### Prescribed Fires Achieve Reduced Fuels

**BOISE COUNTY** -- “The Boise National Forest is working hard to reduce hazardous fuels around communities where we live and work,” Brant Petersen, U.S. Forest Service Supervisor for the Boise National Forest, explained. “Treatments include prescribed fire, non-commercial thinning, and commercial thinning that focus on removal of trees from overstocked forests. Prescribed burns are designed to mimic the historic and natural fire regime of forests through controlled, low-intensity burns to clear excess debris from the forest floor.”

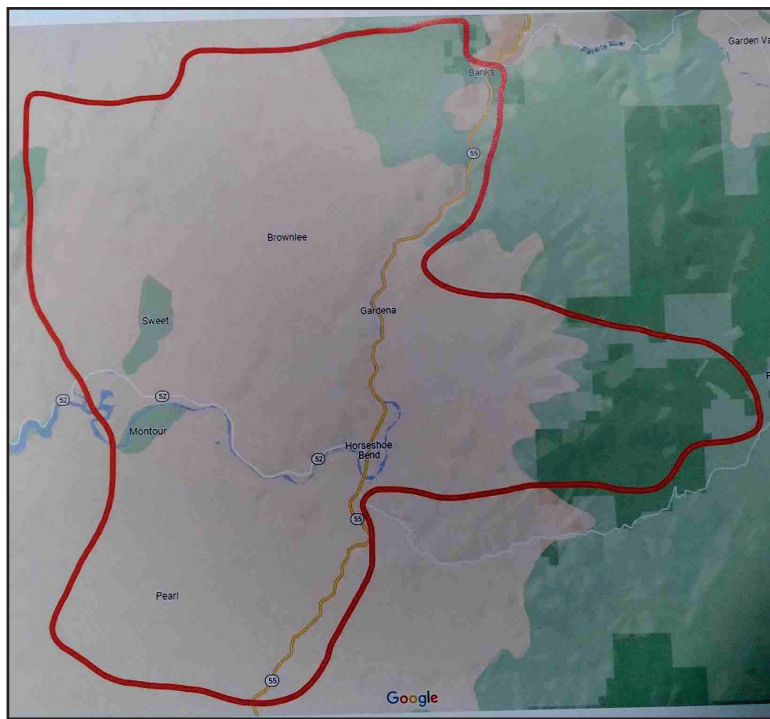
Joshua Newman explained the desired window of time to do a prescribed fire in the Boulder Creek area, to reduce wildland fuels. He said the burning over the past week had first been planned in 2005, was reviewed again in 2016, and then the appropriate timing presented itself recently, with the right amount of fuel moisture and cooler temperatures to have the desired effect. Newman said that the Forest Service works very closely with the weather service to review accurate readings prior to conducting a burn. Newman said there had been a “more recent push in the wildfire crisis strat-

egy landscape, if you don't know, we have been designated as one of ten, twenty-one total, landscapes that are getting priority funding for wildland fuels reduction. And so, this falls within that landscape and has taken a high priority on the Boise National Forest and actually, regionally, and nationally as well.” Additional prescribed burns are planned for the Boise National Forest, and resources will be moved around to manage those fires.

Petersen added, “The work taking place this fall in Alder Creek and Boulder Creek near Idaho City is being accom-

### POWER OUTAGE

#### WEST BOISE COUNTY

-- Idaho Power has scheduled a 10-hour power outage that will affect a large portion of Boise County. The outage will begin on Thursday, September 28 at 9:00 p.m. and continue until Friday, September, 29 at 7:00 a.m.

Two representatives from the company were on hand during the most recent Horseshoe Bend City Council meeting to explain the reason behind the planned outage. Idaho Power scheduled the outage because they were concerned about maintaining service it through the winter without much needed maintenance and repairs. Idaho Power will be working on cross arm change outs, power pole replacements, transmission line upgrades and maintenance to the substation in Horseshoe Bend. Idaho Power deemed that one large outage in the area was preferable to several smaller outages and all the work being undertaken is necessary to keep the power on throughout the upcoming winter season. The areas affected include most of Horseshoe Bend, Garden Valley, Sweet, Ola, Montour, and surrounding areas.

