Christmas Festivities in Idaho City & Horseshoe Bend

IDAHO CITY -- Come one, come all to the annual Idaho City Tree Lighting event this Saturday evening, on December 3rd. The event begins with Christmas caroling provided by the Idaho City Middle School Music Department at 5pm, located by the Visitor's Center on the Main Street stage. The PTA will be providing two kinds of chili to warm your belly; a white bean chicken and classic red bean chili for \$5 a bowl. There will be a few burn barrels provided to help light the area and fend off the winter chill. You're invited to take a special tour of the newly revamped Visitor's Center, and please make sure to take a complementary cup for hot chocolate on your way out.

The first ever light parade will commence at 5:30pm, beginning in the Community Hall parking lot, winding down through Wall Street, and then continuing up Main Street towards the Visitor's Center. Good news, there is still room for more contestants! If you would like to be a part of this historic event, and be a contestant to win a major prize and/or bragging rights, please assemble at the community hall at 5pm.

For the grand finale of the "Light Up Idaho City" light parade, a fire truck will be bringing Santa to the Visitor's Center to visit with all the good little boys and girls. Digital photos will be provided by Woras Focus, donations are always welcome, but not required. Hayden Woras, a local photographer, will be sending a link to access the digital image that can then

be downloaded for free, and from there visitors have the option to purchase prints, cards, and metal ornament keepsakes with their child's photo!

Local businesses are encouraged to stay open Saturday evening to showcase their wares. Santa and a very special helper will be invited to count-down and light the community Christmas tree.

In addition to all the other festivities, earlier in the day, at the Boise Basin Library, the 4-H Mountaineers will be hosting cookies with Santa from 11am to 1pm.

The event couldn't have been possible without the generosity and sponsorship from Idaho Power, the Idaho City Chamber of Commerce, Basin School PTA, Nelson Custom Milling, Heart of the Mountain Daycare, Majestic Mountain Ranch, and many other local businesses.

HORSESHOE BEND -- The Horseshoe Bend Festival and Tour of Trees received a record amount of entries this year! Silent auction bids can be placed at each tree's location up until the close of business this Friday, December 2.

Beautifully decorated full size trees can be seen at the 2 AA Ammo Shop, Horseshoe Bend Valley Chamber of Commerce (viewing location: Horseshoe Bend City Hall), Locking Horns Riverside Restaurant, Mountain Properties Group LLC, Ray's Corner Market, Sweet Home Realty, and Valley View Chevron.

Additional full size decorated trees from Horseshoe Nursery, the Horseshoe Bend Community Pantry, the Horseshoe Bend Fire Department, Ole RV Park, and Valley Christian Center are available to view at the Horseshoe Bend and Area Senior Center located at 109 S. Riverside Drive in Horseshoe Bend. The senior center also has many silent auction items available to bid on as well as two smaller Christmas trees. Bidding will conclude at the senior center by 3:15 p.m. on the day of the festival, Saturday, December 3.

Table top trees are also available to bid on at local businesses. These smaller festive trees were decorated and donated by All Aboard Gifts & More and Shades of Pink (these can be seen inside the Locking Horns Riverside Restaurant), Huckle & Sage, and YD Adventures (both located inside Huckle & Sage), The She Shoppe and the U.S. Post Office.

Holiday wreaths are also up for bid and are on display at the following area businesses: Barreto Manufacturing, Horseshoe Bend Medical Center, Horseshoe Hardware, Mustang Towing, Sonora Mexican Restaurant, The Parts Store, and the Horseshoe Bend and Area Senior Center. The festival runs from 2:00 p.m.-4:00 p.m. on Saturday, December 3 at the Senior Center. Hot dogs, chili, cookies, and hot cocoa are free for all attendees. Santa Claus will be on hand to visit with the children and hand out gifts. All proceeds from the auction will benefit the Horseshoe Bend Food Pantry.

Boise County Commissioners' Meetings

November 22, 2022

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Ryan Stirm (via phone conference), and Clay Tucker

Pledge of Allegiance

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from November 15th. Commissioner Tucker seconded and the motion carried.

