BOISE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Present: Commissioners Clay Tucker, Bob Callahan and Lindy Lindstrom

Pledge of Allegiance

CONSTITUENT INPUT: A Garden Valley resident expressed some concern about the Warm Springs Greenhouse. He informed the commissioners that there will be a jury trial in November and asked that the county hold a public hearing on the construction that is taking place and issue a cease-and-desist order. Commissioner Tucker responded that it was the landowner's property, and the county did not have a "standing to do anything." No paperwork has been filed with the county. If rules have been broken, Commissioner Tucker said that the county would investigate and perhaps send over a county building inspector.

MINUTES: A motion was said to approve the minutes from September 17th and the motion carried.

ROAD AND BRIDGE: An employee hire was discussed for the Garden Valley area. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the payroll addition for a full-time employee.

Concrete blocks for the Centerville Road culvert were discussed, which would help get the project completed at a sooner date. Lindstrom motioned to approve the estimate

for the concrete blocks in the amount of \$26,580. The motion carried.

AGREEMENT: A motion was made to approve the maintenance agreement between Boise County and the Atlanta Highway District. The motion carried.

EQUIPMENT AGREEMENT: An agreement with the Idaho Department of Lands was discussed by Commissioner Callahan. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the emergency equipment rental agreement between Boise County and the IDL. The motion carried. Callahan thanked the road department.

ADA COUNTY JUVENILE DETENTION: Lindstrom motioned to approve the Ada County Juvenile Detention agreement. The motion carried.

RESOLUTIONS: Clerk Mary Prisco addressed the status of a grant and the purchase of two additional "express vote" machines. Prisco said there were still a few thousand dollars to use on this grant from 2021, and this resolution was to reflect the purchase of the two voting machines. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve Resolution 2024-25 to increase the Boise County Elections Department fund. The motion carried.

Clerk Prisco defined the next resolution to adjust the budget for the unexpected K9 expenditures for the Boise County

Sheriff's office. Lindstrom motioned to approve Resolution 2024-26, and the motion carried.

CLAIMS APPROVAL REPORT: Lindstrom motioned to approve the Claims Approval Report in the amount of \$185,018.50. All were in favor and the motion carried.

LIQUOR LICENSES: A motion was said to approve two liquor licenses and the motion carried.

CATERING PERMIT: A motion to approve a catering permit was also passed.

COMPASS ORGANIZATION: The commissioners were all in favor of joining the COMPASS organization. Lindstrom motioned to approve the letter of request for membership with COMPASS, [which could bring some additional grant money to Boise County]. The motion carried.

EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT: A motion was said to approve the Lowman Volunteer Fire District in the amount of \$2,500.

MOTION: Lindstrom motioned to approve the "Celebrite" demand warrant for \$27,850. [Software equipment for the Sheriff's office and Prosecutor.]

EXECUTIVE SESSION: A motion was said to go into a closed executive session to discuss a personnel issue. There was no action required.

Varsity Volleyball: The Horseshoe Bend Lady Mustangs hosted the Tri-Valley Titans on Tuesday, 9/24 in a 1A DII Long Pin Conference match-up. Horseshoe Bend took the win 25-10, 25-13, 25-15.

Statistical standouts were senior Aubree Zimmer with 15 kills, 8 digs and 2 assists. Senior Aliyah Meyer had 8 kills, 2 aces, 1 block, 13 digs and 16 assists. Freshman Malia Goff contributed 5 kills, 3 aces, 11 digs and 17 assists. Freshman Celeste Wilson had 4 kills, 1 dig and 1 assist, senior Ashlyn Wolsleben had 3 kills, 5 aces, 1 block, 9 digs and 1 assist and freshman Aubrey Penney had 3 kills, 1 block and 1 assist. Sophomore Libero, Kimber Jones added 2 kills, 2 aces, 6 digs and 1 assist.

In Council on Friday, 9/27 the Varsity Mustangs took on their Long Pin Conference rival Lumberjacks and came home with the win 25-18, 25-12, 25-17. Stat leaders were Meyer with 10 kills, 6 aces, 14 digs and 11 assists, Zimmer with 8 kills, 2 aces, 1 block and 14 digs, Wolsleben with 5 kills, 4 digs and 1 assist and Wilson with 4 kills, 1 ace, 2 blocks, 3 digs and 1 assist. Goff added 2 kills, 3 aces, 10 digs and 13 assists while the libero, Jones, had 1 kill, 1 ace and 14 digs. Rounding out the stat leaders was Penney who had 1 kill and 1 dig.

The Lady Mustangs are at home for their Annual Pink Out to fight against breast cancer game on Friday, 10/4. The opposing team are Boise County rivals, the Garden Valley Wolverines (JV 3:00 p.m.,

Varsity 4:15 p.m.). On Saturday, 10/5 the team travels to Arco for the annual Pink Tournament. The Varsity Mustangs are at Greenleaf Friends Academy on Wednesday, 10/9 for a non-conference game against the Grizzlies (6:00 p.m.) The Lady Mustangs are 6-0 in conference play, 14-3 overall.