The representatives said that flaggers will be at the intersection of Highways 55 and 52 and reader boards will be stationed on the highways. Automated calls will be rolling out to affected customers as the scheduled outage date draws near. The representatives

felt confident that the 10-hour time frame would be adequate to complete all the necessary maintenance. They suggested that anyone with medical needs be prepared. Idahopower.com suggests that anyone with refrigerated medicine or electrically powered medical equipment make back-up arrangements.

The representatives at the HSB City Council meeting said that anyone with medical needs issues could contact Idaho Power for assistance. Other tips from idahopower.com ensuring that you have a way to feed and water pets, service animals, and livestock when well pumps have no power. Know how to manually open security gates and garage doors. Putting together a kit with the following items is also recommended: *flashlights, matches, blankets, bottled water, non-perishable food, non-electric can opener, first aid kit with prescription medicines, battery or solar powered chargers for phones or other devices, battery powered radio and clock, extra batteries, board games or cards for entertainment, placing a block of ice in the freezer.*

Customers can download Idaho Power's free mobile app to sign up for outage-related push notifications, view the outage map, and track their power status. You can also sign up to receive alerts regarding your residence through My Account on Idaho Power's website.

## BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

September 12, 2023

**Present:** Commissioners Steven Twilegar and Clay Tucker

**Absent:** Commissioner Lindy Lindstrom (via phone)

**Pledge of Allegiance**

**CONSTITUENT INPUT:**

A constituent from Garden Valley stated that she was annoyed that Boise County paid for a salary study, when the Idaho Association of Counties does one every year and posts it on their website for free. She questioned the wage raises and stated that the results will now fall to the taxpayers.

**MINUTES:** The minutes were approved through a motion.

**EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT:** Chairman Twilegar asked to open a discussion regarding EBCAD and its future. He suggested, "Perhaps dissolve EBCAD and start over, and maybe have more people."

Acting EBCAD Director Mari Adams explained that volunteers are not required to work the ambulance runs. She said, "We do need more employees," and more money to keep EBCAD running. Twile-

gar said, "It needs to be pointed out too that the library here gets more money than the people who are trying to save our lives."

Prosecutor Alex Sosa spoke regarding the process of putting dissolution on the ballot for a vote within the district.

Paul Rekow said that he had been a volunteer with EBCAD, but had noticed that "volunteerism had drastically dropped off." He recommended full-time employees and a stipend for those that go on ambulance runs.

Twilegar discussed including Horseshoe Bend under EBCAD. Commissioner Lindstrom was asked to set up an open house in HSB for the public to discuss the possibility of expanding the ambulance district to include HSB.

Sheriff Scott Turner added, "We've got to figure something out," and he agreed with Rekow that it was difficult to get volunteers.

**MOTION:** Sheriff Turner discussed supplies needed for search and rescue. Twilegar motioned to approve the reimbursement grant for the domestic cannabis eradication program for equipment, clothing, and supplies in the amount of \$2,553. The motion carried.

**EBCAD:** It was proposed that EBCAD hire an employee who has been with them for the past three years, and Twilegar agreed that she would be a great addition. A motion was said to approve the hire and the motion carried.

**OFFICERS:** There was a discussion of paying out the vacation time of three officers down to 100 hours. Twilegar motioned to approve vacation payouts for these individuals in the amount of \$13,300. The motion carried.

**CLAIMS APPROVAL:** Twilegar motioned to approve the claims approval report in the amount of \$256,704. All were in favor and the motion carried.

**JOINT TREASURER'S/AUDITOR'S REPORT:** Twilegar motioned to approve the report and the motion carried.

**IDAHO POWER:** Paris Dickerson spoke from Idaho Power and explained the upcoming power outage that will affect mostly Garden Valley and Crouch. [See more on page 1 & 12] The outage will start on the evening of Sept. 28<sup>th</sup> and go through the morning of Sept. 29<sup>th</sup>. She explained that is part of a "ten-year review"

that involves more extensive projects. Dickerson said this upgrade will provide greater reliability for the region. She said that all the property owners and customers have been contacted. There are an estimated 3,300 customers that will be impacted by this 10-hour outage. Postcards have been mailed, phone calls have been made, and an ad has been posted in the Idaho World to inform customers.

**PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE UNIVERSAL LAND ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS:** Alex Gross, Director with Planning and Zoning, discussed clarification in the ULO, "and some slightly larger changes." [Commissioner Lindstrom could not be reached via phone.] The document was reviewed regarding

land use, and the codes were explained in detail, covering the difference between a youth camp, daycare, event center, etc. Gross explained some of the processes through his office, including penalties and "real world problems." Suggested changes were discussed and decided upon, to include in the revised ordinance. Private property rights, lot line adjustments, and lot splits were also discussed.

One constituent had questions and concerns that were expressed.

The hearing was closed and Mr. Gross indicated that he would make the changes discussed. The motion for approval will be tabled until the following week.

Adjourned at 4:25pm.

## Horseshoe Bend City Council Meeting

HORSESHOE BEND --

The following is a synopsis of the Horseshoe Bend City Council meeting that was held on Wednesday, September 13, 2023. All council members were present. Mayor Pat Goff made the call to order at 7:00 p.m. then led the Pledge of Allegiance. After unanimous approval of the agenda, minutes from the previous meeting of August 9, 2023, and the authorization to pay the city's bills, Goff opened the meeting with the agenda's new business.

Two residents, Brittany Watson and Randy Anderson, were on the agenda to discuss relief from their water bills, but neither party was in attendance.

Brett Baldwin was on the agenda for an ITD Highway 55 bypass application, but Baldwin was a no-show as well.

Two representatives from Idaho Power informed the council that they had scheduled some "pretty heavy maintenance" that would cause an area-wide power outage beginning on Thursday, September 28 at 9:00 p.m. and is set to end the following day, Friday, September 30 at 7:00 a.m.

**Department reports:**

EMS: Randy Quijas relayed

the following information to the council: There were thirteen calls made to EMS in the month of August and everything is going really well, plus a couple of new recruits have been added to the service.

Councilmember Martye White asked how the call for the bus accident on ID-55 went. Quijas said she wasn't on duty, but Goff said, "Everything went pretty smoothly."

**Public Works:** The department has been busy during the past month and the rains up north have been challenging. The new service requested by the Pankaus has been installed and the plant's UV maintenance, as well as the lagoon maintenance, is complete.

White asked "Who is American Water Works out of Texas and what do they do?" Public works didn't know, but city engineer Amy Woodruff said that they sell water products. White said that the city has been paying them \$200 every year for membership.

Public works said that they don't order any parts, to which White recommended that the city stop paying for the membership. White then asked why the city was paying Dobson Gravel \$750.00 for backhoe

service when the city owns a backhoe. Public works said it was to fix a leak on Madison, but the representative in attendance didn't know exactly why Dobson had been hired for the job. White asked the representative to find out why an outside company had been hired to do the work and report back to the council next month.

Councilmember Chartier asked the city attorney, Tony Pantera, about city ordinances for people living in recreational vehicles, specifically for someone who has been residing in one for over a year. Pantera

said that any violation of a city ordinance is a misdemeanor and should go to the Boise County prosecutor. White said that the prosecutor doesn't seem to want to enforce Horseshoe Bend ordinances. Councilmember Patti Burgess noted that she had heard that the city council can't cite residents for ordinance violations because it's considered "double dipping" and a conflict of interest. Pantera replied that he didn't think it would be considered a conflict, but he would need to speak with the prosecutor for clarification.

**City Attorney:** Pantera has completed a public records request and is currently reviewing the Acute EMS contract. He is also working on a HUD (Department of Housing and Urban Development) issue and he expects a resolution sometime this month. He indicated that if the council wanted more information, they would need to schedule an executive ses-

sion for next month.

**City Engineer:** Woodruff told the council that she was in close proximity to the bus crash on ID-55 and said that all agencies "worked great together."

It was suggested that she meet with the public works department to collaborate on the impact of the upcoming power outage, and what effect it will have on the city.

Woodruff informed the council that they had received the plans for the sidewalk project and plans for a project outline are in progress, so that the city can request bids for it. City Treasurer Teri Nolan was told to look for a grant check in the amount of \$500,000 to fund the project.

