in bat guano.

EMERGENCY MAN-AGER: Trinia Richardson has been finishing up classes for emergency management.

SOLID WASTE: Paul Rekow said they are about ready to burn, as weather permits, the burn pile at the transfer stations.

ROAD DEPARTMENT: Curtis Dill said he moved one of his guys from Horseshoe Bend over to Garden Valley, "so at least there's one person in Garden Valley." He's hoping another part-time worker will come back and open up another position in Horseshoe Bend. The road department is getting geared up for winter, "but it may be a slow go for some areas, where they may not get plowed. We don't know yet." Dill said he has Idaho City and Horseshoe Bend overlapping to help on Alder Creek Road. "We'll do what we can."

ASSESSOR: Chris Juszczak said they were "plugging away" and needed more people to apply.

SHERIFF: "We're staying busy, from one extreme to the other," said Sheriff Scott Turner. Due to hunting season, the department has had reports of "a lot of lost people and wounded people." They have had search and rescue up numerous times. Sheriff Turner is expecting that once winter hits, they will have vehicles stuck, stranded people, "and everything else."

PROSECUTOR: Adam Strong said they have been busy, "but nothing out of the ordinary. Just the normal criminal court stuff and normal civil stuff." Commissioner Stirm asked if the court was still backed up from COVID. Prosecutor Strong replied that the court is always backed up, "but I think we're through the COVID backlog." He explained that things take time to make it to court.

CLERK: Mary Prisco spoke about the elections and explained that they were going to have poll watchers, "according to law." There will be watchers from the Boise County Republican Central Committee, a list was submitted, and one from the Ammon Bundy team.

She said they are working through "the last leg of the audit for 2021 marathon."

RS2477 ROADS: A public hearing RS2477 road validation was opened through a motion and the hearing was tabled until December 13th at 1:15. The board will allow for written public comments up until December 1st. Verbal public comments will be allowed on December 13 during the public hearing. The motion carried.

Adjourned until November 1st. (There will be discussion on whether the board will meet the follow week, due to the election.)

City Council Meeting in Idaho City

By Georgene Thomas IDAHO CITY -- The following is a review of the regular Idaho City Council meeting which was held Wednesday, October 26, 2022.

The Mayor, Ken Everhart, and all the council members; Tom Secor, Ashley M. Elliott, Mari Adams, and Ryan Heffington were present. The minutes were approved and the bills from October 12 through October 26, 2022 in the amount of \$7,446.86 were paid. Under the Idaho City event checklist, the Idaho City High School prom planning committee led by Carter Elliott was presented. The junior class is promoting fundraisers and the first will be a "Drive-in-Movie" on November 5, at the Community Hall parking lot. The second will be a "Bingo Night" to be held at the Community Hall on November 12. They still need to get their vendor license and proof of insurance from the school. Under New Business, Dax Olvera was appointed to the commission of Parks and Recreation. This was approved and passed as an action item. There were no committee reports.

Citizen comments were given by Nancy Holbert on a program called "Thriving Communities." She is trying to gather people and organizations to help write a letter of interest to find funding for improvements in Idaho City.

In compliance with Title 43, Section 707 of the Idaho Code, as amended, each property owner owning land within the boundaries of the Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District, or person or institution having interest therein, is hereby notified that the 2022 assessments of the District are now due and payable. You are also notified that payments can be properly received only upon your identification of the land that you own. Each of you is hereby notified that, in compliance with the Idaho Code, payments for the first half of these taxes must be made on or before the $20^{\mbox{\tiny th}}$ day of December 2022. From that date to the 21st day of January 2023, the books will be closed for the acceptance of payment of the 2022 irrigation District taxes. Thereafter, a 2% penalty will have been added to the amount of the first half, and interest will accrue at the rate of 1% per month, from the 1st day of January, 2023, to the date payment has been received by the District.

Each of you is also hereby notified that the final payment date, without penalty and interest being added, for

the second half of the 2022 Irrigation District Taxes, is the $20^{\mbox{\tiny th}}$ day of June 2023. Thereafter, the books will again be closed for payment of the 2022 taxes, liens will be placed of record against the land; all fees required by law will be added and payment of these will be required before any release of lien will be forwarded to the office of the County Recorder, interest chargeable by law against both halves accrues from the 1st day of January 2023. Each of you is also hereby notified that, if you are the owner or the interested party in title to land located within the boundaries of the Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District, this is full and adequate notice, under the provisions of law, of the obligation to pay the assessments of the District for the year 2022.

