Wildlife Overpass Takes Shape on Highway 21

EAST BOISE COUNTY -- According to Idaho Fish and Game, more than 7,000 mule deer and nearly 1,500 elk winter in the Boise River Wildlife Management Area that surrounds the Boise foothills. Highway 21 bisects this winter range area, and the number of vehicle/wildlife collisions have steadily increased with the number of motorists traveling along this heavily utilized highway. In 2010, the Idaho Transportation Department completed the construction of a wildlife crossing under the highway, the first retrofitted structure of its kind in Idaho. The efforts proved to be effective in reducing collisions, according to Fish and Game, and they jointly expanded the fencing to help funnel the animals through the underpass at milepost 18.2.

In 2023, ITD was again awarded federal funding to keep the big game from crossing Highway 21. A new wildlife overpass is under construction near milepost 19.32. There are eleven jump-outs to be constructed as part of this project, on the off chance that an animal becomes trapped on

the highway within the fenced corridor. The jump-outs are expected to provide an escape for the large game animals.

Recently, traffic has been diverted back to the existing roadway where a 150-foot concrete arch structure has been placed. Designers of the project were reported to have taken into consideration the topography of the land, which is expected to reduce costs and impact on the natural landscape. The goal of the overpass is to reduce wildlife collisions through this migration area by 80%. Specialized fencing is currently being constructed from milepost 18 to milepost 19.6 to help guide the animals towards the crossing.

According to ITD project manager John Tomlinson, the final funding awarded for this project contract was \$7.2 million, and the total obligated amount was just over \$10 million. Contributions were also made by the Southwest Idaho Resource Committee, the City of Boise, and the U.S. Boise National Forest, alongside other in-kind work matches.

ITD appreciates the public's patience and is hoping to com-



plete the project in October of 2023. Motorists can expect reduced speeds and flagger control until that time. Tomlinson explained that the intention is to bring the highway speed back up to 55mph once the majority of the work is completed this fall.

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar and Clay Tucker

Absent: Commissioner Lindy Lindstrom (via phone)

Pledge of Allegiance

CONSTITUENT INPUT: A constituent spoke regarding the PILT [payment in lieu of taxes] money and what it could be used for, including the true cost to do search and rescue on federal lands. Chairman Twilegar sent an email inquiring.

Another constituent spoke regarding the Idaho Presidential Primary. Should there be a caucus, it will be decided by October 1st.

Jean Mollenkopf Moore, BCRCC, said they will "caucus on March 2nd, regardless with what happens with a so-called Primary Election. It's been determined that we will caucus."

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the lengthy minutes from August 29th, and the motion carried.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE: There were two employees that could not use their vacation hours, due to staff shortages, and the sheriff asked that that vacation be paid down.

Sheriff Scott Turner discussed the fees that are associated with the DMV and how the county needed to recoup some of those costs. Twilegar asked what the percentage of license renewals were from Boise, and the sheriff responded that it was about half or 50%. There was discussion whether Boise County could charge more, but that was determined to be illegal. A public hearing was suggested by Attorney Alex Gross to discuss a 5% increase in fees. The topic was tabled for another time.

SOLID WASTE: Paul Rekow said the department had lost \$53,000 in three years, and said this year he expects to have lost somewhere in the \$25,000 range. He addressed the fees and provided a history. Rekow pointed out that fees per resident property have only increased \$16 in twenty-five years. He said that, averaged out, each person throws away about four pounds of trash per day.

PLANNING & ZONING: Alex Gross discussed hiring an individual for his office in P&Z. Twilegar motioned to approved this payroll addition for Planning and Zoning. This was approved through a motion.

Gross then discussed having a portable recording de-

vice for a transcribable record.

The courthouse will no longer allow the county to use their equipment. Chairman Twilegar motioned to approve the mobile recording equipment in the amount of \$4,802.50. All were in favor and the motion carried.

JUVENILE HOUSING AGREEMENT: Juvenile Justice's Amanda Leader walked through the agreement the county has with Canyon County. Twilegar motioned to approve the agreement between Boise County and Canyon County in reference to juvenile detention. All were in favor and the motion carried.

RESOLUTION: Chairman Twilegar motioned to adopt a resolution to declare surplus from the Noxious Weeds Fund, which included two vehicles. The motion passed.

EXECUTIVE SESSION FOR THE EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT: A closed session was held to discuss personnel and to hire an employee. Coming back into session, comp time was approved for an individual. A motion was said to make Mari Adams the interim Director for EBCAD and bring her up to that level of pay.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: A

closed session to discuss hiring a new employee and personnel issue. Coming back into session, no action was required.

FOREST SERVICE ROAD 377: An individual spoke regarding getting emergency vehicles back to the Valley of the Pines subdivision and signifying an escape route from the subdivision. Sheriff Turner spoke of how his department had asked that FS Road 377 be put on a priority list for maintenance. IDL [Idaho Department of Lands] may be the road block, Chairman Twilegar said, and suggested putting together a team. This would mean access to Arrowrock Road. Superintendent Curtis Dill with the Road Department explained that the county used to grade that road. This will be discussed again on a future agenda.

