## BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

July 25, 2023

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar and Clay Tucker

**ABSENT:** Commissioner Lindy Lindstrom (partially via phone)

Pledge of Allegiance

**INPUT:** CONSTITUENT None

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to accept the minutes from July 18th, which were approved.

**PROSECUTOR:** Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the out-of-state travel for Mr. Sosa, Boise County's Prosecuting Attorney, to attend training in New Orleans. All were in favor and the motion carried.

LICENSE: A collection transportation license application for a dumpster rental service was approved through a motion.

**FILMING:** Twilegar motioned to approve a permit for photography and videography for Yamaha Motor Corporation. The motion carried. He then motioned to approve the agreement to provide law enforcement and crowd control for the upcoming Yamaha event, which also passed.

**ROAD DEPARTMENT:** A seasonal employee has asked to become a full-time employee in the Garden Valley area. Curtis Dill commented, "Which, at this point, will give us a full crew." Twilegar motioned to approve this position and the motion carried.

PRINTER: After much discussion, Twilegar motioned to approve the purchase of a Canon stacker printer for \$9,595.

**REPORT:** Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the Approval Report in the amount of \$172,017.

AUDIO/VIDEO FOR COM-MISSIONERS' ROOM: An individual spoke to the board via

Zoom regarding what they could offer. Twilegar discussed just getting audio, because "this is a poor county" and the money would have to come from somewhere. Zoom meetings were also discussed. Equipment purchases and working with the courthouse were taken into consideration.

ROBIE CREEK PARK: "For the record, we had a severe problem at Robie Creek about emergency vehicles, people parking on the road, literally to the point where we can't even get emergency rigs by. And it's the Army Corps of Engineer's Park. They don't seem to have any interest in remedying their problem. They've expanded the park a little bit and haven't provided for any parking and that's proving a dangerous situation."

Alex Gross said when he was with the ambulance that weekend, there were only six inches of clearance to get through.

Sheriff Scott Turner said he spoke with the Army Corps and they suggested putting boulders along the roadway edge, but the Boise County Road Department would rather not because it would interfere with the snowplow. The sheriff had also spoken with the county prosecutor about changing the "no parking on roadway or pavement" signs to simply read "no parking." He said that they need to limit the number of people that can be in there at the park. He explained that the Corps of Engineers, "has capacities on all their other parks around the lake. They have fees, they have reservation only, all except for Robie Creek."

Director Dill with the Road Department said they were going to go over budget with the cost of signs and striping along the roadway in Robie Creek.

Sheriff Turner also mentioned that homeowners can't get through the blocked county roads. There are other problem areas in the county that need additional signage too; for example, in Garden Valley. The sheriff recommended moving forward with the signs and explained, "We've exhausted all of our efforts."

ROAD DEPARTMENT: Dill said they have a full staff in Garden Valley, but are still down two people in Horseshoe Bend.

CORONER: Pam Garlock reported that she had just returned from a conference training. Chief Deputy Coroner Mike Johnson said they had over a hundred cases last year, but this year it's been a bit slow. However, the number of hours for each case with complications has been more time consuming. He reported that he's involved with nearly 95% of the cases, and "everybody who dies up here lives in Boise." He's looking to retire and has been with the county since 1974 as a deputy sheriff coroner.

MARKET VALUE JOBS: There was a discussion regarding job values in this market.

## Vehicle Accident in Lowman

LOWMAN -- On Friday, July 28, a woman was transported to St. Luke's hospital after her vehicle left Highway 21 in Lowman at mile marker 77.5 and went into the Payette River. A nearby resident called in the accident and witnessed when an off-duty river guide in a kayak skillfully assisted the 23-year-old to the shoreline.

According to Bruce Lund, a Lowman emergency responder, he had lowered a rope down the cliffside for the bystanders that scaled down to help the woman. The concern was how to get her back up to the highway. Lund said, "It was kinda funny, because when she stood up and took ahold of the rope, she just scampered up the hill pulling herself up, leaving her rescuers behind!"

Lund reported that the woman had been returning to Boise where she lives, and may have gone around "Wake-up Corner too fast." The tire marks were partway in the ditch on the mountainside, and Lund assumed that she must have overcorrected, crossed the roadway and headed down the embankment, bouncing off a tree and into the river. He said the car started floating down the river, turned completely around and stopped up against a big rock. B&W Wrecker Service out of Boise was able to retrieve the SUV from the Payette River.

