# Gov. Little and his Cabinet Address Concerns from Citizens in Idaho City

IDAHO CITY -- Idaho City Mayor Kenny Everhart welcomed everyone to the Capital for a Day event and ceremonially presented Idaho Governor Brad Little with a key to the city mounted on a plaque. The scope of the day planned to encompass many topics of concern, touching on education, law enforcement, roads, and emergency services.

The Superintendent of Basin School District, Brian Hunicke, spoke about the challenges faced across the state of hiring new school bus drivers. Although they have raised the salary, he said, "We're running into the problem of, they can go down and get the CDL, but they can't get the training to be a school bus driver. And now, it's really difficult." He said there are several drivers waiting for this training. He explained their dilemma, "We went from \$15 to \$24 an hour, and we still can't get anybody to drive."

Idaho Transportation Department Director Scott Stokes said, "I would not have anticipated this five years ago, but just because of our moving nature of our society, we're involved in

things that I wouldn't have anticipated, including workforce training, and career-type training." He said there were several grants to help with training, and the state is exploring what to do next. He added that the primary goal was to focus on roads and bridges, but there was some money for workforce training and for exploring new programs.

Basin Elementary Principal Jamie Pilkerton spoke about

the advantage of having a preschool and the benefits to students, and the challenges of relying on the citizens for bonds, and applying for grants. Governor Little reflected by saying, "The people who founded this state were right here in Idaho City, when they wrote the constitution in 1890, then determined, you have to have education citizenry... I'm an unadulterated advocate for a ~ continued on pg 2

# Governor Little Addresses Questions and Concerns

great education system." Little said he didn't want to see the "best and the brightest" leave to go to other states. "The first thing I did was increase starting teacher's pay... So, if you're from Boise County, Idaho City, you go to school and you want to be a school teacher, you're going to have a career opportunity right here across the street."

Steve Moore, running for County Commissioner District 1, stated that he had concerns regarding the roads in Boise County that are damaged by recreationalists. There was also the question of whether the state would take back the Banks Lowman Highway. Gov. Little recognized that these repairs came out of the property taxes of residents. He added that the state had put \$2 million last year, this year, and will again next year, towards addressing local bridge problems around the state. Director Stokes said there was a 20-year-old agreement that had not yet fulfilled the terms of conditions for the state to take back the highway. Boise County Prosecutor Alex Sosa stood and stated that portions of the road could be turned over and that he would like Stokes' contact information to possibly discuss this issue further.

ReBekha Lulu, former teacher and Vice Principal at Basin School District, gave a heart-

felt explanation of why teachers are leaving the profession and asked what was being done on a governmental level. Governor Little responded, "First off, we're sad when anybody leaves the teaching field, because there's a special place in Heaven for people who've dedicated their life to educating our children." He then continued by saying, "My statewide teaching retention rate is 87.9%. In this district, it's 79.3%. We wish it wasn't that low, but that's still – I would bet that some of these business people that are in this room would say that every year they probably lose 20% of their employees. So, that's somewhat a factor of a changing economy and the challenges." Little said that he has pushed for increased teacher's starting pay and created a career ladder. He did add, "This world is changing really fast and I blame a lot of it on social media. Social media has created an environment that is more challenging for teachers."

Clayne Barron, a local resident, spoke regarding his concerns for local emergency services. He relayed that he recently suffered from a heart attack and Life Flight could not respond due to a snowstorm.

Gov. Little praised the local emergency services and said with applause from the audience, "You're living proof that it works!" He added that he's hoping to pass further legislation, "I think it's necessary,"

and recognized that local emergency services are essential.

Senator Geoff Schroeder was also present and recounted that he was "stunned" that the bill did not move forward to the House. "It is my intent to get another shot at this... Try to get that passed, because I think this is absolutely necessary, it is essential."

Sheriff Scott Turner stated that with a county so vast, with two interstate highway running through it, it can be a struggle to respond to emergencies with the limited number of deputies.

Idaho State Police Lt. Colonel Sheldon Kelley stood and addressed the concern, "Just call, we'll come, it may take us a while to get there, but we'll

Sheriff Turner proceeded to detail another major concern for Boise County, "In my county, I have these people on felony probation and parole, they account for a majority of our drug crimes and major crimes. We struggle with getting any help and support from the Idaho Department of Corrections, to help us to combat and address these issues. I have people that are in this county that are on felony probation and parole, well, when I go and to talk to them, they'll say, 'well, I haven't talked to my probation officer in eight months.' When we call them and try to get them to come up so that they can help us, we can hardly get them to come up here and help us at all." He said that the Boise County deputies do home visits, and they are finding drugs in the houses, "There's a huge gap in the system that is broken... I can't get a probation parole officer out of the valley to come."

Little said with a wide grin, "I might be able to help," and there was a round of applause from the audience.

Sheriff Turner later confided that within an hour of this discussion with the governor, he had received a message from the probation and parole direc-

Lisa Hanson, a past president of the Idaho City Chamber of Commerce, spoke regarding grants targeted at drawing people into our state, not the patrons that support them most from the valley. She petitioned

that those local patrons should be weighed into the grant process. She then relayed that the Idaho City Chamber of Commerce is one hundred members strong, including businesses within city limits and those that do business with Idaho City.

