FIRE SUPPRESSED In Close Proximity

BOISE COUNTY -- The Idaho Department of Lands gave their final incident update on Tuesday, July 25th, regarding the Goldrun Fire in Gem County, located about three miles from the Boise County line near Ola, Idaho. On July 18th, the source of the fire was discovered to be human-caused. With the help of air attack retardant drops, over 200 firefighters on the ground, and cooler temperatures, the fire is now 100% contained. The fire burned 799 acres of brush and timber. Other resources called

in included seven fire engines, seven helicopters with buckets, five firefighting crews, and one excavator.

Work to restore, monitor, and mop up will continue over the coming week. Fire officials will continue to patrol the area throughout the summer and disclosed that smoke may still be present from the containment area. Holbrook Lane remains closed; however, a rancher was allowed to move his cattle back to the area that was previously threatened by fire.

themselves, earn a black belt, or just have fun, to stop by and find out what it's all about. They offer programs for adults and children.

Horseshoe Bend resident, MMA fighter Brock Miller, trains at The PIT Idaho and is part of The PIT Fight Team. Two of the fighters in the exhibition Freedom Fight match on July 2 were from The PIT Idaho. The PIT is working with the chamber to possibly hold another match in the fall. Owner Sophie Gomez told those in attendance that The PIT promotes "more than just fighting, fighting to be yourself everyday."

The chamber's Freedom Fight raised \$26K to benefit the Woods Veterans Memorial Park. They are planning on making the event an annual occurrence on the Saturday before the Fourth of July.

The chamber has also been working with the city and Boise County on securing grants to benefit the community. The sidewalk grant for \$250K and the plans to build a sidewalk along the western side of ID-55 by the school has been taken over by the Idaho Transportation Department (ITD). Due to concerns regarding storm water drainage, the project has increased to \$750K, ITD has agreed to make up the difference. The city is currently waiting on a memorandum of understanding before putting the project out for bid.

The chamber partnered with Boise County to secure a \$6.5 million dollar grant to replace

the Boise Street Bridge. The new bridge is slated to be completed by the fall of 2024. The bridge will still be one lane and the City of Horseshoe Bend will take ownership of the bridge after completion. The original trestle bridge, which was built in 1901, has been deemed an historical artifact and will be preserved after it is moved to the Woods Veterans Memorial Park by the state. The chamber is also helping the family of Charles Brown with a memorial service set for Saturday, July 29 at the Wood Veterans Memorial Park. Sonora Mexican Restaurant will be serving food with 100% of the profit going to a fund set up for the family. The Longbranch Saloon will be donating 35% of their profits to the family. The chamber has adopted part of Highway 52 in Horseshoe Bend and will be planning a clean-up party in the fall. Spotlight member Huckle and Sage provided refreshments during the meeting, soft serve ice cream (including their famous huckleberry flavor) and fresh baked cookies. The cafe and grocery store serves breakfast, lunch, and dinner as well as delicious baked treats, coffee, ice cream and shakes. New to the menu is their barbecued Tri-tip. Chamber president Kimberly Welsh says she "lives on it." BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

July 18, 2023

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Clay Tucker, and Lindy Lindstrom

Pledge of Allegiance

CONSTITUENT INPUT: Jean Mollenkopf Moore said she had been selected by the Republican GOP to represent all 44 Idaho counties at an event in Denver. She said it was an honor to represent Idaho, with Chairwoman Dorothy Moon, as a conservative and provide input.

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from July 11th, and the motion carried.

SHERIFF: Sheriff Scott Turner mentioned that the ammunition was budgeted for and Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the purchase in the amount of \$3,102.

ROADS: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the request for the 260-dump truck rebuild kit with the motor in the amount \$7,771.87. The motion carried.

Twilegar motioned to approve the purchase of a 2004 John Deere brush beater for a total of \$95,000, which was budgeted for and all were in favor.

A potential hire in the Garden Valley area was discussed and a motion was said to hire the individual.

Curtis Dill said there was a lot of road material and abatement out on the dirt roads. Twilegar commented, "It looks good out there."

HORSESHOE BEND COUNTY INTERNET: Twilegar motioned to approve the internet services in the amount of \$204.

HORSESHOE BEND:

There was discussion about working with local landowners and putting in a bike path. Twilegar motioned to approve the invoice in the amount of \$51,495 for the Grimes Creek culvert steel arch project. The motion carried.

BUDGET WORKSHOP: Clerk Mary Prisco and another presented information on the county's budget. They also discussed the "market value" of employees, including job duties. Prisco presented a slide on how the General Fund is used and calculated.

SHERIFF: Sheriff Turner discussed his budget and said there were some new additions included. They are looking to hire an additional full-time investigator. The department currently has one detective, "and he is extremely overwhelmed," Sheriff Turner said. "The number of felony cases that need investigating are just astronomical." He said most of them were sex crimes, and that they needed to get these cases done faster and over to the prosecutor's office. The Sheriff is also asking for another deputy. "My goal is to get three more deputies, so that I can have 24 hour, 7 days a week coverage. Right now, we don't have 24-hour coverage, and our call load is beyond the point of needing that 24-hour coverage. Guys are working 18 to 24-hours."

