Bus Rolls on Highway 55 in GV

GARDEN VALLEY -- Idaho State Police are still investigating Friday's bus crash that resulted in all the occupants being transported to local hospitals on Friday, August 5th. The children were ages 13 to 18 and were returning from a YMCA activity on a third-party bus. Boise County Sheriff Scott Turner said the reasons for the rollover crash are still unknown and no details have been released as of Monday, August 7th.

Garden Valley Fire District took Incident Command of the scene of the accident. Sheriff Turner remarked that they did a phenomenal job and deserved kudos for managing the scene. Ambulances were brought in from Gem, Valley, Ada, and Boise County. There were an additional two Life Flight helicopters used to transport patients. Other emergency responders included: Horseshoe Bend Volunteer Fire Department, Gem County Fire and EMS, Eagle Fire, three Acute Rescue and Transport vehicles, Boise County Sheriff's Office, and Ada County Sher-

iff's Office, all assisted with the incident. Sheriff Turner said the response was well-orchestrated at the crash site on State Highway 55 near milepost 84 along the North Fork of the Payette River. The crash occurred just north of Banks at around 3 p.m.

There were eleven identified as injured, and seven were deemed to be in critical condition. According to Idaho State Police, nearly all of the children involved were released from the local hospitals and back to their families. An injury update will not be provided by ISP.

There were initial concerns that a logging truck was involved with the bus rollover, but Sheriff Turner corrected this assumption made by the public, indicating that the logging truck

incident happened after the rollover, about five miles above the crash in Valley County.

According to Monday's press release, ISP Troopers will continue to work "with the third-party bus vender to access pertinent information related to the incident and will determine the timeline and crash dynamics."

Single Plane Accident Fatality in Idaho City



IDAHO CITY -- A fatality in a plane crash occurred on Friday, August 4th, during takeoff from the Idaho City Airport. The name of the individual had not been released as of Tuesday, August 8th.

Sheriff Scott Turner indicated that this was the second of two planes that had landed at the airport, both of which were returning to Caldwell, Idaho. Law enforcement observed that the plane appeared to have rolled to the left, skidded along the ground, and then collided with the tree line. The single occupant was dead upon the arrival of emergency responders. Sheriff Turner said he wasn't sure what had happened to cause the accident, but it is being investigated by the FAA and NTSB.

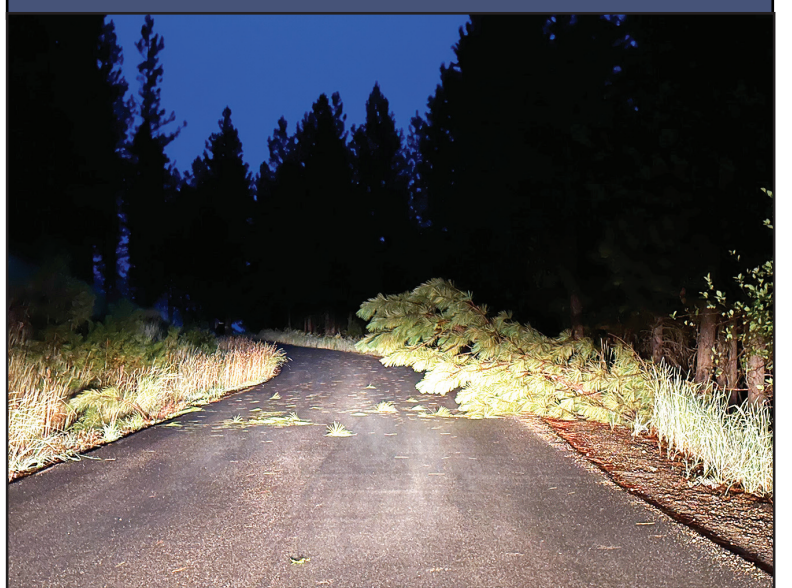

BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

August 1, 2023

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar and Clay Tucker

ABSENT: Commissioner Lindy Lindstrom (via phone)

Pledge of Allegiance

CONSTITUENT INPUT: None

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the minutes from July 25th, and the motion carried.

AUDIO/VIDEO PROJECT: A Zoom call was held with a company that presented two proposals for providing audio, and perhaps video at some later date, of the county commissioners' meetings.

Twilegar later said that the proposed quote was "a lot more" money than what he expected the "essential" equipment would be, coming in at \$22,000. The full package would be \$34,000. The system would be portable, with professional audio recording, and would not require internet. It could also be utilized by other departments.

Clerk Mary Prisco said the funds would come from the building improvement fund.

Twilegar motioned to install the equipment for \$32,941, and all were in favor.

