Horseshoe Bend Bar Rescue at the Corner Cafe

HORSESHOE BEND -- Celebrity bar and grill makeover maven Jon Taffer descended upon the small town of Horseshoe Bend to work his *Bar Rescue* magic on the Corner Cafe Bar & Grill. Located in the heart of town at 446 Highway 55, the Corner Cafe has been under the new ownership of David Johan for about one year. Johan grew up in a small town in France where his parents owned and operated a restaurant, and while he saw the Corner Cafe as a money-making enterprise, he also purchased the restaurant and bar for nostalgic reasons.

Local community member LD Bauer was hired by Johan to be his general manager, and according to the recent episode of *Bar Rescue*, renovations began with high spirits but had fallen off in recent months.

Taffer and his band of experts quickly took over the establishment with their usual bluster, which began by criticizing Johan, Bauer, and staff members, before building them back up and presenting them with a newly renovated bar/restaurant.

On the night of the stress

test, locals lined up to have a chance to be part of the filming pre-makeover. Many were turned off by the Covid testing requirement back in July of 2022, but production was still able to seat a full house.

Things turned ugly shortly after the service began, with Taffer actually throwing the towel on the production. However, the following night, guests were invited back to see the "new" bar and grill the following night. Night two went much smoother for Johan, Bauer, and crew, as Taffer proudly showed off the renovations, which included a renaming of the bar and grill to the Country Barn Corner Cafe, praised the team for their newfound skills, and predicted the bar and grill would soon find success.

The episode, **Horseshoe Bend it Like "Bar Rescue"** (Season 8, episode 37-available On Demand through the Paramount Network) ended with the normal screen crawl of updates that stated sales of drinks and food had been increasing over the weeks since the production staff left, customers loved the makeover, and Bauer was leading her crew in true general manager

Former Fire Chief Pleads Guilty to Grand Theft

HORSESHOE BEND -- On Friday, May 12th, Curtis Corvinus, former Horseshoe Bend Fire Department Chief, plead guilty to the felony offense of taking public money from the Department's Burn Out Fund during his tenure. Corvinus stepped down as chief in March of 2022, but has retained his seat on the Horseshoe Bend City Council. *The Idaho World* reached out to the City of Horseshoe Bend, but has not received word whether the councilmember has stepped down, or will be released due to this felony conviction. According to the Constitution of the State of Idaho, Corvinus will no longer be eligible to hold public office.

The complaint filed on September 7, 2022, against Corvi-

nus alleged that he wrongfully took \$3,668.53 from the Horseshoe Bend Fire Department between November 1, 2021 and March 31, 2022. Sentencing has been scheduled for August.

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Lindy Lindstrom, and Clay Tucker

Pledge of Allegiance

AMENDMENT TO THE AGENDA: Chairman Twilegar motioned to adjust the agenda to accommodate the bill cycle per Clerk Mary Prisco's request under the claims. The motion carried.

CONSTITUENT INPUT: None

MINUTES: Twilegar motioned to approve the official meeting minutes for May 2nd and May 3rd. The motions carried.

ROAD DEPARTMENT: Curtis Dill explained that the Road Department was willing to surplus some equipment that

Gem County is interested in purchasing. Chairman Twilegar will address this issue with a Boise County Resolution next week.

WITNESS COORDINATOR: A motion was passed to compensate travel to a conference for the witness coordinator for out-of-state training.

PLANNING AND ZONING: Alex Gross spoke of hiring a full-time employee, which will replace a part-time employee position. Commissioner Tucker asked what the difference would be in having a full-time employee, rather than part-time. Gross said, "to be more responsive" with people, and listed a few other reasons. Chairman Twilegar asked if approval of this hire might ex-

tend the Planning and Zoning Office open hours to include Fridays. Gross said he would try his best to be open on Fridays. Twilegar motioned to approve the full-time offer for the part-time position that will be vacant soon. All were in favor and the motion passed.

MOTION: Twilegar motioned to approve an agreement for annual generator inspections and services throughout the county for \$3,258.

TECHNOLOGY: Technology and the current status of technology was discussed.

MOTION: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve an agreement between the Boise County Sheriff's Office and the Army Corps of Engineers to patrol an area. The motion was

approved.

Twilegar then motioned to approve an agreement between Boise County and the U.S. Forest Service for weed spraying.

