BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

March 14, 2023

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Clay Tucker, and Lindy Lindstrom

Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Twilegar first congratulated “our new judge, our new magistrate.” Prosecutor Adam Strong responded, “Thank you.” And Twilegar added, “Well done. You crushed the interview.”

CONSTITUENT INPUT:

A constituent proposed that the board of commissioners put a memorandum on new developments, so that Planning and Zoning would have time to amend the Unified Land Ordinance.

MINUTES: Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from March 7, 2023. All were in favor and the motion passed. A motion was also approved for the minutes on March 8th.

SUBDIVISION: Planning and Zoning Administrator Alex Gross spoke about a new proposed subdivision and said, “The developer is planning on spending about \$400,000 to pave this one mile stretch from Harris Creek Road.” He added that, according to the Boise County Road and Bridge Supervisor, this was one of the worst stretches of road in the county and is an expensive mile to maintain.

Commissioner Tucker looked at the cost to maintain the road and said, “These numbers make it look pretty nice to pave it.” Chairman Twilegar agreed and said, “It’s kind of a no-brainer. I didn’t realize that section was that bad.”

Gross said that the meeting concerning the subdivision was to be held later that evening by the P&Z Commission. He said,

“I don’t plan on discussing this with the board,” because the application may come before the board of county commissioners.

GRANT/ LOAN APPLICATION: Boise County Emergency Manager Trinia Richardson spoke about a loan that had appeared to be a grant. Prosecutor Strong addressed the issue and said that, typically, the county could not take out a loan, unless they get voter approval.

A Good Neighbor Agreement with neighboring counties was discussed and projects.

A grant to undertake fire mitigation work in the Lowman area was applied for.

HVAC: A county building has had a company come out to fix their HVAC, but it still was not functional and the employees were using space heaters. A bill from the company was received for \$3,060, and another for \$3,014. Office personnel have been out of the office for several weeks and were unable to answer billing questions.

CONTRACT: Chairman Twilegar motioned to accept a contract between Boise County and a law office. The motion carried.

RESOLUTION: Chairman Twilegar motioned to adopt Resolution 2023-07 to adjust the Boise County Reevaluation Fund. All were in favor and the motion carried. Clerk Prisco stated that it stemmed from the server crash earlier in the year.

CLAIMS REPORT: Twilegar motioned to accept the Claims Approval Report in the amount of \$259,347. The motion carried.

PRE-EMPLOYMENT SCREENING: Twilegar mo-

tioned to approve the Assessor’s invoice for a pre-employment screening in the amount of \$54. All were in favor.

PROSECUTOR: Travel expenses for witnesses were discussed. Twilegar asked, “Where did this person need to drive from, Kansas?” Prosecutor Strong said the person drove from eastern Idaho and explained the statutory mileage requirement. Clerk Prisco explained that they were taking the funds out of the “extraordinary legal department.” Twilegar motioned to approve the invoice for \$374, which was approved.

MOTION: Commissioner Tucker motioned to enter a fire alarm contract with All Valley Fire. Two commissioners were in favor and Commissioner Twilegar recused himself.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to go into executive session for a personnel issue. Coming back into session, Twilegar said there was no action required. He then addressed that the Prosecuting Attorney would be leaving, “There is a process and we all know that getting three people, it would be great if we did, that live in the county.” Prosecutor Strong said any applicant must be a registered Republican because he was elected as a Republican and it must go to the same party. He continued, “If those 15 days lapses, and there are not three qualified attorneys who live in the county and meet all of those qualifications, then that starts a different process under a different statute.” Then that opens up to the board of commissioners to “contract with whoever they want, whether

they are residents or not.”

ANNUAL MEETING WITH PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION: The board of Planning and Zoning attended the meeting in the afternoon, required by statute. **The Boise County Planning and Zoning Commission consists of seven (7) members from the community.**

There were discussions concerning appeals, possible litigation, new cell towers, zoning, etc. An advisory ballot question for zoning was revisited.

BOISE BASIN -- Recently, the Idaho City Community Club's Scholarship Committee, comprised of six members who have worked in universities, schools, and various professional careers, met to determine how they could improve the needs of the students and promote continuing education. With the help of Idaho City School Counselor Lyndsey Bell, the committee was able to track what objectives the graduating students accomplished in the last several years. Specifically, how many students went to universities, vocational schools, or pursued other interests. With that information, the Scholarship Committee wrote new applications.

This year, they will be offer-

Notice To Control Noxious Weeds - Idaho Code 22-2407. LANDOWNER AND CITIZEN DUTIES. It shall be the duty and responsibility of all landowners to control noxious weeds on their land and property, in accordance with this chapter and with rules promulgated by the director.

- (1) The cost of controlling noxious weeds shall be the obligation of the landowner.
- (2) Noxious weed control must be for prevention, eradication, rehabilitation, control or containment efforts. However, areas may be modified from the eradication requirement if the landowner is a participant in a county-approved weed management plan or county-approved cooperative weed management area.
- (3) The landowner shall reimburse the county control authority for work done because of failure to comply with a five (5) day notice, as outlined in section 22-2405, Idaho Code.
- (4) If an article is infested with noxious weeds, it shall not be moved from designated premises until it is treated in accordance with the applicable rules, or in accordance with the written permission of a control authority.

