Gov. Little's Capital for a Day in Idaho City

BOISE COUNTY -- The little ol' mining town of Idaho City has been all-aflutter since February when it was first revealed that it had been chosen as a capital for the day by Idaho Governor Brad Little. Little include: This event is expected to bring many top state officials to this humble neck of the woods, where gold was first discovered in 1862. The gathering will be held at the Ray Robison Community Hall, located at 206 W. Commercial Street, on Friday, April 26th, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Idaho City Mayor Kenny Everhart was eager to invite and remind other Boise County dignitaries, and the community at large, that they were most welcomed and encouraged to attend this prestigious event. April 16, 2024

Present: Commissioners Clay Tucker, and Lindy Lindstrom

Absent: Commissioner Steven Twilegar

Pledge of Allegiance **CONSTITUENT INPUT:** None

Chairman **MINUTES**: Tucker motioned to approve the minutes from April 2. The motion carried.

TREASURER: Treasurer Gina Turner reported that the "original problem" with the county's software was fixed, but that there is now a new problem, "and now when I try to do the distribution, it comes up blank." She has been in contact with the state of Idaho Tax Commission and will be visiting the county soon. Assessor Chris Juszczak informed the board that he too had been in contact with the tax commission and, "They want us to be the first conversion from Computer Arts software [corporation] to the state's software, which is completely free to us, support, licensing, and everything. The bad part of it is that it's only in three other counties right now and converting the data from Computer Arts to the new software has never been done and it's not going to be easy because of the format that Computer Arts is built on. Maybe by this time next year, we'll have new software in that

side of the building." Treasurer Turner added that they were hopeful that by November the county would be on the state program for the tax bills. Tucker agreed and said, "I hope so,

PROSECUTOR'S OF-FICE: Chairman Tucker announced that the Prosecuting Attorney's office would like a new window. Prosecutor Alex Sosa addressed, "In the back office, there is essentially a ten-by-ten square and that's the only light that comes in and, in the past, people have always joked that it's a jail cell." He said that the space belongs to his deputy and he would like to keep him. The lease on the building runs out in 2027, and Sosa would need to contact the landowner. The request was tabled.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Tucker made a motion to go into executive session to discuss potentially hiring an employee. [Time 9:08am to 10:01am] Coming back into session, he said there was no action required.

IDAHO OFFICE OF **EMERGENCY MANAGE-MENT**: There were several grants reviewed, including communication projects. Commissioner Tucker said they were still looking to hire an emergency manager.

POLLING LOCATIONS: Chairman Tucker motioned to

approve the agreement for the use of the polling locations, including: Wilderness Ranch Fire Station, Centerville Fire Station, and the Mutual Improvement Ladies Auxiliary Building in Horseshoe Bend.

BOISE COUNTY HAZ-ARD MITIGATION UP-**DATE**: Commissioner Lindstrom said it was what they had discussed and said, "I like it." Tucker encouraged him to make the motion. Commissioner Lindstrom made a motion for the 2023 agreement for Boise County, for the hazard mitigation update. Lindstrom then motioned for the 2021 grant adjustment notice for Boise County extension for the grant.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE: The destruction of records was discussed briefly and tabled until next week's meeting.

APPROVAL CLAIM'S REPORT: Chairman Tucker asked Commissioner Lindstrom if he had any questions on the claim's approval report. He replied, "I didn't see nothing too alarming." Tucker asked, since they skipped having a meeting last week, "Did last week's bills go onto this report?" Clerk Mary Prisco's report was inaudible. Tucker made a motion to approve the claims report in the amount of \$226,154.07. The motion car-

EAST BOISE COUNTY

AMBULANCE DISTRICT: An agreement with the Gold Dust Rodeo was reviewed. Commissioner Tucker made a motion to provide ambulance service to the Gold Dust Rodeo and the motion carried.

A grant to get the two ambulances fixed, Unit 13 and Unit 15, was discussed and there will be no cost to the county. Tucker commented, "We like free stuff," and made a motion to accept the subgrant agreement through Central District Health for \$6,630. The motion carried

EXECUTIVE SESSION: The board entered executive session with EBCAD for a personnel issue. [Time 10:37am to 11:06am] Coming out of the closed session, Tucker made a motion to sign two letters, all were in favor and the motion carried.

FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS: There were items discussed for future agendas, including denying Bogus Basin an exemption [from paying taxes]. Adjourned at 11:11am.

