### Tenderly Prepared Food Boxes are Gifted Throughout the Community

IDAHO CITY -- The annual food box for 2022 was just completed. During the event, ifferent organizations from the community work together to gather and distribute food to those in need. It is a big project, but when organized, it goes together smoothly. First, the boxes are made and marked for individual families, then food is collected through donations and brought to the Community Hall. Next, the volunteers put the food into the boxes. Finally, the food boxes are delivered

by the Boosters to Centerville, Placerville, and Star Ranch. The rest of the recipients come to the Community Hall to pick up their boxes. Along with the food, they are given fresh produce, dairy products, pies, and choice of turkey, ham, chicken and hamburger. This project was organized by Brent Adamson and Pam from Life Ministries, and supported by many of the local churches and community organizations, all to ensure that families will have food to enjoy for the holidays.

#### December 13, 2022

**Present:** Commissioners Steven Twilegar and Clay Tucker

Phone Conference: Commissioner Ryan Stirm

Pledge of Allegiance

**MINUTES**: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from December 5<sup>th</sup>. Commissioner Tucker seconded and the motion passed.

**JUVENILE JUSTICE**: A revision was discussed. Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the amended juvenile justice annual financial report. The motion carried.

TAX CANCELLATION: Assessor Chris Juszczak explained the tax cancellation for RVs. Commissioner Tucker motioned to request a tax cancelation for a parcel of land in the amount of \$1,522.83. Commissioner Stirm seconded and Chairman Twilegar abstained. The motion carried.

Juszczak said there was another tax cancellation for a house that had burned down the end of October in Terrace Lakes, so they are asking to cancel November and December, "just on the structure." Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the tax cancelation in the amount of \$121.23. The motion carried. Assessor Juszczak then said he may need them to hold off on that motion, because there was some concern for tree agriculture exemptions. Twilegar motioned to table the matter until further investigation could be done by the assessor.

Twilegar then motioned for a homeowners exemption for another property with a tax cancellation of \$267.12. All were in agreement and the motion passed. He motioned for another homeowners exemption done, I guess. *God*, these buildings are killing me." Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve to relocate the unit for \$3,500, and electrical for up to \$1,400.

**BILLS**: There were no questions, so Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the claims approval report in the amount of \$214,715.49. Commissioner Tucker seconded and nothing was heard from Commissioner Stirm. The motion carried.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE: Sheriff Turner mentioned that the grant writer got a grant for \$5,000, which he would like to discuss at next week's meeting.

**ROAD DEPT:** A grader was discussed, which broke down with a blade that was over ten years old. They have been plowing the snow and Chair-

man Twilegar said there had been "a lot of kudos online. Keep up the good work!"

**EXECUTIVE** SESSION: Closed session for exempt records and pending litigation. [Time 9:21am to 9:52am] Coming out of executive session, Twilegar spoke regarding the public hearing for the RS2-477 road validation in Quartzburg, "they gave us notice to withdraw the petition, so that will not be heard. The issue, however, of RS2-477 roads still exists. Maybe we'll come back to that and maybe we won't." He spoke about seeking an agreement and to see how a right-of-way discussion concluded, before they discuss the roads.

Adjourned until December 20, 2022.

### **Toys for Tots in Boise County**





### Fish & Game Winter Wildlife

winters, but Fish and Game steps in if emergencies arise

BOISE COUNTY -- Fish and Game has plans in place if emergency feeding is needed

We humans aren't the only ones who can find it a bit of a struggle when a heavy winter storm rolls through Idaho. Our state's wildlife, specifically deer, elk, and pronghorn, can also find themselves in dire straits during extreme and unusual winter weather.

Idaho's wildlife has adapted over thousands of years to survive a normal winter, but sometime conditions arise that require the department to step in and help big game.

Each region in the state (except the Panhandle) has an advisory committee in place that monitors weather conditions and makes a recommendation if Fish and Game crews should feed animals.

Other situations may also arise where emergency feeding is required, but the main policy is that Idaho's wildlife should be self-sustaining and reliant on natural habitat, not supplemental feeding every winter.

### Here are situations when winter feeding may be warranted:

### Excessively harsh winter conditions

When extreme weather threatens massive die-offs, Fish and Game has feed stockpiled so department personnel can react. But even during normal winters, some wildlife mortality is expected, and the depart-

Big game can handle Idaho ment's policy is that big game populations should generally be maintained under natural conditions, and with naturally available forage.

> If weather conditions begin significantly affecting herd survival, Fish and Game has a system in place to determine the best approach. The regional advisory committees keep a watchful eye on several weather conditions and factors, such as snow depths, whether there's crust on snow that hinders an animal's ability to forage, and extended periods of sub-zero temperatures.

If any of these situations start to occur, the committees convene and make recommendations to Fish and Game regarding whether to begin emergency feeding.

### Significant loss of winter forage

Mother Nature doesn't always play nice, and environmental factors like fire and drought can wreak havoc on a wintering deer or elk's food supply. Fish and Game wildlife managers will step in to help supplement wintering big game's diet when pre-existing forage is severely limited or nonexistent altogether.

### If an animal is causing damage to private property

Fish and Game will sometimes use alternative food sources to dissuade deer and elk from feeding on a landowner's stored agricultural crops, such as hay.

### If an animal is causing concern for public safety

Same goes for big game animals posing a threat to human safety. To entice big game animals away from major highways and roadways, Fish and Game wildlife managers will use feeding sites. This was the case recently in the Upper Snake Region, when Fish and Game instituted an emergency winter feeding operation to prevent a herd of elk from causing safety risks along the highways, and to keep them from mingling with local cattle operations.


- shape.






