BOISE COUNTY DECLARES A DISASTER EMERGENCY DUE TO ACTIVE FIRES

RESOLUTION #2024-33

A BOISE COUNTY RESOLUTION TO **DECLARE A DISASTER EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, there is threat to life and property in BOISE COUNTY as the result of fires, which could result in damage to private citizens structures and critical infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, a disaster emergency as defined in Section 46-1002, Idaho Code, is in existence in **BOISE COUNTY**, due to the imminent threat to life and property created by fires; and

WHEREAS, Section 46-1011, Idaho Code, authorizes the Commissioners of BOISE COUNTY, Idaho to declare a disaster emergency to authorize the furnishing of aid and assistance, thereunder;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved and declared by the BOISE COUNTY Board of Commissioners, as follows:

- 1. A local emergency is hereby declared to exist within **BOISE COUNTY**, created by the fires and creating an imminent danger and threat to life and property, and;
- 2. These conditions require the activation of the response and recovery aspects of all applicable local disaster emergency plans, and;
- 3. Such disaster may require state emergency assistance to supplement local efforts to protect, rehabilitate and replace public property and to provide a coordinated multiagency effort to mitigate, avert and lessen the threat and impact of the disaster, and;
- 4. Boise County is fiscally challenged to undertake and sustain these efforts, and;
- 5. It is vital to restore basic services and ensure our continuing fiscal stability and insure adequate public safety.

APPROVED and ADOPTED in open session this 9th day of August, 2024.

COUNTY COMMISS

August 6, 2024

Present: Commissioners Clay Tucker, Lindy Lindstrom. and Bob Callahan

Pledge of Allegiance **CONSTITUENT INPUT:**

A resident of Garden Valley asked that the commissioners take into account the people who choose to live and work in Boise County, rather than earn a higher wage in Boise when determining the budget for the next fiscal year.

MINUTES: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the minutes from 7/30/2024. The motion carried.

SNOWMOBILE GRANT: A grant to improve the snowmobile facilities in Idaho City was discussed. A motion was said to approve the estimate from an electric company for repairs in the amount of \$7,995. This was approved.

COMMUNITY JUS-TICE: Wildlife removal was discussed. Amanda Leader said that she wanted the bats free to live their lives, but also does not want them living on the building. She stated, "We had 12 dead bats in about a week and a half," and guessed that it may have had something to do with the heatwave. She acknowledged that the estimated cost of treatment is substantial, even compared across the three companies willing to give estimates, but said, "the building is a giant bat box... every single window has bat urine on it."

OPIOID SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the opioid settlement agreement with Kroger, which would provide money to the county for specific uses, and all were in agreement. The motion carried.

ALCOHOL BEVERAGE LICENSE **RENEWALS**: A series of licenses were approved via an assigned number. All were in favor and the

AIR ST. LUKE'S: A motion was said to approve the membership with St. Luke's for a new employee in the amount of \$55.

motions carried.

WITH NEW HIRE EBCAD: A motion was said to approve the payroll addition for a part-time position and the motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: A motion was said to enter into executive session to discuss a personnel issue. [Time 9:33 am to 9:54 am] No action was required for the East Boise

County Ambulance District.

EXECUTIVE **SESSION**: Another motion was said to enter into executive session to discuss a personnel issue. [Time 9:54 am to 11:24 am] No action was required.

APPROVAL FOR ANNEX-ATION INTO PLACER-**VILLE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT**: An approval from the Placerville Fire Protection District was received for an acceptance to be annexed, but the clerk said there was not a specified entity or subdivision. This will be addressed at a later date.

ROBIE CREEK FIRE DIS-TRICT: Clerk Mary Prisco reported that a solicitation was sent into the Idaho World letting the community know that the Board of County Commissioners is accepting applications for the fire district commissioner appointments for each of the subdistricts. There are also items on the Boise County website. The deadline for application submissions is August 23 at 5pm.

