Closed Access to Hot Spings & Campground



and hot spring area will create a significant disruption and necessitate closing the access gate for public safety.

BOISE COUNTY – The access road to the Boise National Forest's Pine Flats Campground and adjacent hot springs, located 5.5 miles west of Lowman along the Banks-Lowman Highway, will be closed Oct. 1-31 as contractors plant hundreds of trees to replace those lost in recent years to insects, disease, and wildfire.

The area will be planted with five-year-old Ponderosa pine trees, averaging nearly four feet tall, arriving in five-gallon pots from the Boise National Forest's Lucky Peak Nursery, and will give the popular recreation site a jumpstart on reforestation.

The use of heavy equipment, presence of large holes in the ground, and staged materials throughout the campground

While the access route to the Pine Flats Hot Springs is closed, other local hot springs, including Kirkham Hot Springs east of Lowman, remain open.

Present: Commissioners Steven Twilegar, Clay Tucker, and Lindy Lindstrom

Pledge of Allegiance

CONSTITUENT INPUT:

None

MINUTES: Chairman Twilegar motioned to accept the minutes from September 1st and 12th. They were each approved.

RESOLUTION: The Road Department budget was discussed with an adjustment for fuel and the Arrowrock Road maintenance account. Clerk

Mary Prisco said the Atlanta Highway District contract is \$40,000 a year, "\$10,000 per the quarter." She said there was a very long delay in billing for 2022.

Commissioner Twilegar joked that "we should stop using fuel," and then motioned to approve Boise County Resolution 2023-38 to increase the Road and Bridge Fund for the "2022 budget."

RESOLUTION: Clerk Prisco spoke regarding the Planning and Zoning vehicle maintenance fund. Twilegar motioned

to approve the next resolution to increase the budget for P&Z for 2023. The motions carried.

RESOLUTION: Twilegar motioned to adopt Resolution 2023-40 to increase the Boise County District Court Fund with the Justice Department. This motion also carried.

EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT: Salaries were discussed by the clerk. Twilegar motioned to adopt 2023-03 to amend the EBCAD budget, salary, and benefit accounts. The motion carried.

DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR: Twilegar reported that he reached out to the department of Interior regarding search and rescue reimbursement, and he was reminded twice that the county received PILT money. Clerk Prisco said they were very restricted funds.

GEM PLAN PAYMENT: A mandatory payment was discussed. Clerk Prisco said the board pays it every year. Twilegar motioned to pay the payment of \$290.68. The motion carried.

PAYMENTS: Chairman Twilegar motioned to pay the invoice of \$2,135 to a lawyer's firm. He then motioned to pay another lawyer for services rendered in the amount of \$12,780. Twilegar motioned to pay another company for "investigations" in the amount of \$700. These were all approved and the motions carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Closed session to discuss risk management. [9:28am to 9:46am] Coming back into session, Twilegar said there was no action required.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Twilegar motioned to go back into executive session to discuss a personnel issue. [9:47am to 10:08am] Coming back into session, Twilegar motioned to approve additional admin time for a Planning and Zoning employee. All were in favor.

He then motioned to pay out comp time for an employee in the clerk's office. All were in favor and the motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: A closed session to discuss risk management and pending litigation. [10:34am to 11:13am]

PUBLIC HEARING: The Unified Land Ordinance was further discussed. Commissioner Tucker had several questions and concerns regarding the time period to allow public comments for P&Z issues.

After much discussion, Twilegar motioned to approve the

changes as discussed and presented to the ULO. The motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: A closed session to discuss "risk management." [11:37am to 11:50am] Coming back into session, Twilegar made a motion to set up a meeting with the Atlanta Highway District to discuss the Arrowrock Road maintenance agreement. The motion carried. Chairman Twilegar then motioned to certify the county levies for Boise County. All were in favor and the motion carried.