CONCRETE: A motion was said for an individual to accept waste concrete material, and release of liability of Boise County.

RESOLUTION: A motion was said to accept grant funds for the Sheriff's office AEDs in the form of a Boise County Resolution. This was approved unanimously.

PROSECUTING ATTORNEY: Alex Sosa asked that the board consider hiring an individual from the valley, someone he has spoken with and recommends, to alleviate some of the caseload. Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve 20 hours a week for a deputy in the prosecutor's office.

ALCOHOL LICENSE: Several retail alcohol bever-

age licenses were approved throughout Boise County.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Twilegar motioned to go into executive session to discuss pending litigation. [Time 10:16 am to 10:32 am] Coming back into session, no action was required.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Clerk Prisco asked that they go back into executive session for a personnel issue, and Twilegar motioned to resume a subsequent closed session. [Time 10:33 am to 10:56 am] Twilegar said there was no action required after coming back into session.

BUDGET: Clerk Mary Prisco reviewed the components of revenues and concerns about job vacancies. "At this point in time, we have eleven full time employee vacancies... I think that's around 13 to 15% of our total full time employee positions. It has reached a critical situation, in my opinion," Clerk Prisco said. "Those vacancies are really, pretty much across the board... It's getting ugly." She said that there were "financial ramifications" in her office in regards to not getting the work done. The State Tax Commission will withhold sales tax, and the clerk estimated that would be about \$765,000 for 2024. She then addressed the increase of the number of residents and said, "As we currently stand today, I believe [they] have a much higher demand for services and timeliness of services."

Clerk Prisco suggested a significant increase for wages to attract candidates and retain full time staff. Assessor Juszcak summarized that the additional amount paid to employees would derive from sales tax and distribution from the state, "not necessarily being passed on to the taxpayer of Boise County." She corrected that was "one scenario." Underpaying employees, "according to market [value]" was discussed, and the possibility of making

those adjustments along with a 5% cost of living adjustment.

Chairman Twilegar agreed with the assessor that they need more structure, so employees know where they stand. He said elaborated, "So we don't have these cowboys and Indians mentality of different departments paying people different wages. I think this is a win overall. This will probably be one of the most important things we've ever done or ever do, in my opinion. I think we should do it. The real question is at what percentage. Just for the record, we're not talking about a percentage raise, we're talking about a percentage of our proposed number to even out different positions within the county to be more in line with the thirteen counties in which we study."

Clerk Prisco would also like to break out detailed information to each employee, as to benefits, vacation time, etc.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: A motion was said for a closed executive session to discuss personnel issues. [Time 3:00 pm to 3:25 pm] Coming back into session, no actions were required.

BUDGET FOR EMPLOYEES: Chairman Twilegar started by saying, "We need to go ahead with this new matrix in order to get in line with these thirteen other counties and give our employees some *hope*, some knowledge of where they stand and what they can do going forward."

Chairman Twilegar made a motion to approve the levels and tables weigh trades, "80% of the proposed salary differences for the full time employees, 50% of the proposal for the full time elected officials, and part-time employees - 4% across the board - noting that the benefit load has been added on to this." Commissioner Tucker seconded the motion and the motion carried. [Commissioner Lindstrom did not weigh in a vote via phone.]

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Twilegar motioned to go into executive session for a personnel issue. [Time: 3:31 pm to 4:56 pm] Clerk Prisco clarified that she was given direction by

the board for additional changes and no further action was required.

Adjourned at 4:56 pm.

GARDEN VALLEY -- During the summer of 2023, many libraries across the country are celebrating the theme 'All Together Now' in their summer reading programs. Missing Snowmobiler is Found

BOISE COUNTY -- The missing snowmobiler from Lowman, Tyler Beyer, was discovered by hikers on Thursday, August 3rd on the backside of Red Mountain. His snowmobile became visible only about two weeks ago when the snow finally melted from an avalanche that tumbled some 800 to 1,000 feet, explained Boise County Sheriff Scott Turner. Teams from Idaho Mountain Search and Rescue, aerial drones, and aircraft scoured the area looking for the 30-year-old local man that worked at the Forest Service Lowman Ranger Station back when he went missing on March 12th.

He is remembered for supplying the Lowman area with firewood that he cut and split, woodworking, and finding elk antlers. His family said Tyler enjoyed snowmobiling in the beautiful mountains of Idaho and had once said, "I wish winter would never end."



A little patch of snow remained on August 3rd near the remains of a snowmobile that belonged to Tyler Beyer.