OBITUARY



Marcos "Mark" Valentine Veristain II 1954 ~ 2024

Marcos Valentine Veristain II of Idaho City, ID was anything but normal. So, this obituary will be anything but boring. He died at home, surrounded by his wife and children, April 16th at 11:39 pm. He was born July 28th, 1954, to Marcos Valentine Veristain and Dixie Marie (Lewin) in Ontario, OR. As the first boy in the family, he kept his sisters (Lynda (Peter) Dallman of Hood River, OR; Dorthy Veristain of McMinnville, OR; and Diane (Scott) Jensen of Oxbow, OR) on their toes. They were joined by a fifth member, Barry (Leslie) Veristain of Portland, OR) to round out their powerhouse crew. Marcos was pretty happy to have a brother to help him in his house full of girls.

Marcos grew up in Vale and Ontario, Oregon where he sang, played baseball, and had a life changing experience when he attended church camp with his friend at the age of 16. God radically changed his life and gave him a focus and love for people that continued his whole life.

Upon graduation from Ontario High School, he made the next best decision of his life and attended Northwest College (now Northwest University) in Kirkland, WA. He obtained his Bachelors of Arts degree, but the best thing he received from Northwest was his wife of 49 years, 7 months, 17 days, and not nearly enough minutes, Loveta (Buhler) of Nampa, ID.

Married life as a lay pastor took him and his young wife to, what seemed like, the ends of the earth. Logging camps and Eskimo villages kept the young couple busy. While pastoring and logging with Silver Bay Logging on Chichagof Island, their first child Loveta Marie (Dowain Geesey) of Lansing NY, joined them. Two years later, Marcos and his wife navigated through the loss of a second daughter (Heather Jo) where they learned to lean on God and lean on each other even more. Two years after their loss, God blessed them with a third daughter, Michelle Danae (Josh Prim) of Marietta, GA. For some reason, Michelle's entrance into the world drove them north...way North! Nuiqsut, Alaska was home for a brief time, but it was extremely impactful. Future congregations would hear stories of Alaska over and over.

The birth of their fourth and final child, but their first boy, took them south. All the way to Nampa, ID. Marcos Valentine Veristain III of Idaho City, ID made his dramatic entrance in June of 1984. In August of that same year, the still young couple made their final move to Idaho City.

When Mark walked into the doors of Idaho City Christian Center for the first time, he heard God audibly say, "This is the place." And it was. Idaho City held his heart for the next 39 ½ years. Death is the only thing that could separate him from his family and his love for "his town."

Mark is pre-deceased by his father, father-in-law Duane Buhler of Nampa, daughter, a stepmother Adelia, and a beloved stepfather, James Broussard of Saudi Arabia, as well as a loved niece Rebekah Kinney Oberson, brother-in-law Mike Elliott, his grandparents, two great nephews, and many aunts and uncles.

For those that are learning to survive without him, there are many. The most important group, as they well know, is the Grandkids. The four-wheeler rides, the waffles and cookies, the hunting, the trampoline, camping, fishing, swimming, sports, music-he was their biggest fan and cheerleader as well as their most influential partner in high shenanigans. Grandpa told me I could! Dowain Paul, Loveta Michelle, Kendra Jackson, Landon James, Olivia Mae, and Lily Grace-you were the light of his world and his favorite everything.

Followed closely in favorites were his children. (Yes, Mom, we know you are actually the favorite!) After those people, the list is a mix and long. Three sisters and five sisters-in-law,

one brother and six brothersin-law. His mother and motherin-law. Thirty-three nieces and nephews. Twenty-eight great nieces and nephews. Holy smokes, we have a big family! And he loved them all. However, his love was not limited to those that were related by blood or marriage. It would be quite negligent to fail to mention the "family" that extended beyond those bounds. To his bus kids, church kids, school kids, and the town of Idaho City at large, you are the family he claimed as well.

Mark, Pastor Mark, PM, Mister Mark, Dad, Gramps, Uncle Myrtle, whatever he was called, he loved fiercely. And with great enthusiasm. Everything he did was with great enthusiasm, although not planning. But he was sure it would be "fine". And usually it was, eventually. From pastoring in Idaho City, a "circuit riding pastor" to Horseshoe Bend for a time, bus driving, keeping stats at games, to living life, he lived life well. But, more than his love, he knew God loved each person he encountered. And he took it as his goal in life to make sure everyone knew that. Just remember-you aren't good-you're great!