MOTION: Twilegar motioned to approve the Claims Approval Report in the amount of \$133,610.88. All were in favor and the motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for pending litigation. [Time 9:36am to 9:42am] No action was required.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session for personnel as the East Boise County Ambulance Board. [Time 9:44am

to 10:00am] No action was required.

PROSECUTING ATTORNEY: Alex Sosa was sworn in as appointed Prosecuting Attorney for Boise County. Chairman Twilegar asked Sosa to raise his right hand and administered the oath of office.

TELEPHONE COMPANY: An individual spoke about providing internet to the Lowman area. He said there was a lot of grant funds available, but asked for a letter of support. Completing the Lowman project was discussed. The board

Construction of State Highway 21 Wildlife Overpass at Cervidae Peak Starts this Month

BOISE COUNTY – The next step in the long-range vision to improve motorist safety along State Highway 21 begins this month with construction of the Cervidae Peak Wildlife Overpass, between Lucky Peak and Idaho City at milepost 19.3.

A two-lane bypass road will allow motorist passage during construction, anticipated for completion in October 2023. Motorists can expect reduced speeds and periods of lane closures with flagger control.

In conjunction with the existing wildlife underpass and fencing to the south, this project's goal is to further reduce the number of wildlife-vehicle collisions while maintaining habitat connectivity for big

game. Big game fencing on either side of the overpass will funnel wildlife to the crossing.

Its placement considers terrain, constructability, future maintenance, recreational needs, and minimizing impairment of views from the road.

BACKGROUND

In 2010, the Idaho Transportation Department, (ITD) constructed a wildlife underpass on SH-21 at milepost 18.2. Game cameras monitoring that underpass show extensive use by mule deer, elk, and other wildlife – all of which would pose serious safety and mobility hazards to drivers if they were on the road. This also improved habitat linkage and landscape connectivity to the Boise River Wildlife Management Area and adjacent public lands of the Boise National Forest, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Idaho Department of Lands, City

of Boise, and Bureau of Land Management.

As ITD developed the Cervidae Peak project, it received support from Idaho Department of Fish and Game, U.S. Forest Service, Army Corps of Engineers, the City of Boise, Ada and Boise Counties, numerous non-governmental organizations, and the Western Federal Lands Highway Division (WFLHD) of the Federal Highways Division. Investment in these improvements supports the varied missions of these agencies to serve the citizens and taxpayers of Idaho.

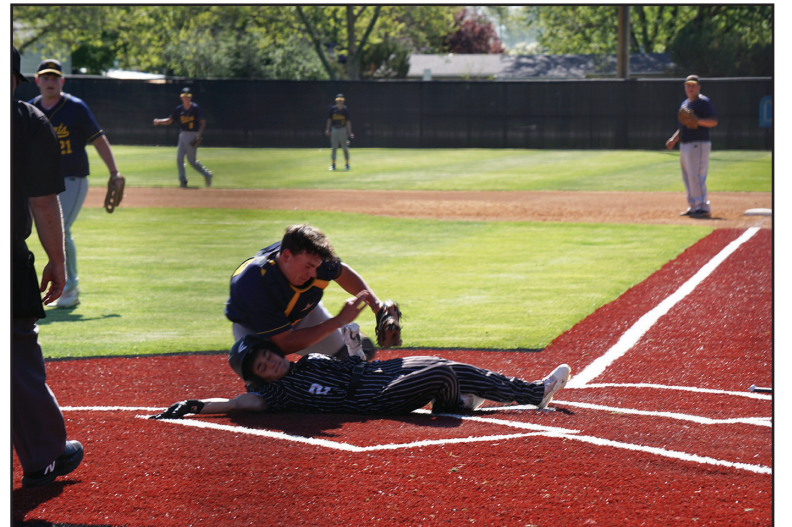
Horseshoe Bend Varsity Baseball #1 in Boise County

BASEBALL: The Horseshoe Bend Varsity Mustangs baseball team earned a berth in the 2023 1A Idaho State Baseball Tournament in Lewiston. The Mustangs defeated Garden Valley on Wednesday, May 10 at Settlers Park in Meridian in a win or go home game against county rivals the Garden Valley Wolverines. The win propelled them to play number 1 seeded Vision Charter the following day, where the team was defeated 9-15. The loss set the Mustangs up to square off against the Idaho City Wildcats at Capital High on Friday, May 12. At one time down by nine points, Horseshoe Bend rallied and came back to take the win 22-14. The 3.5-hour game was a battle of pitchers for the Wildcats who struggled to find their groove after their starting pitcher left the game.