Junior Varsity Volleyball: The JV team fell to Tri-Valley at home on 9/24, 23-25, 25-17, 5-15. Stat leaders were Goff 6 out of 6 serves, 5 perfect serve receptions, Penney with 12 out of 12 serves including 5 aces, 16 out of 16 serve receptions with 5 perfect, junior Emily Hampton had 7 out of 7 serves, Wilson had 9 out of 10 serves with 5 aces plus 3 out of 3 serve receptions with 2 being perfect. Sophomore RyLee Johnson had 2 aces.

Varsity Football: After a BYE week on 9/20 the Horseshoe Bend Mustangs faced a tough away game against the Council Lumberjacks. After falling to the Lumberjacks 44-0 last season the Mustangs were unsuccessful in bringing home a victory in 2024 as Council came out on top 58-6.

The team is at home on Friday, 10/4 for the annual Battle for the Axe game against Boise County conference rivals, The Garden Valley Wolverines. Kickoff is at 7:00 p.m. Homecoming activities begin next week with the community bonfire scheduled for Wednesday, 10/9. This year's bonfire location will be next to the skate park, north of the high school baseball and softball fields.

|------------------------|--|
| Ace | a serve which is unable to be played or returned by the opposing team |
| Assist | pass, set, or dig ball to another player who gets the kill |
| Block | blocking the ball into the opponent's court leading to a point or side out |
| Dig | passing a spiked or hard-hit ball |
| Kill | an attack on the ball which is not returnable by the opposing team |
| Libero | A player specialized in defensive skills: the libero must wear a contrasting jersey color from their teammates and cannot block or attack the ball when it is entirely above net height. When the ball is not in play, the libero can replace any back-row player, without prior notice to the officials |

The following agencies of the state of Idaho have published the complete text and all related, pertinent information concerning their intent to change or make the following rules in the latest publication of the state Administrative Bulletin.

The proposed rule public hearing request deadline is October 16, 2024, unless otherwise posted.

The proposed rule written comment submission deadline is October 23, 2024, unless otherwise posted.

(*PH) indicates that a public hearing has been scheduled.

IDAPA 02 – DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

02-0212-2401, Bonded Warehouse Rules. Zero-Based Regulation (ZBR) Rewrite clarifies procedures for licensing, collection and remittance of assessment, determining claim value, maintaining electronic records use of electronic scales, and remedies of the Department for non-compliance.

02-0214-2401, Rules for Weights and Measures. Amendment updates incorporated document that contains the specifications, tolerances, and other technical requirements for commercial weighing and measuring devices.

02-0301-2401, Rules Governing Pesticide Management Plans for Ground Water Protection. ZBR Rewrite clarifies procedure for testing and monitoring groundwater for pesticides and remedies of the Department for non-compliance.

02-0403-2401, Rules Governing Animal Industry. ZBR Rewrite clarifies procedures for: disease control of livestock and other animals into, within, and out of the state; prevention, control, and eradication of diseases among animals in the state; and Departmental remedies for non-compliance.

02-0405-2401, Rules Governing Grade A Milk and Manufacture Grade Milk. Updates include changes in incorporated federal code governing design, construction, production, manufacture, distribution, handling, storage, quality, analysis, and sale of safe and wholesome dairy products.

02-0415-2401, Rules Governing Beef Cattle Animal Feeding Operations. Removes redundant language now included in IDAPA 02.04.30, Rules Governing Environmental and Nutrient Management, for waste systems on beef cattle animal feeding operations.

02-0419-2401, Rules Governing Domestic Cervidae. Rulemaking complies with recent legislation making certain changes to the quarantine process, sampling protocols, and requirements for domestic cervidae operations while under quarantine.

02-0501-2401, Rules Governing Produce Safety. ZBR Rewrite clarifies procedures for administering the Food Safety Modernization Act and remedies for non-compliance for the growing, harvesting, packing, and holding of safe and unadulterated produce for human consumption.

02-0602-2401, Rules Governing Registrations and Licenses. Updates incorporated standardized regulations for Commercial Feed, Commercial Fertilizer, and Soil and Plant Amendments, refining definitions, technical terms, and

other standards necessary for product regulation.

02-0609-2402, Rules Governing Invasive Species and Noxious Weeds. Changes reduce categorization of Turkish thistle from EDRR to Control category and add clarifying language for EDRR noxious weed list criteria.

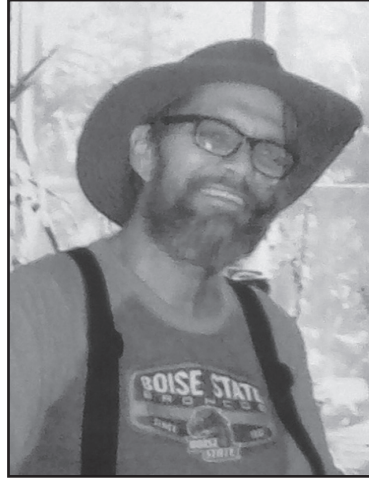

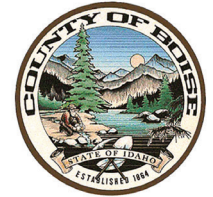
