

Emergency Services Working Together

IDAHO CITY -- Idaho City Fire Protection District team held a full day of scenario training on Saturday, November 11, 2023, at the Basin School District. During the morning hours, the team familiarized everyone with the school suppression system, the operation and alarm system, and the facility shutoff for the propane and main power. They then transitioned to working with the East Boise County Ambulance District. The Unit 14 ambulance, stationed out of Idaho City, was used in training firefighters how to better assist the EMTs, focusing on patient care and best practices. In addition, the local volunteer firefighters practiced specialized techniques that included lifts to rapidly and efficiently remove an injured individual out of danger, including moving patients up and down a tight staircase.

Special thanks to Basin School District, Donnie, and Brandon for the use of the facility to better train for emergencies.


Wrapping up the day, firefighters performed hose lays on their new aerial engine 502, to get it ready for service. They loaded 500 feet of 5-inch hose, 500 feet of 3-inch, and 200 feet of 2 1/2-inch hose, to meet NFPA requirements of a minimum of 1,200 feet of hose lav on scene. However, instructor and ICFPD firefighter John Ward said they had in total upward of 1,800 feet of hose on board. Ward reminded the community, "As always, please thank all these amazing human beings for all the time and effort they so freely volunteer. Many of these people are on call 24/7. When the pager goes off and they are available they drop everything and respond to make a difference.







the world.

His story is a testament to the power of resilience, adaptation, and the pursuit of passion. His memory will be cherished by his family, friends, and all who knew him as a man who carved his path, much like the knives he so skillfully crafted.







ITD Awarded Grant to Design Banks Lowman Intersection

BOISE COUNTY -- There has been growing concern regarding the congestion at the Banks Lowman intersection onto State Highway 55. A public meeting was held for the community by the Idaho Transportation Department in Garden Valley on September 12, 2023. Currently, the agency funds a contract to have flaggers directing traffic during high volume weekends. Oftentimes, traffic coming from Banks Lowman Road has insufficient gaps in traffic flow to merge safely southbound onto SH-55, which results in several hours of bumper-tobumper traffic. ITD is in the process of determining a viable, long-term solution, and was awarded a grant offered by Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP). This spring, there will be a study done that will include the use of signals at the intersection to improve safety and operation. There was concern expressed at the meeting in Garden Valley that the road simply is not wide enough, and to properly resolve the issue would require the widening of both the SH-55 bridge of the South Fork Payette River and the Boise County Bridge of the North Fork Payette River.

ITD Public Information Officer Sophia Miraglio recently announced: "By 2024, we will have an interim plan in place utilizing temporary traffic signals. We will also begin the process to design a full intersection that will include building two bridges and widening the roads. Currently, we only have funds for design and not construction. The \$4 million price tag is for design, as construction is not funded."



Rehabilitation of State Highway 55 between State Highway 44 and Horseshoe Bend begins this week.

BOISE COUNTY -- The Idaho Transportation Department (ITD) will begin rehabilitation of State Highway 55 (SH-55) between State Highway 44 (State Street) and Horseshoe Bend during the week of November 13.

The project includes milling and resurfacing the roadway for a smoother driving experience and making Americans with Disabilities (ADA) improvements at SH-55 intersections with Hill, Floating Feather, and Beacon Light roads. Safety improvements include replacing guardrail, as needed, throughout the project area. Improvements will be completed with a combination of day and night work.

Motorists will begin to see construction activity, including signage and equipment near the Avimor development. The project includes constructing a bridge for both vehicle and pedestrian traffic to travel under SH-55 at the north end of Avimor. This work will occur at night and is being funded by Avimor.

Central Paving Inc. is the contractor for this project. Construction is anticipated to be complete by fall 2024.