Mayor Goff adjourned the meeting at 7:36 p.m. The Horseshoe Bend City Council meets at city hall on the second Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m.

plished as part of the Southwest Idaho Landscape (SIL) Project. It is one of ten initial investment projects of the Forest Service's Wildfire Crisis Strategy. SIL encompasses 1.7 million acres, including about 424,000 and 505,000 acres of the Boise and Payette National Forests, respectively. There are another 800,000 acres under other ownership including private, state, and other federal lands. It is a broadscale effort to reduce the risk of catastrophic and undesirable wildfire while increasing the resiliency of the landscape. The strategy is to treat about 230,000 acres of hazardous fuels or 25 percent of National Forest System (NFS) lands within the landscape over the next 5-7 years.

"The work taking place this fall around Idaho City is part

of the Boise National Forest priority hazardous fuels reduction," Petersen said. "Prescribed fire is an important tool in combination with commercial logging and noncommercial thinning. These tools, when applied in the right place at the right time, will both reduce hazardous fuels while improving forest health." He added, "Minimizing smoke from prescribed burns is a key concern. We work closely with the National Weather Service and our partners at the Idaho Department of Environmental Quality to ensure conditions are right to maximize smoke dispersions."

"The goal is to increase the pace of this work, resulting in healthy forests while reducing the risk of catastrophic wildfire," Boise National Forest Supervisor Petersen concluded.

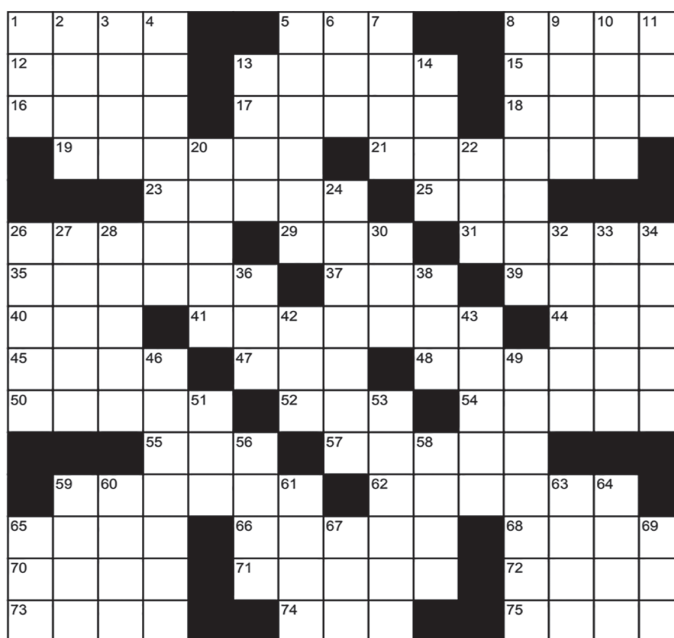

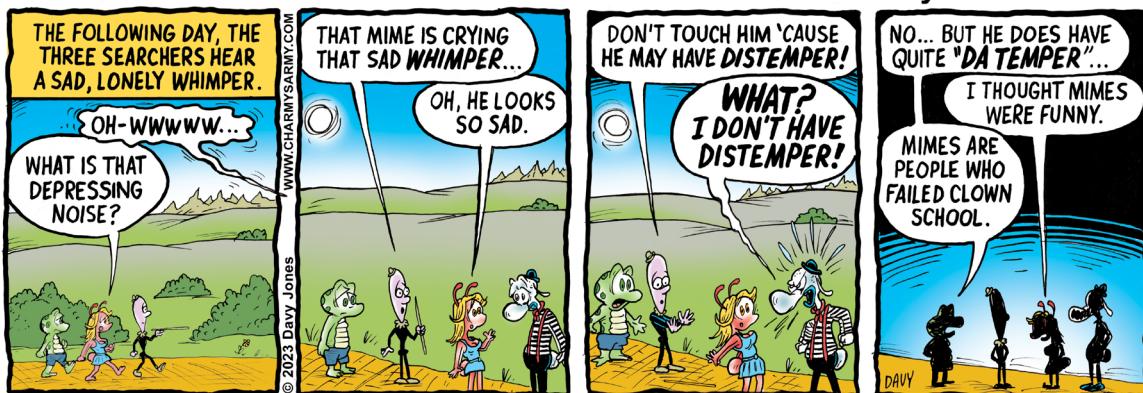