Arrest of Former Doctor

BOISE COUNTY -- Boise County court held a closed Grand Jury last Thursday, March 16th, in which an indictment was issued for the arrest of Richard Pines, 63, of Boise. Pines was charged with three counts of lewd conduct with a child under 16. Boise County Sheriff Scott Turner said this was part of a long investigation between Boise and

Ada County. It is unknown yet if, and what, charges may be added in this developing case. Pines was formerly an adolescent psychiatrist, but had his medical license revoked due to complaints of abuse dating back to 2011.

Boise Police Department detectives arrested the suspect, Richard Pines, on Friday, March 17, 2023. In 2021, BPD

received new information and reopened the investigations. There were three charges filed against Pines that stemmed from an investigation in Boise County against three juveniles, between 2004 and 2008. Detectives from the Boise Police Special Victims Unit (SVU) and BPD Victim Witness Coordinators have been working with these victims alongside the Boise County Sheriff's Office and the Boise County Prosecutor's Office to file criminal charges in this investigation.

"Victims in this investigation have been waiting years for criminal charges to be brought against this suspect," said Boise Police Captain Matt Jones, Criminal Investigations Division. "I would like to thank the Boise County Sheriff's Office and the Boise County Prosecutor's Office for assisting our SVU detectives as they worked tirelessly to ensure these victims' voices were heard. I would also like to recognize the victims in this case for remaining steadfast in their hope that justice would be served."

The Boise Police Department encourages anyone with more information about this investigation or who is a victim of sexual abuse to report it by calling Ada County Dispatch at 208-377-6790. The BPD Special Victims Unit takes all reports of sexual abuse seriously and works with FACES of Hope Victim Center in Boise to provide support for victims. FACES offers a one-stop triage center, where community partner agencies come together to best meet the unique needs that a victim experiences. <http://facesofhopevictimcenter.org/>

Recent Court Cases in Boise County

Stephen Shoemaker was arraigned in District Court on March 17th for four counts of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon or instrument from an incident that occurred in January of 2023. His rights were explained, and said that each charge carried up to five years in the state penitentiary, and up to a \$5,000 fine. He could also be charged with restitution and a civil penalty of up to \$5,000. The defense asked that the court extend the entry of plea for a month, until April 14th.

Stephen McChain was charged with the unlawful possession of a weapon by a convicted felon, and this case was also rescheduled for April 14th.

Edward Smith was charged with assault or battery upon certain personnel, aggravated enhancement. Smith had waived a speedy trial, and the defendant will come back for a trial during the final week in May.

Curtis Corvinus was charged with grand theft from

the Horseshoe Bend Fire Department. His attorney asked that the pretrial be held in May. Corvinus also waived a speedy trial and a pretrial conference will be held on May 12th and a jury trial for May 25th. He currently serves as a council member in Horseshoe Bend.

Scott Greenlaw was charged with the unlawful discharge of a weapon in a house or occupied building, or vehicle.

Danny E. Thompson was charged with aggravated assault, great bodily harm, and as a convicted felon in possession of a weapon. His jury trial was scheduled at the end of April.

Michael Dauber had a status conference on March 17th and more paperwork needs to be filed by the court, and an additional status conference will be held at a later date – March 24th by Zoom.

Lester Reger had his initial appearance in Magistrate court on March 20th for Murder 1, intimidating or deterring a witness from testifying, and arson.

