Horseshoe Bend Student Saves the Day!

A lunchtime incident nearly turned tragic at Horseshoe Bend Middle School on Wednesday, November 20. Eighth grader Jason Jones was in the school fover when he noticed a fellow student enter, visibly distressed. "He wasn't breathing or speaking, and he was hunched over with spit coming out of his mouth," Jones recalled. Realizing the student was choking, Jones quickly decided to take action. Drawing on his training from an Idaho Digital Learning Alliance Health class he completed the previous semester, Jones performed the Heimlich Maneuver.

He asked nearby students to clear the area, then wrapped his arms around the student's abdomen, made a fist below the ribcage, and delivered several sharp thrusts. Jones reported that a large piece of what appeared to be "nacho meat" was expelled from the student's throat.

Jones had learned this technique in practice, but this was the first time he had ever needed to use it in a real situation.

The choking student was escorted to the nurse's office and sent home, but returned to school the following day.

Present: Commissioners Clay Tucker, Bob Callahan and Lindy Lindstrom

Pledge of Allegiance

MOTION: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to appoint the three EBCED (East Boise County EMS District) Commissioners that were interviewed last week. The motion carried.

Chairman Tucker swore in Alex Gross, David Gomez and Jim Anderson.

CONSTITUENT INPUT: None

MINUTES: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the minutes from November 26, 2024. The motion carried.

CANCELATION: TAX Lindstrom motioned to approve the tax cancelation presented by the Assessor in the amount of \$141.48.

PROSECUTING ATTOR-

NEY: Prosecutor Alex Sosa

said that prosecution numbers had increased, and he would like to request a paid intern. He said, "I believe that my ethical obligation falls more to effectively prosecuting crime

and in keeping the county safe. And so, with that, the civil side has had to be delayed, and it has had to wait. I've essentially been the bottleneck for the county in trying to move things forward. But then also, on the criminal side, we have so many cases now that even individual cases are losing the focus that they need." Sosa said that he was working on Thanksgiving and Black Friday, "even those I was vacationing with my family." He said it was time to ease the case load with the second record year of cases. Sosa would like to bring on an intern and perhaps put in a re-

Chairman Tucker said that they missed having him in the commissioners' meetings and, "I think it's definitely something we need to talk about." Commissioner Lindstrom added, "Yeah, I think it's cheap insurance for no more lawsuits against the county." Commissioner Callahan would like to figure out how to get Prosecutor Sosa some more help. The prosecutor reported learning from the "newly elected prosecuting attorneys conference at the State Police," that other counties of this size do have multiple deputy prosecutors. Sosa said there has been an uptick of crimes, "and a lot of it is from people from outside of

the county. But the Sheriff's office is just being very thorough with multiple different deputies and detectives to give solid cases, and a lot of them are just more serious." An example given of the more serious cases was the few child sex cases that

Lindstrom motioned to approve the prosecting attorney's request to hire an intern. The motion carried.

ROAD DEPARTMENT: Superintendent Curtis Dill was concerned by the number of hours required to do snow removal and how little rest operators were getting. Dill said, "We don't have enough manpower to do an overlap [within hours]," and are bouncing around to cover routes. "Most of the guys try to start around 4am in the morning, so they can have all of the bus routes done. Quite a few of us grader operators, we start at two in the morning to try and make sure that we're ahead of everything and to help overlap what the trucks are trying to do." They try to clear 4am to 4pm, but can't control when there's a rockslide. "But then to come back in at 7 or 8 o'clock at night, to be able to do more calls, it's hurting my morning for sure. I mean, we just don't have the manpower [for snowplowing and sanding.]" Commissioner Callahan talked about the possibility of a swing shift. He recognized that we are a growing county and there is more traffic. He said, "We do have our roads set up in three priorities. The first priority, of course, is the bus routes, major commute routes. Second is mail routes and then we start into the heavier residential. And then we do have a third priority, which is roads, which is very low residential." Some of those, they don't plow until 6 inches or more. The department also gets called out when people come up from the valley, unprepared, and get stuck. Chairman Tucker said that after 12-hours, Valley County shuts down. Dill said it was discussed, "They do work with about the same miles