BUDGET FOR BOISE COUNTY: Clerk Prisco presented the first balanced budget for Boise County for the next fiscal year. She said, "I did take the liberty to put, [as the] budget officer, 100% of market for everyone across the board. And for those who were already at market, I put in a 3% cost of living increase." She shared with the board the charts and graphs used to balance the budget to cover services and fees throughout the departments. Prisco spoke to funding sources, expenses by fund, and then balancing that fund. The county is working with a total budget of \$16.5 million for fiscal year 2025. Property tax is 36% of this funding at \$5.9 million. Road and Bridge Department received a new revenue stream though the new legislation to strengthen county districts, highways, and bridges. Prisco reported, "We received \$1.4 million in total for what they call the 'highway users general fund.""

Maintenance and repairs of \$150,000 will be budgeted for, specifically for county facilities.

Commissioner Callahan would like to get more material on Centerville Road due to high traffic, because funds are becoming available for specific projects. The other two commissioners were concerned with safety factors on Highway 17.

Distributing the money equally throughout the county was a large concern for the commissioners and there was much discussion.

SHERIFF: Sheriff Scott Turner said they were having some major issues with the E911 phone system and there was no voicemail. "They get phone calls coming into dispatch and that's about it," the sheriff said. "The black box system is completely shut off." He asked that an emergency meeting be called by the commissioners to address the issue. Sheriff Turner added, "We can call in, we can call out, for now, but that's it." He said that they fear that the rest of the phone system will go down.

4-H: The 4-H program and the county's annual donation were discussed, a cost of \$8,500 per a year. A new Gem County building was discussed for the 4-H program, and the 4-H representatives asked that

Boise County contribute ten percent. Commissioner Callahan would like to come to a realistic number as to how much the Boise County 4-H participants use the facilities.

BUDGET SALARIES: The salaries were reviewed for each employee, taking into account how many years they had served in that position and "market value."

EXECUTIVE SESSION: A motion was said to go back into executive session to discuss a personnel issue. [Time 3:48 pm to 5:31 pm] Coming back into session, there was no action required.

AGENDA FUTURE ITEMS: Next week's meeting will be to discuss more budget items. Following the meeting, the commissioners will go on a tour of the county office buildings in Idaho City and Horseshoe Bend.

Recessed until next Tuesday, 5:36 pm.

SPECIAL EMERGENCY **MEETING**: Chairman Tucker reviewed Idaho Code stating when it was appropriate to call an emergency meeting. Sheriff Turner explained his request to hold this meeting. "Due to the failure of the phone system," the sheriff is asking to expend dollars to replace the equipment system. Commissioner Callahan recognized the situation and said, "It's completely necessary. If our emergency center goes down for the county, we're in a lot more trouble."

Lindstrom Commissioner motioned to approve the replacement of the phone system at the Sheriff's Office, authorizing up to \$40,000. The motion carried.

Adjourned at 5:41 pm.



CURRENT STATUS/ **PLANNED ACTIONS:**

Middle Fork Complex: The Middle Fork Complex is comprised of Bulldog, Nellie, and Anderson fires.

On the Bulldog Fire, strategic overnight firing operations along the south side of the fire were successful in connecting with the historic Pioneer fire burn area. Firefighters continue to secure the edge of the fire. On the north side of the fire crews are working with terrain and fuels to create a fuel break. The public is reminded that the Middle Fork Road is closed at the Forest Service boundary just south of Lightning Creek for firefighter and public safety as crews continue to work to protect private property and structures in the vicinity of Crouch.

On August 12th the Nellie and Anderson fires merged and will now be treated as one fire and retain the name Nellie. The current containment on the newly combined Nellie fire is 0%. The fire is burning in steep remote terrain and is backing into the 2016 Pioneer fire area. Crews plan to utilize unmanned aerial system (UAS) today to conduct strategic firing operations ahead of the fire to reduce fuels availability. The public is reminded that Forest Service Road #555 is closed at the intersection of Highway 17.

