Exploration Project Presented to the Public

BOISE COUNTY -- The

U.S. Forest Service recently hosted two public meetings, one virtually and the other at a forum in Boise at the Best Western Vista Inn near the airport. Unfortunately, the projector at the hotel did not work correctly and only the audio of the presentation video could be heard on June 18th. However, it was promised by Idaho City District Ranger Joshua Newman that a link would be made available on the Forest Service website for the 2023 CuMo Exploration Project to view this presentation. The project is located approximately three miles east of Grimes Pass in

Boise County, Idaho.

The conference room was full of constituents and many insisted on making comments. Although Newman said this was not a time for questions, he did allow several individuals to voice their concerns should the project be approved. There were also individual stations around the room, organized by the Forest Service in an effort to address these concerns, related to botany, wildlife, reclamation, and groundwater.

The proposed exploration would consist of 122 drill pads through 2,917 acres, and the construction of under nine miles of temporary roads. This

proposal would not consider a full-scale mining operation at this time, rather it would be for the purpose of exploration and the limited public comment period ends on Thursday, June 27th. Comment electronically on the Forest Service website: [cara.fs2c.usda.gov]. An environmental assessment will be open for the public to view on their website. Currently, the video shows a link to play on the website, but it was unable to be viewed at the time of this publication, due to an error in the video loading process.

The CuMo company has their own website, cumoproject.com, which states that they

have an interest in exploring the mineral properties of stateowned and privately-owned land. This project site is said to be the largest known molybdenum deposit in the world. This is a component used in lithium batteries, semiconductor technology, vehicles, and other technologies. In speaking with representatives of the project,

they indicated that changes had been made and the company is now fully based in the United States and not a Canadian venture.

The U.S. Forest Service is not anticipated to make a decision regarding this project until November 1, 2024, and implementation could begin as early as May 1, 2025.



MINUTES: Chairman Tucker motioned to approve the minutes from June 11th and the motion car-

CLERK/TREASURER'S **QUARTERLY REPORT**: Clerk Mary Prisco reviewed the documents, stating that fiscal year 2023 ended on September 30th and the quarter ended on December 31 which was part of fiscal year 2024. "This has not been done before prior because we, the treasurer and I, had too large of a difference," the clerk stated. "An explanation as to why you're getting it now, it is required by statute to be done... I would add too that we were working towards having the second quarter of fiscal year 2024, which would be 3-31-2024, but we've got like a \$1,700 or \$1,800 difference. We need to figure out what, it's too substantial to sign off on that."

Chairman Tucker made a motion to approve the 2023 Treasure/ Auditor Quarterly Joint Report and the motion carried. He then made a motion to approve the first quarter for FY2024 Joint Quarterly Report. That motion was also approved.

AUTOMATION CAMERA: The purchase of a second camera to cover where the safe is located was discussed. Treasurer Gina Turner said, "It just seems logical

to me to have a camera where it

really matters." Chairman Tucker

agreed. Clerk Prisco researched and presented some options for the board. Tucker motioned to approve the agreement to install the camera to cover the safe in the amount of \$2,064.32 with premium support annually in the amount of \$206.42. All ayes.

ROAD CLOSURES: Sheriff Scott Turner spoke regarding the closures requested for Garden Valley for the 4th of July. He said that his office provides "crowd control for the parade" and offered signs and cones for the boxcar derby. Tucker had some concerns for the prosecutor regarding the boxcar derby race and Sosa responded, "I saw the pictures in the Idaho World last year. I think that the board certainly has some discretion. In my view, the policing power of the Sheriff. The Sheriff can just kind of unilaterally do it, but I think this is just a good effort to show that everybody in Boise County is a team player." Chairman Tucker then motioned to close the two roads for the 4th of July as requested by the Garden Valley Chamber. The motion carried.

