Life Flight Helps Instruct Volunteer Emergency Responders

IDAHO CITY -- The Life Flight Network offered to do a presentation, including landing zone training, with emergency responders this past Saturday in Idaho City. Tom Mortimer, an EMT with Life Flight, conducted a lecture for eighteen Boise County fire personnel, with representatives from Idaho City Fire, Robie Creek Fire, and Lowman Fire. There were additionally a few Lowman Ambulance personnel that attended the training.

Life Flight was kind enough, and had a long enough lull in calls, that they were able to actually fly to Idaho City to help instruct the team on proper emergency setup. The volunteers learned how to secure a landing zone, about radio communication, and hand signals used for landing the helicopter. The team even learned how to load a critical patient into the helicopter while the blades were still whirling!

Special thanks to Idaho City Fire Protection District for hosting the event and to Life Flight for sponsoring the event. John Ward, an instructor with ICFPD, reminded the community, “As always, please thank all the many volunteers in our county. They give freely of their time and finances to provide invaluable services to residents and visitors.”

Legislative Session Review

By Rep. Matthew Bundy, District 8 (Elmore, Boise, Valley, Custer Counties)

BOISE COUNTY -- The 2023 legislative session had some great successes, and we accomplished some great things. Here are some of the issues that were addressed and put into effect this session. I appreciate representing you in the legislature.

Property tax relief – The Legislature passed \$117 million in ongoing property tax relief and \$20 million in one-time relief for FY 2024. In the past three years, Idaho has turned back more taxpayer money through tax relief than any other state per capita.

Launch – The Legislature approved the Idaho Launch program, providing \$8,000 grants for qualifying high school graduates to use at any community college, career technical program, or workforce training provider of their choice starting in 2024.

Teacher pay and education investments – The Legislature approved raising starting teacher pay to \$47,477, targeting Idaho for a top 10 spot nationally. The plan also strengthened pay for all teachers, including our most experienced educators, as well as school staff. The Governor and Legislature fulfilled a historic commitment to public schools – a 16.4% increase in state funding.

Educational assistance for families – The Legislature approved making permanent the popular *Empowering Parents* grant program to help families take charge of education expenses for their children outside the classroom.

Transportation, water, and infrastructure – In recent years, the Legislature has championed investments in critical infrastructure without raising taxes or fees. The Legislature fully funded the known ongoing transportation safety gap, making Idaho roads safer. We leveraged federal funds to

increase broadband capacity in Idaho and made investments to expand water projects to ensure a stable water supply and safe local drinking water and wastewater systems.

Public safety – The Legislature renewed their commitment to safe communities by increasing pay for law enforcement officers, beefing up resources to fight fentanyl, and improving behavioral health resources for Idahoans in need.

Boise County Republican Central Committee

The Boise County Republican Central Committee cast a unanimous recorded "No Confidence Vote" in Senator Geoff Schroeder at our regular meeting on April 24, 2023. Senator Schroeder campaigned as a conservative but voted with the Democrats on most bills. According to the Idaho Freedom Foundation's 2023 Idaho Freedom Index, 2023 Idaho Spending Index and the 2023 Idaho Education Index, his votes rank a solid "F". Education @ 44.4% "F", Freedom @ 40.7% "F"; Spending @ 6.1% "F". An example of excess spending is Governor Brad Little's "Launch Program" that added new expenditures by the state of \$80 Million. Senator Schroeder's YES vote increased the tax burden on the Idaho taxpayers and increased the size

of government. Another example of Senator Schroeder's bad voting is the vote he cast on SJM 101 Immigration - His YES vote for this Joint Memorial sets forth a path for amnesty by those that have come to this country illegally.

The Boise County Republican Central Committee also cast a unanimous recorded "No Confidence Vote" in Representative Matt Bundy on April 24, 2023. In 2022, he served as a Representative in District 23. His Idaho Freedom Foundation's 2022 voting record was terrible but it got even worse in 2023 when he represented District 8. His votes now rank a solid "F." Education @ 39.5% "F", Freedom @ 48.1% "F", Spending @ 8.9% "F". Representative Bundy's NO vote on H071 Vulnerable Child Protec-

tion Act, generated a censure from the BCRCC and all other Legislative District 8 Republican Central Committees. Rep. Bundy voted to increase Idaho's budget for fiscal year 2024 to a whopping \$13.9 billion while voting for a minimal property tax relief bill.

When a candidate runs as a Republican in Idaho, they are to accept the Party Platform as written and voted on by grass root Republicans from all over the State of Idaho. Boise County's Republican Central Committee is committed to individual freedom, lower taxes and less government.

Or, an alternative is to pick up a DETERRA drug deactivation system pouch Deanna Paine is holding in the picture. Pouches are available at the GVFD during office hours, 8am-5pm Monday - Friday. It is easy to use. Just open the pouch, place unused drugs inside the pouch, fill halfway with warm water, wait about 30 seconds for the foam to dissipate and then seal the pouch. The drugs will be rendered inactive and ready for disposal in a safe and "green" way, as opposed to flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the

May Kicks Off Safety Awareness for the Boating Season

BOISE COUNTY -- The season of enjoying the outdoors and water activities is quickly approaching, with May kicking off the boating season. Each year our Federal, State, and local agencies along with the United States Coast Guard and United States Coast Guard Auxiliary participate in the National Safe Boating Week event. This event helps to set the focus on communicating safe boating practices for the remainder of the boating season. This is also a chance to participate in a free vessel safety check offered to boaters and paddlecraft users. The safety check focuses

on boaters and paddlecraft users having readily available life jackets, whistles, registration/documentation, and a few other safety items. During the vessel safety check, volunteers will ask if you have completed a Boat Idaho or other boating safety course and share information about further resources and available safety classes. These classes can make a critical difference. Every year, people are injured or killed due to poor paddlecraft and boating practices. Contributing issues range from not wearing life jackets, not being alert to potential dangers, and boating under the influence. Wearing a properly fitted life jacket, limiting alcohol consumption, and taking a boating safety class are a few of the most important things people can do to prepare for a safe boating season this year.

