# **Volunteer Rural Firefighting Training**

BOISE COUNTY -- The Clear Creek, Thorn Creek, and Centerville Volunteer Fire Departments teamed up on Saturday, January 27th, to train in responding, communications, and scene guidelines for an initial fire attack. Fire Chief Marvin Jennings of Clear Creek explained that once firefighters were on the scene, they "needed to know and under-

stand what they were looking at in order to make a plan and be safe. A big part of initial attack is the ability to read and understand smoke." State Fire Marshal Knute Sandahl contributed some helpful tips to firefighters. The structure used was a much smaller version of what firefighters would normally defend. This was a 32" x 16" x 48" donated doll house.

A fire was started in the bottom floor, and firefighters observed how the fire spreads by opening and closing doors. There was quite a bit of smoke and Chief Jennings commented that it created, "an awesome visual for the fire fighters." He added, "Along with smoke, this helps the fire fighters understand flow paths, how they spread the fire, and how we can use it to our advantage. The doll house also helps to understand ventilation, and when, where, and how to do it safely. Ventilation is very tricky, if done wrong it can change your whole situation. February's training, we will diver deeper into these things for a better understanding."



# **Expansion of Firehouse** in Osprey Subdivision

#### **EAST BOISE COUNTY --**

On Wednesday, January 24, the Wilderness Ranch Fire Protection District held their monthly District meeting at Station #1. During this meeting, Commissioner Drew Bodie updated the Board on the project to expand Station #2 in the Osprey subdivision. Several years ago, it was decided that the department was quickly running out of room to store their emergency vehicles and could no longer protect all of the district's equipment. A savings plan was put into effect to help pay for an expansion and, approximately 18 months ago, Chief Colton McCarthy delegated this project to Bodie. Accepting the challenge, Bodie set forth to follow the governmental guidelines for expansion.

The project came to completion and will now provide the fire protection district with ample room to house two more vehicles, plus provide some much-needed additional storage space. There was some concern that the department would also need to add a heating unit to the addition, but



the current heating has been surprisingly effective in keeping the whole building warm in winter conditions. Measures were taken to well-insulate the building. Bodie explained that much of the fire fighting equipment was old, and in order to best protect it from costly maintenance, housing the vehicles indoors was a must. The project has been fully funded and is now turned back over to Fire Chief McCarthy.

The expansion on the Osprey subdivision firehouse provides an additional 34' by 24' room. McCarthy commented, "This project is something we've wanted to do for quite some time and it is nice to see it come to fruition. I'd like to thank Drew [Bodie], the board, and all the contractors for putting it all together."





Statistical standouts for the Mustangs include senior Layth Bromgard, who is averaging 18 points per game (252 season total) as well as averaging 14.9 rebounds per game (209 season total), 2.9 assists per game (41 season total), and is 93% at the free throw line. Senior Keelun

Jones is averaging 3.1 steals per game, with a total of 43 this season.

The team will be on the road against the Tri-Valley Titans (3-5) on Tuesday, 1/30 and again on Monday, 2/5 to face off with the Council Lumberjacks (2-5) in their final Long Pin Conference challenges. Both games start at 7:30 p.m. The Mustangs (3-5) find them-

selves in 3rd place in the Long Pin Conference behind Garden Valley (9-1) and Cascade (7-1). The team is 8-9 overall for the season.

Girls Basketball: The Horseshoe Bend Lady Mustangs came close to pulling off their first 1A DII Long Pin Conference game win on Thursday,

1/25 in Cascade, but the Ramblers (2-6) held them off and the Mustangs took the 40-42 loss. At home on Monday, 1/29 against the Ramblers, the Lady Mustangs fell again and will be on the road to Tri-Valley to play against the Titans in their final regular game of the season. The Long Pin Conference

district tournament will begin on Thursday, 2/1 (highest seed will host) and continue on Saturday, 2/3 so expect to see the Lady Mustangs on the road. The Varsity Girls Mustang team finished 2-10 overall and 0-8 in conference play for the season.

**BOISE COUNTY --** Heating systems have been working overtime to keep homes and businesses warm this past month. That means higher energy bills may land in mailboxes in the next couple of weeks. Idaho Power can help customers manage their winter energy use, as well as help prevent surprises when winter bills ar-

When temperatures drop, heating systems have to run more frequently to keep up, even if the thermostat is set at a steady 68 degrees. Other appliances may use more energy too. While you're in My Account, sign up for alerts to be notified if your monthly bill reaches a set amount, and consider enrolling in Budget Pay. Budget Pay levels out your payments so they are the same each month — eliminating higher bills in the summer and winter months

Turn down the thermostat at night and when you're away, or install a smart thermostat to automatically make the adjustments for you. Some homes heated with electricity or a heat pump may even qualify for a \$50 smart thermostat incentive. If you have a heat pump, don't turn your thermostat

down more than 2 to 3 degrees.

Add insulation, if needed, and seal air leaks around windows and doors to keep heated air where it should be - inside!