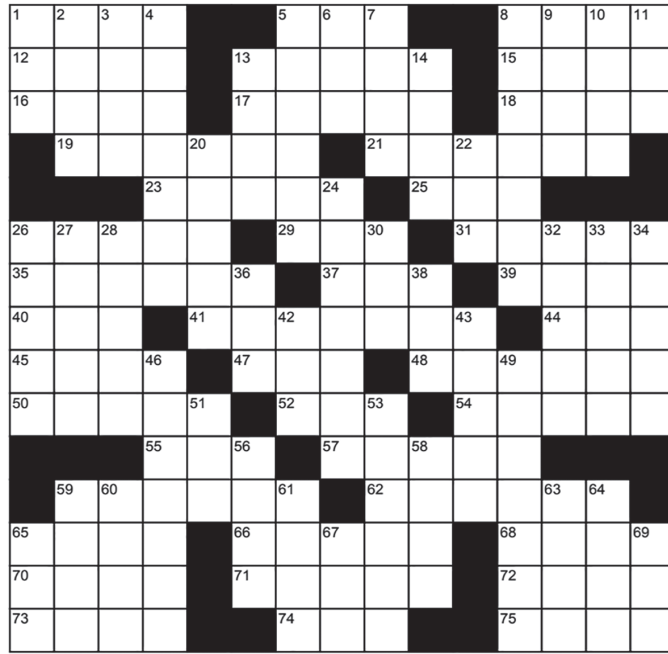

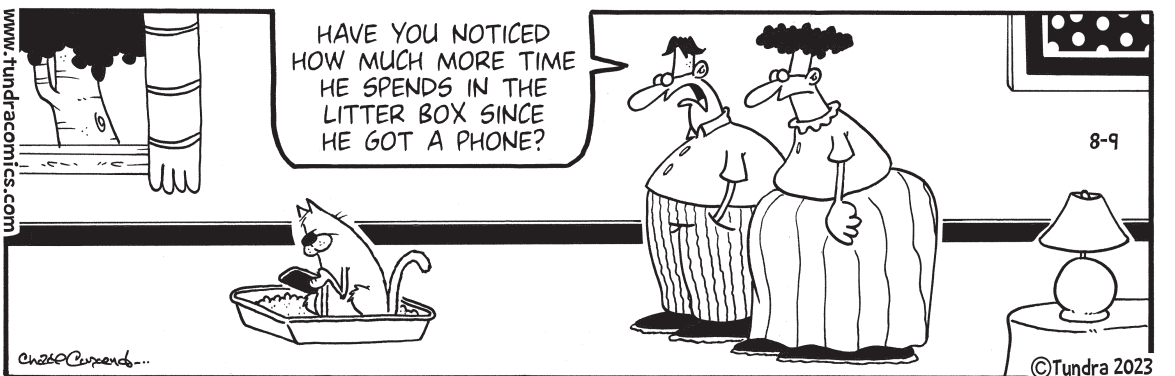
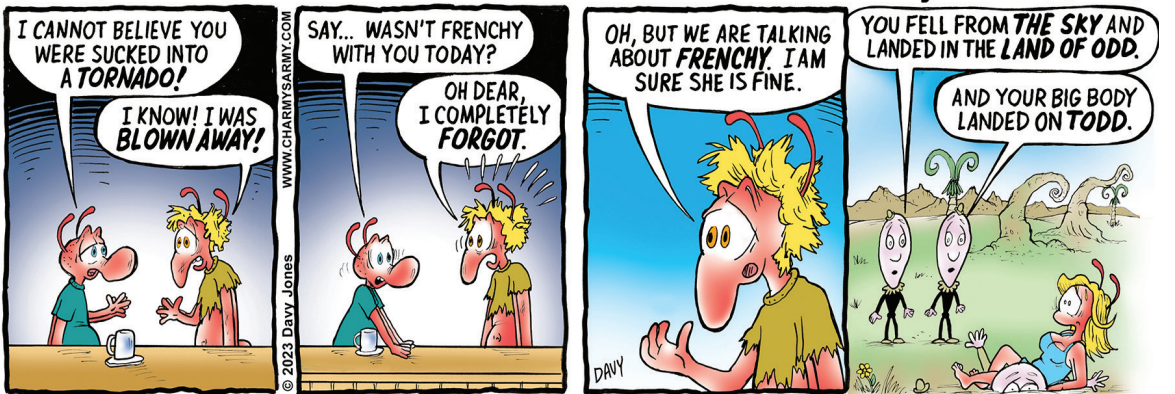