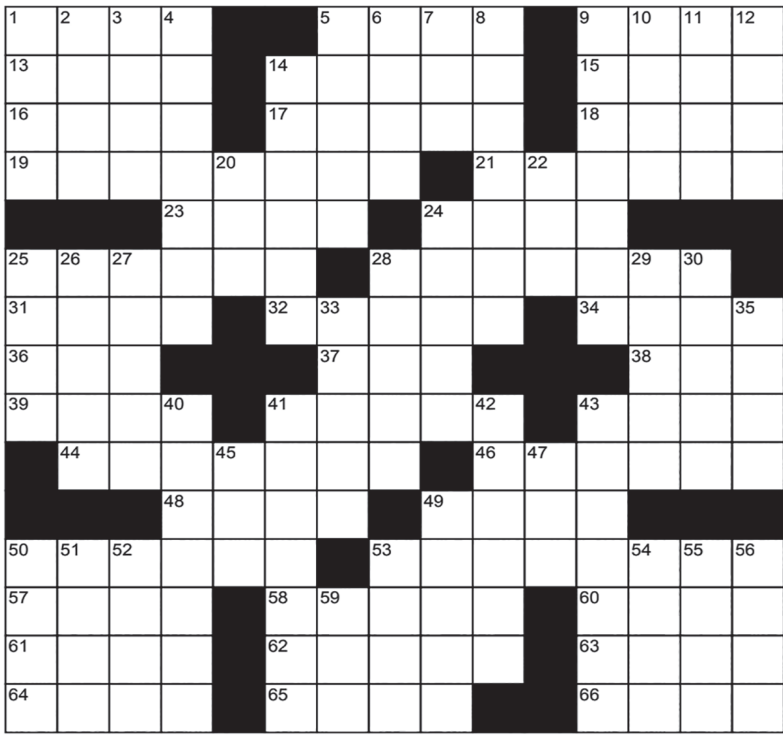

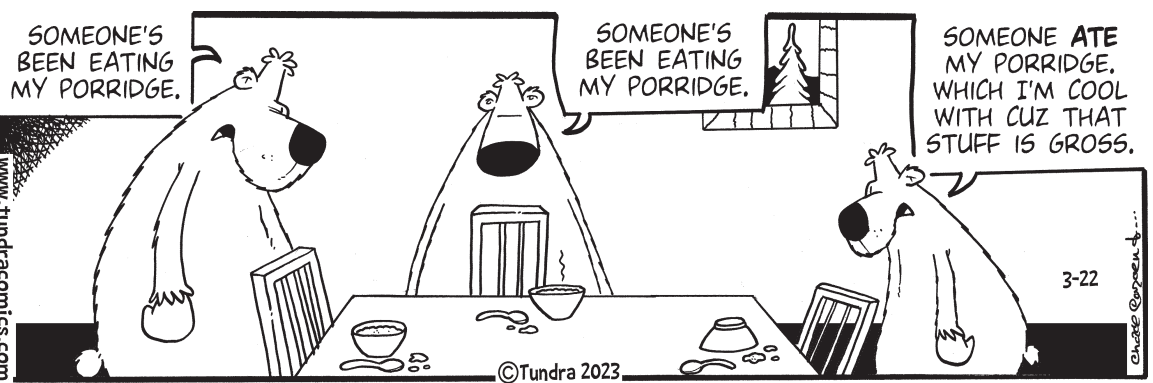

IDAHO CITY CLOSES PORTION OF ROAD DUE TO EXCESS DAMAGE AND POTHOLES

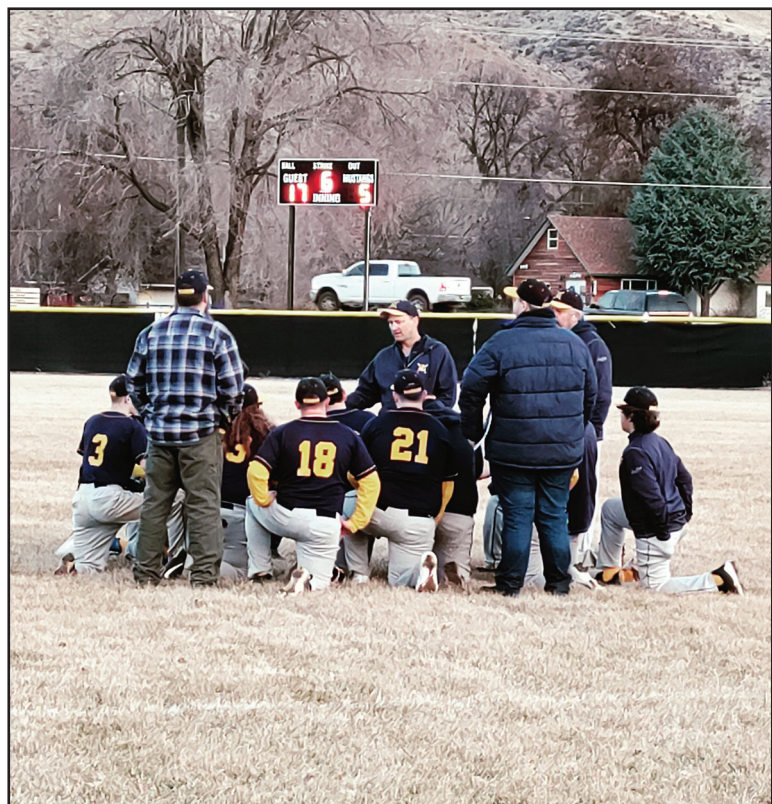
IDAHO CITY -- During a Boise County Commissioners' meeting held on Tuesday morning, March 21st, the status of Montgomery Street in Idaho City was discussed at length with a constituent and Idaho City Mayor Kenny Everhart. There was some question as to the ownership of the road and whether it was a designated truck route; however, the county prosecutor said that, by statute, the road would belong to the city. The potholes have grown so expansive that it makes it very troublesome to travel by vehicle on that road. County Commissioner Steven Twilegar questioned whether the paved area could be removed and the road could be returned to gravel, and the mayor seemed to agree.

A notice went out to local residents from the City of Idaho City on Tuesday afternoon stating: "Beginning March 22, 2023, at 7am until further notice, Montgomery St. will be closed from Highway 21 to Walulla St. for road construction. We apologize for any inconvenience."

Mayor Everhart was unavailable for comment.