Shelly Huffington, Vice President for the Idaho City Chamber of Commerce and owner of Majestic Mountain Ranch, then spoke regarding tourism.

The "Capital for a Day" program was an ideal method to bring rural folks together with the Governor's administration to address issues and concerns facing our Boise County community. This was indeed an opportunity for local Idahoans to ask questions of state agencies and share their heartfelt opinions.

# IC City Council Meeting

IDAHO CITY -- In the regular Idaho City Council meeting on April 24, 2024, under old business, Brent Adamson asked the council if they could discuss the Idaho City Fire Protection District. Mayor Everhart replied, "We can sit down and talk to see where you are...with a bunch of the city folks. They would like an opportunity once they come... they would like an opportunity to make sure they are informed. I told them we would do that."


Ashley Elliott added, "We were able to go back to our budget and find out how much the city has spent. This shows how much the taxpayers paid for the fire department. The records show, between 1972 to 2009 it [spending for the fire department] equaled \$147,741.00, and from 2009 to 2017 it equaled \$104,475.00." Mayor Everhart suggested that they hold a closed meeting with the Council and Fire Commissioners soon. A date will be deter-

Under old business, the city council decided to sign the master service agreement with Clearwater Financial. Councilmember Ashley Elliott made a motion, and Councilmember Mari Adams seconded the motion, to allow Mayor Everhart to sign the agreement. This agreement will be for two years, at \$6,000.00 per year and will offer the City of Idaho City professional services in areas of public engagement, planning and development, budgeting, accounting, and economic development.

Under public works, Tami Claus stated that she will be starting road construction on Bear Run. Construction will begin on May 6, 2024, and continue until it is completed. There will be delays and short-term closures. Construction workers will work from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.



It is unfortunate that we as adults do not have a better understanding of property taxes, levy rates, and how our government works in general. So I am going to try to explain some of it in a way that I hope is easy to digest.

School levies last two years and that is why it was up to be voted on again.

The school was asking for \$792,000 a continuation of a levy that was already in place.

That means that everyone

inside of the Basin School Taxing District would have to pay taxes. Taxes that were already being paid.

The government takes the TOTAL taxable value of the ENTIRE taxing district and computes a levy rate. The most comparable past levy rate would be .000730071. I use the most comparable, because I am unable to tell you exactly what the levy WOULD have been, had we passed the levy.

Now time for the real math:

For every \$100,000 taxable value the amount would be about \$73. An average house in Boise county has about \$400,000 taxable value. That would mean an average home owner would pay the school in taxes \$292. Let's round to \$300, just for my people that don't like math. If the levy would have passed the average home owner in Boise county would have paid \$25 a month in taxes to the school.

If you are truly worried about saving money, I bet there are bigger monthly bills that you could fight. Idaho power, your cell phone, budget your groceries, cancel a streaming service...

I said it in 2022 (2 years ago, last time this levy was up for vote) and I'll say it again. Voting no on this levy is a slap in the face to every teacher you have had, every student that has passed through our school system, and every child that is currently enrolled. If this levy is up again, I hope you find it within yourselves to vote yes.

This levy is even less than the explanation given because the budget for education has been cut yet again. They are only asking for \$493,500, that is less than \$15 dollars a month! Does anyone else hear Sarah McLachlan (in the arms of an angel)?

For comparison, Boise School District No. 1 has a levy of 0.003188013. That means that people living in that taxing district are paying over \$300 for every \$100,000. That's over \$1,200 for a \$400,000 home in Ada county on average!

## HSB School District Receives Needed Grant

#### By Tracy Koslosky HORSESHOE BEND

Thanks to the Securing Our Future (SOF) Grant Program, the Horseshoe Bend School District will be the recipient of grant funds to secure the district campus by installing 6' tall perimeter fencing with electronic gates at all three vehicle entry points. The SOF grants were a school safety partnership initiative between the Governor's Office, the Idaho Legislature, and the Idaho State Board of Education. The goal of the SOF grants is to fund durable and demonstrated effective security improvements in Idaho K-12 schools. Horseshoe Bend will receive nearly \$196,000 to install the fencing from phase 2 of the grant.

The available funding for the SOF-2 grants was \$6.1 million and close to \$23 million was requested for projects throughout the state's school districts. Horseshoe Bend School District Superintendent Dennis Chesnut applied for the grant due to the school's close proximity to potentially dangerous areas. "We have a very vulner-

able campus, being so close to a major highway (ID-55) on one side and a river [the Payette] on the other. We feel very fortunate that they chose to fund our project. A project of this scope would have been nearly impossible to fund without this grant," Chesnut remarked after receiving confirmation of the award.

The district also received funding from the first phase of the grant, \$40,000, which the district used to upgrade security cameras and hand-held radios, equipped the last of the exterior doors with electronic locks, and remodeled the middle school office to allow closer monitoring of the main

entrance. Chesnut added, "We are very thankful for the Governor and the Idaho Legislature for making this grant money available to schools as it will go a long way in helping us secure our campus. The safety of our students and staff is paramount."

In the past, the district has relied on the generosity of the community by way of supplemental levies to implement safety measures such as a Student Resource Office (SRO), security cameras, electronic doors capable of locking down the entire campus with the push of a button, radios, and a public address system in every classroom.