The Horseshoe Bend win puts the Mustangs in the 3rd seed position of southern teams. They will play the north's number 1 seed, the Clearwater Valley Rams, on Wednesday, May 17 at 6 p.m. at Church Field in Lewiston.

SOFTBALL: The Horseshoe Bend Lady Mustang softball team ended their season at GALS Field in Caldwell after two back-to-back losses on Friday, May 12.

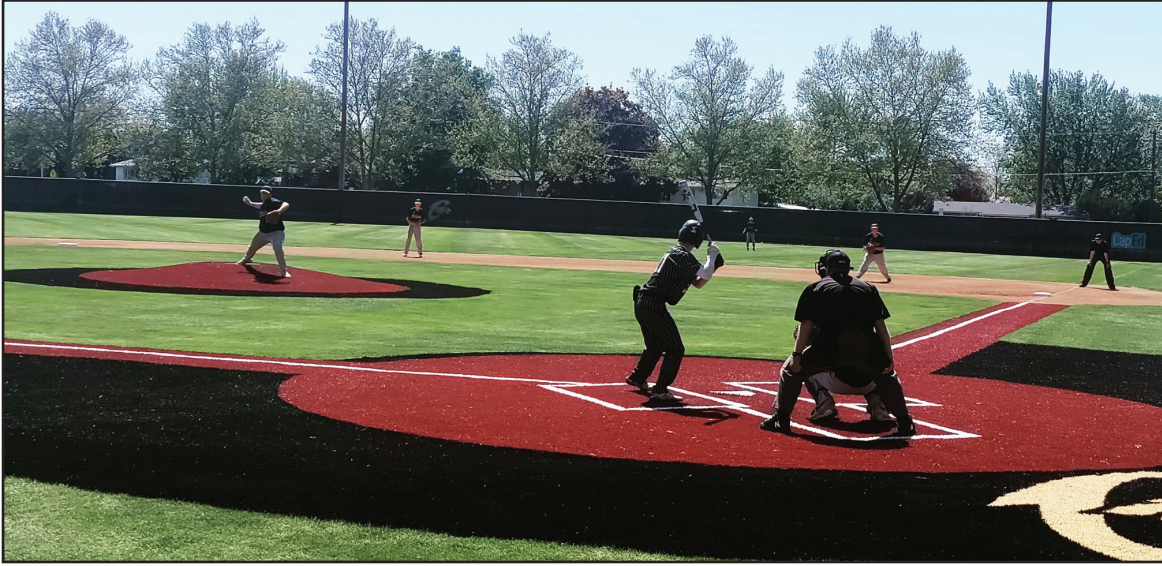

Guilty Plea for Grand Theft

BOISE COUNTY -- Curtis J. Corvinus entered a guilty plea to Grand Theft in Boise County District Court on Friday, May 12th. His attorney stated that Corvinus did not want this case to go to trial and had prepared to enter a plea.

The Honorable Judge Theodore Fleming had Corvinus swear to tell the whole truth and nothing but the truth, and said the guilty plea advisory was submitted on May 3rd. Judge Fleming asked the defendant if he had any questions about the rights he would be

waiving by entering a guilty plea. Corvinus answered that he did not. There was no plea agreement in this case and the former Boise County Prosecutor Adam Strong refused to reduce the charges to a misdemeanor.

Judge Fleming reviewed that this charge of grand theft created a minimum of one year, and up to fourteen years in the state penitentiary, or up to a \$5,000 fine. Corvinus could also be ordered to pay restitution. He would be ordered to provide DNA and a thumb print.

"I horribly and regrettably made a decision to use money that was not mine to make sure that my current situation in my life was stable," Corvinus said. "As the Chief of the Fire Department, it was the Burnout Fund, it was donated funds to help somebody with a house fire or anything. It's to give them a little bit of assistance to keep them going, until they were able to get any other funding." Judge Fleming accepted Corvinus' guilty plea and set sentencing for August 18, 2023.

He represented Idaho City and the school extremely well.