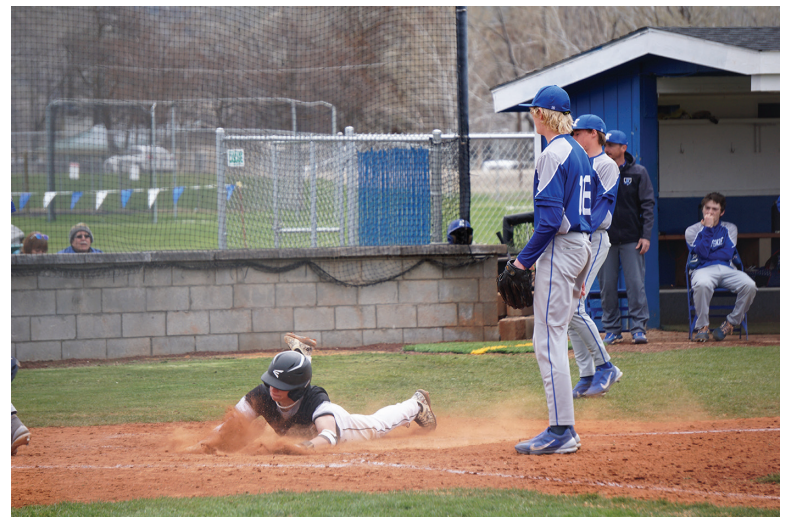

Sophomore Trey Bauer had 2 hits with 1 run and 2 RBIs. Ochoa had 1 hit with 1 run and 1 RBI. Senior Barette Huston came in with 1 hit with 1 run. Freshman Lukken March contributed 1 run. Sophomore Brayden Bouge was on the scoreboard with 1 run. Graham had 1 hit and 1 run and junior Nic Cooper had 1 run.

At home on Thursday, April 13 against the Raiders the Mustangs senior pitcher, Evan Hampton, had 2 strikeouts giving up one earned run off a hit by pitch. Junior Nic Cooper gave up 7 hits with 10 runs, 6 earned and put away 13 by strikeout. Junior Gavin Tomlinson closed walking 5 with 5 runs. The Mustangs lost in a close one, 14-16.

Bauer had 2 hits with 1 run and 1 RBI. Ochoa had 3 runs. Junior Carson Drake had 1 hit and 2 runs. March had 1 run, Hampton had 1 hit, 1 run and 3 RBIs. Graham came in with

Senior Blayne Meyer had 2 hits with 1 run and 1 RBI. Ochoa had 1 hit, 1 run and 2 RBIs. Drake came in with 1 hit 2 runs and 4 RBIs. Huston had 1 hit and 3 RBIs. Bauer had 1 hit and 2 runs, Hampton had 1 run, and Graham had 1 hit, 3 runs and 1 RBI. Cooper contributed 1 hit and 2 runs and Bromgard had 1 run.

The team was in Glens Ferry on Tuesday, April 18 where they lost to the Pilots 9-14 in a 1A Western Division conference game. Drake started on the mound, giving up 4 hits for

Blood Drive in Idaho City on May 5th

IDAHO CITY -- Thirty years ago, Gale and Jim Phillips' infant son Colton was in an Oakland hospital fighting for his life. Now, three decades and countless blood transfusions later, Colton is doing well, and his parents are organizing a Red Cross Blood Drive in Idaho City on May 5 to raise awareness of the profound impact blood donors have on families like theirs.

"We just felt like it was so important to give the community the opportunity to save a life," she said.

A couple weeks after he was born, Colton became very sick. Gale and Jim, who were living in Eureka, CA, at the time, took him to a nearby hospital. Initially, doctors diagnosed him with hydrocephalus, which causes fluid buildup in the brain and excessive pressure. The Phillips were told a shunt would solve the problem.

But four weeks later Colton's condition worsened, and he was life flighted to the Oakland Children's Hospital. Within minutes of his arrival, an MRI revealed Colton had brain cancer. A 12-hour brain surgery followed.

"It was terrifying," Gale said.

During that time, Colton's entire blood supply had to be replaced three times.

"So at a very young age – my husband and I were 21 – we realized how important it was that people donated blood because without that our baby wouldn't have made it," she said.

During the next year, Colton was in and out of the Oakland hospital as he underwent chemotherapy and continued to receive blood transfusions. Things seemed to be heading in the right direction, but then doctors discovered cancer cells in his back and saw that his main tumor was growing. Meningitis followed, and Jim and Gale made the difficult decision to stop treatment and bring Colton home so he could be more comfortable. Against all odds, Colton began to recover.

Now age 30, Colton deals with

epilepsy and other challenges related to his illness but is doing well and works a couple of hours each week at the local library.

"He wants to give back to the world that gave him his life," Gale said. "Colton is in awe that we live in a world where we're able to do this kind of stuff."

Gale and Jim, who have lived in Idaho City for the past five years after 25 years in the Boise valley, are both blood donors, though Gale said she was a bit hesitant at first.

"I'm scared of needles so I'm just surprised at how easy and how comfortable the (staff) makes you feel," she said. "The employees of the Red Cross are very understanding, compassionate and patient and they make a very uncomfortable thing comfortable."

The Phillips family said they will never forget the generosity and kindness of the blood donors who helped keep their son alive during their darkest days.

"We are so grateful that they were able to be an instrumental part of saving our son's life," Gale said. "Without the blood, the doctors and the nurses and the hospitals couldn't do it."