EAST BOISE COUNTY AM-BULANCE DISTRICT: Prosecutor Alex Gross said that they had over one hundred signatures for the proposed redistricting of the EBCAD, and resolutions from both Idaho City and Placerville for the dissolution and reformation of the ambulance district. The signatures will be verified with the Clerk's office and then the proposed redistricting will come before the Board of Commissioners. Tucker motioned to wave the publication fees for the EBCAD petition, and the motion carried.

FORESTER: A motion was

said to approve the "Good Neighbor Agreement," which passed.

JUVENILE JUSTICE: Amanda Leader spoke regarding all the many, many programs that are provided for with grant money. A motion was said to approve an agreement to support these programs. The motion carried.

DESTRUCTION OF RE-**CORDS**: Treasurer Turner said they had eight boxes of paperwork that had "exceeded its lifetime of what I have to keep it for. Some of them are three years and some of them are ten, and they're all well over that. I'm running out of room." Tucker agreed and said, "Time to clean house." Prosecutor Sosa said that everything appeared to comply with statute and he was impressed that each box in the courthouse basement is clearly marked for a date of destruction. Tucker motioned to approve a resolution to destroy certain records of Boise County, which was ap-

MOTION: Tucker made a motion to approve a demand warrant for a "rescue trailer" in the amount of \$6,820. The motion carried.

EBCAD: A motion was said to approve a new business account with Norco for oxygen supply, etc. Mari Adams explained that due to switching to a new medical director, the Medical Supervision Plan needs updating. A motion was said to update this plan for the EBCAD.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Chairman Tucker motioned to go into executive session to discuss a personnel issue and pending litigation. [Time 9:22am to 9:44am] No action required.

SESSION: EXECUTIVE


Tucker motioned to go back into executive session to discuss acquiring real property. [Time 9:44am to 10:34am] No action required.

FORESTRY: Properties were bid on to help with fire mitigation per acres and were accepted "bidding blind." A representative with Torch Fire said they based it on a past property and information from the Assessor, but this one large parcel was a lot "brushier." The presenter said that they were losing money because it was taking much longer to treat. Sosa explained that it was a "capped contract," and Clerk Prisco said that they couldn't get reimbursed for the additional work.

New Commissioner Decided by Governor Brad Little

BOISE COUNTY -- The Boise County Republican Central Committee was tasked with recommending three qualified candidates to fill the vacant position of Steve Twilegar, Boise County's District 1 Commissioner. Twilegar has officially resigned from office, effective June 11, 2024.

Boise County Republican Central Committee Chairwoman Jean Mollenkopf Moore said that once she was advised on the matter by County Clerk Mary Prisco, a special meeting was immediately called to formally address the matter. Mollenkopf Moore explained the process, "A letter to Governor

Brad Little [was] hand delivered to his office at 9:30 a.m. on June 20, 2024." She assured that the recommendation took into consideration the results of the May election, and the candidates were listed by order of their number of votes.

The letter to Idaho Governor Little read: Per Idaho Statute **Title 59 Public Officers in Gen**eral. Chapter 9. Resignations and Vacancies:

Boise County's Republican Central Committee has met and determined the following three Commissioner District 1 candidates. Each man listed below ran for the Boise County District 1 position in the May

21. 2024 Primary. We ask for your consideration to fill the position as follows with Bobby **Callahan (winner of the Prima**ry) as our 1st choice. Mr. Callahan is prepared to assume the duties of Boise County Commissioner District 1.

No. 1 Bob Callahan **Votes received in Primary Election: 861**

No. 2 Steve Moore **Votes received in Primary Election: 507**

No. 3 Kenneth Everhart **Votes received in Primary Election: 348**





Accidents and Fires

BOISE COUNTY -- Emergency responders were busy this weekend, according to Boise County Sheriff Scott Turner. There were multiple crashes and four fires started along Highway 55 on Sunday from a camper dragging its jacks on the highway. Special thanks to Horseshoe Bend Fire Department and the Bureau of Land Management for quickly getting the fires under control.

