

BOISE COUNTY -- Recently, Idaho Power built a new distribution line that provides an additional source of power to several areas in Boise County. Having multiple lines feeding these areas will help keep the lights on in case an unplanned outage occurs on one of them.

We've also been hard at work across our service area — including Boise County — making our grid more resilient and reducing wildfire risk. We're putting extra time into inspecting lines and trimming trees. And we have a lot more to do.

While I can't attribute the last year's results in Boise County to any one of these efforts, we believe that the people who live, work and play in these ar-

eas will benefit long-term from the investments we're making to keep the lights on and our communities safe.

Alexis Freeman, Idaho Power - Corporate Communications, wrote in response to the

query as to why the power was out on Monday in east Boise County for several hours, "A cause was not identified in today's outage, but we safely restored power to the approximately 1,300 customers who were impacted."

STAR RANCH -- For months, many of us asked the leadership of the Placerville Fire Department for information on what was needed to fix to see a training exercise on the non-functioning fire equipment. I finally submitted an official request in writing for a list and description of equipment, the function of each vehicle, and a plan for repair. I received a list of equipment and whether it was operational

Throughout 2023 I have offered many suggestions to the leadership on how they could improve their image and provide better information to their constituents. Recognizing the need for training backup personnel in certain positions requiring institutional knowledge, Andrew Bourret and I volunteered to learn the duties of the Treasurer and Secretary. I met with Dan and Jessica Gasiorowski on May 19th. to offer a plan to train Andrew and me. I gave them a list of suggestions they could use to present at a Fire Commission meeting explaining their intensions.

I met again with Dan, Jessica, and George Butters a few days before the June 10 Commission meeting. I told them I believed my plan would change public opinion and that transparency was the key. I specifically told them I was NOT asking for their resignations. I then gave them the name and phone number of the man who had built our 3,000-gal tanker. I told them to use that information in the meeting in a positive way.

The following is a copy of the suggestions that I offered Dan and Jessica.

We know that the Placerville Fire Department has a Public Relations problem, as well as other problems that need to be addressed. In an effort to create more transparency and move forward in a positive way, we will institute the following changes.

1. We will create 2-3 new positions to train people to do jobs that require Institutional Knowledge, Fire Chief, Treasurer, and Secretary. This will ensure that trained people are in place to protect against an unexpected death, or retirement. We intend to train TA and AB (or whoever) to perform the duties of Treasurer and Secretary, as Dan and Jessica plan to retire before they leave for

three months this September. Once in place, they in turn will train new blood. George will designate an assistant to train in the duties of Fire Chief.

- 2. We will invite the public (pick a date) to observe the FD personnel demonstrate the function and capability of each
- 3. Create a Web Site for the PFD to show:
- Personnel Roster
- Volunteer Requirements and
 - Vehicle List with uses
- · List of Rural Fire District Ratings and plan to increase our rating.
- Budget breakdown with list of three sources (Taxes, Donations, Grants)
- Breakdown and explanation of expenditures from each category.
- Detailed list of monthly expenditures and balances of each category

It is our hope that this effort will answer questions from the community and encourage young people new to the area to participate in the vital services performed by PFD.

#1 was just common sense, to have people trained and know where records were, whether Dan and Jessica were ready to retire or not. I told them if they were reluctant to train Andrew and me, then choose someone else, but please train someone.

#2 was to demonstrate to the public that the Fire Department has the capacity to put water on

#3 are some of the changes I felt were necessary to change public opinion of the leadership team. I said if I was to be involved, these changes were a must.

Dan, Jessica, George, and Rick Barber have been the backbone of the Fire Department for many years. It would be irresponsible for anyone to have demanded their resignations. I know I didn't. Nor did I say I was representing anyone other than Andrew and me, and this was only a request for

As with any change to a new administration, the success in part is determined by the information and assistance given by the outgoing one. With the proper assistance, a new leadership team will succeed.










Community Adult Softball League in Garden Valley



Idaho to Receive \$38.2 Million in PILT Funding for Community Services



Washington, **D.C.--**U.S. Senators Mike Crapo and Jim Risch (both R-Idaho) announced 44 local governments in Idaho will receive a total of \$38.2 million in Payments in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) funding for 2023. Since local governments cannot tax federal lands, annual PILT payments help cover the costs associated with maintaining community services

"PILT payments are critical to rural Idaho counties that rely on the funds for essential services," said Crapo. "Without a tax base, it is imperative the federal government provide the necessary resources for com-

munities to carry out vital services such as firefighting and police protection, construction of public schools and roads, and search-and-rescue opera-

"Every county in Idaho has nontaxable, federal land within its borders," said Risch. "Despite not being able to collect property tax revenue from these areas, our counties are still required to provide vital services on these lands. I will continue to strongly support fully funding PILT to ensure Idaho's counties are being compensated for this lost revenue that provides for essential and emergency services."

Crapo and Risch have been long-term proponents of ensuring the continued viability of the PILT program.

The U.S. Department of Interior (DOI) collects more than \$26.3 billion in revenue annually from commercial activities on public lands. A portion of those revenues is shared with states and counties. The balance is deposited into the U.S. Treasury, which, in turn, pays for a broad array of federal activities, including PILT fund-

Payments are calculated based on the number of acres of federal land within each county or jurisdiction and the population of that county or jurisdiction.

Boise County is expected to receive \$612,559 for their total acres of 883,961 acres.