## Horseshoe Bend's Back-to-School Wellness Fair on August 10th

On Thursday, August 10th the Horseshoe Bend Community School will be holding a Back-to-School Wellness Fair at the Horseshoe Bend City Park from 3:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. Parents and students can pick up free school supplies at the event. Three licensed cosmetologists will be on sight to provide free haircuts for students. Garden Valley Family Medicine will be on site to give free health and wellness checks to students.

Horseshoe Bend School District will also have a booth to assist parents in signing up for the free or reduced lunch program. Any parent who feels they need help covering the cost of school meals should fill out the form. The form asks for information about your income and household size, which will be used to figure out if you qualify. All applications for free and reduced lunches need to be completed every school year. The information is private

and the forms are not given to the federal government. The district determines who qualifies using established federal guidelines. Even if your child will not be eating a school lunch it's important and helpful for the district to get as many applications as possible. Some federal and state funding is determined by how many students qualify for subsidized meals and helps provide more resources for all students. Families whose income is at or below 130 percent of the federal poverty guidelines automatically qualify for free lunch. Currently a family of 2 making \$25,636, a family of 3 making \$32,318, a family of 4 making \$39,000, a family of 5 making \$45,682, or a family of 6 making \$52,364 would qualify for free lunch. Families that make more can qualify for reduced price lunch.

Attendees can also learn about speech and hearing services or join the newly formed Horseshoe Bend Booster Club. The Community Closet will be

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF IDAHO CITY, BOISE COUNTY, IDA-HO, AMENDING TITLE 1. CHAPTER 5, OF THE CITY CODE, CHANGING THE REGULAR MEETING TIME FOR CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS, AND PRO-VIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. WHEREAS, The City Council has determined that the interests of the Citizens of Idaho City would best be served by amending the time of regular monthly City Council meetings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IDAHO CITY, IDAHO: That the City SECTION 1. Code of Idaho City, Section 1-5-1.A (Section 1 of Ordinance 320) of the be amended to read as follows:

1-5-1: MEETINGS:

Regular Meetings: The Mayor and City Council shall meet in regular session at the City Hall on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month, such meetings to commence at the hour of seven o'clock (7:00) P.M. During such regular sessions, the Mayor and Council may consider any and all business of the City properly brought before the Council. When a holiday recognized by the City falls on the second or fourth Wednesday, the reqular meeting may be moved or canceled at the direction of the City Council.

That this ordi-SECTION 2. nance shall be in full force and effect upon passage, approval, and publication according to law.

#### CITY OF IDAHO CITY ORDINANCE NO. 379

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDI-NANCE 369 AND ANNEXING CERTAIN LANDS TO THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF IDAHO CITY, WHICH LANDS ARE LOCATED IN BOISE COUNTY, IDAHO, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE THEREFORE

WHEREAS, the Landowners of a parcel known as 6 Proffer Lane consented to annexation of their real property into the city limits of the City of Idaho

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission held a public hearing on the zoning of the parcel and recommends the parcel be zoned residential.

WHEREAS, the City Council of Idaho City after public hearing adopted Ordinance 369 annexing 6 Proffer Lane, and the Idaho State Tax Commission rejected Ordinance 369 annexation as untimely filed.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IDAHO CITY, IDAHO:

SECTION 1: That Ordinance 369, adopted on May 25, 2022, is repealed.

SECTION 2: That the lands and territory described in the "LAND DESCRIPTION 6 PROFFER LANE ANNEXATION TO IDAHO CITY" attached hereto, all of which lie contiguous and adjacent to the corporate limits of Idaho City are hereby annexed to the corporate limits of Idaho City, and by such annexation of said territory and all lands included therein, are hereby annexed and included within the territorial limits of the City

The provisions of this Section shall not apply to emergency vehicles, rubbish pickup vehicles, street and utility service vehicles, vehicles delivering goods and supplies to businesses on Main Steet, moving vans delivering materials to, or used in connection with, a construction project on or near Main Street or Elk Creek Road in the City. ## Wildfire Evacuation Plans for Boise County

**BOISE COUNTY** -- There are three levels of fire evacuation orders: "Ready, Set, Go." Level one, ready, means there is a threat from a wildfire in your area. Residents should monitor fire alerts and have their evacuation kit ready. Level two, set, means there is a significant threat, or an unpredictable threat of fire and residents should be ready to evacuate at a minute's notice. Level three, go, means there is an immediate threat and residents should get in their vehicles and leave NOW! When the evacuation order comes, regardless of the level, it is too late to start thinking about your evacuation plan. You need a plan before an order is issued. Your plan should cover three phases of an evacuation: pre-fire preparation, what you will do during a wildfire event, and after evacuating. Rule number one, people and pets come first... everything else is replaceable.