Dress for the weather, even inside. Wearing long-sleeved shirts and pants, sweaters, and socks will warm your body and help prevent the need to bump up the thermostat.





# **Boise County History Class 101**

By Skip Myers PLACERVILLE --The story of the **Three Fiddlers** 

On June 4, 1865, near the toll gate on the road from Placerville to Centerville, George Wilson was murdered, robbed of his gold, and his body hidden in a prospect hole that was filled with water. Fred Cursons and L. Moulton, who were both musicians, banjo player and a fiddler, happened to come across the crime in progress. Both men were shot in the back as they attempted to run from the crime scene and died not long after. Deputy Sheriff Maloney and his posse continued the search for the suspects who eluded justice. Fred Cursons was also known as "Curzoni," he was an Englishman and his mother and sister resided at No. Park Street, London. His wife was named Victoria. He was a musician of more than any ordinary ability. He had been employed with the Potters Theatrical Company, and on his way to Centerville for employment in mining and to play at saloons in Placerville and Centerville, then both thriving communities, when his life was tragically cut short.

George Wilson was a native of Ireland. George was about thirty three years old and unmarried. He had always lived in Illinois and Missouri before coming to this coast. He had lived in Sawyers Bar, Klamath County, California and another mining area near Willow Creek and Weaverville, California. He also was a good standing member of the Odd Fellows Lodge in Placerville. He had been discharged in February from Co. A, Oregon Calvary. He was buried with Moulton and Cursons thoughhe was solely a miner and not a fiddler. He was





robbed and killed near Centerville. Moulton and Cursons were killed because they witnessed the murder.

These brutal murders caused a widespread furor, and within a few days the Sheriff arrested a John Williams who had a reputation as a gunslinger and gambler. The locals wanted justice by hanging but were held off by the sheriff. A verdict of not guilty was handed down by the district court a month later. No one else was ever apprehended, and so the true identity of the murderer remains lost in time. Williams was indicted on another charge of robbing John Carpenter, on September 1863, of two hundred dollars and was set free as no laws at that time were written to cover the criminal code.

Local records reveal that an Owrn McCaler died earlier on the day of the murders, stricken by a fallen tree on California Hill. All four are buried together in a single grave at this site. There are four pine trees that grew from the corners of the grave site that are stand silently, watching over the bodies of these men as solemn reminders of the bloodiest day in Placerville History.







# U.S. Flag History and Etiquette

**History** - The United States Flag was adopted by the Continental Congress June 14th, 1777. The original design was composed of thirteen stars representing the thirteen colonies on a blue background, thirteen red and white stripes to represent the thirteen colonies. The stars were in a circle pattern to represent that each state was equal. The red color represented valor, white signified purity, and blue represented loyalty. The flag was called the Stars and Stripes.

Flag Code – 4 U.S.C. United States Code, 2011 Edition Title 4 - FLAG AND SEAL, SEAT OF GOVERNMENT, AND THE STATES. The code covers everything from the design of the flag, use of the flag, codifies the "Pledge of allegiance to the flag", times and occasions for display, manner of display, respect for the flag, and the conduct during hoisting, lowering, or passing of the flag. This code does not provide for penalties for violation of this code. This code is very interesting; I recommend reading it at least

**Display** – The flag should always be displayed higher than any other flag. It should always be in serviceable condition. Serviceable means that the flag is not torn in any manner or dirty. If you find the flag not serviceable, the proper way to dispose is via burning. If a flag is just dirty, you can try washing it. Most Veterans groups will dispose of the flag for you if you just contact them. There are several ceremonies that are performed when you burn a flag and it's easy to google them.

If you are going to display the flag on anything but a flagpole, I recommend that you look up the proper way to display it. There are so many variables that it is hard to cover in an article. We see flags at half-staff from time to time. The correct way to fly a flag at half-staff is to hoist it all the way to the top and then lower it to half-staff. When you lower a flag from half-staff, it is hoisted to the top position, then lower. Only the President and a State governor can order flags to half-staff. The code covers all the reasons for flying a flag at half-staff. The only exception to the rule

is on Memorial Day the flag is to be flown at half-staff till noon.

**Myths** – There are a lot of myths about the flag.

- The biggest one is if the flag touches the ground, it must be burned; this is false. If it is serviceable after touching the ground, it can still be used.
- Flags that were draped over a coffin cannot be flown; this is not true.
- A flag cannot be worn as clothing; this is false. An actual American flag cannot be worn as clothing, but to wear clothing with stars, stripes, red, white, and blue is within flag etiquette.
- A flag cannot be flown at night; this is false. It can be flown at night if properly illuminated. Properly illuminated means you can see that it is a flag. There is nothing specific about this topic in the flag code.

Enjoy flying your flags and showing your patriotism. If you see a flag that is not serviceable, please inform the person or business/entity of the problem. You would be amazed how many are not serviceable and yet still being flown.