FUTURE AGENDA: Items were discussed and public hearings were scheduled for Sept. 26th. A planned outage for Horseshoe Bend and Garden Valley was discussed, scheduled by Idaho Power in the latter portion of September [Sept. 28 at 9pm, until 7am on Sept. 29]

ADJOURNED: The board adjourned at 11:09 a.m.

What Every RVer Needs to Know about Tires

BOISE COUNTY -- One of the most common issues encountered by any RV, trailer, or private vehicle is tire failures on the road. Tire failures can be costly in terms of time and money. There are four elements that affect tire performance on the road: heat, air pressure, and load and wear.

The easiest issue to avoid is tire wear. This includes tire rot and worn tread. Check for cracks in the tire, taking time to check inside and outside of the tire. If there are signs of cracking, replace your tires. Next, check each tire to ensure you have more than the minimum of tread on the tire. Compare the amount of remaining tread with the wear bar found between the tread. If the tread is even with the wear bar, it is time to replace your tires.

Another factor that will cause you issues is heat. Heat can be caused by your speed. Each tire has a max speed for the specific tire size. Ensure you are driv-

ing at the speed for which your tires are rated. You can use an Infrared Thermometer Gun to check heat. Tires should never get above 190 degrees.

The biggest cause for tire failure is under-inflation. Most tires heat up and fail due to pressures being too low for the load on the RV or trailer. Every tire made has a load chart that tells you what your pressures need to be. Google your make, model, and tire size for

the specific load chart. Check your tires every morning during a trip and take a quick walk around during stops. I personally have a TPMS (Tire Pressure Monitoring System) on my fifth wheeler and I still walk around at each stop. Don't forget to check your spare tire.

These quick checks can save you a lot of time, money, and frustration.

site to casting his vote, and such oath shall be the usual elector's oath with the following words added thereto, 'and I own land within the _____ irrigation district, and am a resident of the county within which the district, or a portion thereof is located'." This oath requires that each applicant for a ballot certify that he or she owns land within the boundaries of the Nampa & Meridian Irrigation District; that he or she is a resident of either Ada, Boise, or Canyon County and that he or she possesses all the qualifications required of electors of the State of Idaho by the general election laws thereof.

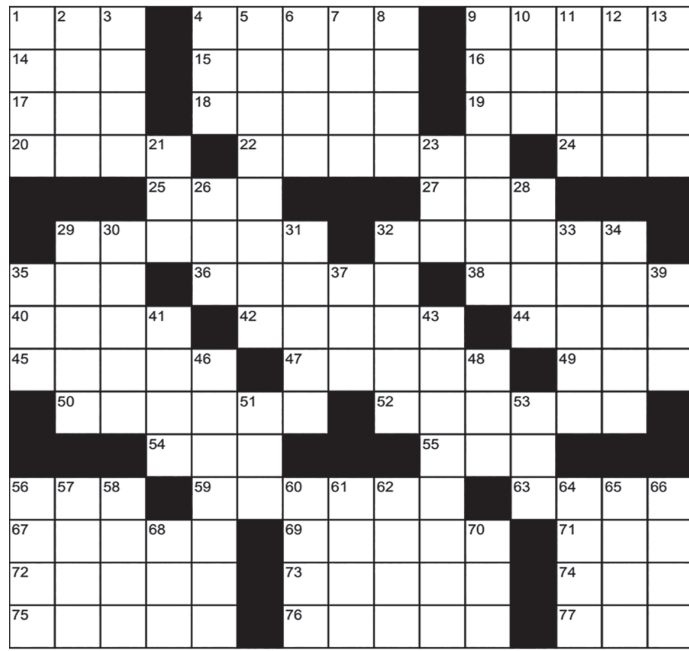

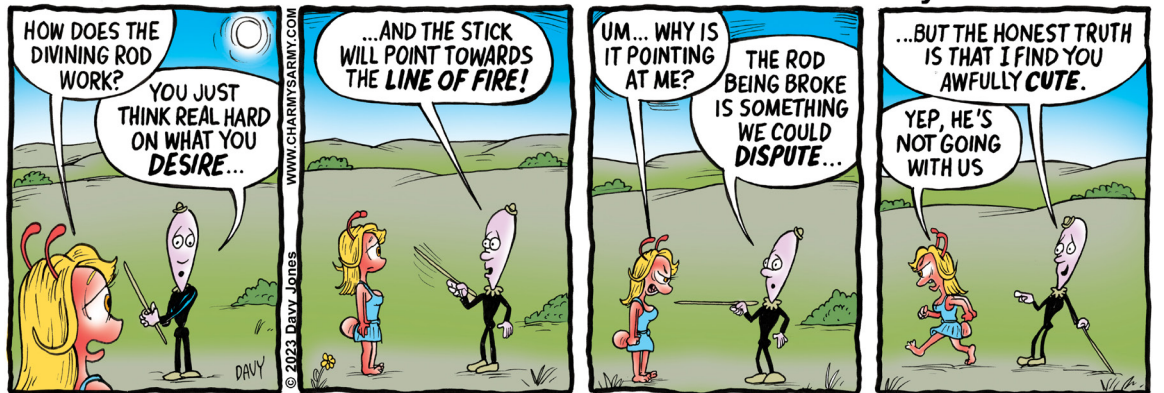