The Sheriff also spoke about adding a second drug enforcement dog. Chairman Twilegar would like to consider adding to the K-9 budget. Sheriff Turner said there are 7 or 8 drug trafficking cases going through court and the department is getting a return, providing the example that from Nampa they

will receive a couple thousand dollars directly related to a drug trafficking case.

There was discussion regarding services like fuel, statutory/mandated increased costs, and the cost-of-living costs going up.

SOLID WASTE: A new superintendent hire was discussed and the pay. In considering the restoration of the assistant position, that has not been hired for four years, Paul Rekow said that there were items being missed. He reported that the department disposed of 497 gallons of antifreeze at \$2 a gallon, which the county doesn't collect for. However, Rekow is concerned that people are just going to dump the antifreeze should the county decide to charge. He said they were running out of room at the Idaho City and Garden Valley transfer sites, "Even if we stay in the same footprint, we're going to have to rearrange some things." Rekow said he would like to see the board advertising for a new superintendent, because he will be retiring October 1st.

Curtis Dill with the Road Department said they need another roller, because they are currently sharing one roller between three districts and it makes it difficult when doing dust abatement.

There will be no chip sealing projects this year, because they don't have the manpower. He addressed the Robie Creek parking problem and said, "We put \$400 worth of signs out last year. It doesn't make a difference," and they park in front of the signs. Striping on several roads and fixing guardrails were discussed.

COMMUNITY JUSTICE: Amanda Leader said that the large hiring sign outside their office has attracted some attention and potential candidates. She suggested that, after the job(s) are filled in her office, they move the sign to the county offices or sheriff's office. Leader would also like to add an additional part-time position that would work a maximum of 16-hours a week and would be over community justice projects over the weekend for increased opportunities to do community service. She said, "I think our cases are going to be increasing."

She also noted that there were issues with the air conditioning and a water line break that they were able to fix. Leader then discussed the cost of juvenile housing, the cost in 2019 was \$9,903, in

2020 it was \$29,316, in 2021 it was zero dollars, and in 2022 it was \$2,808. "Then in 2023, it jumped up to \$29,270... This year it's pretty bad and I'm not happy about it."

PROSECUTOR: Alex Sosa asked to move a part-time position to a full-time position for the front desk, along with a 6% cost of living increase. There was also discussion regarding the witness coordinator.

CLERK: Mary Prisco asked for a 5% cost of living increase for her office.

ASSESSOR: Chris Juszczak asked for a 6% raise for his office, which is currently short-staffed.

TREASURER: Gina Turner asked for 8% raises. She said there are 130 parcels for tax deeds, and they are counting on some of those people paying.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City of Horseshoe Bend, Boise County, Idaho (the "City"), has petitioned, pursuant to Idaho Code § 7-1301, *et. seq.* to seek judicial confirmation of the power of the City (1) to incur an indebtedness as an "ordinary and necessary expense" of the City authorized by the general laws of the State, within the meaning of Article 8, Section 3, of the Idaho Constitution, in a principal amount of approximately \$2,000,000 for the purchase of improvements to the water system of the City; (2) to issue a promissory note or other evidence of such indebtedness of the City for same, for the purpose of financing the cost of necessary improvements to the water system; and (3) to pledge the City's water system revenues and other lawfully available funds of Petitioner to the payment of such indebtedness for a term of years.

Any interested party may appear by written appearance or answer to the Petition filed with the Clerk of the above-entitled Court at any time prior to the date set for hearing on the Petition, which has been set before the Hon. Theodore Fleming on the **25th day of August, 2023, at 3:00 o'clock P.M.**, or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, by remote hearing. Horseshoe Bend School Board Joins Lawsuit

By Tracy Koslosky
HORSESHOE BEND -- The Horseshoe Bend School District Board of Directors voted to join a social media mass action lawsuit during their meeting on Wednesday, July 19. The following is the motion that the board voted on: *Whereas the Board recognizes that juvenile's access and use of social media is a national and local problem which is alleged to have contributed to the mental health crisis, including students of the District, which likewise impacts the operation of the District; and whereas multi-district litigation is pending against multiple social media companies, in Federal Court; and whereas the Board, hav-*

ing considered the inclusion of the District in this multi-district litigation and having found it to be in the best interest of the District and its students, I hereby move that the Board take all necessary steps to join this lawsuit as a Plaintiff and hereby authorize and direct the Board's Chairman and/or the Superintendent to execute all necessary documents to that end.

The district has joined 35 other Idaho school districts and charters in the suit with more expected to follow. The litigation is against social media giants Facebook, TikTok, Snapchat, Instagram, and YouTube and addresses those companies' impact on the country's youth mental health crisis by

influencing children that use the platforms. The lawsuit suggests that these social media services intentionally design and market exploitive media that has a negative effect upon youths' mental health. The lawsuit also alleges that these companies have algorithms that promote eating disorders, violence, self-harm, and suicide. Reports show that at least 90% of youth use social media with almost 50% spending one to three hours a day focusing on these platforms.

The district will participate in the lawsuit on a contingency fee basis, meaning that the district will not have to pay lawyer fees to become members of the suit.
