Missing Snowmobiler in Lowman, Tyler Beyer

BOISE COUNTY -- The search for Tyler Beyer, the 30-year-old man from Lowman, who went missing on March 12th after snowmobiling into the backcountry may have been temporarily halted, but the thoughts and grieving continues in Lowman. Tyler had resided in Lowman since 2019 (originally from Wisconsin) while working in the local timber department of the U.S. Forest Service Lowman Ranger Station. He had a passion for his job that was inherited from his father and grandfather who both worked in the timber field. He also supplied many in the Lowman area with firewood. He spent most of the summers cutting and splitting after getting the proper fire cutting wood permits from the U.S. Forest Service, which are available to anyone at the Ranger Station.

The last couple of years, Tyler took up the hobby of wood-working. He built amazing usable handmade wooden items such as picnic tables, bird

feeders, and even coat racks, to name a few. He also loved elk shed hunting. Somehow, he was always able to go out hiking and return with several sheds. Once, when shed hunting in the Blackhills of South Dakota, he and his beloved dog Aspen returned with 14 sheds!

The entire family regularly rode snowmobiles in northern Wisconsin. In Tyler's freshman year of college at the University of Wisconsin, he received his first brand new Arctic Cat snowmobile from his father for Christmas. His mother, Suann told *The World*, "It was one of those gifts of boxes in boxes until he finally got to the key."

Tyler was not new to snowmobiling, although our beautiful Idaho mountains hold their own challenges. His parents, Suann and Brian Piontek, of Oregon, were very proud of their son, as were his younger sisters Brittani and Kiersten. They are completely heartbroken.

Tyler's favorite time of year was always winter. He loved to ski and recently bought a

new Arctic Cat snowmobile. He loved winter and once said, "I wish winter would never end." It has now been almost three weeks since the last time someone saw Tyler. Our hopes of having him back in our community are fading, but his memory will always live on in our hearts. Tyler will forever have winter and the beauty it holds.

BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Transcribed by Eileen Capson

March 28, 2023

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Clay Tucker and Lindy Lindstrom.

Pledge of Allegiance

CONSTITUENT INPUT: None

MINUTES: Commissioner Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from March 21st, which was seconded, and the motion carried.

LETTER: Clerk Mary Prisco explained an annual insurance requirement for the Warm Springs landfill closure.

CORONER: Pam Garlock and a few of her deputies will be attending training.

DEPUTY PROSECUTOR: Mitchell Coats suggested that since it was decided that Montgomery Street was the responsibility of the city of Idaho City only after reviewing fifty years of information, this agreement should be documented. Chairman Twilegar agreed.

PUBLIC DEFENDER: The regular public defender for Boise County had a conflict of interest with a client. Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve a public defender contract with another attorney. The motion carried.

OPIOID SETTLEMENT: Clerk Prisco explained that there were five motions to be made. Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve each pharmaceutical distributor, including CVS, Walmart, and Walgreens. The motions carried.

CLAIMS REPORT: Chairman Twilegar asked if there were any questions, then made a motion to accept the claims report in the amount of \$125,320.14. The motion carried.

CERTIFICATES OF RESIDENCY: Twilegar motioned to approve two certificates of residency for two college-bound students. The motions carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Twilegar motioned to go into executive session for risk management. [Time 9:11am to 9:26am] There was no action required.

EMERGENCY MANAGER: Trinia Richardson informed the board that Idaho Power was considering doing a pilot program using cameras to detect smoke throughout Boise County.

ROAD DEPARTMENT: Curtis Dill explained, "Mother Nature is just not playing fair, but actually the guys are doing pretty good." The department has had more grader training,

and they are looking to get more material on the roads.

TRASH AND WEEDS: Paul Rekow said that they have four different types of weather at the collection sites. In Horseshoe Bend, they are spraying weeds and receiving vegetation cleanup from residents. Meanwhile, Lowman is still frozen. Rekow added that there were complaints about the Garden Valley dump road and that they work on it, along with the road department. "It's steep and until the frost is out, it's not going to get better. We haven't lost a garbage truck in it yet, so we're good." Twilegar chuckled and said, "That's a plus." Rekow said if the brush pile doesn't dry out, it may remain closed until May 1st, "so that's going to upset a lot of contractors with wanting to get dirt work started for foundations."

