Sheriff Scott Turner was elected to serve the people of Boise County for another 4-year term. Boise County Prosecutor Alex Sosa was also elected to serve a 4-year term.

Clerk Mary Prisco has served for several terms and was elected to serve another four years in 2022. She swore in both Boise County Commissioners Callahan and Lindstrom to serve their elected terms.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Clerk Mary Prisco explained that there was a nonmedical in-

digent issue to discuss. Chairman Tucker motioned to go into the closed session under exempt records. [Time: 9:06 am to 9:16 am] There was no action required.

MINUTES: Commissioner Lindstrom motioned to approve the minutes from December 31st, 2024. The motion carried.

ROAD AND BRIDGE: It was explained that an old copier, which is not being used, "is just taking up space." The machine could be surplused because it is still considered an asset for the Road and Bridge Department. Clerk Prisco said that it would likely be valued under \$250. Lindstrom motioned to approve the request for a surplus or disposal of the copier.

The superintendent job description for the Road and Bridge Department was dis-

cussed, which was last updated in May of 2021. A motion was said to include updates, for example: to actively look for grant opportunities with this new job description. The motion carried.

VACATION ACCRUAL: Clerk Prisco spoke regarding vacation time accrual under several departments. Sheriff Scott Turner explained that they were short-staffed due to the requirements that two of the officers attend an academy for 15 weeks. East Boise County Ambulance District also asked for an extension, as well as an employee with the Assessor's Office and several from the Road Department. Clerk Prisco said these would be exceptions to the personnel policy that specifically states that there is a 160-hour cap for vacation accruals. Lindstrom motioned to extend the vacation time to everyone on the list presented, with the exception of the "elected official."

ATLANTA HIGHWAY DISTRICT: A letter drafted by the Prosecuting Attorney for Boise County was reviewed. There was some concern because there was no signed contract. A motion was said to send

the letter to the AHD. The invoice from AHD has been received, but will not be paid until some response is received. The AHD said in their invoice that no further work would be done until they receive payment.

PLACERVILLE FIRE DISTRICT COMMISSION-ERS: Four potential commissioners were interviewed and three were chosen. Due to new lines drawn, it was unclear which districts these candidates lived in. A motion was made by Commissioner Lindstrom to appoint Placerville Fire District Commissioners John Longden - District 1, Thomas Andreason - District 2, and Richard Barber – District 3. The motion

carried.

SOLID WASTE: A brush truck purchase was discussed for weed spraying. Lindstrom motioned to approve the purchase request in the amount of \$20,062,08. The motion carried.

TREASURER: The tax cancelations for four properties were motioned and approved.

POLAR BEAR PLUNGE:

A motion was said to approve the mass gathering permit. There will be Life Flight, EBCAD, and a dive team on hand. The motion carried.

EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT: Mari Adams said she had sent out an email stating that the

ambulance service was down overnight during the weekend because ambulances 14 and 15 were needing repairs, and Unit 13 had smoke coming out the back and was out of service. A loaner 2-wheel drive van ambulance with chains will be used as a backup free of charge. Adams was pleased and a motion was said to sign the contract to add the vehicle to the county's insurance. The motion carried.

This includes our two main ambulances and our backup unit. Unfortunately, we don't yet have a clear timeline for when these vehicles will be back in service.

Bust in Garden

BOISE COUNTY -- The Boise County Sheriff's Office released a statement on January 7th with the results of an extensive eight-month investigation into the illegal sale of methamphetamine. A warrant had been served at a residence in Garden Valley, and with the help of the U.S. Postal Inspector and Boise County K9 Unit, over one hundred and twenty grams of methamphetamines, almost 600 grams of marijuana and, nearly two and a half grams of heroin were seized for evidence in this case.

Delora Melford, 54, is as of January 14th being held at the Ada County Jail on a \$50,000 bond and a felony charge of drug trafficking in metham-

phetamines. Fairel Corbin, 57, was also charged in this case on a felony charge of drug trafficking and is being held on a \$100,000 bond.

According to Sheriff Scott Turner, the suspects had a preliminary hearing on Monday, January 13th, at the Boise County Courthouse.




ELECTRIC SERVICE GROWS AS SNAKE RIVER VALLEY GROWS

In only twelve months, the electric system of Idaho Power Company has virtually doubled in capacity with the completion of the Lower Salmon plant and near completion of the Bliss plant. The figures speak for themselves: At the beginning of the year total capacity was 132,000 kilowatts-at the end of 1949, 240,000 kilowatts, More will came in 1950.