**Pre-Fire Planning**: Before a level one evacuation order is the time to develop your evacuation plan and prepare for evacuation. The first action to take is to sign up to receive emergency fire alerts on home phones, cellphones, and computers. Select an evacuation gathering point so that all members of the family know where to meet if an evacuation becomes required. Next, plan your evacuation routs, at least two separate ways out in case your first choice is blocked. Identify a designated contact person outside any potential fire zone. Family members may become separated, so this person is the coordinating point for information for your family

members. Be sure everyone knows the person's contact information, including phone numbers, email, and physical address. Be sure your contact knows your evacuation plan and usual locations of family members like schools, workplaces, and commuter routes. Be sure this contact knows how to reach each member of the family in an emergency.

Now it is time to start working on your actual evacuation plan. If you have animals, in addition to pets, what are you going to do with them? Where will they stay in the event of an evacuation? Do you have the equipment like cages and trailers to evacuate them? Can you get this equipment out both of your evacuation routes? It is a good idea to practice evacuating animals and pets. You will probably find it takes a lot more time to cage, corral, and get them in the trailer than you planned on. Also, practice operating trailers and other vehicles needed to transport them. Next, what are you going to take with you? Make a priority list of items. After family and pets my list has important documents, which I keep in a folder that is easy to grab, then my computers and external hard drive, and finally family heirlooms and photo albums. When making this list, think about how much you can carry in your vehicles. How easily can you get the items in the vehicle? Heavy or dispersed items may be difficult to load and take too much precious time to be a reasonable selection. As you are making this list, start with the most important items, do not forget to have a "go bag" ready. A go

bag has your critical medications, toiletries, changes of clothing, and anything else that you believe will be critical for you, should you have to leave your home and stay at a hotel. It may be helpful to think about what you packed when you went on your last vacation. Be a good neighbor. Work with your neighbors who may need help evacuating because they are elderly, infirm, or have animals with which they will need help. Be sure they have an evacuation plan and define what your role is in that plan.

**During a Wildfire Event**: When you get a level one evacuation order you should always keep at least a half tank of gas in your vehicles. Monitor the local fire conditions, track the fire and any changes it makes. At level two, be sure to park so nothing obstructs your ability to drive out. Charge up your cell phones, and those of your family members. Pack your go bag, gather up all the important items on your evacuation list into one place that is easy to get to, pre-pack your vehicles, if reasonable, based on your use of the

If you have any concerns about evacuating, do not wait for the level three "go" order, leave early. It may take you more time to evacuate than you think due to decreased visibility from the smoke, heavier than expected traffic from others evacuating, or fire apparatus using your evacuation rout. It may take you longer than expected to hook up trailers and gather frightened livestock. Speaking of trailers, do not try to drive trailers or RV's if you have little or no

experience, especially backing up. If you get stuck you may end up blocking the evacuation rout and put others at risk, in addition to yourself. When driving out keep your windows rolled up and your air conditioning on to reduce the effect of smoke and the possibility of embers getting in your car. Continue to monitor local fire resources for new or changes in evacuation plans and orders.

Level one is the time to start preparing your home for evacuation. Close off all exterior vents, prop a ladder against the house for firefighters, connect all garden hoses, and attach nozzles set on spray. At level two, place combustible patio furniture in the garage or at least 30 feet from the home, move portable propane tanks 30 feet away from the house, and move sofas and stuffed chairs to the center of the room. When the level three order is given, close all interior doors, close all windows, leave a light on in every room, close fire-retardant drapes if you have them, shut off propane tanks, turn off all gas appliances and pilot lights, turn on exterior lights, and close all exterior doors as you leave.

After Evacuating: Go to your evacuation gathering point and make sure everyone is okay. Get a hold of your contact person and let

them know you are out and okay. If family members get separated, have the contact person let you know where each member is located and make a plan to reunite all members. If anyone is injured or feels sick, seek medical attention immediately. Do not return to your home until the evacuation order is lifted and you can return safely. An early return can put you at risk, which means firefighters may be required for your rescue, which puts them at risk, and takes resources away from fighting the fire. Once you can return to your home, think about health and safety issues. Do you have a safe source of drinking water? Do you have toilet facilities? Is the food you left behind safe to eat or has it spoiled, or been tainted by the fire? Do you have electricity? Is your home structurally safe to live in? Do you have a safe way to get back in... and out if necessary?