Rekow said as soon as it stops freezing, they will start weed treatments.

TREASURER: Gina Turner said this was a quiet time of the year for her office, but they are focusing on past due property collections.

SHERIFF: Scott Turner said his office was busy and they are looking to have "justified" deputy overtime this summer.

COMMUNITY JUSTICE: Amanda Leader said their computers were from 2013 and need to be updated. Twilegar said he's put this request "on the list."

Leader then spoke about implementing new electronic monitoring technology, "I anticipate seeing an increase in the use of monitoring equipment." This would include ankle GPS bracelets, alcohol breathalyzers, and a bracelet for alcohol monitor.

An agreement for maintaining the area by the Horseshoe Bend Pond was discussed.

PLANNING & ZONING: Alex Gross spoke regarding access to the community justice building.

CLERK: Mary Prisco said her office was getting ready for Bailey and Company to come for the 2022 audit. She said the books were still not closed, "It has to do with some really, really weird stuff on the software."

Pertaining to elections, she said there was an effort to recall a Horseshoe Bend City Council Member. Prisco said, "Yesterday, I did send out a certification letter to the petitioner validating... that initiates the process." The petitioner will have 75 days to collect signa-

tures of Horseshoe Bend voters within the Horseshoe Bend boundaries [to recall Councilmember Curtis Corvinus].

PUBLIC HEARING: A variance was requested for a property due to some unique features of the land in Centerville. There was a matter of three feet that was in question, in meeting the ordinance, where the owner wants to build a new building. Chairman Twilegar made a motion to approve the variance after some discussion, and the motion carried.

PUBLIC DEFENSE COMMISSION: Jennifer York from the Public Defense Commission offered an update and then asked about Boise County's indigent defense system for their annual review. They offer training to public defenders and prosecuting attorneys.

PUBLIC HEARING FOR SOLID WASTE INCREASES: Paul Rekow restated from a previous meeting that, "The solid waste department is not tax funded; it's strictly funded off of the fees that are charged." He said in looking at the revenue versus expenses over the past three years, "We lost about \$53,000." Rekow spoke further about the physical costs and the fees that are collected at each waste transfer site, including Garden Valley, Horseshoe Bend, and Idaho City [Lowman was not mentioned]. He said the crux of the resolution states that fees would be raised from \$70 a ton to \$80 a ton. The resolution would also raise the cost for construction demolition to \$15 a cubic yard, from \$10. They are also proposing that the fee for asphalt and gypsum shingles, and drywall disposal be \$20 per a cubic yard from \$10. Rekow also had concerns with the cost of the disposal of tires. Currently, the transfer stations will take two free tires each time an individual comes. This initiative, although it's a large portion of the budget to dispose of the tires, is to keep them out of the creeks, from being dumped along the roadways, etc. The resolution does not address free tires.

Chairman Twilegar recounted for the record, "The idea is to have Solid Waste pay for itself." Rekow stated that they have also seen a 9% increase over last year in contracts, wages, and fuel.

Chairman Twilegar motioned to adopt Resolution 2023-08 to set solid waste fees for extraordinary items and county

transfer facilities that will be effective May 1, 2023. He then reiterated that two free tires will be accepted per day. The motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING FOR PROPOSED PLANNING AND ZONING FEE INCREASES: Alex Gross said the goal of the resolution was for development to pay for itself and not be a burden on property tax payers. He said, "I think what we've been charging for smaller projects has been the right amount, and they're going to stay or decrease a little bit now." This would include carports and sheds. He said it was unequal in the past, "how little new houses, new developments, were paying." Additional fees to cover Lowman and Bogus Basin, because of distance traveled, was discussed for inspections. Commercial properties were also discussed. "That was the whole point of this whole thing," Commissioner Twilegar said, "was to shift costs on to the people who are building and doing developments." Twilegar then proposed a few changes, "to illuminate the extra cost to Lowman and north of Lowman, keep it at \$150,

all around. The commercial inspections will be determined by Planning and Zoning staff at the time of the application permit based on square footage."