Wilderness Ranch Fire Chief Colton McCarthy gave an account of an accident that occurred on Highway 21, "There was a vehicle rollover in the curve between Mile markers 24 and 25. This curve catches a lot of people off guard. We have several incidents a year there. They were north bound and slid off the road, rolling into the water, landing upside down. All occupants, a driver and two dogs

were able to self-extricate, no major injuries were sustained. The dogs scattered. Wilderness Ranch Fire, East Boise County Ambulance, and Boise County Sheriff's Office responded. Mountain Towing retrieved the vehicle from the water. We appreciate all who were involved. Responders on scene tried to locate and catch one of the dogs, seen across the creek from the incident, but were unable as the dog was very distraught. WRFPD was called to the incident location later in the night to help assist the driver, who came back up for the dogs, back across the creek. She was able to retrieve one of her dogs, but last we heard the other dog was still missing. It was last seen in Clear Creek." The dog is described as a multi-colored Australian Shepherd mix. The woman's phone was lost in the

Chief McCarthy continued, "By some accounts, Boise County has two out of the top three most dangerous highways in Idaho. While not true every year, our roads aren't very forgiving. Please drive safe."





NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN: That the Boise County Commissioners and the Board of Commissioners of the Garden Valley Fire Protection District will jointly conduct the following two combined public hearings:

PURPOSE OF THE FOUR COMBINED PUBLIC HEARINGS:

County Commissioners Hearing 1: To consider an amendment to Objectives Part 15 of Chapter 8 Public Services and Utilities of the Boise County Comprehensive Plan to read as follows: 15. Follow the policy that new growth shall pay for itself. In order to provide for current levels of fire services and to assure that new growth pays its share; enact an ordinance and enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Garden Valley Fire Protection District for the collection and expenditure of development impact fees for the Fire District's systems improvements as identified in the Garden Valley Fire Protection District Impact Fee Study and Capital Improvement Plan (Final Report — April 19, 2023) as Appendix K. Encourage the County to research ways to make this possible.

County Commissioners Hearing 2: To receive comments regarding the County Commissioners' intent to consider adoption of the Garden Valley Fire Protection District Impact Fee Study and Capital Improvement Plan (Final Report April 19, 2023 (the "Capital Improvements Plan").

County Commissioners and Fire District Board of Commissioners Hearing 3: To receive comments regarding the Boise County Commissioners and the Garden Valley Fire Protection District Board of Commissioners' intent to impose the below described new development impact fees:

A. New fee summary — City of Crouch: The Fire District Board of Commissioners intend to establish the following new Fire District Development Impact Fees within the unincorporated area within the boundaries of Boise County which are also within the boundaries of the Garden Valley Fire Protection District:

Garden Valley Fire Protection District Development Impact Fees	Proposed New Fee
Impact Fee – New Residential (per unit)	\$1,672.00 per unit
Impact Fee – New Non-Residential (per square foot)	\$0.84 per square foot

County Commissioners Hearing 4: To receive comments regarding the Boise County Commissioners intent to consider the adoption of the Garden Valley Fire Protection District Development Impact Fee Ordinance for the purpose of imposing development impact fees for the Garden Valley Fire Protection District's systems improvements as identified in its Capital Improvements Plan.



NEWS RELEASE: DEQ awards \$2.7 million to **Terrace Lakes Water Company in Boise County**

BOISE COUNTY — The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) today announced the award of a \$2,671,175 low-interest drinking water construction loan to Terrace Lakes Water Company in Boise County, Idaho.

The funding will be used to drill a new well, replace a reservoir, construct a booster pump station, replace mains, and map the system.

The loan from DEQ's State Revolving Loan Fund, which is capitalized annually by grants from the United States Environmental Protection Agency, carries a simple 2.5% interest rate and is payable over 20 years. The favorable loan terms represent a \$360,075 savings to the community when compared to average costs for municipal general obligation debt issuances.