Wapiti Fire: Wapiti fire has been active in areas exposed to winds in upper elevations and ridges. Firefighters continue to ensure the structures in the vicinity of the fire are protected with improved defensible space, with an extensive sprinkler and water pumping system in communities near the fire. Crews are evaluating the Hanging Valley subdivision. Smoke may be visible from State Highway 21 please use caution while driving in the area. A predominant ridge on the west side of the fire is being assessed for opportunities to conduct strategic firing operations when conditions are favorable. On the south side of the fire is a historic fire area is adjacent to the fire and remains less receptive to fire activity.

Bulltrout Fire: The fire is 92% contained and firefighters continue suppression repair in areas affected by the fire.

The fire is smoldering and creeping through unburned areas within the interior of the fire and crews continue patrolling and extinguishing pockets of heat in the interior of the fire on the south side of the fire.

CLOSURES, **RESTRIC-**TIONS, AND EVACUATIONS:

Middle Fork Complex: The Boise County Sheriff's Office continues to maintain the Level 2 evacuation notice for residents on and near the Middlefork Road between Stump Ranch Road up to Tie Creek Campground. The Boise National Forest issued areas closure for the fire area (Closure #0402-06-59 and Closure # 0402-05-93). Effective August 12, 2024. The purpose of these orders is to protect public safety during the

Wapiti Fire: The evacuation order for Summer Homes and the Sawtooth Lodge remain in effect for the Wapiti Fire, as does the area closure issued by the Sawtooth and Boise National Forests (Closure #0402-05-94) Effective August 12, 2024. This Order is for public and firefighter safety during fire suppression efforts of the Wapiti Fire.


Bulltrout Fire: The Bull Trout Fire Area Closure (Closure #0402-05-93) remains in effect for the roads, trails within the perimeter of the fire. Boise National Forest issued this order on August, 12, 2024. It will be rescinded as soon as it is safe to do so.

Dear Editor,

This is in response to a comment presented at the June 25, 2024 Boise County Commissioners' meeting as recorded in *The Idaho World's* July 3, 2024 edition -

Prosecutor Sosa commented "he's been working with the Department of Health and Welfare and Sheriff's Office stating "We're trying to give a lot of attention to child protection cases, child abuse, child neglect, and things like that to PROTECT CHILDREN IN BOISE COUNTY."

Based on my experience, that is not a true statement. I understand the Prosecutor's Office is busy but not too busy to keep up on their cases through BCS and ISP reports.

Case Example of Legal Neglect:

- 02/13/24 Neighbor arrested for domestic violence; spouse required emergency care
- 03/18/24 Hearing 02/26/24 No Contact Order dismissed; abusive spouse allowed back in home with minor children. Felony Domestic Abuse charges filed.
- 03/20/24 to 07/28/24 12 occurrences of PUBLIC distur-

bances, confrontations, anger, violence, degrading language to abused spouse and neighbor in front of minor children and neighbors.

• 06/25/24 - Hearing - Domestic Abuse Felony charges lowered to Disturbing the Peace Misdemeanor agreed to by Prosecutor's Sosa's office and approved by Judge.

Instead of helping the child involved above, the Boise County Judicial System is neglecting and allowing this horrific home environment to continue escalating.

I have Zero Tolerance for domestic/child abuse. Just living in an abusive household is hazardous to adult/children's physical and mental health.

Case in Point:

November 1981 - After 27 years of an abusive marriage, my father, in a drunken rage, murdered my mother in their home while my 16-year-old brother and 11-year-old sister were hiding in their bedrooms. Being the oldest of 5 children, I was the one who helped our mother with her domestic injuries and consoled/raised my siblings.

At age 26, I inherited my minor siblings joining my hus-

band, 4-year-old son, 6-monthold daughter, and myself. I'm pleased to say that my siblings and children are happy, productive individuals today. 3 of 4 siblings have been or are alcoholics, homeless, jobless; the sister we finished raising has celebrated her 16th year of sobriety recovery.

43 years later and acknowledging/pursuing mental health care, I can speak of my personal tragedy now without being embarrassed, ashamed, or victimized and will no longer turn a blind eye or deaf ear on our abused Boise County neighborhood children.

Prosecutor Sosa, please do the same. Please take a stronger stand and make a change!!







Smokey's 80th Birthday at the Library