Chairman Twilegar closed the public hearing, and motioned to adopt Resolution 2023-09 establishing a revised Planning and Zoning department fee schedule. The effective date will be April 1, 2023. The changes will include the \$150 fee for everyone in the county, even Lowman. Commercial inspections will be determined by the P&Z staff at the time of the application for permit based on square footage. The permit fee multiplier will start at .0041. Commissioner Tucker seconded the motion, all were in agreement, and the motion carried.

Adjourned at 2:11pm.

When you are elk hunting and see someone across the canyon shoot and kill more than one elk, how would you report this? Providing the right details when reporting a wildlife crime not only helps our conservation officers investigate a case, but ultimately increases the likelihood that a violator stealing Idaho's wildlife resources is held accountable.

Please remember that safety should always be your first priority when acting as a witness to a crime.

Without dedicated sportsmen and women doing the right thing—making the call and reporting—many wildlife violations would go undetected, undocumented and unsolved.

Try to remember the details when reporting a wildlife crime. These specific details will help us investigate a case:

Vehicle: Describe the vehicle

and note the license plate, vehicle type, and color.

Location: Where did the crime take place? Use a GPS location or mapping app to point to the location where the crime occurred.

Wildlife: What wildlife was

involved?

Photos: Take photos or videos that capture the scene.

Suspect Description: Describe the suspect, and be specific as possible.

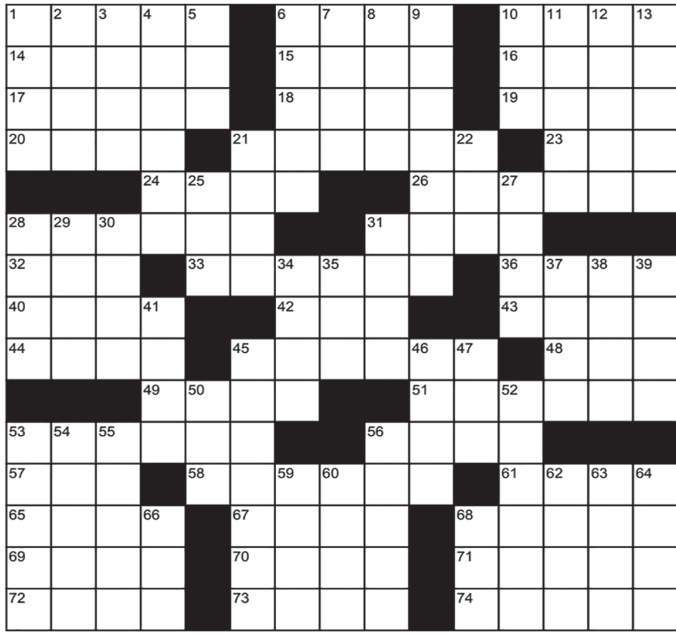

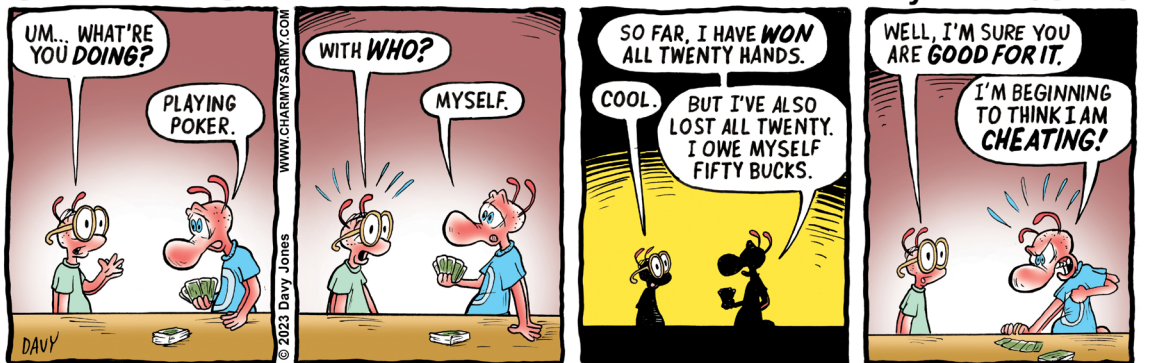
