# BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Transcribed by Eileen Capson

**January 17, 2023**

**Present:** Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Clay Tucker, and Lindy Lindstrom

**Pledge of Allegiance**

**CONSTITUENT INPUT:** None

**MINUTES:** Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from January 3<sup>rd</sup>, the emergency meeting from January 4<sup>th</sup>, January 9<sup>th</sup>, and January 11<sup>th</sup>. The motions carried and each were approved in order.

**ROAD NAME CHANGE:** Planning and Zoning Administrator Alex Gross referred to a road located down Highway 21, by Daggett Lane. The new residents requested that their road name be changed and there were no issues for concern. Chairman Twilegar motioned that the road name be changed to Lori Lane.

**APPROVED SUBDIVISION:** Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the signatures for Old Mills Acres subdivision plat. The motion carried.

**TRANSFER STATIONS:** Paul Rekow said all the inspections had been done for last year at the waste transfer stations.

**RACE TO ROBIE CREEK:** Sheriff Scott Turner explained that it was their standard contract. Prosecutor Adam Strong said there were several contracts that would need to be approved, including the mass gathering permit, law enforcement and EMS contract.

Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve this agreement to provide law enforcement at this event, traffic control, for the Race to Robie Creek by the sheriff's department.

**TITLE THREE:** Clerk Mary Prisco spoke regarding the federal funding for Title Three funds that include: Search and Rescue on federal lands, Firewise community projects, and help with the fire departments and EMS if their equipment is damaged on Forest Service or BLM property. She said that there would be a certification of expenditures coming up on February 1<sup>st</sup>.

**FORESTER/ EMERGENCY MANAGER:** Trinia Richardson said the "all-hazard mitigation plan" will expire in May and, "It's very important for the county to have the all-hazard mitigation plan for federal reasons." She spoke with contractors and was surprised by "the dollar amount

of what this cost." Richardson was quoted between \$54,000 to \$65,000 to have an update completed. She has reached out for help with funding and would like to incorporate the Title Three money. Chairman Twilegar asked how often the plan needed to be updated, and she responded it was every five years.

**DEMAND WARRANTS:** Chairman Twilegar said this was the last bill they had for T-Mobile through the Sheriff's office, because the service was not working well for the deputies. He made a motion to pay T-Mobile in the amount of \$1,016, and the motion carried.

Twilegar motioned to approve an invoice for internet in the Horseshoe Bend area in the amount of \$441, which was approved.

**CENTRAL DISTRICT HEALTH** – Jerry Davis spoke regarding Idaho sanitary restriction requirement laws in Garden Valley and passed out handouts. He said, "Any platted subdivision is subject to sanitary restrictions." And that the sanitary restrictions are in place, "unless they are released by Environmental Quality" or designated CDH department. He spoke regarding homesites that were less than two acres, and addressed water and sewer systems. Davis said that ten lots had been given to an orthodontist, as payment for orthodontic work done on one of the developers. Now the orthodontist wants to sell these lots that were developed back in 1974. Davis said that people get these good prices for bare land, but when they go to get a permit to build on them, like Garden Valley

Homesites, they can't build. "It's a camping lot," Davis said, referencing these lots that are about a half-acre, plus or minus. There are approximately 124 lots that are not on flat ground, without a public water system, and there have not been studies done to see how much water is available for individual wells. They are therefore unable to accept permits to build. Davis said there was an option to vacate the subdivision and several people had so over the years. Boise County's code says that the land must be a minimum of two acres lots for individual water and sewer. He said that if land owners want to go through this process of vacating the subdivision, they make them do test holes, monitor the groundwater, and meet all the rules.

**PUBLIC HEARING:** There was a public hearing for Alder Homes for a variance in Garden Valley. There was discussion regarding combining lots, and septic and well placement in relation to a creek and the hillside. The public comment portion was closed. The undue hardship of being unable to build a house was discussed at length. Prosecutor Strong offered federal and state definitions.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Closed session to discuss pending litigation. Coming back into session, Twilegar said they would continue to deliberate on this variance.

He then motioned to close the public hearing to discuss "the greater good... The evidence shows that there are special site conditions and characteristics that exist, which are peculiar

of the land." He said there were going to be high costs for a water system.

The Health District had rescinded the permit a year after the subdivision was approved in 1974.

**HEARING MOTION:** Chairman Twilegar made a

motion to approve the variance, and Commissioner Tucker said he agreed and seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion carried.

The findings of fact will be signed at a later time, prepared by the planning and zoning department.

## Horseshoe Bend Basketball Season and Tournament

**HORSESHOE BEND** --

The Horseshoe Bend Mustang Varsity Boys Basketball team has an overall record of 7-6 with an in-district record of 3-2 in the 1A DII Longpin division.

The team competed in the Truckstop.com Tournament over the winter break at Payette High School. The first day of the tournament had the Mustangs squaring off against the Vision Eagles from Caldwell. Horseshoe Bend took the win 52-41 with junior Porter Larson bringing in 22 total points.

Day two had the Mustangs facing off against the Watersprings Warriors from Idaho Falls. The Mustangs took a loss in this game, 23-42, junior Kaelun Jones was the high scorer with 8 total points.

The last day of the tournament, the team played the Liberty Charter Patriots from Nampa. Larson and junior Carson Drake tied for the most points scored with 8 apiece, but the Patriots came out ahead 55-38. Larson's efforts on the court earned him the title of All Tournament Player.

The team was on the road January 5 to Fairfield where they played the Camas County Musers. Junior Layth Bromgard brought in the most points, 18, but it wasn't enough for the victory and the Mustangs fell to the Musers 42-62.

At home on Saturday, January 7, the Mustangs hosted conference rivals, the Salmon River Savages. Larson scored 17 points and Bromgard broke a school record with the most rebounds, a total of 21! (The

previous record was made in 2018 by senior Blake Foster). In Cascade on January 10, the Mustangs played a nail biter against the Cascade Ramblers in a conference match-up. Horseshoe Bend took the win 43-41 with junior Nic Cooper scoring 15 points.

The team found themselves on the road again on Friday, January 13, this time traveling to Council to play the Lumberjacks in a Long Pin Division game. Council was able to pull off the win 57-35. Bromgard was the high scorer with 12 points.

The Mustangs were at home against Meadow Valley on Monday, 1/16 before hitting the road on 1/17 to play Tri-Valley, and then to Garden Val-
