Middle School Basketball Heads to Championship



B-team got a big win over Riverstone on Thursday to end their perfect 6-0 season.

IDAHO CITY -- The Idaho City Middle School boys' basketball team is making great strides under the leadership of Coach Sean Smith. The B-team went undefeated all season, 6-0, and the A-team is headed to the Eastern Conference as the #2 seed. Hosting in Idaho City on Wednesday, February 22, the Wildcats will take on the Victory Kodiaks, ranked #3, out of Meridian. Coach Smith said that his team had beat Victory in the preseason, but they have a point guard that is likely the best in the conference. Although this player may be good, it sounded like Coach Smith had a strategy planned for Wednesday's game.

Should the A-team beat Victory on Wednesday, they will move on to play on Saturday

against the team they had their first lost to in last week's game. Riverstone also was undefeated, 5-0, coming to the game on Thursday, February 16th, in Idaho City. They are ranked #1 in the conference.

Coach Smith admits he has known many of his players since they were babies. He has also taken over coaching middle school football, and had a duel winning season, 6-0, this year. As coach, Smith is also looking forward to next year's basketball team, because he will only be losing four of the twelve players to high school sports. He seems to have an innate passion for the competitive nature of sports, to hone the talents of his young players, and importantly, he recognizes their desire to "strive for greatness."

BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Clay Tucker, and Lindy Lindstrom

ROAD DEPARTMENT: Clerk Prisco explained the state of Road and Bridge maintenance, including old revenues and new revenues. Prosecutor Strong said, over time, with the new revenue, "I think it puts the road department in a much better position than it's been in the last four or five years."

POLLING PLACE: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the Ladies Auxiliary building in Horseshoe Bend for the polling place. The motion was approved, with a lease agreement of \$75.

GRANT: Chairman Twilegar motioned to accept the grant award in the amount of \$59,067 for the victim coordinator's salary and building cost. The motion carried.

RACE TO ROBIE CREEK: A six-hour time-frame for four EMTs, ATVs, and ambulance costs were reviewed and calculated by the commissioners. Prosecutor Strong said that they were not going to be able to negotiate the contract, because it was already signed by the other party.

ELECTED OFFICIALS MEETING

CORONER: Pamela Garlock explained her job within the county, which includes attending all deaths in the county and tending to investigations. She does have a few deputy coroners to help her, and the department works 365 days a year.

EMERGENCY MANAGER: Trinia Richardson spoke about the Boise County Fire-fighter Association, Boise Forest Coalition, and other meetings she attends. She discussed grants and those funds through the Idaho Department of Lands to reduce fire fuel on private lands.

WASTE MANAGEMENT/ WEEDS: Paul Rekow, Waste Superintendent, spoke before the board on the number of waste sites and their management. There are three waste sites and a fourth is managed by a private contractor, which they help to maintain. He presented the costs and rate changes. Rekow said, "In the last twenty years, we've only increased the prices five percent... In the last ten years, we've increased household waste 62%. Overall, we have about doubled the amount of

waste out of the county. Last year, we disposed of 5,816 tons and hauled it out of the county," and that did not include the burn pile items. The department has eleven employees and they have 40,000 contacts with the public. The Garden Valley waste transfer station, "On a busy day, there's a car on that road every 45-seconds. That's 300 people in 8-hours," Rekow said. "It's a busy, busy place." Other revenues include the sale of metal, sale on batteries, and auction items. He reported that trucking costs have almost doubled.

Rekow also explained that the current policy of the weed department - staffed by part time employees - is to provide chemicals to landowners who request them.

Chairman Twilegar inquired, "We provide spray to anybody who wants it in the county?" Rekow confirmed, "Pretty much." Twilegar continued, "Do we have applicators?" Rekow said that the county will supply the equipment, "a lot of my budget is the maintaining that equipment." Rekow said that the spray was to be used for noxious weeds, and the equipment needs to be returned to the county.

ROAD AND BRIDGE: Curtis Dill, Superintendent of Road and Bridge, said they were still working on hiring. "We normally have a crew of thirteen operators," Dill said. There are still two open positions in Garden Valley and one in Horseshoe Bend. He said they are working on more training. They are also bringing in more material for the roads because "they're worn out" and are trying to get them up to par. They have been experimenting more with de-icing. The department is looking to get some more equipment this year, and doesn't plan on doing any paving. Dill said he put in for some grants to do chip sealing for Banks Lowman Road.

SHERIFF: Scott Turner, Boise County Sheriff, said he has several employees that he shares with other departments,

nine patrol deputies, three school resource officers, and the chief deputy. There are also dispatchers and reserve deputies. Sheriff Turner explained his duties, "First and foremost, we're just required to keep the peace." He said, "A lot of people forget that. I have that argument with people all the time. We're peace keepers, we're not the Gestapo, we're not your personal Gestapo... People forget that now-a-days. We're obligated to provide a jail and transport prisoners. We don't have a jail. We contract out to Ada County." He said they take all the emergency and 911 calls, and dispatch the fire departments. He explained, "We are not emergency medical dispatchers. We transfer medical emergencies to State Com, and they coordinate the ambulance." He added, "Four or five years ago, we on average every quarter we would handle roughly between 700 and 800 calls a quarter, calls for service, generated or that come into our office. Currently, we're pushing probably 1,400 to 1,700 calls a quarter." He said they're extremely busy.