Boise County and Nearby Road Closures

BOISE COUNTY -- There are several road constructions happening in and around Boise County that may have a dramatic impact on travel plans. The *World*, spoke with IDT and Forest Service personnel to get an overview of what commuters can expect. Paving operations on SH-21 between Idaho City and Lowman are ongoing in both directions from MM (52) to MM (71). All lanes are closed until 8/31/2023. Construction and closure begin every weekday at 7:00 am and ends at 7:00 pm. Between these times on the weekdays, IDT is proving a pilot car for people that must get through. This pilot car will lead cars from the Idaho City side (heading towards Lowman) at these times only: 8:00 am, 10:00 am, noon, 2:00 pm, 4:00 pm, and 6:00 pm. From the Lowman side headed towards Idaho City, the pilot car will lead vehicles through the construction at these times only: 9:00 am, 11:00 am, 1:00 pm, 3:00 pm and 5:00 pm. The work consists of removing gold pavement and replacing it with new asphalt overlay. Road closures will be in segments no longer than 4 miles at a time.

The road construction on SH-21 at Cervidae Peak is continuing and expected to last until Oct 1, 2023. SH-21 is reduced to one lane in both directions. All lanes are affected Monday through Saturday. Sunday the work is paused. There is also a

25 MPH speed limit in this area in effect all day, every day. This construction is due to a wildlife overpass being constructed for safer passage of animals.

Also, be aware that many Forest Service Roads are likewise being repaired. Forest Service Road 579 from SH-21, about 30 minutes before Stanley, will have a hard road closure. This closure will start 8/8/2023 and end 8/15/2023. It begins at the junction of NFS Road #579 and Trail #015 (aka Wyoming-Fir Creek Trail) and extends to the junction of NFS Road #579 and NFS Road #568 (aka Dagger Falls Road). This is located within the Lowman Ranger District, Boise National Forest, Valley County.

Flaggers will continue to be located at the intersection of SH-55 and Idaho 17 on the weekends.

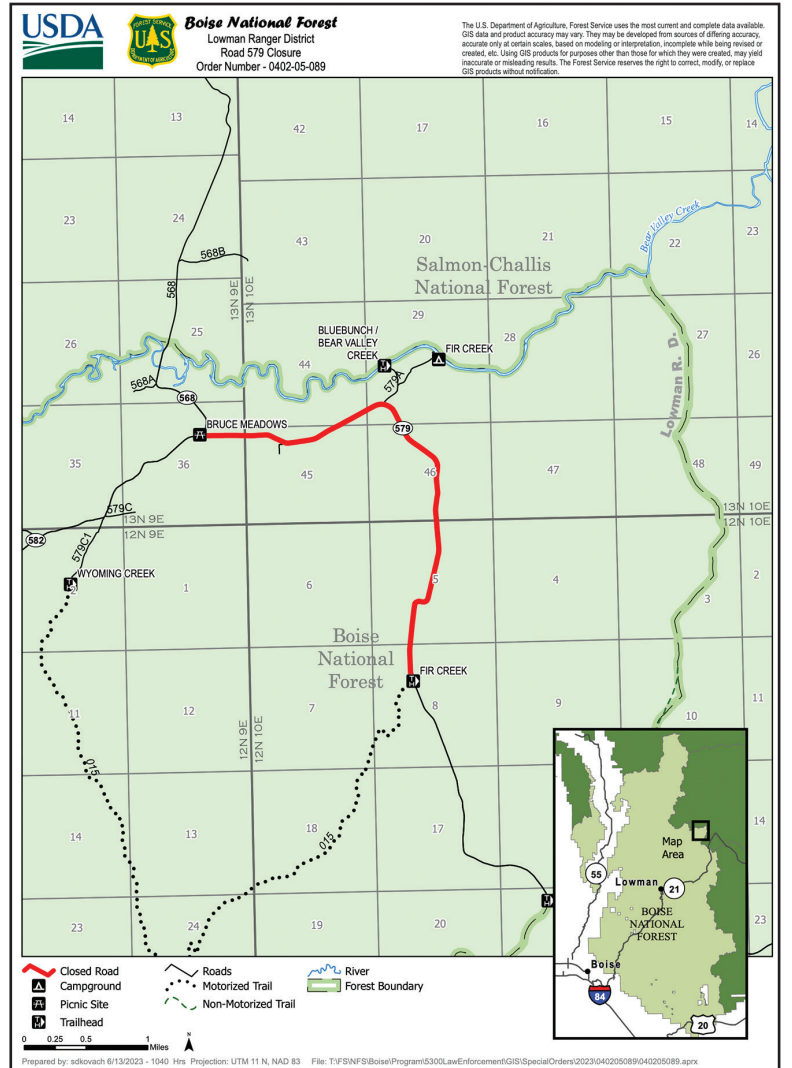