This new power is serving new industries -phosphates, antimony, food processing, mining and manufacturing, It makes possible the expansion of irrigation pumping for new farm acreages, It is serving the increased population of southern Idaho and eastern Oregon. It will serve new and expanding business concerns as they prosper and grow.

There has been no power shortage in this area, and there will be none. The only areas of the Pacific Northwest where a power shortage exists-as it has for several years -are those areas where the federal government has assumed responsibility for power





HORSESHOE BEND CITY COUNCIL

By Tracy Koslosky HORSESHOE BEND --

The following is a synopsis of the Horseshoe Bend City Council meeting that was held on Wednesday, January 8, 2025. All councilmembers were present. Mayor Pat Goff made the call to order at 7:00 p.m. then led the Pledge of Allegiance. After unanimous approval of the agenda, minutes from the previous meeting on December 8th, plus the authorization to pay the city's bills, Goff opened the meeting with a public hearing listed on the agenda as Deer Valley Subdivision: Amending Preliminary Plat. David Bailey of Bailey Engineering took the podium as a representative of Trilogy Development and outlined the previous preliminary plat approvals which were approved in 2021 and 2022 and contained a 7-phase construction plan. The requested plat amendment included a modification to how fees were to be paid for the water system upgrades needed to accommodate the new construction. The city received a grant so that developer fees were no longer needed upfront and will be paid when permits are pulled. The 20 acres of commercial property developed by Twin Island, LLC will consist of a storage facility, commercial/industrial lots, and were amended to include a larger industrial area with 6 industrial lots.

The new plat was given to councilmembers to review. The city attorney recommended that the plat amendment be approved, if the following conditions are agreed upon: Phase 3 (commercial) to be completed before Phase 2 (residential) OR

the service access road in Phase 3 must be completed prior to the start of the Phase 2 build.

Bailey also told the council that Corey Barton Homes was still the residential builder of Deer Valley and said that the Idaho Transportation Department (ITD) had approved the widening of Highway 55 adjacent to the development. Bailey added that a traffic light would be installed at the Highway 55/52 junction. Goff asked, "Will they take any input from the city regarding that?" Bailey replied, "I don't know, have they listened to you before?" "No," said Goff.

At the end of the testimony, Goff opened the floor to those in favor, opposed, and neutral. No one approached the podium to speak. City Attorney Tony Pantera wanted the minutes to reflect that all legal requirements for the public hearing had been met. Goff closed the public hearing at 7:25 p.m.

The meeting immediately transitioned into the action item on the agenda: Deer Valley: Approve the Amended Plat. Councilmember Jennifer Patterson motioned to approve the plat amendment, seconded by councilmember Martye White. Goff opened the motion to discussion. "Pretty cut and dried as far as I'm concerned," said White. Goff replied, "I'm ecstatic that we're finally getting some traction on this thing." Goff went on to state that it will be a "blessing" to get residential and industry development coming to the city at the same time. The council then unanimously approved the amended plat with the conditions stipulated.

The next action item on the

agenda was to approve the city liquor licenses for the year. City Clerk Gina Elmer told the council that there were no changes from the previous year. The item was passed unanimously without further discussion.

EMS: No report.

Public Works: The public works representative told the council that they were, "getting through the holidays, that's a thing." The department is also working on UV and filters in the water plant as well as "gearing up" for other projects.

City Engineer: The sidewalk project on Highway 55 is 80% complete and they are currently working on seepage beds

(for stormwater) and crosswalk placement is also being developed. Booster station #2 plans will be delivered to the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) by February. They are also compiling numbers to finalize the water facility plans and hope to submit it by next week. It was mentioned that Barreto Manufacturing may be moving forward on building plans.

City Attorney: Pantera said he was attempting to set up a meeting with Ziply [internet provider] and had nothing else to report. Goff concluded the meeting by telling those in attendance, "I hope everyone had

a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year." He also asked everyone to keep Southern California in their prayers due to the wildfire situation. The meeting adjourned at 7:36 p.m.

After the meeting ended, Goff asked Pantera about what he was able to learn about cities contracting with rafting services. Pantera said he didn't have an update and Goff asked Elmer to add the topic to next month's agenda. The Horseshoe Bend City Council meets on the second Wednesday of each month at City Hall, 112 Ada Street. Meetings start at 7:00 p.m.