ASSESSOR: Chris Juszcak, Boise County Assessor, said that the main task of their office was to assess the taxes on many different types of properties, process ownership changeovers, and report to the State Tax Commission.

GRANTS: Nancy Holbert spoke regarding grants.

COMMUNITY JUSTICE: Amanda Leader said that her office "oversees a lot of different things: Juvenile and adult misdemeanor probation, pretrial services, out of court diversion program, community service, [and] electronic monitoring," consisting of GPS bracelets and alcohol bracelets. They are also out in the community, in the schools, and oversee several grants. The department assists the prosecutor's office. There are three employees in this office. There are currently four juveniles in detention, held in an outside county that Boise County con-

tracts with. Leader said that their numbers fluctuate within their services. She also oversees the grounds maintenance of the county buildings.

PLANNING AND ZONING: Alex Gross, Administrator, said there were five people in his office. He discussed some of their duties, including: building permitting, inspections, review, land use, addressing, code enforcement, road names, etc. They also prepare notices for all public hearing, review applications, and answer questions for the public. Gross said that they needed more staff.

PROSECUTOR: Adam Strong, Boise County Prosecuting Attorney, said he has two primary roles, which includes handling all the criminal cases, "that means that we handle every felony that happens in the county and we handle misdemeanors and infractions that occur outside of city limits." He said they average about 2,000 criminal cases a year, which includes everything from infractions to murder. Strong reported that five years ago, when he started, the number was about 1,200 a year, so that number had gone up about a third. They also handle

child protection cases, juvenile cases, and mental holds. "We represent the county in civil matters. So, we represent the Board of Boise County Commissioners for civil issues, we represent all the elected officials, because they have legal issues, all the department heads when they have legal issues, those run through my office. I give legal advice on employment issues, contracts, whatever." He said there are five people in his office.

CLERK: Mary Prisco, Boise County Clerk, explained, "the office of clerk is a very administrative position." There are five statutory responsibilities, including: Clerk of the District Court (4 employees), Auditor - Chief Financial Officer (county system, reporting to state agencies, budget, and payroll), Chief Elections Officer (which she faces a lot more public scrutiny), Recorder (responsible for the recorded documents), and Clerk to the Board. Prisco is also the Risk Manager for the insurance program, unemployment, and debt from indigent. She discussed public defense services that she receives, with primary and

conflict attorneys.

IT: Robert, computers and technical advisor, introduced himself.

LAND SWAP: A possible land swap with the Forest Service was discussed in detail.

AUCTION ITEMS: A vehicle belonging to solid waste, and other items for the auction were discussed. All the departments will be included.

COMMISSIONERS & DEPARTMENTS: The board members were assigned individually to work with each of the different departments.

PLANNING & ZONING: A public hearing was held for a land use issue that did not meet the Unified Land Ordinance, but permission and advice was given by the previous P&Z administrator for improvements to the septic system in Terrace Lakes on the individual's property. A right granted was discussed due to a hardship for the

applicant.

Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the three items, and that they had been met. The variance was approved with ayes from Commissioners Twilegar and Lindstrom. Commissioner Tucker voiced a nay. Chairman Twilegar then motioned to approve the proposed findings of fact and conditions of approval. All were in approval and the motion passed.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for a personnel issue. [Time 12:47 to 1:22 pm] Coming out of executive session, there was no action required.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for an indigent issue. [Time 1:22 to 1:41 pm] Coming out of executive session, Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve several "indigent assignments," and each were coded without names. The motion carried.

Adjourned at 1:42 pm.

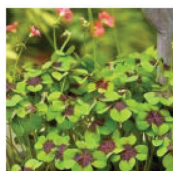

Horseshoe Bend Middle/High School Sources of Strength Assembly

HORSESHOE BEND -- The Horseshoe Bend Student Council, along with Middle School Peer Leaders, have been actively promoting a Sources of Strength "Gratitude" campaign on both campuses. The campaign culminated in an assembly on Thursday, February 16. Students wore t-shirts with key gratitude words (hope, faith, connect, grace, dream, strength) and completed a final activity together- Making a rainbow of things they are grateful for.

Sources of Strength is a suicide prevention program that helps students realize their strengths, as well as the strengths they have available to them in their community. Staff advisors and peer leaders conduct messaging campaigns throughout the school year that are meant to change peer group norms that can influence teen coping practices. The program targets eight critical protective factors that are linked to overall psychological wellness and reduced suicide risk. The aim is to increase the chance that a youth will seek out help and use their "Sources of Strength" when they are facing a period of distress or crisis.