CONSTITUENT INPUT: None

SOLID WASTE: Paul Rekow said he would like to hire an individual for Lowman. He said, "We just got his background check done this morning, and his drug test is clear and ready to go." There was no further discussion by the commissioners, then Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the hire. The motion carried.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE CELL PHONES: Sheriff Scott Turner said they were having issues with T-Mobile and would be switching to Verizon. He said, "We're just having way too many problems with T-Mobile and the service not working at all, deputies having to use their personal cell phones for county business." Sheriff Turner added that Verizon was "who we had before, and we tried to save some money, and it just didn't work out." Chairman Twilegar recognized, "There's certain things we can skip on and communications for our Sheriff's department is not one of them."

AMMUNITION: The sheriff is looking to buy "less lethal ammunition," which was budgeted for. Sheriff Turner would like to do some more training, and get deputies recertified. Commissioner Twilegar asked how often the department bought ammunition and Sheriff Turner replied, "We try to only buy once a year."

Commissioner Twilegar asked if there was any discussion from the other commissioners and Tucker said that he had spoken with the sheriff prior to the meeting. Stirm had no further questions. Twilegar motioned to approve the estimate for ammunition for the Sheriff's Department in the amount of \$2,410.25. Commissioner Tucker seconded and there were all ayes.

TAX CANCELATIONS: Treasurer Gina Turner explained why these tax cancellations were presented, with one from a statute change, a rebuild, and solid waste fee for just land. Commissioner Twilegar motioned to accept

the first tax cancellation in the amount of \$237.60. The motion carried. He then motioned to accept a second tax cancellation in the amount of \$352.07 and another for \$122.10. All motions carried.

COUNTY SOFTWARE: Treasurer Turner recounted, "Computer Arts had an issue on Friday where it just shut down in the middle of work. It lost \$26,000 out of one of our tax payment packets." Twilegar interjected a four letter word, and Turner continued, "They finally responded to me yesterday [Monday], but they won't take any responsibility and they were trying to tell me I had to fix it. I can't fix it, because I can tell which [land] parcels the money disappeared from within the packet, but if I just go in to apply payment again, it says that they don't owe any money. So, there's nothing I can do to fix it. Hopefully, they will fix the problem." She said the Assessor's department also had a problem that same day, "His employees, I think, lost Computer Arts for twenty or thirty minutes that day, shut down and they couldn't get back in."

Prosecutor Strong said he had written a letter to Computer Arts back in July regarding invoices that the county should not have to pay under their contract and that he did not receive a response. Chairman Twilegar asked the department heads to keep track of the hours it takes to fix all of this and said, "I think we should send them an invoice." Treasurer Turner admitted that she had "a lot of hours involved."

CONTRACT: A contract and insurance for a couple of structures donated by the snowmobile club was discussed at length with the prosecutor. Chairman Twilegar said they are "doing the county a service," which could be utilized for emergencies, such as search and rescues. He then motioned to enter the agreement for donation of Sheriff use of property between Boise County and the Boise Snowmobile Club.

All were in favor and the motion carried.

CLAIMS APPROVAL: Chairman Twilegar noticed that there was only one red mark to change the amount this time and considered that it could have been an issue with Computer Arts. He then motioned to pay the bills in the amount of \$163,996.40. All were in favor and the motion passed.

GRANT: Support for a bridge was requested of the board. Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve a letter of support for the U.S. Forest Service for the Buena Vista bridge construction efforts in Idaho City. All were in favor and the motion carried.

DEMAND WARRANTS: The 2023 membership renewal for Air St. Luke's invoice for \$3,510 was motioned and approved.

LAND SWAP WITH THE FOREST SERVICE: The prioritizing of several land parcels was discussed with Prosecutor Strong, and providing a proposal with an explanation of use.

PUBLIC HEARING: Alex Gross with Boise County Planning and Zoning gave an overview of the Alden Homes, LLC variance. There was discussion regarding the minimum standard for a 1/3 acre lot, and whether it could have a well and a septic on adjoining lots. Commissioner Tucker pointed out, "Every variance that gets approved in a subdivision like this takes away what other people bought." Twilegar said that "there's just not going to be enough room for everybody to have a septic and well." The person had bought three lots. Commissioner Twilegar commented about the 1974 developed lots as a subdivision, "Wow, what a mess!" He said, normally, he would say, "It's your land, do you want. The problem is if we let you do what you want, we're potentially ruining the potential of your neighbors to be able to put in a well." Commissioner Stirm said he didn't have a comment

and agreed with Twilegar.