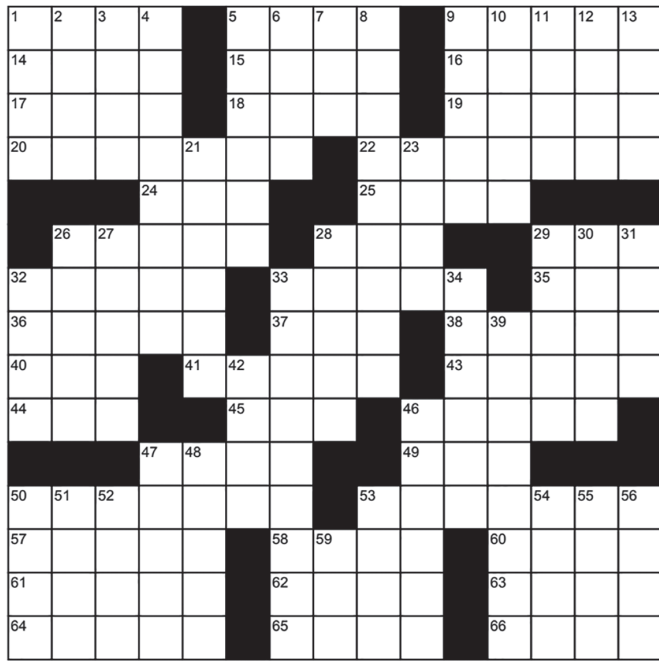

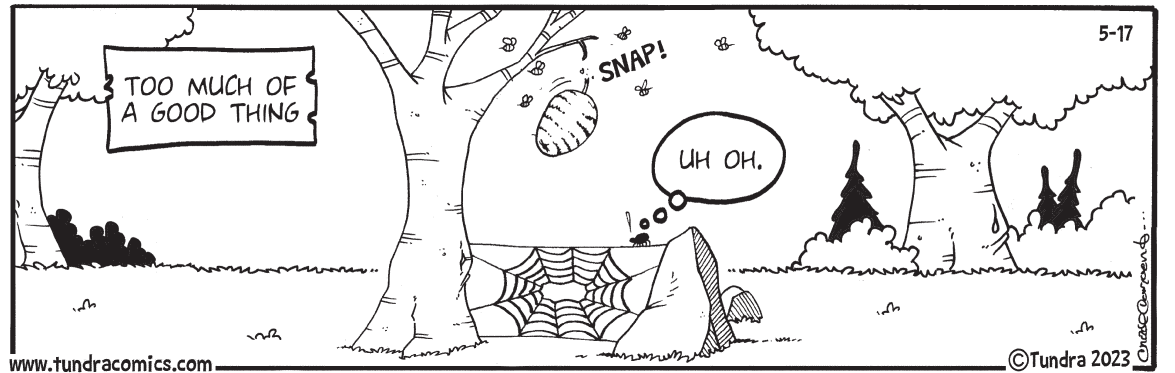

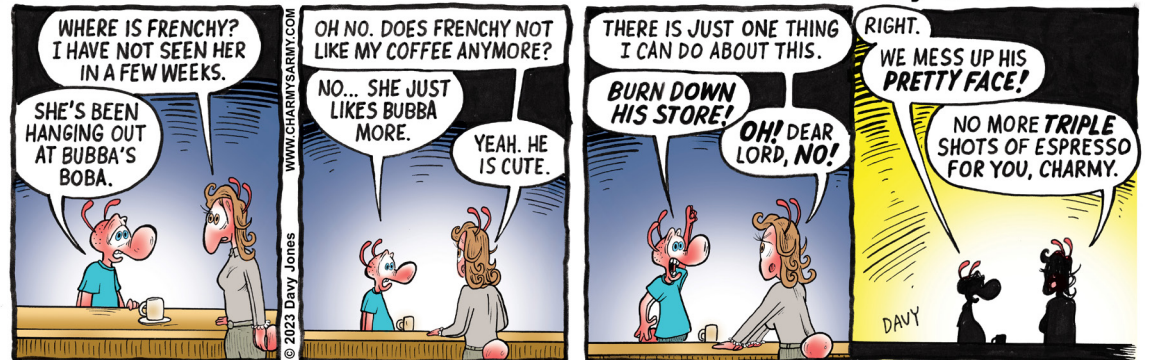