FILMING: Two gentlemen discussed with the commissioners the possibility of coming up on a Saturday to film at the courthouse, and Bryan Bowermaster stated it was their "civic duty" and freedom of speech to

do so in a public building. The individuals were with Bowermaster Productions. Twilegar said that he did not have a key to the building and there was an issue with them not having the proper insurance. The commissioner said he would be in contact with the individuals and proposed an alternate location.

FUTURE AGENDA: Items were discussed, including upcoming public hearings: solid waste fee increase, DMV fee increase, and the FY2023 budget opening.

Adjourned at 12:05pm.

Boise County's budget has grown explosively in the last 2 years, more rapidly than its population growth. As a result, property owners are being hit hard by higher property taxes.

It appears the commissioners did not conduct a rigorous examination of the newly enacted FY2024 county budget, including a new employee compensation structure. County commissioners owe it to taxpayers to work hard to avoid unneeded spending now and in future commitments.

But kudos to commissioner Clay Tucker for trying to get the commission to look deeper into the budget and pay system. Unfortunately, the other commissioners apparently just wanted to get it over with.

Some specific points:

- Folks moving to Boise County should not expect Ada County-level services. Boise County is a rural county, and should remain so.

- Most important priorities for the county should be roads, infrastructure, law enforcement, emergency services, transparency.

Employee compensation

should favor rewarding merit, not seniority.

County employees should pay part of the cost of their medical insurance, as private sector employees do, and thus be incentivized to help hold medical costs in line.

The county should consider novel cost-saving approaches such as health savings accounts and direct primary care medical coverage.

A constituent suggested moving the county seat to Horseshoe Bend (HSB). This would increase the available employee pool, and also make it easier for residents to participate in county government. Simply moving the commissioner meetings to HSB would be a big improvement.

Just some observations. When discussing the EBCAD issues, Commissioner Twilegar commented "It needs to be pointed out that the library here gets more

money than the people who are trying to save our lives". He then makes a motion to approve \$2,553 for "...cannabis eradication program...". I guess the cannabis eradication program is more important than saving lives with the ambulance service. Can we Boise County residents then assume the cannabis eradication program is a profit center for the Sheriff's Office? You just have to love Idaho Power suggestions for outage preparedness. "Prepare for medical needs, whether those are related to refrigerated medicine or electrically powered medical equipment. This could mean finding a place you can go during an outage or buying a backup generator." I sure hope there is nobody in the affected area, who is on a ventilator and in home hospice care, and dependent on EBCAD. But at least we have the cannabis eradication program and money for the library.

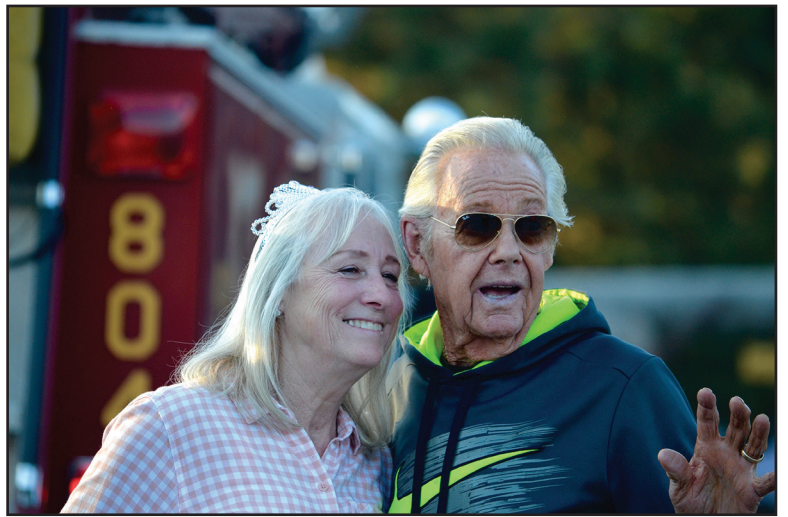