of road, but they do have twice the crew." He added that he's reached out to people about part time work to cover with some overlap with the sanding. Currently, everyone puts in a minimum of 10-12 hours a day. "Where we're running into problems is if we're called back out at night. Now that interferes with our start time. And if I have to delay their start time for the 8-consective hours that's required, now they're going to miss getting out for the buses and to do their rounds. And I don't want to delay on getting the roads cleared." Lindstrom suggested looking into getting a DOT exemption for the county for serious storms. Dill said it was in the policy, should the board of commissioners declare an emergency, "but that doesn't apply to everyday plowing." They would like to hire full time and part time employees, or an on-call person. Dill said the individual would need a CDL, and be familiar with the equipment to be able to drive.

Road Superintendent Dill reported that the Centerville Road culvert was completed for the season and open. "We will do final beautifications in the spring, when the weather allows." The bypass has been removed and the water is fully running through.

He said that with four days of rain and then a freeze, there are some potholes, but they are going to work on getting some material down on the roads. Although, he added that there is a shortage of material, "We'll move forward, as we can."

SHERIFF: Sheriff Scott Turner reported that they had lost two School Resource Officers at the beginning of the year, but hired two more replacements. They will need to attend an academy that starts the beginning of January. They have the previous Horseshoe Bend SRO on as a reserve deputy, and she is willing to help cover that 15-week period.

have a patrol deputy attending the academy at the same time, so they will be short of deputies. Sheriff Turner said that they had hoped the deputies would be put into different academies; however, "We're at their beck and call."

A motion was said to bring the reserve deputy back for a maximum of 28-hours a week. The motion carried.

PLANNING AND ZON-ING COMMISSIONER: Ben Williams of Idaho City was interviewed for the position of Planning and Zoning Commissioner. Commissioner Callahan thanked him for stepping up. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to appoint Ben Williams as the new Planning and Zoning Commissioner.

COMMUNITY JUSTICE: The Idaho City Historical Foundation sent a letter to the Community Justice Department, but it was unclear as to what it pertained to other than the updated paint on the building. Callahan suggested that maybe they wanted a fee, but was under the impression that

government office buildings were exempt.

PROCLAMATION: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the proclamation in support of Boise County military and caregivers in collaboration with Idaho's DAR [Daughters of the American Revolution] and Hidden Heroes

DEMAND WARRANTS: None

EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE: A 20-page document regarding the boundaries and history of EBCAD was reviewed. Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the organization of the East Boise County EMS District as an ambulance service district, pursuant to Idaho code. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Mari Adams said that although the new district was voted in, the money would not come in until 2026, so they cannot hire any additional staff at the moment. There was one individual working part time that recently resigned. There is the potential that the ambulance

will be out-of-service. Adams says she feels "horrible" about the situation and has jumped on some calls rather than say they were out-of-service, since people voted for the new district. She asked for further direction from the board. Lindstrom said, "I trust you with the comp time. And I think that a little bit of comp time to save some lives, or something, is well worth it." Adams pointed out that there would be a higher compensation for other agencies to come up, which could be expended as comp time. The ambulance is hoping to have more volunteers, including drivers.

Alex Gross gave an update on Unit 15 ambulance and said they were having issues with the suspension. It is in the shop again at Ford.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: A closed session was motioned to discuss a personnel issue. [Time 10:13am to 12:21pm] No action was required.

FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS: Several topics were discussed, placed on future agendas, and the meeting adjourned at 12:29pm.

Horseshoe Bend's Community School

By Tracy Koslosky HORSESHOE BEND Since 1948, the US Marine Corps Reserves have been collecting new unwrapped toys to give to the less fortunate children in communities all across the United States, including Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands. According to the History of the Toys for Tots Program, it all began when Marine Corps Reserve Major Bill Hendricks was asked by his wife, Diane, to find an organization for children in need to which she could donate some handcrafted dolls. When Major Hendricks could find no such agency, Diane told him he should "start one!"

Major Hendricks enlisted the help of his reserve unit in Los Angeles, and they collected and gave out 5,000 toys that year. Major Hendricks' Commandant directed all Marine Reserve sites to begin Toys for Tots programs after seeing the results of the community's engagement in the program.