Commissioner Twilegar would like to table this public hearing until January 17th and added that "a ton of these were done in the '70s." The motion passed to table the hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING: The board deliberated on the Castle Mountain Home conditional use permit. Commissioner Twilegar said that members of the public had raised concerns that septic property was not legally divided.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Commissioner Tucker suggested a closed executive session under exempt records. Chairman Twilegar motioned the session and the motion passed.

PUBLIC HEARING: Coming back into session, Commissioner Twilegar said there was no action required and they

were continuing to discuss site specific conditions in the development of the property in regards to business. He spoke about the noise ordinance and specific hours of operation. Commissioner Twilegar motioned to reject the appeal for the conditional use permit based on the evidence presented. He said, "In doing so, uphold the decision of the Planning and Zoning Commission to approve the conditional use permit for Castle Mountain, including the findings of fact, the site specific conditions as outlined by the Planning and Zoning Commissioners," and then listed some changes for the conditions regarding the RVs or mini homes. All the commissioners were in favor and the motion passed.

Adjourned at 1:59 pm.

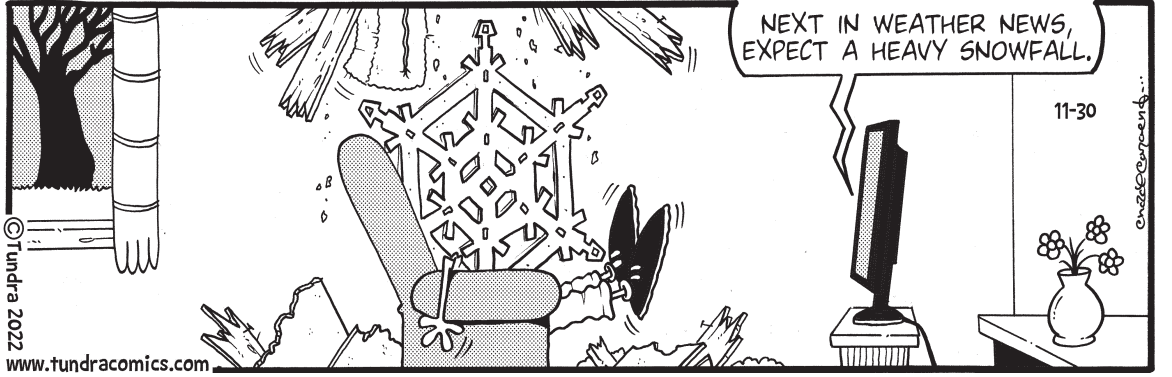

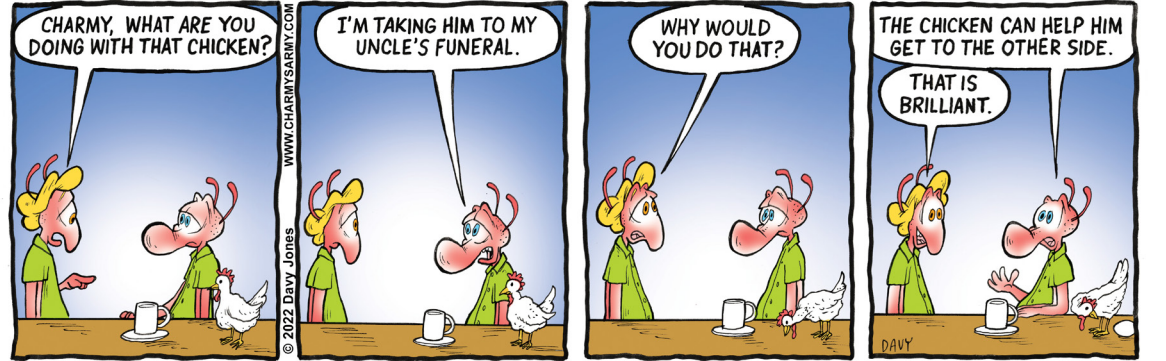

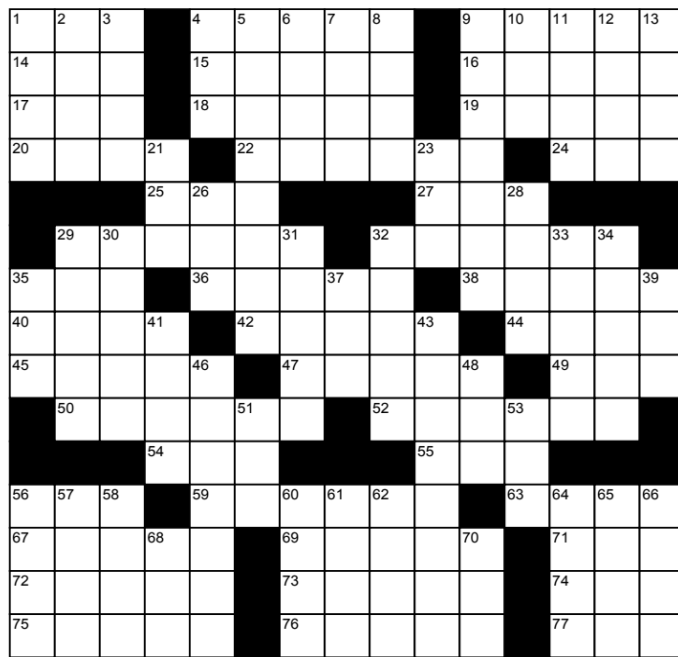

Be Prepared and Stay Safe During Winter Weather Power Outages

Provided by Idaho Power BOISE COUNTY -- With more winter weather arriving this week, Idaho Power is reminding customers to stay safe and always be prepared for possible outages. Although Idaho Power keeps the lights on 99.9% of the time, weather-related outages can last hours or even longer. The company offers the following tips to ensure you're ready if you are impacted by an outage:

- Sign up to receive alerts of outages at your residence or

business through My Account on the Idaho Power website or by downloading Idaho Power's free mobile app.

- Maintain both home and car emergency kits with water and other essentials. For a full list of items to include in your kit, visit idahopower.com/outagetips.
- Learn how to manually open security gates and garage doors.
- Keep a block of ice in your freezer in case the power goes out, and if it does, keep

your refrigerator/freezer doors closed to keep cold air where it's needed most.

If your power goes out:

- Check their online Outage Map or call 1-800-488-6151 to view or report outages.
- To protect your appliances, turn off any that were in use when the power went out — especially electric ranges and space heaters — to prevent the possibility of a fire if you're away when power is restored.

- For safety reasons, use battery-powered lights instead of candles.

- Only use generators in well-ventilated areas, and ensure the total electric load on your generator won't exceed the generator's rating.
- Never attempt to connect a portable generator to house wiring or plug it into an outlet.

Stay clear of downed power lines:

Falling trees, high winds, and

car accidents — especially on slippery roads — can knock power lines to the ground. If you come across a downed power line, always assume it is energized and dangerous. Stay clear, keep others away and immediately call 911 or Idaho Power at 208-388-2323 in the Treasure Valley or 1-800-488-6151. Learn more about what to do if a power line falls on your vehicle on Idaho Power's website.

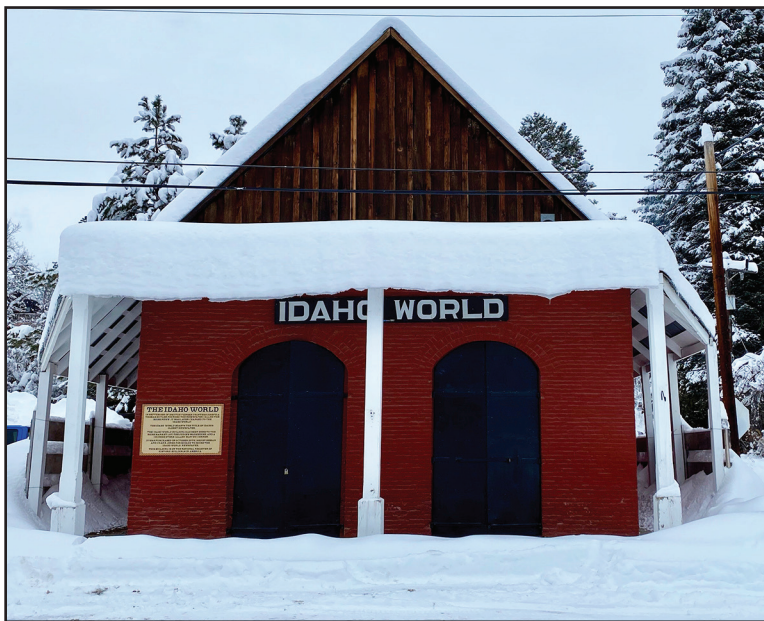
Garden Valley's Christmas Wish Tree