Idaho Constitutional Amendment SJR 102

Legislative Council's Statement of Meaning, Purpose, and Result to Be Accomplished

Currently, the Legislature may meet in a special session only upon call of the Governor. The proposed amendment would allow the Legislature to convene itself in special session if 60% of the members in each house submit a petition to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The petition must specify the subjects to be addressed in the special session, and only those subjects could be considered during the special session.

The amendment also requires the Legislature to hold an organizational session in December following a general election. The purpose of the organizational session is to prepare for the upcoming regular session. The proposed amendment would formalize in the Idaho Constitution the Legislature's longstanding practice of holding an organizational session.

Statements FOR the Proposed Amendment

This constitutional amendment is needed to correct an imbalance of power among the three branches of government. The executive and judicial branches of government have no restrictions on their ability to conduct business when and as they deem appropriate, and the legislative branch should have the same power.

Idaho is one of just 12 states whose legislature has no power to convene itself into a special session under certain circumstances. The Idaho Legislature should not be dependent on the Governor to call it into special session when extraordinary events occur. For example, in 2020, the Idaho Legislature wished to convene to consider Covid-19 matters and the expenditure of federal funding related to the pandemic but the Governor delayed convening the Legislature. Idaho should join the 38 states (including all of Idaho's neighboring states) that recognize the legislative branch of government's right to determine independently when it should convene and conduct the business of the people it represents.

journing sine die indefinitely as happened in 2021 when the House of Representatives wanted to preserve its right to take up anticipated issues later in the year. Deferring the date of adjourning sine die results in numerous administrative problems such as delaying effective dates of legislation and administrative rules. If the Legislature is able to convene itself, there will be no need to avoid adjourning sine die.

The proposed amendment contains sufficient safeguards against any potential abuse of power by limiting the subjects of legislation to be considered during a special session to those listed in the petition, just as a special session called by the Governor is limited to the subjects listed in the Governor's proclamation.

Statements AGAINST the Proposed Amendment

The Legislature has conducted its business for over 130 years without needing the ability to call itself into special session. This constitutional amendment is not necessary because the Governor has called and can continue to call the Legislature into a special session when necessary. Passing this amendment would remove a check and balance from the Idaho Constitution.

The Idaho Legislature is a part-time citizen legislature. The proposed amendment provides no limitations on how often special sessions may be called or how long they may last. Idaho should not move toward having a full-time legislature, and Idaho's part-time citizen legislators with other careers should not be burdened with sudden, unpredictable special sessions.

Idaho businesses and citizens need the stable, predictable, and routine timeline of the regular legislative session to communicate with legislators regarding the effects that pending legislation may have on businesses and citizens. The ability of the Legislature to convene itself into various special sessions may result in the passage of legislation that has not been properly vetted and could result in unintended consequences for Idaho businesses and citizens.

The proposed amendment requires a petition signed by only 60% of the members of each house of the Legislature. This threshold is too low. Many states require a higher percentage, such as 67% or 75%. A higher percentage would deter the Legislature from convening itself for subjects that may be trivial, vague, or not widely agreed upon.

Amendment Text

Section 8. SESSIONS OF THE LEGISLATURE. (1) The regular sessions of the legislature shall must be held annually at the capital of the state, commencing on the second Monday of January of each year, unless a different day shall have been appointed by law, and at other times in extraordinary sessions when convened by the governor and in organizational sessions commencing on the first Thursday of December after the general election, unless a different day shall have been appointed by law.

(2) The legislature, while remaining a part-time, citizen legislature, must also be convened in special session by the president pro tempore of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives upon receipt of a joint written petition of at least sixty percent of the membership of each house, specifying the subjects to be considered. Such special session must commence no later than fifteen days after the petition is received by the president pro tempore of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives. At a special session convened pursuant to this section, the legislature shall have no power to consider or pass any bills or resolutions on any subjects other than those specified in the petition and those necessary to provide for the expenses of the session.


