HSB Fire Results in Devastating Loss for Family

The Horseshoe Bend Volunteer Fire Department and Emergency Medical Services crews were hard at work this past week. On Friday, June 7, EMS received a medical call at 8:12 p.m. followed by a call for the HSB Fire Department an hour later for a structure fire with EMS on site for three medical evaluations. On Saturday, June 8, a structure fire with five medical evaluations occurred shortly after 2:00 a.m. at 115 Valley View Drive in Horseshoe Bend. The home, belonging to Ron and Keri Jones, was a total loss. Luckily, the family and their pets were unharmed.

A family friend has set up a GoFundMe account for the family to help offset the costs of their immediate needs. Anyone that is able to donate can access the account by entering "Help Needed for Jones Family-House Fire" in the search bar on GoFundMe.com

The family could also use help with clothing, food, dog

food, and toiletries. Sizes for clothing are as follows: Ron (dad)-Large shirts, 32/34 pants/shorts, 9.5 shoes; Kaelun (son)-Large shirts, 32 pants/shorts, 10.5 shoes; Keri (mom)-Extra Large shirts, large or XL leggings or shorts, 9 shoes; Kimber (daughter)-Medium shirts, 25/26 waist pants/shorts, 8.5 shoes. Arrangements to give monetary donations, clothing, food, etc. can be made with either Meleina Massey (208-781-0425) or Kristi Miller (208-861-9189).

According to Horseshoe Bend Fire Chief Jeff Johnson, Friday's structure fire was confined to a single room and its contents. Both fires are still under investigation by the fire marshal. Johnson said that this weekend's fire brings the total to four confirmed structural fires within the last month.

The Horseshoe Bend EMS crew was also called out at 2:20 a.m. for a possible motor vehicle crash and two additional medical emergency service calls were made on Sunday, June 9. With the extreme heat

approaching, both volunteer organizations will be called upon for a variety of services.

For those interested in continuing to support the Horse-shoe Bend Fire Department Burn Out Fund, Johnson recommends participating in the department's fundraisers. The Burn Out Fund helps community members with the overwhelming task of dealing with a catastrophic fire and is funded




This was a large graduating class of 27 students from Idaho City High School. Numerous students received local scholarships and awards.