The group's next campaign will focus on "Healthy Relationships" by giving students tools designed to recognize the signs of an unhealthy relationship. Middle School teacher Amy Hennig's Drama Club presented several vignettes of healthy and unhealthy relationships.

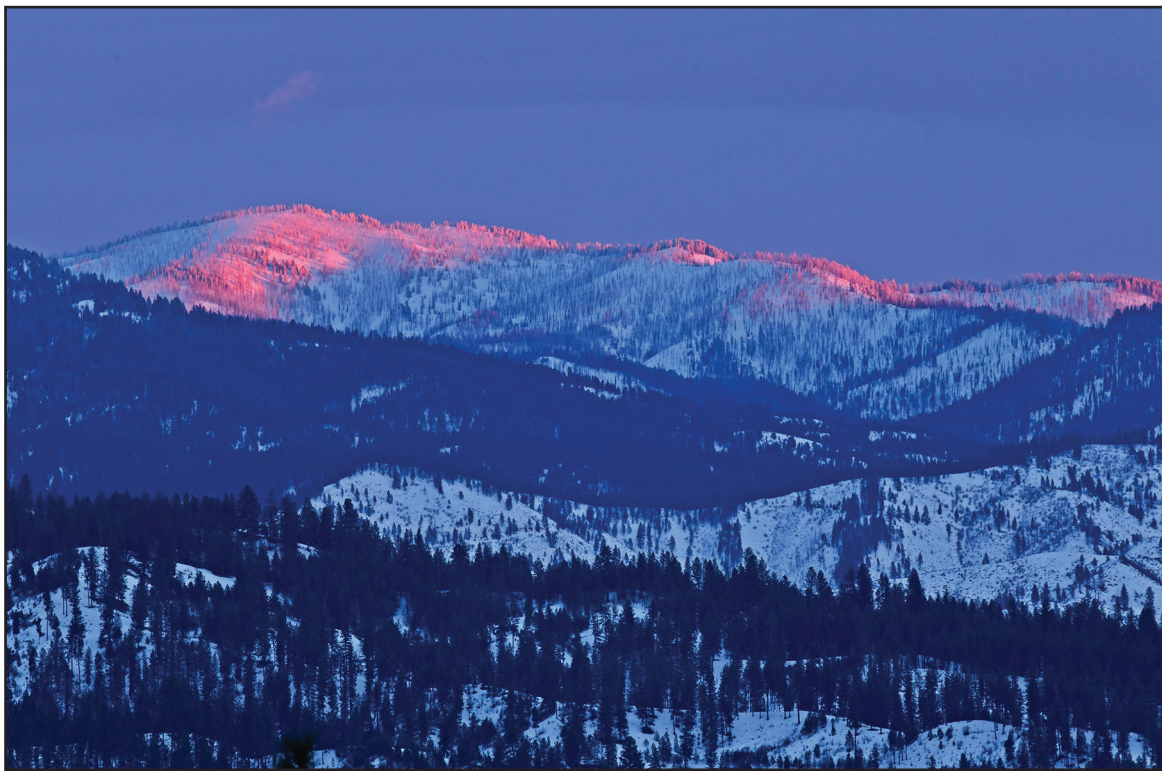

Proposed uses of federal funds
The County proposes to obligate the funds, as set forth in PL 114-10, as follows:

Funds to carry out activities described and sanctioned by the Firewise Communities program:

\$129,908 to pay salary, benefits, and operating costs of the Boise County Fire Mitigation Forester and to assist homeowners with professional management advice and modification of fuels within the home ignition zone.

The Forester will provide to Boise County homeowners living in fire-sensitive ecosystems education on mitigation best practices for community wildfire risk reduction, and home landscaping that can increase the protection of people and property from wildfires.

This proposed amount would be for the salary and benefits of the Forester, expenses for transportation, office and operations for the Forester, revision and maintenance of the Boise County Community Wildfire Protection Plan, and wildfire hazard mitigation and response planning, per the Boise County Community Protection Plan.

Assist homeowners with professional management advice and modification of fuels within the home ignition zone.

Funds to reimburse the County for emergency services performed on Federal land:

\$15,234 for the Boise County Sheriff

This amount would be to reimburse the Sheriff for anticipated search and rescue emergency services performed on federal land and paid for by the County.

The reimbursement will be for the salary or wages of emergency response personnel deployed during an emergency response, the replacement of equipment, material and supplies expended, damaged or destroyed during an emergency response, the repair of equipment damaged during an emergency response, and the maintenance of vehicles, equipment, and facilities during an emergency response.

Public comments

The County is holding a 45-day comment period which will end at 5:00 pm on March 18, 2023. The board is also sending this proposal to the Southwest Idaho Resource Advisory Committee pursuant to Section 302(b)(2) of PL 110-343. Please send the County any feedback, suggestions, or concerns that you may have regarding these proposed uses of these federal funds. Following the 45-day comment period, and after taking into full consideration the comments received, the Board will issue a decision on the proposed use of funds. The instructor, Cody Trowski from the City of Caldwell Fire Department and a member of the state HazMat Response Team, led the class.
